Come to downtown Crandon, Wisconsin on Saturday, July 27, for the Annual Kentuck Day Festival. This popular summer festival celebrates the heritage of many of the area's early settlers from Kentucky. The rich history of families from Kentucky will be highlighted at this event, featured in the historical booth on the grounds of the courthouse square. With artist and crafter booths, great sidewalk sales, specialty food booths, kid's venue, and live entertainment on the grounds, there will be something for everyone to enjoy! Not to mention the best car show in the Northwoods and you won't want to be anywhere but in downtown Crandon.

New to the Kentuck Day Festival line up is the 2nd Annual 5K Moonshine Run. The Moonshine Run starts at 9:00 a.m. (registration begins at 8:00 a.m.) and will wind its way through downtown Crandon and end near the Kentuck Day festival grounds on the courthouse square. The registration (paid by July 21) is \$10 for youth (under 18), \$20 for adults, and \$50 for a family of four. Registration after that will be \$15 for youth, \$25 for adults, and \$60 for a family of four. All proceeds will benefit the local youth sports groups. It's a great way to kick-off a full day of family fun.

The 10th annual Kentuck Klassic Car Show will take place on the beautiful grounds of the Weber-Hill Funeral Home from 9:00 a.m. till 3:00 p.m. An entry fee of \$10.00 can be paid upon registration, taking place from 8:00 till 11:00 a.m., at the show grounds. Show Chair Winda Collins encourages everyone to register early as the first 100 participants receive a 'goody bag', including tshirts and dash plaques. First, second and third place trophies will be awarded in each class. Food and refreshments will be available on the grounds and DJ Rusty will be playing tunes throughout the day. Whether your vehicle is show ready or a work-in-progress, plan to attend and show pride in your ride at the Kentuck Klassic Car Show.





John began working at Borgwardt Funeral Home in Wauwatosa as an apprentice and funeral director. Later, he joined the family business. Suminski Funeral Home, as a third generation funeral director. He and Colette lived in South Milwaukee and operated the Suminski Funeral Home for a number of years. In addition, John used his experience and education to teach in the mortuary science program at Milwaukee Area Technical College (M.A.T.C.) from 1972 through 1975.

In 1976, John and Colette moved "up north" to own and operate funeral homes in Wabeno and Crandon, Wisconsin. The northern woods became the backdrop of a lovely setting in which to raise a family. They were blessed with four children-Theresa, Matthew, Jean Marie and Mary—who learned life's lessons not only from what their father said, but more importantly, from the life he lived. John truly "walked the talk."

As a parent, John was strict but loving and involved in the lives of his children. He provided direction and made sure they were exposed to life's opportunities. For example, family vacations were fun for the kids but also educational. John was right there for them, helping develop their talents, stimulating their passions, encouraging responsibility and establishing budgets. Leaving the "Three Rs" to classroom teachers, John taught life lessons on the "Four Fs": Family, Faith, Finances and

The family's faith was tested when Jean Marie was diagnosed with cancer. They journeyed with her in her courageous battle, and in her death, they clung to each other and to the promises of God.

Alongside his professional life, John was actively involved in the community. He taught religious education at his church, served on parish councils, sang in the church choir, and was a member of the Lions Club, Knights of Columbus, and Human Concerns. Being part of a family business over several generations. John's vocation and volunteer activities wove him into the fabric of community life and earned the respect of many.

John and Colette retired from funeral service in

2009, after nearly 40 years of compassionate care for the community. They returned to Waterford, and John welcomed the surroundings of lake and land. His backyard garden became the "apple of his eye," yielding such success that he often donated extra produce to area food pantries. He enjoyed the solitude that Lake Metonga, a lone fishing pole and breathtaking sunsets offered him. Mole Lake disturbance leads to two arrests

On 7-13-2013 at approximately 9:34 pm, Forest County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a report of stabbing in Mole Lake, Wisconsin. Deputies made contact with a male subject who appeared to have superficial wounds. As a result of the investigation Deputies learned there was an altercation between the male subject, 17 year old Bradley McGeshick and a 17 year old female subject Pagelyn Ducat-Cornell. Mr. McGeshick was taken into custody and is being charged with Disorderly Conduct, Substantial Battery, Obstructing Law Enforcement and for a Probation Violation.

The following day, Forest County Sheriff's Deputies received information that a female subject was at a local hospital seeking medical treatment. Deputies responded hospital and took 17 year old Pagelyn Ducat-Cornell into custody as result of the investigation. 17 year old Pagelyn Ducat-Cornell has been charged with endangering safety by use of a dangerous weapon, 2nd degree reckless endangering safety, battery and disorderly conduct.

Deputies do not believe this incident was gang related. This is an on-going investigation and no further information will be released at this time.



Free blood pressure checks

High blood pressure cannot be cured, but it can be controlled in most cases. The treatment for high blood pressure must be tailored to the specific needs of the individual, as guided by their doctor. Detecting it is the first step.

- Make sure your family, friends and neighbors are drinking enough water.

Stay informed

- Check your local news for extreme heat warnings and safety tips.
- Keep your friends, family and neighbors aware of weather and heat safety information.

Additionally, the Health Department encourages all residents to learn the signs and first aid response for heat-related illness. Warning signs and symptoms vary but may include:

Heat Exhaustion Symptoms

- Heavy sweating
- Weakness
- Skin cold, pale, and clammy
- Weak pulse
- Fainting and vomiting

Heat Stroke Symptoms

- High body temperature (above 103°F)*
- Hot, red, dry or moist skin Rapid and strong pulse
- Possible unconsciousness

What You Should Do

- Move to a cooler location.
- Lie down and loosen your clothing.
- Apply cool, wet cloths to as much of your body as possible

If you have vomited and it continues, seek medical attention immediately. What You Should Do

Call 911 immediately - this is a medical emergency.

Move the person to a cooler environment.

Reduce the person's body temperature with cool cloths or even a bath.

Amanda is putting these documents into the Past Perfect Museum Collections computer program purchased by the library and museum, so they may be made available to people doing research of genealogy






