The European Marsh Thistle, or European Swamp Thistle, can be easily mistaken for another invasive species, the Bull Thistle, due to its similar rosettes.



European Marsh Thistle spreads south

Northern Wisconsin and the U.P. of Michigan are used to new invasives spreading from the south, but there is one invasive doing the exact opposite. European Marsh Thistle, or European Swamp Thistle, entered the country around 1900 and the U.P. of Michigan in 1934. Since then, the plant has been spreading south, although it is still considered rare, and prohibited, in much of Wisconsin.

Like other thistles, Marsh Thistle starts out as a basal rosette of long, spiny, deeply lobed leaves. These rosettes can be easy to mistake with another invasive, Bull Thistle. Marsh Thistle typically sends up a flower stalk the second year (although it can take more than one year to flower). Plants can be very tall, up to 6 feet in height, with spiny winged stems, alternate leaves and distinct branching near the top of the plant. Marsh Thistle also has unique clusters of several (12+) thornless pink/purple flowers. After flowering, plants die but a host of fluffy seeds remain, up to 2,000 per plant. These seeds are easily carried away by wind, water, animals and people.

European Marsh Thistle prefers moist, acidic soils and sunny areas, but also grows in partial shade and even forest openings. In Europe this plant is not deterred by cold and grows nearly to the arctic circle. In invaded areas, Marsh Thistle is most visible in roadside ditches, but seeds can spread just as easily to undisturbed wetlands and wet forests. There it has the potential to create dense colonies, replace native plants, compete with tree seedlings in cut areas and decrease biodiversity.

Large patches of Marsh Thistle are easiest to control with herbicide in fall or early summer (before flowering). Scattered plants can be manually removed by cutting them off with a sharp shovel below the surface of the soil (plants cut above the soil may resprout/reflower). Whichever method you use, any flower heads must be cut off and bagged before treatment. Bags can be set in the sun to compost before disposal in the landfill. Fair entry forms due August 29

It's that time of year again when many of you are busy planning what to enter in the Forest County Fair and others are busy planning booths or possibly activities that your organization will take part in. The Forest County Fair Citizen's Committee is very excited and hopes they will see representation from individuals and organizations throughout the county. The citizen's committee has worked hard to plan a great celebration of the county, communities and fall harvest for both children and adults.

This year's fair is being held September 4, 5, 6 and 7, with September 4 being entry day. Buildings will open at 4:30 p.m. Thursday afternoon so you can begin placing your exhibits. They are asking all Open Class exhibitors to send their entry forms to Brenda Flannery at 206 W. Madison Street, Crandon, WI 54520 by Friday, August 29 so the Blue Ribbon Manager will have time to get your tags printed and ready for you when you arrive on Thursday evening.

Late entries will be accepted but if you wait past September 2, you may have to hand write your entry tags on Thursday evening when you bring your exhibits in. Also, if something is entered incorrectly, it may be disqualified by the judges as fair staff won't have the opportunity to catch the error last minute.

When filling out your entry sheets, feel free to put down what you plan on exhibiting as it is easier to remove an entry than to add it later. They will accept entries on the evening of the fair but they will not have a computer on site so you will be responsible for hand writing your own entry tags and turning in a correct copy of the entry listing so it can be put in the computer prior to judges' sheets being ran. Again, if there are errors in the department, class or lot that you list, the item you entered may be disqualified so it is imperative that you ask questions if you are unsure of where to enter an item. They encourage you to submit your entries early so exhibits are entered correctly and also because of the extra workload late entries create for fair

If anyone has any question while filing out their forms, they can contact Brenda Flannery at 478-8802 and she will help you through the process. Also, if any towns or organizations are interested in setting up a booth, contact Brenda as soon as possible so they can make arrangements for you to do so.

Featuring high-impact rock racing, the blazing speeds of dirt drags and the side-by-side intensity of off-road short course competition, the 400-acre Crandon complex was filled with the sounds of horsepower, flying dirt and enthusiastic fans. The Crandon management team led by President Cliff Flannery was particularly pleased with the turnout, as the track hosted a three day crowd estimated at just over 2,000 fans -- an increase of more than three times over 2013's turnout.

"The staff and management here at Crandon are extremely grateful to our spectators, racers, sponsors and sanctioning bodies that worked together to make our second Super Challenge weekend such a success," Flannery explained. "There was something here for everybody, and we feel very optimistic that we set a firm foothold for a new Crandon tradition."

The legendary race track has also hosted the iconic Brush Run 101 races since 1970 and the short course Labor Day World Championships beginning in 1985.

In contrast to the more traditional short-course off-road race format Crandon is famous for (including the TORC series World Championships held Labor Day weekend), the Super Challenge event brought together three separate racing organizations and over 150 competitors from around the nation and Canada for one action-packed gathering of the off-road faithful -- all contained within the 400 acre grounds located just outside of downtown Crandon. Crandon's new "Playground 4x4" area passed its first competition test with flying colors as both W.E.ROCK rock racers and UTVs took to the challenging course as part of a longer 3.5-mile course. The first annual Branik Cup provided an additional \$5000 to the driver's purse thanks to sponsor Branik Motorsports. The lion's share of winnings went to Pro4400 class winner Jason Shipman and UTV race winner Brian Strane.

"The reception we had at Crandon from fans, our racers and the track's staff has lived up to everything we had hoped for and more," explained W.E. ROCK President Rich Klein. "This is just the start of something special at Crandon. You can count on us coming back bigger and better next year."

The best short course drivers in the Midwest Off-Road Racers (MORR/TORC Series Sportsman Truck and Buggy Divisions) also brought fans non-stop excitement over two days of racing at Crandon with 11 MORR race categories including Short Course Kart category, several truck-based groups including Super Truck, Super Stock Trucks and Stock Trucks (for production-based pick-ups) as well as the Super Buggy class.

The "Super Challenge" weekend also served as a final tune-up for Crandon's huge upcoming World Championship races taking place with the TORC series professional classes over Labor Day weekend August 29-21

Additional weekend entertainment came in the form of intense side-by-side off-road drag racing and a Friday night mud bog competition in the track's new Playground 4x4 area.

Proposed inland trout regulations aim to increase opportunities for anglers

MADISON - The public will have an opportunity to provide input on proposals to simplify existing inland trout fishing regulations and provide more quality trout fishing opportunities at 10 public meetings that will be held throughout the state beginning Sept. 3.

Beyond simplifying the rules for anglers, communities that serve as home to Wisconsin's 13,000 miles of trout streams will likely see additional economic benefits as a result of proposed extensions to the spring and fall seasons and elimination of the current five-day closure says Joanna Griffin, trout coordinator for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

"Wisconsin's trout fishing regulations and seasons were last reviewed in 2003 and much has changed, including improved fish populations," says Scot Stewart, DNR district fish supervisor. "Guided by public input, we've developed draft rules that support the continued health of our trout waters while making the fishing experience easier for anglers."

DNR has sought public input throughout the rule review process and the next step is to bring the proposed rules to the public for final comment. Since 2011, DNR staff members have hosted 31 public meetings, developed three angler surveys, organized trout task force stakeholder meetings and developed advisory questions for spring hearings hosted by the Wisconsin Conservation Congress.

The public feedback has resulted in a proposal that reduces the number of special regulations from more than 40 to 12. The proposal also creates uniformity on streams within small geographic areas.

The new system uses color-coding resembling a stoplight to guide anglers. Under the proposed rules:

--Green means go fish - with no length limit, a bag limit of five fish and no bait restrictions;

--Yellow means caution - with an 8 inch length limit, a bag limit of three fish and no bait restrictions; and

--Red means special regulations are in place. Anglers are advised to stop and understand the regulations before fishing.

Changes also are proposed in the season dates for inland trout fishing. The current early catch and release season runs from March 1 up to five days before the regular fishing opener. The proposal would extend the early catch and release season to Jan. 1 and would run right to the regular fishing opener with no five-day closure period.

Ten public meetings are scheduled for September to gather additional citizen comments. The process will conclude with spring hearings and a vote in conjunction with a meeting of the Wisconsin Conservation Congress.



Natural Resources Board approves 2014 migratory bird hunting seasons

Waterfowl hunting season structure for 2014, recommended by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, was approved today by The Natural Resources Board.

In 2014, Wisconsin will be divided into three duck hunting zones, each with 60-day seasons. There will be split seasons in the Southern and Mississippi River duck and goose zones.

Waterfowl breeding populations in 2014 are mostly good to excellent in Wisconsin and North America, according to recent surveys by state, federal and Canadian wildlife officials. A recent United States Fish and Wildlife Service survey showed the highest North American duck population estimate in the survey's 59-year history.

"With strong total duck populations and good water conditions, Wisconsin waterfowl hunters can expect a good season," said DNR waterfowl ecologist Kent Van Horn

Changes as a result of NRB approval include an expansion of the Horicon Zone Canada goose season harvest limit (from six birds to 12) and a reduction in the daily bag limit for canvasbacks (from two birds to one).

"I appreciate all the folks who took the time to get involved, attend public meetings and participate in the regulatory process," said Van Horn. "As always, we heard from hunters with a range of desires and practices. The final season dates represent a compromise among diverse hunter preferences. Waterfowl hunting is a blend of traditions, friendships and memorable days on the marsh.

The 2014 youth waterfowl hunt will be held Sept. 20-21.

The daily bag limit statewide will be six ducks, including no more than: four mallards, of which only one may be a hen; one black duck; one canvasback; three wood ducks; two pintails; three scaup; and two redheads.

For species of duck not listed, such as teal and ring-necks, the combined bag total with all other species may not exceed six ducks. It is important to note that possession limits have been increased to three times the daily bag limit.

"Overall, the status of duck and goose populations in 2014 is promising," said Van Horn. "Water conditions across major North American duck breeding areas were mostly good to excellent, and continental duck numbers remain above or near the long-term averages. This is good news and means another liberal 60-day duck season will be offered in 2014."

In 2014, duck hunting season structure is as follows:

Northern Zone - Sept. 27 to Nov. 25;

Southern Zone - Oct. 4 to Oct 12 and Oct 18. to Dec 7; and Mississippi River Zone - Sept. 27 to Oct. 5 and Oct. 18 to Dec 7.

Opening day shooting hours for duck season will begin at 9 a.m.

In 2014, season structure for Canada goose hunting is as follows:

Early September Canada goose season - Sept. 1-15, with a daily bag limit of five geese;

Northern Exterior Zone - Sept. 16 to Dec 16, with a daily bag limit of two geese; Southern Exterior Zone - Sept. 16 to Oct. 12 and Oct. 18 to

Dec. 21, with a daily bag limit of two geese; Mississippi River Subzone - Sept. 27 to Oct. 5 and Oct. 18 to

Jan. 8, with a daily bag limit of two geese; Horicon Zone period 1 - Sept. 16 to Nov. 2, with a daily bag limit of two geese and total season harvest limit of 12 geese;

and
Horicon Zone period 2 - Nov. 3 to Dec. 16, with a daily bag

Horicon Zone period 2 - Nov. 3 to Dec. 16, with a daily bag limit of two geese and total season harvest limit of 12 geese.

The department will offer an early teal-only duck hunting season in 2014 that will begin in September. Hunters will not be required to purchase any additional licenses or permits, other than those required for hunting ducks in the regular waterfowl season.

The framework established by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service requires an early teal season to be scheduled in September prior to Wisconsin's regular duck season. Only teal species may be harvested during this period.

While the early teal season is offered statewide, there are some state owned properties that have special limitations in regards to waterfowl hunting. For example, Mead Wildlife Area does not allow waterfowl hunting prior to the regular season, and Lake Mills Wildlife Area (Zeloski Marsh) has shooting hour restrictions. Please check to see if the areas you hunt have any additional requirements or limitations.

The department will be required to monitor and report hunter performance throughout the experimental three-year period - this will help determine the success of an early teal season.

In addition, 20 days will be added to the end of the current 70-day dove hunting season.

To help hunters understand new seasons and regulations in 2014, the department will host an online waterfowl season chat Aug. 27 at noon. Wildlife and regulations experts will be on hand to answer any questions related to 2014 waterfowl hunting seasons. For more information, visit dnr.wi.gov and search keyword "chat."





Silver Alert program goes in effect Friday, August 1st

Wisconsin will join 30 other states in having a Silver Alert Program for older adults with cognitive impairments like Alzheimer's and dementia who go missing. It enables police throughout the state to use the existing Wisconsin Crime Alert Network to promptly send statewide notices when a senior citizen goes missing. The bill was signed into law by Governor Scott Walker in April of this year.

Silver Alert is a notification program similar to an Amber Alert that help locate missing children, it is designed to help people who are 60 years of age or older and have Alzheimer's or other permanent cognitive impairment.

"On behalf of our advocates, families and those we serve, I am so pleased that Wisconsin will have a Silver Alert Program. This critical program puts in place a comprehensive system to ensure that when someone with Alzheimer's or a related dementia becomes lost while wandering they are reconnected both quickly and safely with their loved ones," said Kim Kinner, Alzheimer's Association Greater Wisconsin Chapter executive director.

The law honors Leo and Claire Baeb, an elderly couple who became lost last year during a drive from their home in Townsend to Green Bay for a doctor's appointment. The bill was signed into law by Governor Walker at St. Mary's Hospital where Baeb had been a

About 30 states, including Florida, Indiana and Connecticut, have Silver Alert-type systems in place.

More than 110,000 people in Wisconsin are living with Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia and six in 10 people with dementia or Alzheimer's disease will wander — repeatedly. They may not remember their name or address and can become disoriented, even in places that once were familiar.

"Anyone with memory problems who is able to walk is at risk", according to Kinner. "This program is a major step in helping protect those who are at risk for wandering."





For example, children who are 4 to 6 years old are due for boosters of four vaccines: DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis), chickenpox, MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) and polio. Older children, like preteens and teens, need Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis), MenACWY (meningococcal conjugate vaccine and HPV (human papillomavirus) vaccines when they are 11 to 12. In addition, yearly flu vaccines are recommended for all children six months and older.

Northwoods Dental Project receives Wisconsin Seal-A-Smile Grant Award

Northwoods Dental Project has been awarded \$17,640 from the Wisconsin Seal-A-Smile (SAS) program. Wisconsin SAS is a statewide sealant program that offers grants to local school-based dental sealant programs, SAS is funded by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) through State General Purpose Revenue and a generous grant from the Delta Dental of Wisconsin Foundation. The SAS program is managed collaboratively by Children's Health Alliance of Wisconsin and DHS Oral Health Program. Statewide the program provides care to children in 58 of Wisconsin's 72 counties.

Wisconsin SAS programs provide oral screenings, dental sealants, oral health education and fluoride varnish application in the schools using evidence-based practices. Wisconsin SAS targets schools where at least 35 percent of the enrolled children participate in the free and reduced meal program. Any students in need of additional dental care are referred to local dental offices. Northwoods Dental Project will provide 600 students with preventive dental services to help keep them healthy and free of dental pain during the upcoming school year.

Dental decay (cavities) is the most common chronic childhood disease. Despite advances in prevention, some children still suffer unnecessarily with dental pain and infection. Often the dental conditions prevent children from attending school. Dental sealants are an evidence-based strategy for preventing cavities. Many uninsured and low-income children lack access to regular preventive dental care, including sealants. Northwoods Dental Project serves schools in Florence, Forest, Oneida and Vilas Counties during the 2014-15 school year.

Northwoods Dental Project uses grant funding to deliver the school-based services. Local organizations are also important as they make financial contributions, donate supplies, and volunteer time to support the program. Northwoods Dental Project has provided a school-based dental sealant program since 2005. 

If you're a boater, swimmer or anyone who spends time by the water, remember -- drowning is quiet. The victim rarely splashes and screams for help.

Instead, former U.S. Coast Guard rescue swimmer Mario Vittone advises everyone to look for these signs:

- Head is low in the water; mouth at water level.
- · Head is tilted back with mouth open.
- · Eyes are closed or appear glassy, empty and unable to focus.
 - Hair is over forehead or eyes.
 - Not using legs -- remains upright in the water.
 - Hyperventilating or gasping.
- Trying to swim in a particular direction but not making headway.
 - Appears to be climbing an invisible ladder.

Supervise children at all times. Never leave them alone near water -- not even for a minute.

Crossbow license required for all crossbow hunters starting in 2014

MADISON - With bonus antlerless permit sales and archery and crossbow seasons just around the corner, license sales have begun to increase. Crossbow hunters are reminded that they will need to purchase a different license than in previous years.

New laws have established two kinds of deer

hunting licenses applicable to archery and crossbow seasons. A crossbow license will allow hunting deer and small game with a crossbow. An archer license will only allow hunting with what is typically considered archery gear - a bow drawn and held through the effort of the person releasing it (this excludes crossbows). Under the new law, those who wish to hunt with a crossbow must purchase a crossbow license.

"In the past, hunters age 65 or older and those with permits for hunters with disabilities could hunt with a crossbow after purchasing an archer license," said DNR wildlife regulation policy specialist Scott Loomans. "Under the new law, they will need to purchase a crossbow hunting license. We want to remind people of this change and make sure they buy the right license."

Hunters may also purchase a crossbow/archer upgrade in addition to a single crossbow or archer license. This reduced price license option will allow hunters to hunt with both a bow and crossbow, but will not include an extra set of tags. Conservation patron licenses include an archer and crossbow license.

"People do ask us why there are separate license types," said DNR lands division administrator Kurt Thiede. "It was a compromise reached between people who were interested in allowing more crossbow use and those who wanted to move forward a bit more slowly with the new opportunity. The department will be sure to evaluate the crossbow season, talk to hunters, and make sure folks are satisfied with how things are going."

Crossbow licenses are currently on sale through dnr.wi.gov, keyword "license," or at participating license sales locations throughout Wisconsin.

Hunters are encouraged to check out the frequently asked questions page for more information regarding rule changes. The FAQ feature provides brief responses to a wide variety of deer hunting questions, ranging from deer management unit boundaries to antlerless permits. To view the FAQ page, visit dnr.wi.gov and search keyword "deer."

Those interested in receiving e-mail updates regarding crossbow deer hunting can sign up to receive occasional e-mail reminders about season dates, regulations and other important information. Visit dnr.wi.gov and click on the e-mail icon near the bottom of the page for "subscribe for updates for DNR topics," then follow the prompts and select the "Crossbow Deer Hunting" distribution list
