



In all cases, the idea was expressed that a referendum now would kill the idea of an Off Boad Park and that much effort has went into the idea of an Off Road Park, which if created could be a boon to our County. I was told that "strange as it sounds, none of the people I represent have contacted me either pro or con on this idea".

And so, the 10 County Board Members that voted against a referendum on this issue were listed publicly last week. I'm asking, those many of you who have offered me support in my efforts to make public the issue of a County owned Off Road Vehicle Park. Hey Rocky, watch me pull a rabbit out of my Hat

Well, those of you of a certain age (I'm of that age)should remember the "Adventures of Rocky and Bullwinkle" during each show, Bullwinkle would attempt to "pull a rabbit" out of his hat.

If you don't remember, I'll clue you in, each time Bullwinkle tried, he got everything but a rabbit from the hat.

So, did you read the news last week about our County Board members, having a tied vote to consider holding a referendum this fall with the fall elections, asking us the citizens and taxpayers of Forest County whether or not we were interested in the County getting involved (with County Tax Dollars)in W.O.R.V.P.I's (Wisconsin Off Road Vehicle Park Inc.)planned 10,000 acre "Lambeau Field of Off Road Parks". (now to be owned by we the taxpayer, and run by W.O.R.V.P.I).

Boy, if you weren't present at the County Board meeting, you missed a good show! Very passionate discussion over such a simple idea as holding a referendum to let us the residents of Forest County decide, whether or not, we (the taxpayers)wanted to own an Off Road Vehicle Park, or not.

Well, here's the problem, I think every County Board Supervisor present knew that if a referendum vote was held this fall, an overwhelming majority of the people of Forest County, would vote against the idea of the County spending tax dollars to own and build such a park.

Why do you think the majority would be against W.O.R.V.P.I.'s planned park? And, why do you think that 10 of our County Board members voted against letting the people of Forest County decide? Well, I have some ideas, as to why.

First off, I want to tell you straight out, that our Tax Dollars are already paying W.O.R.V.P.I.'s bills. (a private corporation that claims tax exempt status, even if they don't have it "yet").

You might remember, that I have asked the question, "Who is paying W.O.R.V.P.I.'s bills" in previous letters to the Editor, I also asked it at Paul Millan's (our County Board Chairman, and a member of W.O.R.V.P.I.) "informational session" held at the Laona School last Winter.

Well, it turns out, We the Forest County Tax Payer are paying the majority of W.O.R.V.P.I's current bills, but we will have to get into that at another time, It's a very deep and complicated subject (and yes, I will address that issue in a future letter).

The letter I want to talk about right now, is a letter written by John Schnorr "President" of W.O.R.V.P.I. which was addressed to Don LeMaster the head of the Forest Counties Forestry Committee (the Committee that forwarded the recommendation of a County wide referendum to the full County Board). I was told, that all members of the County Board received John Schnorr's letter, before the tie vote on the referendum was taken. Most of the letter deals with John's request for a "MOU" (Memo of Understanding) with the County Board, that the idea of a County owned Off Road park will move forward. However, the last paragraph of the letter is very disturbing to me. I am going to quote it in its entirety.

"Lastly, it appears that the Forestry Committee will recommend that a county-wide advisory referendum be held to determine if Forest County should participate further in the creation of nearly 300 employment opportunities and \$28M in economic stimulus that the MRA Project could deliver to your county? It would seem premature and too early in the process for this. I strongly urge the Forest County Supervisors to consider the opinion of their Corporate Counsel on this matter. This could indeed strike a dangerous and unintended precedent which could lead to removal of control and the decision making process from the Board of Supervisors".

Again, this is a direct quote from John Schnorr's letter to our County Board supervisors.

As I stated at the beginning of this letter, it is my belief that every Supervisor present at the referendum vote, knew that a referendum of the people of Forest County, would overwhelmingly kill the idea of a County Owned Off Road Vehicle Park. But still, 10 County Board members voted against letting the people that elected them, have a say in whether or not Our County should be involved in a Publicly owned Off Road Vehicle Park. Why, Because John Schnorr, thinks that "This could indeed strike a dangerous and unintended precedent which could lead to removal of control and the decision making process from the Board of Supervisors"

I ask, who were our County Board Supervisors elected to serve and represent?

I did personally speak with a couple of the 10 Board members who voted against the idea of a referendum, to gain some personal knowledge of what their thoughts were on their No vote.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF LAONA

As a result of recent federal legislation (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act-AHERA), each primary and secondary school in the nation is required to complete a stringent new inspection for asbestos and to develop a plan of management for all asbestos-containing building materials. The School District of Laona has a goal to be in full compliance with this law and is following the spirit, as well as, the letter of the law. As a matter of policy, the District shall continue to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our community's youth and employees. In keeping with this legislation, all buildings (including support buildings) owned by the school district were inspected by Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) accredited inspectors and samples were analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the District prepared and the state approved a comprehensive management plan for handling asbestos safely and responsibly. Furthermore, the School District of Laona has completed its AHERA 3 year re-inspection requirement. Federal law requires a periodic walk-through (called "Surveillance") every six months. Also, the law requires all buildings to be re-inspected three years after a management plan is in effect. The Asbestos Management Plan for the School District of Laona is located in the district administrator's office in the Laona Elementary School. The plan is available for public inspection during regular business hours in the district administrator's office by appointment only, when such appointment is made with the district administrator at least one working day in advance. Any request to view the plan must be honored by the designated person within five (5) working days of the receipt of such a request. Copies of the document are available at 25 cents per page from the district office. Allow five (5) days after written request for compliance.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF LAONA STUDENT RECORDS

Student records are maintained to assist students, parents, guardians, and the school in achieving the student's educational goals. Such records are accumulated, maintained, released, transferred, and eventually destroyed by the building principal or his/her designee in accordance with state and federal law. Only those individuals or agencies specifically authorized by state and federal law shall be granted access to a student's records. The school district does forward records to other schools that have requested the records and in which the student seeks or intends to enroll, or is already enrolled, as long as the disclosure is for purposes related to the student's enrollment or transfer. An adult student or the parent/guardian of a minor student may inspect the student's records in accordance with administrative policy and established procedures and may challenge the content if he/she believes the records are inaccurate or misleading. Such a complaint would be filed with the building principal. If not satisfied with the decision, an appeal avenue is available through the Family Policy and Regulations Office of the U.S. Department of Education.

The School District of Laona today announced its policy to serve all students breakfast and lunch or milk for split-session students served under the Special Milk Program free of charge each school day. The School District of Laona is eligible to receive reimbursement for part of the cost of these meals through the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). DPI will reimburse the school at a higher rate for those students who qualify for free or reduced price meals, based on their household size and income level or due to receipt of FoodShare, FDPIR, or W-2 cash benefits.

The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility. Children from families whose annual income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free and reduced price meals, or free milk if a split-session student does not have access to the school lunch or breakfast service.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk, households must fill out the application and return it to the school (unless notified at the start of the school year that children are eligible through direct certification). Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by agency or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children in a household where one or more household members receive FoodShare, FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, list the household member and the FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number, list the names of all school children, sign the application, and return it to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk of households not receiving FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 cash benefits, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or mark the "I do not have a Social Security Number" box. Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal and free milk policy, the high school secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to: Kay Connors, School Board Clerk, 5263 Fairway Court, Laona WI 54541 or call 715-674-3200.

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the household eligible for reduced price meals or free meals if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above, and they may reapply at that

Children formally placed in foster care are also eligible for free meal benefits. Foster children may be certified as eligible without a household application. Households with foster children and non-foster children may choose to include the foster child as a household member, as well as any personal income available to the foster child, on the same application that includes their non-foster children.

The information provided by the household on the application is confidential. Public Law 103-448 limits the release of student free and reduced price school meal eligibility status to persons directly connected with the administration and enforcement of federal or state educational programs. Consent of the parent/guardian is need for other purposes such as waiver of text book fees.

Shape up your blood vessels

Your heart pumps blood through a vast network of blood vessels called the circulatory system. Arteries carry oxygen-rich blood from your heart and lungs to every cell in your body while the veins carry blood back to your heart. Capillaries, the smallest blood vessels, connect and support arteries and veins.

Over time, cholesterol and other fat deposits accumulate on artery walls, harden into plaque and narrow the arteries. Chronic high blood sugar also slowly damages blood vessels. Blocked arteries decrease the supply of blood and oxygen to your body, which can lead to high blood pressure, heart attack and stroke.

To keep blood vessels strong:

- · Kick tobacco. Because smoking injures the blood vessels, quitting is the best way to strengthen them. Within one year of quitting, your excess risk of heart disease drops 50 percent.
- · Control diabetes. Monitor you blood sugar level frequently. Heart and blood vessel problems are the main causes of sickness and death among people with
- · Check your vital signs. Blood pressure and cholesterol levels are key indicators of blood vessel
- · Add fruits and vegetables. Their nutrients, including soluble fiber, are crucial to arterial health.
- Exercise daily. Just 30 minutes of moderateintensity activity, such as walking, can produce blood flow and oxygen delivery that can significantly improve your
