Crandon International Off-Road Raceway extreme 4x4 course

On a recent trip to the Crandon International Off-Road Raceway, Cliff Flannery interrupted his work on the extreme 4x4 course for a tour. While the course is not quite completed, it will be in the days ahead.

Flannery said that the track has everything that is needed to cater to the wants of both 4x4 drivers and ATV fans, with roads and trails intersecting the woodlands and the obstacle courses and mud areas to test the ability of the drivers and their machines.

In addition, the campground is already there as are the toilets and showers. He said that ATV riders are welcome to use the campground and the facilities right now.

There will be a competition on the course on August 8-10, called Super Challenge Off-Road Race Weekend. Watch for details in later issues.

The CIORA course is roughly on 80 acres with more ground being added. The obstacles look challenging, and should give wheelers a good time conquering the course.

Special meeting of the Forest County Board on ORV Park closed to public

On Tuesday evening, May 27, a full meeting of the Forest County Board met to discuss the proposed ORV park. It was a special meeting called for that purpose. Unlike the last special meeting, where a majority of the board voted not to go into closed session, the board voted unanimously to hear the scoping results that WORVPI has touted recently.

The board did have a discussion on whether or not to listen to details of the project in private or in front of the public, with some members of the board expressing that they thought only the part of the presentation that dealt with land purchase and land prices qualified for a closed session. However, the corporate counsel, Paul Payant, assured the board that it was legal for the entire presentation to be heard behind closed doors.

While there were objections from many of the citizens in attendance, the board voted to meet privately with the people representing WORVPI.

John Schnorr told those attending that if they watched the news on channel 12, they would hear some of the information that would be presented.

According to legal advice, any information heard by the board members cannot be discussed with their constituency except that information presented on channel 12 news or on Green Bay's Fox News. So if you have questions for your county supervisor, don't be surprised when you are told that they cannot discuss some of the information.

To learn something about Forest County's proposed park, it is advisable to check out the website's for channel 12 and other regional media outlets that were given that information at a media event at the Forest County Chamber offices on Tuesday.

On the WSAU website, the location was listed as east of Argonne, off County G, utilizing the old 250 landing area where many of us delivered pulpwood to Consolidated Papers. WORVPI wants Forest County to purchase the eventual 10,000-acre park over several years and phases. The land is currently owned by Plum Creek and Crandon Timber. To begin the project, the county is asked to acquire 2,000 acres. About 150 acres would be developed into a park and a campground. The rest of the land purchase would provide roads for 4x4 traffic and would be managed for timber production.

According to the WSAU website, the price could be near the \$13 million dollar mark. WORVPI thinks that about half that amount could be from DNR stewardship grants and another \$2 million from no-interest state loans. The remaining \$4.4 million would come from interest-bearing loans from the Bureau of Public Land Commissioners.

The project has been controversial here in Forest County. While the public was told that taxpayer dollars would not be used, the information available appears to be to the contrary. The approval of this project is certainly not close to happening immediately, promoters are insistent that they need a park to make Forest County thrive economically. Others disagree and would like to see more light industry brought into the county. There is also a likelihood that a referendum will decide the issue with the citizens of the county determining whether or not they want to assume any debt for the project.

Petition for recall of Mayor Rob Jaeger circulating

There is a petition being circulated to recall Crandon Mayor Rob Jaeger. The petition was started on May 21st and those circulating the petition have 60 days to collect enough signatures to have a recall election for the post of mayor.

Currently, there has been no formal announcement as to who would oppose Jaeger in a recall election.

Rails are being pulled on the old "Whiskey Northern"

A bashful worker left his sledge hammer and fled the lens of the camera in the picture at left. He is starting to knock apart the rails on the last rail line in Crandon. Canadian National will be removing the rail and abandoning the line.

This railroad was originally the Wisconsin Northern, and was built by sheer will power and guts by investors from Forest County down the line to Neenah. The first segment was put in from Crandon to just west of Argonne, starting in 1906.

The C&NW served the community, but dissension caused by high freight rates and poor passenger service brought the second line to town. Passengers would leave Crandon from the depot, now at Pioneer Plaza and serving as a gas station. They would disembark by the Samz farm, now the Kevilus farm. Using the Samz parlor for a waiting room, they would board the east-west Soo Line when it arrived.

The railroad finally reached Neenah in 1921, and was promptly bought by the Soo Line and later became part of the Wisconsin Central line, before being bought by Canadian National.

The rail line gained the nickname Whiskey Northern because in the moonshine days, much of the cargo carried by the line was the sugar and grain used by local moonshiners.

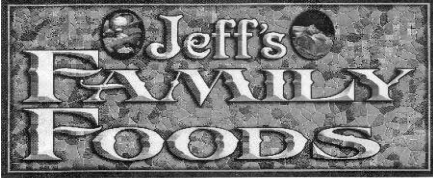

Forest County Holds Oldest Document of Wisconsin Deer Hunting History

Amanda Flannery, Local History Clerk of the Crandon Public Library, recently had a visit from Mike Kukowski and his wife from Hager City, Wisconsin. They generously donated copies of the oldest known deer hunting licenses in Wisconsin, all originally issued in Forest County!

Michael Kukowski also provided scanned copies of the hunting licenses dated 1897, 1898, 1900 to the Wisconsin DNR headquarters in Madison. The documents were so rare, DNR attorneys recommended against owing the original copies. The DNR has the framed replicas in their central office.

In 1897, the state of Wisconsin required its first deer hunting license. The license cost state residents \$1.00 and nonresident hunters \$30.00 and the law stated that hunting without a license would incur a fine of \$50 to \$200; illegal transportation of deer would cost \$100 to \$500; and false swearing of having a license cost \$500 to \$1,000. Possession of skins in the red or spotted coat was unlawful. Licenses were sold only in "counties frequented by deer" which were the northern counties. 12,000 licenses were issued the first year.

The existing deer hunting license given out the first year, 1897, was issued to George Ogomoso of Armstrong Creek. George Og(k)mas aka Ogimass, Ogemah, Ogmass, Ok maus, Ogemos, was a Chippewa, who purchased land under the Indian Homestead Act in Forest County, located west of Carter, off of Highway C and east of King Lake (source: Mike Alloway). After researching this time period, local history clerk Amanda Flannery also believes it is possible that the man's name was actually George Amose, who resided in Flambeau in 1920 and was buried there as Chief George Amour Amose in 1929. It is likely that George was illiterate because he did not fill out the license himself or sign his name he only left an "X" as his mark. It is possible that George was a chief because the license describes him as having "lost two front upper teeth and two teeth were filled with gold". He must have held some standing if he was able to afford gold filled teeth. The investigation into the identity of the only known recipient of the first deer hunting license is ongoing and if you have any information please contact Amanda Flannery at the Crandon Public Library at 478-3784 or email her at localhistory@crandonpl.org

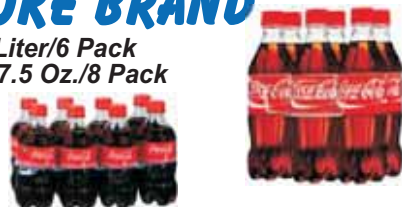

Animal Resource Fund News

 A long, cold, snowy, difficult Winter behind us, and we can now concentrate on making the money to take us in to another season. Summer is certainly the best time for fund raisers in our part of the world.

Our Annual Rummage/Antique Sale is scheduled for Saturday, June 7th.

We will again hold this sale at the Nashville Town Hall, four miles South of Crandon on Hwy 55. We'll be opening the doors at 8:00 A.M. We have accumulated a lot of really nice things for this sale - everything from furniture to jewelry to antiques to beautiful glassware, and lots of home décor. AND everything in between!

I am still set up nearly every Wednesday at the Nashville Town Hall Flea Market, which has proved to be a steady income for us. Our Vande Walls candy bars are still for sale at Campbell's Auto Supply in Crandon.

We found ourselves giving out more pet food this past year than ever before, probably because of the weather when a lot of people were feeding cats that were out on their own. We normally put over 18,000 pounds of dog and cat food in a year at the NEW-CAP food pantry. Additionally, this year we gave out many, many large bags of cat food to those we knew to be feeding the homeless.

We have been working with The Fix Is In, advertising the shot clinics they have held, by putting up posters for them in all parts of Forest County. For a while, they were getting good responses at those clinics. They held them later in the day, right after they closed the scheduled surgeries, so people working would be able to get their pets in. The last time I checked with the the head of T.F.I.I., she said the turnout was so minimal that it really was not worth the time allotted.

We were waiting to see if it would be worthwhile for us to hold a shot clinic, there having been so many clinics held in the area recently.

I have had maybe five people ask about it. If we knew that cost was the reason for the low attendance at the clinics, we would do it, because we're trying to reach the animals whose families are unable financially to provide this disease prevention for them. We only asked for a \$5.00 donation, which covered both the rabies & distemper vaccinations. We were able to financially provide this by working with all volunteers, including the veterinarian. We deemed it a community service- not a fund raiser, and that donation barely covered the cost of the vaccines and necessary supplies.

We have still been taking in foster pets when we have a foster home available, and when they have nowhere else to go, or they are in a condition that requires special needs care, which would be difficult to provide in a shelter. We just adopted out such a dog that had been nearly starved to death. He came to us weighing about 70#, and weighed in at 115# (which is what he should have weighed) when we placed him in a forever home. I admit, I cooked a lot of hamburger and chicken for him, in addition to really good pet food, but that's what brings them back to health faster. Dave handed out lots of hot dogs, sausage sticks, etc., which helped in teaching him manners. While it is very difficult to let them go after they sort of burrow into your heart, you do it willingly when you know you've found the right place for them - not just providing necessary daily care, but become a beloved family member.

Our next event to raise more working revenue will be working at the Brush Run in June. Thankfully, we have a full slate of volunteers lined up to help.

We are a small organization, but the dedication is present to saving as many of God's creatures as we possibly can. Our motto reflects this dedication - we're saving "One at a time, one of a kind".

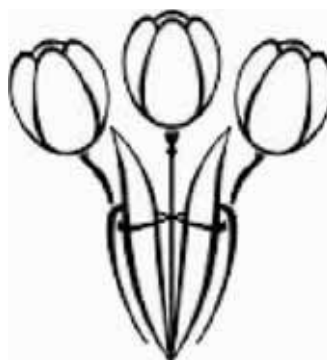

Handy Pet Tricks

Save your carpet from scratches: Your cat has a perfectly good scratching post, but she ignores it and tears up your living-room rug instead. The possible reason: she may be a "horizontal scratcher", preferring to drag her claws across a flat surface rather than up and down. The fix: Try giving her an old carpet car mat to scratch. (Spritz with catnip spray to entice her if necessary.) Car mats are super durable and have a tight pile that will satisfy her needs - without sacrificing your decor!

The surefire way to decode Fluffy's mood: Cats are private creatures, so it can be hard to figure out what they're thinking. The secret: look into your kitty's eyes. If she's surprised, excited or scared, her pupils will be dilated. If she's feeling tense or aggressive, her pupils will be constricted. When you're faced with an unexpected situation, this trick can help you decide how to deal with her.

De-tangle fur and struggle: tackling a matted-up coat can be a pain for you and your pal. To the rescue: cornstarch. Simply sprinkle the pantry staple over the problem areas, then use your fingers to gently divide the clumps, starting at the ends of the hair and working inward. The soft, slippery cornstarch will coat the stands, making them easier to pull apart. Once you've divided the big tangles into smaller knots, use a wide-toothed plastic comb to finish the job.

The switch that keeps a litter box smelling fresh: for a simple way to reduce odor from your cat's box, replace your slotted scoop with a ladle. Litter scoops with holes or slots are intended to remove solid waste, but they leave behind the main cause or odor: decomposing urine. By using this kitchen tool to scoop out all soiled litter, you'll help prevent unpleasant smells from settling in. (The ladle will remove more litter than a standard scoop, so top off the box with fresh litter if necessary.)

Easy-clean dog bed: Whew! Your pup's stinky bedcover makes you wish you could change his linens as often as you change your own. For a simple alternative, sew a zipper across the opening of an old pillowcase, then stuff it with worn towels or blankets. the lightweight pillowcase will be easier to launder than a regular dog bed - just empty the case and toss it in the wash.

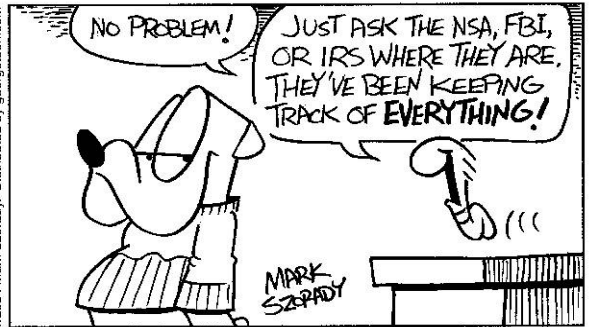
