

Chuck Sleeter resigns as Nashville Town Chair

Not all heroes are found in the sports pages or on the battlefield. Political life in the Town of Nashville has given us a hero in its former Chairman, Chuck Sleeter. Chuck retired from his chairmanship on Oct. 1st after eighteen years of leadership during which our communities and lakes benefitted markedly and directly.

Chuck came to us as a retired police officer on disability. He built a home on Pickerel Lake and found himself drawn into the divisive Crandon Mine controversy motivated by his wanting to protect area lakes from mine waste and mismanagement. He opted to run for town chairman in 1997 and was elected. His election was contentious and witnessed a 97% voter turnout based on whether a voter was for or against the mine.

He was severely tested during his first years in office by the duplicity and self-interest in the mining issue fostered by the influence that a global corporation can bring to bear in a rural community. His election became subject to recall within a year. He not only survived, he was re-elected the following year. His sense of justice and his belief that democratic government means "the greatest good for the greatest number" won him many followers among voters and organizations interested in environmental issues. The hallmark of his leadership struggle was the passage of the Mining Moratorium law under then governor Tommy Thompson.

Wisconsin statute describes the duties of the town chairman as: to preside over town meetings, appoint committees, oversee the creation of budgets, the payment of bills, and to provide basic services. Chuck's annual salary ranged from \$4,513 to \$7,039 over the eighteen years. Every year he donated his salary back to the town, giving the town a windfall of over \$117,000 during his tenure.

Chuck was a micromanager and a doer. He was

As the day was drawing to an end, Lariat, entertained the crowd from 6:00 to 10:00.






School District of Wabeno **Area Meets Expectations** on State Report Card

This week, the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction released all of the district and school report cards. Districts and schools are evaluated on four priority areas: student achievement in reading and mathematics on statewide assessments; student growth in those assessed areas; closing gaps for reading and mathematics achievement and graduation, based on student subgroups; and postsecondary readiness which uses several measures as predictors of college and career readiness. Accountability is calculated on a scale of zero to 100.

The School District of Wabeno Area scored as follows: Student Achievement, 59.5; Student Growth, 72.0; Closing Gaps, 66.2; On-Track and Postsecondary Readiness, 84.2. There were no deductions made for Student Engagement Indicators for test participation, absenteeism rate and dropout rate. 



always looking to lower spending by finding some way lue creation that his integrity and service to the community become truly distinctive. Early in Chuck's administration, the town was among several application partners, which included area tribes, to be awarded "Enterprise Community Status" by the USDA during the Clinton Administration. There were only ten communities in the United States to receive this distinction. Competition for the award took almost a year of community research and form preparation; an effort in which Chuck and Nashville's elected Town Clerk, Joanne Sleeter, personally undertook leadership and coordination.ess expensive. He was handy and if he could fix something rather than shop for outside services, he would do it. Rather than pay an annual fee of thousands for outsiders to pick up and lodge stray dogs, Chuck became the town's dog catcher. He would insist on a credit for materials unused on any construction project. He personally performed maintenance cleaning services in the new town center building. He and his cell phone were available every day.

His personal commitment and governing style directly resulted in the town's tax levy being lowered 13 of his 18 years, unchanged for three and increased in only two. Never was there a reduction in town services to the citizenry. The total cost of the new town center facility on County Hwy. Q was \$1.2 million. It was completed under budget and without raising taxes.

Enterprise Community Status carried with it a \$2.5 million award. The application partners formed a representative Board of Directors called NiiJii to handle the distribution of money based on the projects undertaken. About \$100,000 came directly to Nashville, which was used for professional grant writing and seed money for the \$400,000 Rural Business Opportunity Grant that followed. In all, 20 grants, directly benefitting the town, were awarded during his tenure with a record of 95% successful conversion from request to award.

There were organized volunteer efforts for fund raising as well. A Human Resources Development Fund was active from 1999 to 2004 that included Ainsworth, Langlade and Nashville. This effort raised thousands per year in cash and goods and services that benefitted perhaps 50 poor and needy families in the area. A Legal Defense Fund raise low six figures in donated legal services and cash contributions during the polarizing Crandon mining issue. The corruption pervasive in the mine proposal produced a successful town lawsuit recovering over \$40,000 in legal fees from fraud and racketeering charges against one of the lawyers.

In total, about \$2 million in grant and volunteer revenue flowed beneficially into the area during Chuck's years of service, including approximately a quarter-million dollars in grants from both USDA and the Wisconsin Department of Commerce related to the construction of the new Town of Nashville Community Center.

Chuck had the ability to attract volunteers throughout his tenure. Not only for specific tasks, but many signed on year after year. Names like Jim Huss, Phil Hollmann and Les Borgwardt quickly come to mind. There were many others who are unsung heroes as well. Chuck's honesty and proclivity for doing the hard, hands-on work assured volunteers that their altruism channeled to the community.

To be sure, there was public recognition. The National Center for Small Communities bestowed the "Hometown Leadership Award" on Chuck in 1999. A
