



#### Nicolet College installs advanced telepresence distance learning technology



Students will begin using Nicolet's next-generation telepresence technology at the start of Spring Semester. Classrooms with this equipment are in Minocqua, Tomahawk, and on the Nicolet Campus just south of Rhinelander.

More people might find getting a college education easier and less expensive thanks to new, nextgeneration distance learning technology Nicolet College recently installed in Rhinelander, Minocqua, and Tomahawk.

"The experience is amazing," Chuck Komp, Dean of Business and Instructional Effectiveness, said of the technology known as telepresence. "You feel like you are sitting in the same room with people who are actually many miles away. This will definitely cut down on travel time for many students and make it much more convenient for them to earn a college education."

The high-tech classroom on the Rhinelander campus is outfitted with five displays, including three 65inch, high-definition screens that sit side-by-side. In front of the displays is a specially-designed table for students and instructor. Each site has an advanced camera system along with theater-quality audio equipment.

People appear life-size on the displays and participants view each other eye to eye. To complete the effect, the rooms at each location are also nearly identical down to the paint color.

The system is one of only a handful like it in the state. The U.S. Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration funded this project by providing a \$415,000 grant to Nicolet.

"After using it for a while it's easy to forget you're talking to someone who is actually a long distance away," Komp said. "You actually get the illusion that they are in the

Numerous general education classes that are required for other college credentials will also be offered over the new technology. These classes will include Oral and Interpersonal Communication, English Composition I, Written Communication, Principles of Microeconomics, Introductory Reading Study, Principles of College Math, and Introduction to Literature.

"On many days, we'll be offering classes eight to 12 hours a day over telepresence," Komp said.

#### Avoid these calorie traps

If you've resolved to shed a few pounds this year, pay attention to foods that can derail your weight-loss plan. You know the ones - the innocent-looking muffin or fruity trail mix with shockingly high calorie counts.

Imagine this: You order a salad and a 16-ounce bottle of apple juice for lunch. It sounds like a vegetable and fruit packed meal with approximately 200 calories.

Look closer: The salad has 60 calories, but the 4 tablespoons of salad dressing add 200 more. The juice is 242 calories, bringing your lunch total to 502 calories. You could have easily enjoyed a filling, nutritious meal of chicken, brown rice and salad for the same amount of calories.

Even healthy fats need to be eaten in moderation. Foods such as olive or flax oil contain heartfriendly mono- and polyunsaturated fats. Since they have approximately 120 calories per tablespoon, eat no more than 2 to 3 tablespoons each day.

Sugary foods such as regular soft drinks, candy and pastries are easy to over-consume because they taste good, but the calories add up quickly. Always watch your portion sizes of the highest-calorie foods and drinks.

Small changes can help: When eating salad, for example, have the standard serving size of dressing (2 tablespoons). Use less oil and more vinegar, or dip vegetables in dressing instead of pouring it over the salad.

Other traps: Granola, cheese, smoothies and nuts can be healthy, but keep portions small to save calories. Always fill plates with vegetables, which are nature's lowestcalorie foods.



#### Community Blood Center Feeling Impact from Flu-Related Illnesses

The Community Blood Center encourages eligible volunteer donors to give the gift of life this holiday season by donating blood, platelets or plasma. Busy holiday schedules and seasonal illnesses, like the flu, can often mean fewer donors scheduling and keeping appointments. But for patients with cancer or other illnesses or injuries requiring blood transfusions, the need for blood is constant.

As donors struggle with cold or flu symptoms that can hang on for weeks, The Community Blood Center's collections are down, and that means more healthy volunteers are needed to donate immediately to help ensure adequate blood products are on the shelves for the 18 area hospitals served.

"We feel the impact flu season has on blood collections this time of year. The Community Blood Center is a non-profit organization that has worked with generous blood donors to provide a steady, reliable blood supply for hospital patients for over 50 years. Volunteers who donate blood support the local blood supply at 18 hospitals in Wisconsin and Michigan. Partnerships are created with community groups, schools, churches, and businesses to hold over 125 blood drives each month. Donor centers are located in Appleton, Little Chute, Oshkosh, and Woodruff. 


