





USDA Reminds Producers of upcoming Livestock Disaster Assistance Deadline

(WAUSAU, WI) Jan. 22, 2015 — Brad Pfaff, State Director of USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Wisconsin reminds livestock producers that the Jan. 30, 2015, deadline to request assistance for losses suffered from Oct. 1, 2011 through Dec. 31, 2014, is fast approaching.

Applications for the Livestock Indemnity Program and the Livestock Forage Disaster Program, restored by the 2014 Farm Bill resumed in April 2014, after having expired on Sept. 30, 2011. To date, more than 556,000 applications have been approved nationwide to assist farmers and ranchers in recovering from nearly three years of natural disasters.

The Livestock Indemnity Program provides financial assistance to eligible producers for livestock deaths. Losses can be caused by adverse weather, extreme temperatures, disease, or wildfires, or due to attacks by animals reintroduced into the wild by the federal government or protected by federal law, including wolves and avian predators.

The Livestock Forage Disaster Program provides compensation to livestock producers that have suffered grazing losses due to drought or fire. Qualifying droughts are based on U.S. Drought Monitor severity ratings, and qualifying fires are those occurring on rangeland managed by a federal agency and normally permitted for grazing.

To expedite applications, all producers who experienced losses are encouraged to collect records documenting their losses. Supporting documents may include livestock birth records, purchase and transportation receipts, photos and ownership records showing the number and type of livestock lost, documents listing the gallons of water transported to livestock during drought, information related to grazing land, grazing leases or federal grazing permits, and more.

Local FSA county offices can provide additional information on the types of records producers will need to apply for assistance. Producers are encouraged to contact their county office ahead of time to schedule an appointment. Producers who already have appointments don't need to take any additional action to meet the deadline. FSA offices can be found at offices.usda.gov. 



Planning Healthy Meals for One or Two

Sometimes, it can be hard when cooking a meal for just one or two people. Here is a checklist to help you get the most value for your time and money if you're cooking for two, or just you.

Shopping Tips

- Should you buy in bulk? It may be half the cost but it's just as expensive if you toss half! Smaller portions help avoid eating the same food over and over. Repackage meat in freezer bags for smaller servings and freeze.
- Consider individually packaged servings of items if you frequently have leftovers. Purchase string cheese, wrapped cheese slices, single containers of tuna, soup and fruit and individual cartons of yogurt.
- Buy smaller number of servings from the meat counter. Enjoy one pork chop. Purchase a single salmon filet. Explore a different cut of beef.
- Buy fruit at varying stages of ripeness. Buy some fruit to eat immediately and some to ripen for later. Apricots, bananas, cantaloupe, kiwi, nectarines, peaches, pears and plums continue to ripen after purchase. Refrigerate fruit after it has ripened for longer storage.
- •Buy frozen vegetables in bags. Pour what you need. Use in 8 months (or per package). Toss into soups, casseroles and salads. Thaw corn and peas in a strainer under cool running water for salads. Frozen vegetables have taste and nutrition, are comparable to fresh and often are lower in salt than canned vegetables.
- Can-do canned foods. They are nutrition comparable to fresh/frozen and no refrigerator space is needed. They are helpful in an emergency but have a manual can opener handy. Remove from the can when storing unused portions. Use by the date recommended on the can for best safety/quality. After the can is opened, use within three to four days. Low sodium versions are available.

Restaurant Tips

• Benefit from large restaurant portions. It's two meals for the price of one. Divide the meal in half BEFORE eating. Refrigerate perishables in shallow containers within two hours of service.

General Tips

• Cook once, eat twice. Plan two meals from the same entree. Separate out extra food BEFORE serving. Eat extras in three to four days or freeze.





Commercial drivers get help with online driver license guide

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) offers a new online service designed for the unique needs of commercial drivers. The Driver License Guide now enables drivers, even fleet owners, to check their eligibility and status and ensure they have the proper endorsements. The step-by-step process also creates a personalized checklist of the documents needed to obtain a new card at a DMV customer service center.

The self-serve Driver License Guide is at the DMV website (www.wisconsindmv.gov). Customers can use the mobile-friendly site 24/7 to conveniently get information specific to their Wisconsin driver license record. They can also browse anonymously to explore and learn about obtaining a driver license. Both regular drivers and commercial users can access their information here. This is the first of its kind online application.

"Paperwork for commercial drivers can get extensive. All their driving-related information is now accessible to them anytime from anywhere," says Alison Lebwohl, DMV Driver Qualification chief. 

Health insurance open enrollment

90 percent of Wisconsin consumers who signed up for coverage through the Health Insurance Marketplace are getting financial assistance to lower monthly premiums

- --90 percent selected a plan with financial assistance

"We're pleased that in Wisconsin, 177,157 people are signed up for Marketplace coverage, and 90 percent are able to lower their costs even further by getting tax credits, making a difference in the lives of so many families," HHS Secretary Sylvia M. Public Listening Session held at Crandon Public Library

Representative Jeff Mursau, Representative Rob Swearingen and Senator Tom Tiffany held a public listening session sponsored by the Crandon Library on Monday, January 26. The purpose of a public listening session is for the public to bring their concerns to the legislators that represent them.

Representative Swearingen opened the session by giving an overview about what is taking place in Madison. Swearingen explained that the budget for the coming year is set to be presented by Governor Walker on February 3rd. "All eyes are on the budget. Anyone that has read a newspaper in the last six weeks has learned that we are 700 million dollars in the hole in the transportation section. We think that the Governor will be addressing that. We are not sure, the Governor keeps the budget pretty close to the vest. My hope is that having been on the rural schools task force committee is that we have some money in the budget to help give relief to the rural schools." Swearingen further explained, "The budget process will be from about February 3rd to the end of June. After the introduction of the budget it will go to joint finances, they will have several hearings around the state from now until April or May. The budget is then sent back to the full legislature for the vote and it is expected to be passed before July 1st."

The floor was then opened to the public, Lee Lamers started the comments. Lamers first asked about a proposed oil pipeline that would start in Superior and run Southwest and out of the state. Representative Swearingen said that he had heard about the pipeline, but not much and that it probably does not affect the districts in our area. Mr. Lamers also asked about education. He wanted to know how the state would support the University of Wisconsin School System. There was a report that more funding was being cut. People get paid less in the state of Wisconsin and our children are leaving for the higher pay. The response was that the last budget had thirty three percent go towards education. We will have to wait to see how much money is set for education before we can see what we can do to help the education field. Mr. Asher asked about rural schools and the grading system and funding. He asked for no grades, same assessment for all Wisconsin schools and no sanctions. If a school is struggling and it loses aid, how is it going to

move forward. Mr. Asher asked for helping the schools.

The response was that the assembly and the senate versions are very different. The senate will take it up this week. There will probably be multiple revisions before anything gets to the governor.

The Good Neighbor Authority was the next concern. The Good Neighbor Authority was passed in the Farm Bill last year. The Forest Service has said that the people are not there to get timber sales out, The Good Neighbor Authority would allow the state and the county to take action and get the timber harvested. Senator Tiffany said that he will work with the U.S. Representatives to make sure that it is enacted properly and that this is something that needs to happen. The schools will keep the twenty five percent off of the sales under the Good Neighbor Authority.





U.s. Forest Service issues final policy for over-snow vehicles on National Forests, Grasslands

RHINELANDER, Wis. (Jan. 28, 2015) - The U.S. Forest Service has released the final policy for managing snowmobile and other "over-snow" vehicle use for all national forests and grasslands in the United States including the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest.

The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) manages, along with our partners, more than 9,000 miles of roads, nearly 300 miles of developed all-terrain vehicle trails and more than 800 miles of groomed snowmobile trails.

"We are part of a well-developed snowmobile trail system in northern Wisconsin and we work very closely with local clubs and partners to keep the trails groomed and maintained," said Paul Strong, forest supervisor for the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. "The state, counties and local snowmobile clubs help us provide a safe and enjoyable snowmobile experience through the national forest which also supports local economies and our towns."

The CNNF Land and Resource Management Plan already allows snowmobiles on routes and trails posted open and designated for their use. In addition, snowmobiles may travel on normally unplowed, open roads when snow accumulations exceed four inches.

The policy, published in the Federal Register today, requires that roads, trails and areas where oversnow vehicle use can occur be designated by local Forest Service managers.

The final policy will preserve existing decisions governing snowmobile use that were made under previous authorities with public involvement; allow decisions for over-snow vehicle use to be made independently or in conjunction with decisions for other types of motor vehicle use; and local units will create over-snow vehicle use maps separate from use maps for other kinds of motor vehicles.

With the finalization of the Over-Snow Vehicle Rule, the CNNF will be working with our partners to create an over-snow vehicle use map for the Forest of existing snowmobile trails. When complete, this map will be available to visitors both online and at the local Forest Service offices.

The U.S. Forest Service is an agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, a mission of sustaining the health, diversity and productivity of the nation's forests and grasslands to meet the needs of present and future generations. The Forest Service's Eastern Region includes twenty states in the Midwest and East, stretching from Maine, to Maryland, to Missouri, to Minnesota. There are 17 national forests and one national tallgrass prairie in the Eastern Region. For more information, visit.

The U.S. Forest Service manages 193 million acres of public land, provides assistance to state and private landowners, and maintains the largest forestry research organization in the world. Public lands the Forest Service manages contribute more than \$13 billion to the economy each year through visitor spending alone. Those same lands provide 20 percent of the nation's clean water supply, a value estimated at \$7.2 billion per year. The agency has either a direct or indirect role in stewardship of about 80 percent of the 850 million forested acres within the U.S., of which 100 million acres are urban forests where most Americans live.
