


Duck & goose season to open September 27th



Hunters should look forward to seeing good numbers of waterfowl when Wisconsin's Northern and Mississippi River zone duck hunting seasons and Mississippi River Canada Goose Subzone open Sept. 27, according to state wildlife officials.

"Although a few areas in the southern half of Wisconsin have started to dry out, areas in northern portion of the state have received abundant rainfall, and Wisconsin waterfowlers have potential for a good hunting season," said Kent Van Horn, migratory game bird ecologist with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. "Continental breeding surveys that have been conducted for 59 years have reported record numbers of ducks this spring.

WORPVI and Forestry sub committee discuss proposed park in Forest County

The MRA Park Sub Committee on behalf of the Forest County Forestry and Recreation Committee met with Wisconsin Off Road Vehicle Park Incorporated, WORPVI, on Monday September 22. The committee consists of chairperson Don LeMaster, Paul Cleereman, Bill Chaney and Larry Sommer. Representatives for WORPVI were; John Schnorr, Melinda Otto and Jack Matuszewski.

Chairperson Don LeMaster opened the meeting with approval of the agenda and explained to the audience that they were invited to listen but that no questions or comments would be taken from the audience at this meeting.

Corporate Council Paul Payant stated that "The purpose of this meeting is to establish a background for eventually building a motorized vehicle park. The first step as I understand it would be to have the 15 year comprehension land use plan amended to identify that we want to have a motorized vehicle park. In order to apply for funding for that park through project loans and the Knowles - Nelson Stewardship grant, we would have to amend the 15 year plan. We have people from WORPVI and the forestry committee because the 15 year plan is established by the forestry committee and the grant and loan has to go through the forestry committee." Payant further stated that he could make a memorandum of understanding, but he would have to know what each group is responsible for. He then asked, "Am I correct in thinking that the first step is to amend the 15 year comprehensive land use plan?"

DNR Liason Craig Williams answered, "I don't know that this has to be the first step, it does have to be taken care of in the process, but I think in order to save work, it may make more sense to incorporate the change after we have a complete understanding of what this park is so we can work with the DNR to see if the park will be compatible with forest law."

To the People of Forest County:

The Forest County tax payer is going to fund a change to the 15 year forestry plan to placate the wishes of a off-road group called WORVPI. This group feels it is necessary to amend our 15 year forestry plan as a first step to the building of a MRA park. In order to change the forestry plan much time, money, committee meetings and public meetings must take place. Then the plan goes to the full county board for approval before sent to Wisc DNR for review.

I ask, why do all this work before understanding what the Forest County tax payer is getting into? I feel before changing Forestry Plans, signing MOU's, and wasting tax payer funds, many questions should be fielded to WORVPI, with prompt acceptable answers from the group. Much like the show on television, Shark Tank, the Forest County investor should not go into a business relationship without having their questions answered.

I question John Schnorr's statement on the WOHVA forum," Yes Forest County would be on the hook for the investment, leaving the average property taxpayer in Forest County to foot an increase equal to the cost of 1 (one) McDonald's Extra Value Meal each year! "

These are questions that myself and others think should be answered before any partner or governmental agency proceeds in a relationship with WORVPI:

A. A complete business plan including:

- 3. Financial Plan with a minimum of a 3-year, monthly, cash flow projection. Provide copies of all reports from Chuck Bryce and all business consultants used to develop the financial plan.
- 4.Cost estimate for acquisition and development including all research materials from the "Ripon College Study"
- $5.\,A\,d evelopment, operation\,and\,maintenance\,plan.$
- 6. A schedule of public informational meetings including a list of public benefits to be derived from developing a MRA park with taxpayer funds.
- B. All riparian studies-including needed DNR Water Regulation and Army Corps of Engineer Permits .
- C. Results and Reports from the Survey Monkey Company.
- D. Complete MRA Park study developed by North Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission.
- E. Complete listing of WORVPI contact information including names addresses, phone numbers and email addresses for the WORVPI president and board of directors.
- F. Maps, appraisal, costs, letters of intent to purchase, timber surveys, purchase sale agreements. Project Loan Applications, Knowles-Nelson Stewardship application and any other information on the land base intended to be purchased for the MRA park.
- G. All legislative efforts pursued by WORVPI and WHOVA to cost share or fund the development of a MRA park.
- H. All WORVPI meeting minutes regarding the MRA park.
- I. WORVPI's financial status to contribute to developing or maintain the MRA park. All plans, public or private, that WORVPI proposed to pay the cost associated with the development of the MRA park.
- J. All contracts with vendors, engineers, consultants, developers, etc. used in the past that may be used in the future to assist in developing the MRA park.

Don LeMaster asked, "How are we going to know, the DNR will never tell us unless we fill out an application."

Williams answered, "If we have a complete plan of what the park will be, we can bring that to the DNR, work with the DNR while that is being developed to address all of the concerns that may arise. That way you can do a complete and accurate change to the 15 year plan."

Dave Ziolkowski stated that we need hard numbers from WORPVI such as how many campsites would be on the site, how many miles of roads, how many vehicles would be used on the land and how will it affect the land base.

Payant asked Dave Ziolkowski if they needed all of that information to amend the 15 year plan. Lemaster added that he wanted a list of questions from the DNR of what information they needed to review the project.

Craig Williams explained, "You can amend the plan with relatively general information, but a more recent conversation with the DNR in Madison stated that a plan with more specific information would help the department evaluate that amendment to the 15 year plan."

The question was raised, "Can we apply for the grants first?" Ziolkowski explained that, grants and funds applications would need three separate approvals from the county board. There would need to be a public hearing and a show of support from the public and county. Without this, the applications will go no where and they will not be approved."

The discussion went on about what the first step should be. Should we see if we should amend the 15 year plan or should we see if the park will fit into the forest law. The committee concluded that the sub committee will bring the question of amending the 15 year land use plan. They will need approval from the full forestry committee. The Forestry Committee members are Don LeMaster, Bill Chaney, Don Dehart, Bill Connors, Dave Campbell, Paul Cleereman and Larry Sommer. If the approval is granted, the work will proceed. There will need to be a two week public hearing and comment period before it can go to the full county board for approval

The next meeting will be on Monday, October 7 at 4:00 p.m in the board room of the courthouse. The next sub committee meeting is scheduled for Monday October 27 at 5:00 p.m.



This opportunity only applies to specific locations which will be outlined when firewood cutters receive their permit, the addendum and associated map. Firewood cutters are required to have their permit and addendum with them while cutting. The firewood addendum permits will expire October 31. If current permit holders are interested in the addendum there will be no additional charge, however they do need to come into the Park Falls Forest Service office to receive the addendum.

It is anticipated that additional firewood cutting through an addendum will be available on the Great Divide District. More information will be posted to the website when available.

However, even with excellent continental breeding indications, local water levels, fall weather, and time spent scouting will be the most important factors when pursuing ducks this fall."

The duck hunt in the Northern Zone will open Saturday, Sept. 27 at 9 a.m. and will continue through Nov. 25. The Mississippi River Zone will also open Sept. 27 at 9 a.m. and will run through Oct. 5. The first portion of the Mississippi River Zone will be followed by a 12-day split and will reopen Oct. 18 and continue through Dec. 7. After opening day in each respective zone, hunting hours will begin 30 minutes before sunrise.

The Southern Zone duck season will open Oct. 4 at 9 a.m., and will run through Oct. 12. Following a brief closure, the Southern Zone will reopen Oct. 18 and run through Dec. 7.

The Mississippi River Canada Goose subzone will open Sept. 27, and will run through Oct. 5. Following the same 12-day closure as the Mississippi River Duck Zone, the Mississippi River Canada Goose Subzone will reopen Oct. 18 and run through Jan 8, 2015.

Many of the ducks harvested statewide are birds that breed in Wisconsin's wetlands, Van Horn said. The four most abundant ducks in Wisconsin's fall hunting harvest are mallards, wood ducks, green-winged teal and blue-winged teal.

The daily bag limit statewide will be six ducks, including no more than:

four mallards, of which only one may be a hen; three wood ducks;

one black duck;

two redheads:

three scaup;

The daily bag limit for mergansers is five, to include no more than two hooded mergansers. The daily bag limit for coot is 15.

two times the daily bag limit and is now three times the daily bag limit.

"As always, hunters who do the early legwork scouting for good wetland conditions and observing what areas birds are using -- will be the ones having a good hunt," Van Horn said. "Hunter survey data in Wisconsin show that duck hunters who scouted there or more times harvested an average of 14.7 ducks, while those who did not scout harvested an average of 4.8 ducks per season."

Licenses and stamps required include a Wisconsin small game license, Wisconsin waterfowl stamp, and 2014 federal migratory bird stamp. Those who wish to hunt Canada geese are required to purchase an additional zonespecific goose hunting permit.

A \$15 federal stamp can be purchased at a U.S. Post Office. Hunters may also purchase a federal stamp privilege at license vendors for an additional \$2.50 surcharge. This purchase will be noted on their license, but the stamp itself will arrive at a later point via mail.

Waterfowl and other migratory bird hunters must also register each year with the federal Harvest Information Program, which places them on a list of hunters that may receive a mailing with an option to provide a harvest summary. HIP registration is free, and can be completed at the time each hunter purchases a license. HIP registration may be completed at a later time if a hunter decides he or she may pursue migratory game birds.

State licenses and stamps, permits, and HIP registration are also available through Wisconsin's Online Licensing Center.

For information on-the-go hunters can use a mobile device to check out the official DNR hunting and fishing mobile application to gain access to useful fishing, hunting and wildlife watching information. Users are able to easily locate great places to enjoy the outdoors and view on-thespot species profiles, rules, regulations, permit and license details and sunrise and sunset times. For more information. visit dnr.wi.gov and search keywords "mobile apps."





Separating the myths and reality of jury duty in Forest County

"I consider trial by jury as the only anchor ever yet imagined by man by which a government can be held to the principles of its constitution."..-- Thomas Jefferson

Everyone has experienced it. You go to the mailbox, grab your mail and as you walk back to the house you see it. It's the letter from the County summoning you for jury duty. For some, it's considered an honor-even their patriotic duty. After all, the ability to serve your community and participate in the right to trial by jury is one of the cornerstones of the American democracy. A right guaranteed by both the state and federal constitutions.

For others though, it's seen as an inconvenience. Something to avoid at all costs, even if it means lying to the courts about why they can't serve as a juror.

According to Forest County District Attorney, Chuck Simono, not only is the responsibility of serving jury duty our civic duty, but it is something that strengthens our nation, our justice system and our community.

"I am a bit biased given the fact that I love the legal system and anything that has to do with the law," explains Simono. But as a citizen that enjoys the freedoms that we all do and to have an expectation that such freedoms will continue, I feel it's important that we as citizens need to be active where called upon to assist in making the system function the way it was designed. Because the judicial system doesn't work without the juror."

So why do some people fear becoming a juror?

Many court officials believe this is due to the misperceptions or myths that surround the duty of serving as a juror. Forest County Clerk of Court, Penny Carter, agrees.

"There are definitely a lot of 'misperceptions' surrounding jury duty that are simply untrue, explains Carter. It's funny, because a lot of the time the people spreading the myths are people that have never ever served at all." **Debunking the myths**

So exactly what are the myths of jury duty that so many people fear getting that notice in the mail?

"Some people think that just because you got a summons you will automatically serve on a trial, explains Carter. That's not true. Many potential jurors are dismissed during the pre-trial

selection process. And sometimes cases even get settled at the last second before they even go to trial."

In fact, of the approximately 750 Forest County residents who are summoned each year for jury duty, less than 150 end up having to serve as a juror on an actual trial, according to Carter.

Another one of the myths, according to Forest County District Attorney Chuck Simono, surrounds the trial length itself.

"Maybe we all have seen too many courtroom dramas in movies and on TV, but a lot of people think all trials must last for weeks and you will be away long periods of time from your work and family, explains Simono. The reality is, most jury trials last no more than a day or two, and the juror is able to go home to their family in time for dinner."

Other people think that they need to know more about the law to be a juror or that they have to have a college degree. Both, of course are perceptions about the process that are totally untrue.

Another myth, that Carter hears a lot, is that people believe they are being targeted or punished by being chosen for jury duty more than once.

So how are jurors chosen?

The reality is that Forest County residents are chosen governmental bodies. random for jury duty --from a source list using the Wisconsin licenses or identification cards who live in the area served by the circuit court. What happens next?

After being chosen, jurors become part of what is called the "jury pool."

The judge then gives the jury pool instructions and tells them when to appear. The jurors are then sworn to answer truthfully all questions about their qualifications for the case in a process called 'voir dire,' which is where the judge and attorneys ask questions of the prospective jurors to determine if they have any bias to the case, so they can ultimately find the fairest and most impartial 12-member jury. During this process, jurors may be excused for a number of reasons, including their perception after serving as a juror is something he see often.
