With the last snippets of a brutal winter now a distant memory, warm, sunny skies and an all-day, jampacked schedule of racing greeted a huge crowd on hand for Saturday's 3rd annual "Londerville Super Challenge Off-Road Weekend" at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway.

After three years of growth, the third "major" event in Crandon International's summer racing series set attendance and participation records for the allencompassing, dirt-filled event. The track, known affectionately as the "Big House," promoted a kaleidoscope of off-road disciplines utilizing different configurations of the 400-acre facility located in the picturesque Wisconsin northwoods. While officials did not release final attendance figures, they were confident that the event had "doubled in size" since last year's running of the unique competition.

The first race on Saturday's schedule for the Crandon Sportsman Series was for the 1600 Light Buggy class. Representing the largest class of the day, 21 entries fought to take the year's first checkered flag. In the end, #201 Greg Stingle took a flag-to-flag victory with a great battle going on behind him between Matt Mullen and Todd Lamks

Race 2 combined the Classix and Stock Truck classes. #613 Dale Chestnut beat #601 Bill Wilson and #655 Galen Gee in Classix and for the top three overall positions. The Stock Truck class was won by #520 Brad Milan, with #593 Diesel Shanak and #573 Lon Jaskie coming in second and third.

The ultra-fast Super Buggy class was next, with Rodney Vaneperen putting on a driving clinic in Super Buggy, piloting his #45 car to a first place finish. Number 22 Herman Barnum was in the mix early but suffered the worst roll of the morning. He kept going, thanks to the immediate assistance from the Crandon Track Safety Crew. Crandon veteran Scott Schwalbe took second, with his son, #2 Ryan Schwalbe, right behind in third.

A field of thirteen 1600 Single Buggies cars took the green flag for the 12-lap race, with a tight fight for the opening laps. 2014 Crandon World Champion #331 Mark Steinhardt had to battle with West Coast veteran racer #312 Bruce Fraley (from Las Vegas) after Steinhardt got the hole shot. Hailing from nearby Rhinelander, Steinhardt maintained his pace for the win. Fraley took second and #326 Rob Kinner took third.

The growing crowd was enjoying the midday sun as the 7- to 12-year-old kids in the Crandon Short Course Karts took the green flag. These tiny trucks run under strict safety and competition regulations and are a fan favorite. A slight incident off the start held up 2014 class champion #77 Carter Vanden Heuvel, while an ultra smooth Owen Vaneperen copied his Super Buggy-winning father, Rodney, in taking the win. Gage Garvin took the runner-up spot, with Zack Wirhanowiz in third.

Crandon's Limited 4 and Formula 4x4 were next, with eight trucks racing side-by-side into the infamous Forest County Potawatomi turn one. From the onset, veteran #17 Dan Baudoux set the pace, with #497 Jerry Conrad and #69 Milan Mazanec in hot pursuit. The pace took out Baudoux, moving #471 Brad LaMarche into third. Up front Conrad and Mazanec put on the best race of the day, with Conrad smoking for much of the time. Mazanec took advantage at the halfway point, passing Conrad before claiming the checkered flag and starting his season right.



You see, last week on Tuesday (06/02/15) there was a meeting held in the county board room.

Our county board forestry committee held a listening/comment session on proposed amendments to our county's 15 year forestry plan, which if enacted, might have allowed a "for pay" motorized recreation area on county owned forest land.

These proposed amendments, in my own words, "had been shoved down the throat" of the Forestry Committee by the County Board Chairman, and members of a "private corporation" whose membership includes some County Board members. I still think that county board members who also have membership in a "private corporation" wishing to obtain a concession from the county coffers, is a monumental conflict of interest that will sooner or later, come home to roost.

However, back to "Taking a Stand". The meeting that night filled the room beyond capacity and people were still standing out in the hallway. A lot of good, thoughtful people got up to speak and took a stand on the issue of amending the counties forestry plan to allow for a "For Pay" motorized recreation area on our county forest.

I was reminded again and again, of Norman Rockwell's painting, *Freedom of Speech* which shows a normal American standing up in a public meeting to say his piece. Check it and Rockwell's *Four Freedoms* paintings out. They are very powerful.

Overwhelmingly, the vast majority of the comments given that night were against amending our county's forestry plan. Anyone that says different wasn't in the same room with me that night.

I really appreciate the efforts of everyone who was there that night and those that have stood to be heard over the last 22 months that this issue has been floating around the county. In the end, I believe that the Forestry Committee did the right thing, and voted not to pass these amendments on to the full County Board, effectively ending Forest County's role in the private corporation's plan to create a 10,000 acre mud bog (at least on county owned land).

My hat is off to everyone who has "Taken a Stand" on this issue. I believe that by standing up for what you believe in, a basic American right, justice for all will prevail.

# Grapefruit and Rx: What you need to know

If you take prescription medications, ask before you eat. Get your health care provider's OK before eating grapefruits or drinking grapefruit juice. Grapefruit in any form (whole, fresh or frozen juice) can influence the effectiveness of many prescription medications.

The intended effect of a medication can be greatly increased or decreased if grapefruit is ingested. It potentially can cause a serious medical reaction. The list of affected medications has grown since the effect was discovered in 2008.

Interactions with medications can last up to 3 days after consuming as few as 7 ounces of grapefruit. Chemicals in grapefruit called furanocoumarins interfere with the normal breakdown of certain medications. This can cause a possible drug overdose or reduced drug effectiveness.

The risk of side effects is also greater. These include heart rhythm problems, kidney failure, muscle breakdown, difficulty breathing and blood clots. Grapefruit interference with medication is highly individualized. It affects some people more than others, but it is potentially more serious after age 70.

Grapefruit is not the only culprit. Grapefruit relatives such as pomelo (shaddock, pamplemousse) and tangelo (honeybell) also contain furanocoumarins. Seville (sour, blood) oranges and limes can have a similar effect.

You can also discuss potential interactions with your pharmacist.

# The men who were left behind

There has been much written about the early days of logging and the colorful characters who lived in camps and cut logs with the old misery whip, as the crosscut saw was called. Those early loggers thought the big timber could never be completely cut. Like most young people, those men thought that the way of life they chose and often were addicted to, would never end. Of course, we all know that it did. So what happened to the men left behind?

Growing up in a small town in northeastern Wisconsin during the 1950's and early 1960's, these men who were left behind made up part of our population, and while many were well-liked, they were never a full part of the community. They lived in poverty, making do with a miniscule social security check. Most lived in a small, one-room shack with an outhouse in the back. Some still drank their check up as soon as they could and spent the rest of the month eating poorly and waiting for the next check. Most of them, as I remember, didn't drink like they did in the old days, having an occasional beer and stretching that check as long as they could. I might add that there was no food stamp program back then, and people were pretty much on their own.

The one-room shack had become a way of life for many of these men after the logging camp days were over. When the logs were cut, logging turned to cutting spruce and balsam stands to feed the growing pulp and paper industry in Wisconsin. These leftovers from the big logging days made their living with an ax and a one-man saw cutting and bunching spruce, and many of them stayed in the woods in a small shack they knocked together, coming out in the spring. The jobber would keep them in groceries, and their diet consisted largely of meals cooked on a frying pan on top of a small woodstove. Remains of these shacks are still to be found in the woods to this day.

As a kid who liked history, these men were walking books on what life was like in our little community of Argonne in the decades before I came along. Some of these people I only knew by their nicknames, and some of them, while I knew their real name, never saw it written out, so I don't know the correct spelling. Here are some of the old-timers I remember.

Jack O'toole lived on a farm a few miles from town. He was snugly living in what was once a milkhouse constructed from field stone. He did some work around the farm and earned his rent. Speaking with an Irish brogue and wearing what we call a touring cap, he was colorful. With black hairs growing from the bridge of his nose, he did his best to fill in any gaps we may have had in our sex education. Fortunately, at age fifteen, we already knew better, so our minds were not completely twisted on that subject. I think Jack was a teamster, who drove a team pulling sleighs filled with logs, but his favorite memories were of his drinking days, and he liked to tell of winning a whiskey-drinking contest at Mrs. Tom's tavern. He was the last man standing, and he was proud of his feat. I don't know when Jack went to the Big Tavern in the Sky. I think I had left for college when he passed, and I don't know where he was buried.

Not all of the old Jacks were drunks. Bill Kruse lived in what was supposed to be an old travel trailer that had an oil burner added for heat and an outhouse. His small plot of land was next to the Argonne Dairy, and he was an avid Milwaukee Braves baseball fan. He like to fish trout, and always went to one of our many trout streams by himself, returning with trout that made other trout fishermen envious. Nobody that I can recall ever knew where or how he fished. He left with his old Ford pickup and returned with plenty of great eating. Hard of hearing, he rode the clutch on the truck, with the motor roaring, slowly backing out of his parking place in front of King's Tavern, where he might have enjoyed a glass or two of beer. I was probably a freshman in high school when he passed. It was in April, and a cold spell was followed by a very warm string of days. Because he didn't come over to talk about the Braves game a few days back with the owner of the dairy, Leo Pelek walked next door to check on him. The little trailer was somewhere around the ninety degree mark, meaning the oil stove was turned on high during the cold spell when he had obviously died. Needless-to-say, Bill was well on his way to returning from whence he came, and Leo, when I saw him, had emptied his stomach more times than he cared to remember. Bill had family, and he has a stone in the cemetery. He died alone, much as he had lived his life.

Charlie Pratt was another who lived in a small dwelling that was about eight feet wide by twelve feet long. He was an avid reader, and he was almost crowded out of his small home by the magazines, newspapers and books that he had accumulated. He lived behind our old town hall, and his empty cabin was still there until a few years ago. One day I drove by and realized it was missing. I never remember him drinking, but my father said he was a heller when he was a kid. His cabin, I think, sat on property owned by a lumberjack named Onearmed Bill, who had a small brick house and must have been in on the very last days of the old lumbering era. He worked in the woods until he died working in 1965. Bill



had a left arm that ended a few inches from the elbow, but that didn't stop him from running a chainsaw, hooking the forward handlebar in the crook of his left elbow. He was also a good man with an ax, and had a right arm bigger than the top of his leg.

Old lumberjacks often took a job working on a farm, like O'toole, but some took jobs swamping a tavern, living in a small room or the basement of the saloon. Swamping, by the way, means cleaning up the saloon after hours. They also would have kept the wood stove or furnace fired both day and night. George Weed was the swamper at King's Tavern, that was across the street from my father's garage in Argonne. As a kid, I watched this stooped old guy carry out the garbage and clean the spittoons. I remember that he wore his wool Malone pants summer and winter, was congenial, and lived in a small room in the back corner of the tavern. One day, Manny King announced that George had "woke up dead" that morning. I don't remember any funeral or burial.

There were numerous other characters like this in my younger years. There was big Hans, who claimed that he could make a baby any time a woman wanted one! I don't think many took him up on that offer. Walter Sebastian was another old Jack that frequented town, and I don't remember him very well, other than he was found dead in the woods one spring, and he was long past his working years. I often thought that this was the place where he wished to die.

Whispering Paul had a small shack about a quarter mile out of town with a nice spring just a few steps from his door. He must have had something wrong with his voice box, because he earned his name by whispering all of the time. He must have passed when I was away at college, and when I came back, he was no more. I never knew his last name.

There was a big raw-boned Native American that had an affliction that caused his hair to fall out, and bald as a cue ball and with scarey, light colored eyes, minus eyelashes or eyebrows seemed to look right through you. His passing went unnoticed as well, but I heard that when he was living in a shack in the woods and cutting spruce for Magnus Sjoquist, Maggie, as he was called, plowed the road with his crawler and Oscar was rolled out of the road and into the snowbank. It was said that Maggie took him into his shack, built a roaring fire and thawed him out. He was unhurt from his brush with the dozer blade, and he was cutting spruce that afternoon. He must have had great circulation, because I never saw him wear socks summer or winter.

John Skeezix, and I am spelling this phonetically because I never saw his name written down, used to be in either the Prussian or Polish Army at one time. At this late date, I doubt that it matters which one. He talked very broken English and like to drink. When in his cups, he liked to demonstrate his marching technique in the taverns. He was actually a decent guy when he was sober, and would give the kids a coin for ice cream or other treats if they talked with him awhile.

They came from all corners of the earth, and for some reason, were drawn to the logging game and to the solitary lifestyle. I would bet, however, that when the evenings grew long in the winter woods, they had dreams of home, parents, and brothers and sisters. There had to be some sad and lonely times for these people, yet they did contribute to society.

The logs and pulpwood they produced was used to build the cities and economies of communities downstate, and men working in paper mills and making good wages probably never realized that their job was made possible by the toils of men like these.

They are all gone now, and so are many of the younger people who remembered them. Ceil Gayhart, who grew up in an old hotel in Wabeno, Wisconsin said that much of their business was from lumberjacks that needed a place to stay during breakup and sometimes through the summer months when they did farm work. Ceil said that after she took over the hotel, she had some of these old and worn-out jacks as full-time residents. They paid their rent and she fed them every day from the hotel kitchen. When they died, they were put in the potter's field part of the cemetery, where they still lie, with not any known relatives. In fact, said Ceil, she often didn't know their last names. They went by their nicknames, like "Old Pete" or "Big Joe." She said it didn't matter to them that their real names would pass into obscurity. They lived the life they chose and accepted the consequences.

Cemeteries throughout the Upper Great Lakes have their areas that look untouched, but can't be used for modern burials. Unmarked graves are often disturbed when digging a new grave, so a large area is mowed, but never dug in. The cemetery in Cavour Wisconsin is such a place. When standing in the gate and looking to your left, headstones abound, but on the right side is a large area of mowed grass that they have learned not to disturb. Who is there? Nobody remembers, but at one time, they were bulls of the woods, a terror in the saloon, and they had some fun while it lasted.

category was next, with a huge and competitive field 17 vehicles strong. The next race featured the \$10,000 Branik Cup race for the radical 4400-class 4x4 vehicles, as well as W.E.Rocks more production-based "Trail" class. Taking home the big prize for a second consecutive year was Jason Shipman, who beat Doug Jackson and Darrell Gray in convincing fashion. Jesse Oliver took the Trail class win, outrunning Josh Jackson and Tom Yash.

The hills near the rock crawling area were packed for the rest of the afternoon, as spectators enjoyed the noise and muddy fun of the West Michigan Mud Run group taking on a wet and wild track specially built just for the occasion.
