Forestry Subcommittee meet to discuss proposed off road vehicle park

The Forestry MRA Subcommittee met with WORPVI on Monday, October 27. The agenda for the meeting was simple. First the committee was reviewed the amendments to the 15 Year Comprehensive Land Use Plan. Then, the subcommittee also planned to review the MRA studies, goals and plans.

Dave Ziolkowski started the meeting with a hand out of the amendments that needed to be changed. He had clearly marked which amendments had to deal with the MRA park. The rest of the amendments that were listed needed to be updated to be accurate with our growing county forest. Dave also stated that, "I would like to get comments and concerns from everybody, see if there are more additions or corrections to the proposed amendments, make another draft of the amendments to be presented to the Forestry Committee and then the county board. If the amendments are approved by both the Forestry Committee and the full county board, we need to do a two week public notice in the local papers and have a public hearing or informational meeting."

Craig Williams of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources stated that some of the amendments were going to raise concerns because it did not have specifics such as where it will be located, how big will it be and what is the specific purpose of the MRA park."

Dave Ziolkowski confirmed that Craig was correct that the forestry department will need to know the specifics such as the site and the size, possible fees for using the park and how many people it will accommodate at one time. The forestry committee will be able to make a better amendment to the 15 year plan if they have a better idea of WORPVI's vision of what they want the park to be.

President of WORPVI, John Schnorr, said that he was on vacation the previous week and was not able to look at the amendments. He said that he would have a meeting with the rest of WORPVI and layout a concept plan of what WORPVI's vision of the park will be. Schnorr also said that he will send a copy of plans that he has to the Forestry Committee.

The next forestry committee meeting will be on November 17 at 4 p.m. and the next forestry subcommittee meeting will be held December 9 at 5 p.m.

U.S. Forest Service seeks proposals to expand markets for wood energy and products, provide new jobs

Forest Service's Wood Innovations Program to provide roughly \$5 million to help create new products

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27, 2014 – The U.S. Forest Service today published a Federal Register Notice seeking proposals to expand wood energy and wood products markets to support sustainable forest management, especially in areas of the country with high wildfire risks.

"We must continue to find new, economically valuable ways to use wood," said U.S. Forest Service Chief Tom Tidwell. "The biggest threat to forests is conversion to non-forest use. Harvesting wood can be used to help forest managers protect forests from hazards, such as insects, disease and fire."

Proposals will be evaluated through the agency's Wood Innovations program, which will provide roughly \$5 million to help successful applicants increase or stimulate markets for wood energy and wood products in a manner which helps enhance forest sustainability while providing useful products and jobs for people.

The funding is available for a diverse range of activities such as completing the final engineering design for a renewable wood energy system or establishing statewide wood energy or wood utilization teams to demonstrating wood as a primary building material in commercial construction.

Bioenergy is the use of organic material, such as materials from forest thinning, residues, agricultural waste or urban wood waste, to generate heating, cooling and/or electricity.


Since 2005, more than 160 grants, typically for individual projects, have been awarded to small businesses, non-profits, Tribes, and State and local agencies to improve forest health while creating jobs, green energy, and healthy communities. Since 2013, 16 cooperative agreements with individual states have been awarded to establish Statewide Wood Energy Teams that promote conversion of fossil fuel systems to wood energy for heating, cooling, and electricity.

Today's announcement also supports objectives identified in the White House Council on Environmental Quality's recently released Climate and Natural Resources Priority Agenda.

Past screenings have identified that between 15 and 20% of students require additional testing by a professional optometrist.

Parents and/or guardians will be notified by letter whether their child passed the screening. Parents are urged to do follow-up testing and the Lions are available to provide additional help if necessary.





On Friday October 24, 2014 history was made. Tanner Moris (sophomore) qualified at the Wisconsin Sectional Cross Country (C.C.) running meet in Athens, WI to advance to the State meet in Wisconsin Rapids on November 1st. Tanner is the first runner in Crandon High School history to advance to the State level.

It was 1998 when the first C.C. team was started at Crandon. His time for the le (5 km) race was 17:47. Tanner's hope is that this moment will inspire other student athletes to break through their limiting beliefs, to believe in themselves and chase their dreams. If Tanner did this so can they. Being a winner at anything is a choice, but is possible for anyone. Being successful at anything will always require your best efforts in self-discipline, persistence, hard work and a positive attitude. This story is about the power of a dream and the importance of painting a vision of what you want to accomplish.

Tanner's dream of qualifying for the state Cross Country (C.C.) meet started last fall at the State C.C. meet when he attended as a spectator with Coach Jessica Keao. That experience was so impactful that he came back a different person. The first thing he said when he returned home was. "I really want to compete at the state C.C. meet next year." 

Q&A: Fall Harvest Safeguards

Submitted by Kate Schultz

There's no doubt that vegetables and fruit are good for you, but how do you store and prepare them safely? Here are some answers to common questions.

Q: Is there any harm in eating overripe vegetables or fruit?

A: If it's ripe, but not bruised, it's OK to eat - to a point. If you see mold on the surface, toss it. Also, bacteria can build up quickly on damaged or bruised vegetables and fruits. Remove the bruised section before eating.

Q: Do you have to wash fruit and vegetables?

A: Yes, wash them even if you plan on peeling them. Wash your hands before and after handling produce. Exception: You don't need to clean bagged produce (mixed green or fresh spinach) labeled prewashed or triple washed.

Q: What should I wash them with?

A: Plain water is fine. Use a clean produce brush to scrub firm produce, such as melons and cucumbers.

Q: How can I avoid cross-contamination?

A: Separate fruits and vegetables that will be eaten raw from other foods such as raw meat, poultry or seafood to avoid cross-contamination. Wash cutting boards, dishes, utensils and countertops with soap and hot water after preparing raw meat, poultry and seafood.

Q: How do I store fruits and vegetables?

A: Store perishable fruits and vegetables at temperatures of 40°F or below. Note: Refrigerate all produce that is purchased pre-cut or peeled.

Forest County working together on joint Ebola planning

Forest County— Public health, Tribal health partners, Clinics, EMS, Emergency Management, in collaboration with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS), are preparing in the event the Ebola virus is diagnosed here. "Preparing and collaborating on the federal, state, and local level will ensure that the public and health care providers receive prompt public health information, "said Jill Krueger, Forest County Health Department Director.

"People are naturally concerned about the Ebola virus, especially with the cases recently diagnosed in the United States," said Krueger. "While we work together to prepare, it's also important to reassure the public that Ebola can only be transmitted through contact with the body fluids of people who are sick with the virus, or who have died from it. Ebola cannot be transmitted through the air."

Health care workers and first responders are keenly aware that they must be especially vigilant with following rigorous safety practices in the event they are ever called on to assist or care for an Ebola patient.

"Our health care workers take preparedness seriously," said Krueger. "We are following current safety practices for putting on and taking off personal protective equipment. We will continue to review and update our plans for transporting and isolating a patient with Ebola, and we continue to practice the best methods of sanitation, including the disposal of waste."


"We want to stress that there are no reported cases of Ebola in Wisconsin, and the risk of contracting it remains extremely low in Wisconsin," said Karen McKeown, State Health Officer. "DHS remains vigilant in its monitoring of the Ebola virus, and will continue to provide our partners and the public with the most current information and guidance concerning this disease."
