A look at the proposed timber land purchase for ORV park

In the course of this seemingly never-ending debate over the county's purchase of lands for an ORV park, the possible first land purchase was identified, and as most of those following the debate predicted, it was on County G east of Argonne and in the towns of Caswell and Ross. These were lands formerly owned and managed by Consolidated Papers for years and eventually owned by Plum Creek. The lands have been extensively cut.

According to the park promoters, the first use of this proposed buy by the county is for timber for county forests, but as long as the county buys it for timber production, it can also be used by off-roaders as a place to recreate with their 4x4's and ATV's.

Our timber buying program has been quite active in Forest County, with County Forester Dave Ziolkowski successful in adding forest lands that will give a timber sale and dollar return to the county in a short period of time. These photos are random shots in the forest land that was selected by WORVPI for inclusion in the county timber program. As can be seen above, the pine plantations have been extremely thinned, adding many more years until the next cut. In the photos below you will see more of the same.



Aspen is relatively fast growing, and a good estimate of age on the emerging stand above is about ten years. In about 35 to 45 years, Forest County should see some return on this timber stand, around the year 2059.



This stand of young pine plantation stands directly north of the old 250 landing and is part of the proposed purchase. It should be ready for the first thinning in 25 to 30 years.

Crandon City Council has tie vote on recall election date

At a Crandon City Council meeting last Monday evening, a vote was needed by the council to set the date for the election date for the recall of Crandon Mayor Rob Jaeger.

The proper amount of signatures were collected, turned into the city clerk, who sent the petition to the state Government Accountability Board (GAB). After looking at the reasons listed for the recall, the GAB certified the recall. It was up to the city council to vote to hold the election on July 29.

City Attorney Lindsay Erickson clearly explained that it was a "must" vote. Should they vote not to do it, then the state would step in and set the election date. Erickson said that if they voted no to the election, they would be in violation of state statute.

Councilman Stamper made a motion to hold the special recall election on July 29, and Councilman Ison seconded the motion. The vote went as follows: Stamper-yes; Ison-yes; Gryczkowski-yes; Daley-yes; Berg-no; Otto-no; Houle-no; and Asher-no.

Since the meeting, the question of "what's next" has been uttered numerous times. In fact, the GAB hasn't had this happen before, but assuredly, there will be an election date set, if not by the council, then by the GAB or Department of Justice. By the time you read this, it may have already happened.

In another aside to this issue, Councilman Berg spent a sleepless night thinking about the situation. He thinks he voted wrong and would like to reconvene the council for another vote on the subject and legalize the election date. There is a letter to the editor in this issue from Mr. Berg with more of his thoughts on the subject.

The Crandon International Off-road Raceway will be hosting a competition on this course in August, and in the meantime, the U.P. group will be giving advice on how to improve the facility, as well as using the campground and the other amenities in place at the CIORA track.

The New Cap Food Pantry serves an average of 230 families per month.

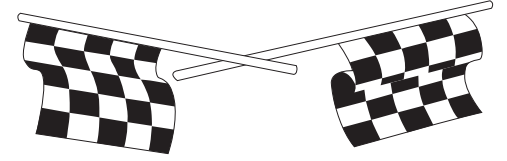

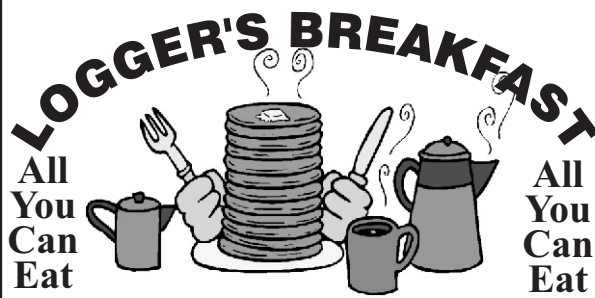

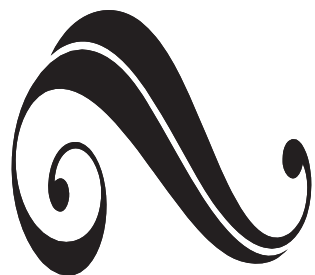

4. I fee we must immediately reconvene, with our council president, Bucky Daily, conducting the meeting.

Hello Mike

The continued account in the Pioneer Express of the proposed Off-Road Park in Forest County continues to my attract interest. I have worked in local economic development, albeit not in Wisconsin but internationally – mostly Latin America, for the past 20 years. Since I am not a resident of Forest County I should not, and cannot get involved in local personalities and perceived or direct local interests. However, as a close neighbor in Lakewood who frequently visits Forest County with my wife and young son, I want to share my opinion.

Certainly given the continuing general economic malaise in the USA – remember that US the Gross Domestic Product at an annual rate for the January to March 2014 period was negative 1.0% – so, to be considered competent and relevant, local government officials and boards have to be open to innovative ideas and need to continue to seek out initiatives to promote and attract economic development for the benefit of the community as a whole; including the businesses, families and individuals residing in the county. In Forest County this is even more important given the US Forest Service's continued policy focus on conservation at the expense of a focus on promoting healthy forests and earning revenue from the forest products of the Chequamegon-Nicolet Forest. The geographic expanse of the National Forest includes a large part of Forest, Florence and the northern portion of Oconto Counties and significantly reduces the property tax base, and as a result, the school board budget of the county school districts.

It is clear that the increasing growth in ATV and off-road vehicle usage has helped to sustain a number of small rural communities in northern Wisconsin over the past five years. While I don't have data to cite the increase in ATV and off-road 4x4 tourism to local economies, I am confident that it is a significant input to local economies and an important conduit to foster broader economic development. This being said, each economic development project which bases its financial viability on the contribution of Forest County tax payer's funding, needs to be analyzed on its own merits.

From my work over the past 20 years the key factors to analyze regarding the Forest County Off-Road Park before any authoritative or government body makes a decision, are:

- (i) technical feasibility – since we are in 'get er'done northern Wisconsin' and the road building and landscaping nature of the ground works required are well understood, this aspect should be relatively straightforward with the preparation and presentation of appropriate maps, diagrams and surveys of the locations and works;
- (ii) financial and institutional feasibility – in terms of overall cost of the project, who will be responsible to manage the initiation, completion and hand-over of the project and who will be responsible for the sustainable management of the operation over time;
- (iii) economic feasibility expressed in terms of a rigorously calculated cost to benefit ratio of the operation over a 5 year, 10 year and 20 year period;
- (iv) given the extensive use of natural land resources, an independent assessment of the environmental impact of the project on the soils, waterways and habitats affected and what mitigation and enhancement measures are included in the physical works of the project;
- (v) analysis of the current ownership of the land to be acquired and the process required for acquiring the land rights and interests of the land needed for the project; and
- (vi) at minimum, presentation and execution of a broad community participation program in the planning and decision process followed by an eventual monitoring of the implementation of the project.

I believe that the residents of Forest County, once information from the analysis mentioned above is made available and disseminated in a publicly accessible and satisfactory manner, will be more informed, more involved and more able to make an informed decision regarding the Off-Road Park.

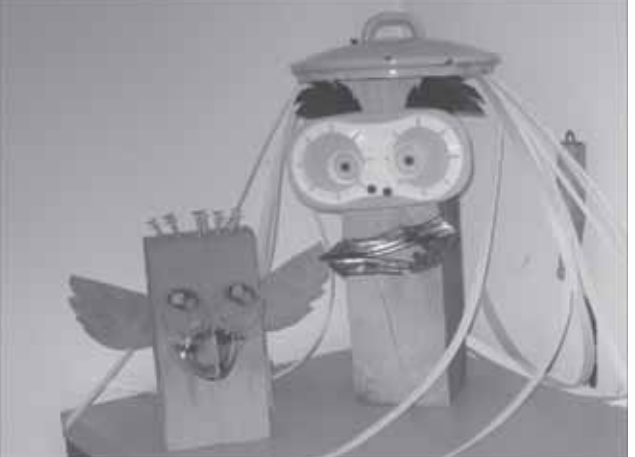

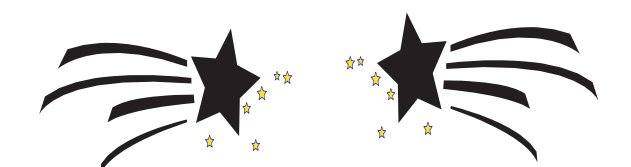



Get Ready for Summer Produce

Use summertime's plentiful vegetables and fruit as inspiration to add more color to your plate. Here's how:

Go Green: Include green vegetables daily for their stellar nutrient content. Stir-fry leafy greens - kale, spinach, arugula, collards, Swiss chard - in garlic and olive oil, or use them for salads.

Throw in more colors. Expand your taste buds with these fruits and vegetables:

- Apricots - When fresh, these relatives to plums give a delicious tart-sweet bite.

- Heirloom tomatoes - Succulent and juicy, these colorful red, green and yellow gems pair well with feta cheese and oregano. And they're actually a fruit.

- Jicama - Peel the brown skin, slice and eat alongside celery and cucumber with hummus.

- Peppers - For a fast rainbow, toss together vitamin C-rich green, red, yellow and orange peppers with olive oil, lime and cilantro. Look for purple peppers too.

- Berries - Farmers markets have unique in-season berries to try. Look for black currants, bilberries, Cape gooseberries and mulberries in addition to traditional blueberries and strawberries.

Produce Pick, Fruit or Vegetable?

Botanically speaking, a fruit develops from a flower and is the section of the plant that contains seeds. For example, tomatoes, peppers, peapods and cucumbers are fruits because they contain seeds, but are considered vegetable by popular culinary standards. The other edible plant parts are considered vegetables - stems, leaves and roots. One thing's for sure: We should eat plenty of both.

Fresh produce adds vibrancy, texture and flavor to your meals - plus lots of fiber and few calories.

Spring turkey harvest sees increase despite harsh winter

MADISON - Despite a long and severe winter, Wisconsin turkey hunters registered a total of 41,815 birds during the 2014 spring turkey hunting season. This is a 10.7 percent increase from the 2013 spring season.

"I think many hunters were pleasantly surprised by the number of birds they were seeing in the field, given the prolonged winter weather," said Scott Walter, upland wildlife ecologist for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. "It certainly appears that impacts were localized, with winter flocks inhabiting areas without access to food likely seeing the greatest impacts."

Zone 1 produced the highest overall turkey harvest at 12,188 birds, followed by zones 3 and 2, where hunters registered 10,519 and 10,363 turkeys respectively. Success rates were up in zones 1-5 and down only slightly in zones 6 and 7, where winter weather likely had some impact on overall turkey numbers. In 2014, the statewide success rate was 19.9 percent, compared to 17.9 in 2013.

"Decent weather for hunting throughout much of the season certainly allowed hunters to hit the woods hard this spring and likely contributed to the increase in harvest," said Krista McGinley, DNR assistant upland wildlife ecologist. "The fact that we saw an increase also paints a picture of a turkey population that's still in good shape."

The National Wild Turkey Federation has identified a large portion of the heavily wooded northern region as a focus area. NWTF will concentrate funding and management efforts to address habitat-limiting factors within these focus areas.

"In the northern forest we need to provide foods that can sustain turkeys through harsh winters and brood habitat to increase productivity so that flocks can quickly recover from severe winters", said Rick Horton, NWTF conservation field supervisor.

The number of permits issued for this year's hunt decreased slightly (by less than 0.5 percent), from 211,307 to 210,496. This decline in part reflects a department decision to reduce over-the-counter permit availability by 25 percent in zones 4 and 5 and eliminate leftover permits entirely in zones 6 and 7.

"I think the modest permit reduction was a nice compromise that allowed us to respond to hunter concerns," said Walter.

2014 fall season

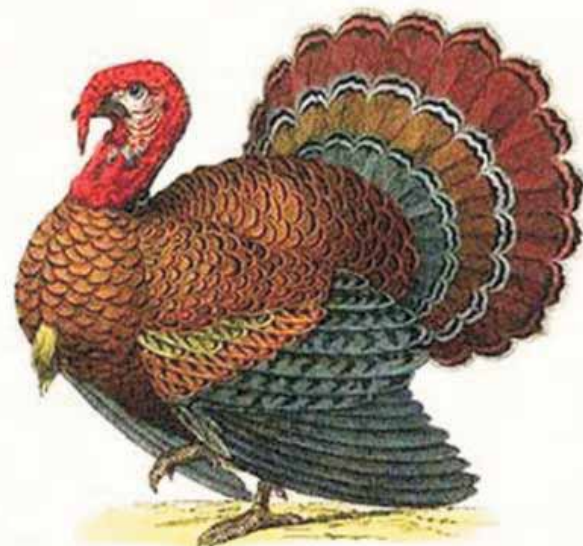
The fall turkey season will require many hunters to employ a different hunting strategy compared to the spring season. In the fall, hunters generally try to ambush turkeys moving between roosting and feeding sites or break up flocks and try to call in a bird as the flock reassembles.

The number of birds available for hunters to pursue this fall will depend to some extent on weather conditions experienced over the next month.

"Thus far, we've had a fairly wet spring," said Walter. "Warm, dry weather over the next month or so will help to ensure that a good crop of young turkeys is produced."

The fall 2014 wild turkey season will run from Sept. 13 to Nov. 20, with an extended season in Turkey Management Zones 1 through 5, from Dec. 1 to Dec. 31. The deadline for applying for a fall permit through the lottery process is Aug. 1. Applications cost \$3 and can be purchased through the Online Licensing Center, at license sales locations or by calling toll-free 1-877-WI LICENSE (1-877-945-4263).

The 2014 Fall Turkey and 2015 Spring Turkey regulations are included in the 2014 Wisconsin Small Game Hunting Regulations pamphlet and will be available soon on the hunting regulations page of the DNR website. Clean Boats Clean Waters and DNR to educate boaters in annual "Landing Blitz"

MADISON - Clean Boats Clean Waters volunteers and Department of Natural Resources staff will be at boat launches throughout the state during the July 4 weekend helping boaters inspect their boats and learn the necessary steps to slow the spread of aquatic invasive species. The sixth annual "Landing Blitz" aims to educate and reward boaters for taking steps in preventing the spread of invasives such as zebra mussels and Eurasian water-milfoil.

"The Landing Blitz is always a great event for both boaters and our Clean Boats Clean Waters volunteers," says Bob Wakeman, aquatic invasive species coordinator. "We're happy to see it inspired Michigan to start their own Landing Blitz, which can only strengthen our joint efforts to stop the spread of invasive species. We would also like to thank all the volunteers over the years who have helped make this campaign successful"

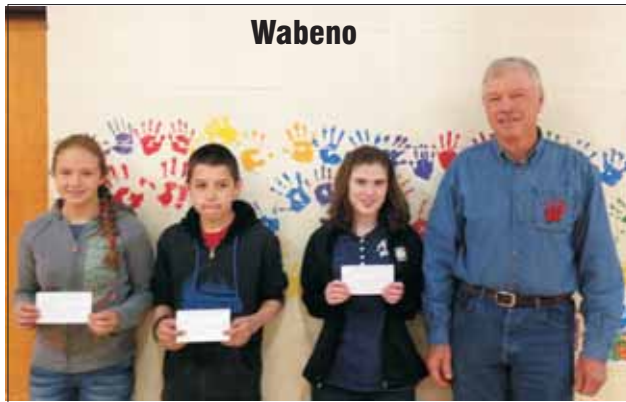
DNR anticipates another banner year that will hopefully encourage other states to blitz their lakes as well. The Landing Blitz uses the busiest weekend of the boating season, running from July 3 to 6, to educate boaters on steps they can take to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species and highlights the role of the Clean Boats Clean Waters program in those efforts.

Boaters spotted already practicing the important prevention steps of "Inspect your boat, remove plants and animals, drain water from live wells and buckets and never move live fish" might be rewarded with a free "Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers" towels.

The Landing Blitz has grown steadily throughout its brief history. For example, ninety lakes participated in 2011. By 2013, the total grew to 290 lakes in 54 counties involving 167 participating groups such as lake associations, local and county governments, tribal entities and non-profit groups.

Clean Boats Clean Waters is a partnership between DNR, the University of Wisconsin Extension Lakes program in Stevens Point.

A familiar site to anyone who travels County O is this timber that has been clearcut and replanted with red pine. Again, it will be 30 to 40 years before any substantial timber is available.



Just down the road from the scene above is a corner and a yellow gate. Behind the hill and the gate this open panorama hits the eye. This area has also been planted in pine and is part of the same clearcut pictured above.

If a hayfield is left untouched, and most of us have seen this often, aspen eventually will start to fill the void, and the scattering of young aspen will spread and eventually give rise to a mature aspen forest with an understory of trees like maple, ash, basswood and other species. This is one of the great attributes about the place we live in. But, if you are interested in logging timber and getting a return to the county treasury, it isn't advised that the county buy hayfields and/or heavily-cut timberlands and expect anything but the debt from the purchase for decades to come.

The County Board is strongly urged to check out this land purchase for themselves before deciding to purchase a very long-term investment "for timber."

2014 wolf season quota set at 156 by Wisconsin Natural Resources Board

MADISON - The Natural Resources Board today approved the 2014 Wisconsin wolf season quota of 156 as proposed by the Department of Natural Resources Wolf Advisory Committee.

The quota was set with the intention of continuing to reduce the state's wolf population in accordance with the goals identified in the wolf management plan.

The DNR Wolf Advisory Committee is comprised of DNR staff, the Chippewa tribes, partner natural resource agencies and stakeholders representing the agriculture industry, Wisconsin Conservation Congress, sportsman groups and organizations with an interest in wolf management.

The upcoming season's quota of 156 is a decrease from 2013's quota of 275. State hunters and trappers harvested 257 wolves in 2013.

The state's current late-winter 2014 minimum count is 660-689 wolves. This count represents a decline of 18% from the 2013 winter count of 809-834.

Analysis of available data, review of published scientific literature and use of population modeling tools suggests the quota, if reached, will result in reduction in the 2014 late winter count but at a rate less than observed last year.

The quota will be distributed across the Wisconsin's six hunting and trapping zones. The harvestable quota established for each zone concentrates hunting pressure more in areas with higher potential for agricultural conflicts and less where potential for conflict is lower.

Though the quota has been decided, the amount of wolves harvestable by state trappers and hunters may be adjusted dependent on tribal harvest declarations.

The department will maintain the 10-to-1 license-to-quota ratio from the 2013 season. One half of available permits will be issued randomly among all permit applications and the second half will be issued through a cumulative preference point drawing. Successful applicants will be notified via mail. Applicants who are not successful in the drawing will be awarded a preference point toward future drawings.

Those interested in obtaining a license or a preference point for the 2014 season must apply by Aug. 1. The permit application fee is \$10 and applications may be purchased from [authorized license agents](#), over the Internet through the [DNR Online Licensing Center](#) or by phone at 1-877-945-4236 toll free.

The season is set to begin Oct. 15 and will run in each zone until the zone is closed or the last day of February, whichever occurs first. The department has the authority to close hunting zones when quotas are met or if deemed biologically necessary.



MOSQUITO LIFE SPAN

Female mosquitoes lay eggs about every third day during their lifespan, usually in clumps of 100 to 300 eggs. The eggs are deposited either as "rafts" floating on the surface of standing water or on the ground in areas that regularly flood. Mosquitoes can lay eggs in as little as one inch of water. The eggs, generally white when laid, cannot hatch unless they are in water, usually for two to three days.

Larvae
 When the eggs hatch, the larvae emerge. They are called "wigglers" because that's how they swim. Most of the time, they hang from the surface of the water, breathing through tubes. The wigglers feed on organic matter in the water, shed their skins four times over about a week, and develop into pupae. Larvae are the easiest to kill, using oils that block their breathing or bacteria that poison them.

Pupae
 The pupae are called "tumblers" for the way they fall into the deepest part of the water when threatened by predators. They are shaped like commas, partially encased in cocoons, with the head at one end and tiny flippers at the other. The pupae do not feed while developing, but breathe through tubes like the larvae. It takes about four days for the the adult mosquito to emerge.

Adults
 The newly emerged adults climb out of the water to rest and wait for their bodies to dry out. The males will take a day or two to fully develop their reproductive organs, then seek out a female, by the sound of her wingbeats, for mating. They'll live about three to five days after that, feeding on fruit and plant nectar. The females mate once, but continue laying eggs after every blood meal. Under the best conditions, they can live up to a month or two.
