Forest Service cuts back on boat landings & campgrounds

The Forest Service is cutting costs, and that includes cutting out some campgrounds or reducing the services offered at service sites.

In this area, the Roberts Lake boat landing will not have the lawn mowed, will have no picnic tables and the toilet buildings will be closed. The campground at Sevenmile Lake will be closed, as will the Brule River Campground and Windsor Dam Campground. At Himley Lake, the dispersed site will not have the toilet serviced or the grass mowed. The Deer Lake site will not have the toilet buildings open, nor will Burnt Bridge camping site.

Rose Lake boat access will be open for launching, but the lawn won't be mowed and the toilets will be closed. At Green Lake Beach, the beach will be closed, but the boat landing will remain open. Mountain Fire Tower will have the picnic tables removed and no lawn mowing.

The Farr Lake dispersed site will have no mowing, no service to the box toilet and no fees. Mountain Lake dispersed site is the same as Farr Lake, as is the Old 32 dispersed site.

Eagle Creek boat landing won't be mowed, and the Laurel Lake boat landing and campground will be closed. Nine Mile boat landing will lose the toilet. At Kentuck Lake Campground, part of the campground will be closed, there will be reduced mowing, boat landing will be open as will the public water supply and garbage service. Halsey Lake boat landing will have reduced mowing and no toilet service.

Correction to the article on the Goodman/Armstrong Creek School Forest

We have a correction to the story we ran last week on the logging on the Goodman/Armstrong Creek School Forest. Superintendent Ben Neihaus was contacted by Roy Gordon, a former resident of Goodman, who knew the history of the three school forests.

There is a school forest between Goodman and Armstrong Creek, another behind the school where the thinning took place, and another tract east of Goodman.

We reported that the forest being thinned was planted in 1958, when in fact, it was planted in the late 30's. According to Roy, R.B. Goodman was trying to keep his men busy in the depths of the depression. Single men were allowed to work less hours than married men, as they didn't have the mouths to feed. When the work was light at the sawmill, they cleared brush and stumps and planted trees. The Goodman School Forest is the second oldest in the state, with the Laona School Forest the oldest.

So, we stand corrected, and men who worked for R.B. Goodman actually planted the trees that have now produced the money for the Children's Miracle Network. and also provided the learning experience for the young people from the area school districts.

If anybody is still around that helped plant those trees, please let us know.





Annual Spring Trap Shoot in Long Lake







Save Our Police Department

The town of Wabeno is a beautiful, rustic small town. Until recently things around town have been very quiet. On April 21st we had 3 new town board members elected into office. Within their first week of office our new board members, Paul Ehlinger, Jim Smith, and Nancy Schuhart, have had 2 closed door meetings specifically with one task in mind; Dissolving our town Police Department. Why would they do this one might ask? What purpose does this solve? These are all questions that do not have answers to them because nothing has been discussed at an open meeting. Why doesn't the public have a say in this? The Police department protects us, too.

If there is no Wabeno Police Department, the response time from the Forest County Sheriff's Department could be up to 30 minutes. Whereas, the Wabeno Police Department can respond in under 5 minutes.


The Wabeno Police Department also has a State certified K-9 unit that detects the odors of marijuana, cocaine, methamphetamines, heroin, and their derivatives. The Wabeno K-9 is also utilized for tracking lost persons and article searches. Please keep in mind that the Wabeno Police Department is often times the first responder to medical and

The K-9 dog has won state recognized awards and has been 100% funded by the Community Task Force and has been no expense to the taxpayers of Wabeno or Townsend. The use of the K-9 is available 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. The Wabeno K-9 unit was the first unit available in Forest County. The K-9 provides mutual aid to the surrounding counties such as Langlade, Florence, Marinette, and Oconto counties.

The Wabeno K-9 unit has diminished the amount of drugs coming into our area significantly.

The Wabeno Police Department in 2009 has re-established a municipal court and has always shown positive financial earnings back to the town of Wabeno. In 2014, Wabeno took in over \$16,000 just through the municipal court alone. The Town of Wabeno receives 70% of all the forfeitures. The Forest County Sheriff's Departments are not allowed to write municipal citations. If the Wabeno Police Department is dissolved, the 70% of yearly forfeitures, would not be received.

The Wabeno municipal court has the area's only juvenile court that allows juveniles to provide community service back to the community versus paying forfeitures. From January 1st, 2015 until present, there has been over 1,300 Police calls/contacts with citizens in the Wabeno jurisdiction. The Wabeno Police Department only operates at a 40

hour week with a flexible schedule. Wabeno Police Department is always on duty during large gatherings such as weddings, parades, street dances, and cultural gatherings hosted by the Forest County Potawatomi's.

The Wabeno Police Department serves the Wabeno High School and Elementary School districts. They also have many family oriented places in their jurisdiction which would include the Potawatomi Carter Casino Hotel, Forest County Tribal lands, campgrounds, hiking trails, recreational trails, and lakes. While on duty the Police Department covers a 90 square mile area of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest.

The Wabeno Police Department has updated their computer systems. The new computer system corresponds with the Forest County record system which is also known as CIS. In 2015, the Wabeno Police Department has replaced their squad with a 2014 Ford Crewcab pick-up truck with topper. The Community K-9 program has paid in full to accommodate K-9 Dutch in the rear of the squad.

The only cost that the K-9 unit is to the town of Wabeno is insurance. This is a "blanket" coverage that has no additional cost to the town of Wabeno. The Wabeno K-9 is shared with the town of Townsend. The town of Townsend also covers their own liability coverage.

The new Town Board is trying to disband the Humane Officer position for animal control. In 2014 the Humane Officer has seized over 32 dogs and in the beginning of 2015 approximately 12 dogs have been seized. At no time have any animals been destroyed. Approximately 90% of the dogs have been returned to their owners and the other approximate 10% have been taken to the Langlade County Humane Society.
