Johnny Greaves wins 4th Crandon FCP Cup



After an incredibly competitive and intense two days of racing at Crandon International's Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run, the overriding opinion by veteran off-road observers was simple. The general consensus was that last Sunday's racing in general -- and the big FCP Community Cup finale in particular -- would be ones to remember.

Not surprising given the track's legendary reputation for producing big drama and world-class performances, those observations were right on the money.

A healthy crowd of the Crandon faithful indeed enjoyed big doses of sunshine, hospitality and great racing as local favorites wrote the weekend's biggest headlines. This was especially true fo the Greaves family, who took both day's The Off Road Championship (TORC) PRO 4WD unlimited races and the events biggest prize -- the 22nd Annual Forest County Potawatomi Cup.

Unlike Saturday, Sunday's schedule split the racing sessions between the TORC PROs and the Crandon Sportsman series drivers. In the morning session for Sportsman, Greg Stingle took his third consecutive weekend victory in the Auto Gear 1600 Light Buggy class before being matched by the three-for-three performance of Dale Chestnut in the Parson's Chevrolet Classix division. Popular Crandon racer Diesel Shanak returned to his winning ways in the Londerville Steel Stock Truck class, while Jerry Edgerton stood at the top of Crandon's podium by winning the Country Hearth Super Truck class for the second consecutive day.



A big news story this weekend came from north of the border as young Canadian Travis Dinsmore laid claim to his first-ever professional racing victory. Driving the #43 Sle-co./Atturo Tire-supported truck, the resident of Paris, Ontario survived a tough battle to win Sunday's TORC 2WD race -- which also happened to be his first-career victory at Crandon International. For The Off Road Championship series (TORC) presented by Amsoil crew, the day's schedule was rearranged from Saturday's to allow both the top PRO 2WD and PRO 4WD teams to race, then re-prep their exotic, high-horsepower race truck for the day's feature race – the 22nd annual Crandon Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup Challenge.

As was the case Saturday, the PRO 4WD race for unlimited four-wheel drive trucks was another Greaves family showcase. After leading for much of the race, #33 Maxxis Toyota of CJ Greaves reversed yesterday's result by passing his father Johnny with just a few laps to go to earn his fourth class victory of 2015 – despite it being his rookie season. Like yesterday, Scott Douglas come home in 3rd.

Popular local racer Keegen Kincaid in his #7 Traxxas truck backed up yesterday's exciting PRO 2WD win with a hard-fought victory over CJ Greaves and Marty Hart. For the son of Crandon champion Jeff Kincaid, the weekend double was the first in 2015 after Keegan burst into class with last year's TORC victory at Sturgis.

Celebrating the nation's birthday

We are once again celebrating our nation's birthday. It is actually a celebration of the Declaration of Independence. Before the thirteen colonies became a nation, they declared that they were no longer part of the British Empire, had thrown off their connections to Britain, and were going to go it alone. No more taxation to support a monarchy and a system of noblemen, and no more restrictions on who the colonies could trade with. Being a colonial and a second-class citizen was to be no more!

To sign that Declaration of Independence, in 1776, took courage. Great Britain was arguably the strongest nation on the planet at this time. In the various wars between France and England, England had come out the winner, but both nations were deeply in debt from financing these wars, and England wasn't going to take losing the income from her North American colonies sitting down. The Revolutionary War followed, and while the colonies lost most of the battles, they did win the war. The victory was largely due to the financial help provided by France, who enjoyed seeing their former enemy lose to the ragtag colonials. It was a form of revenge. While France was also deeply in debt from warring with England, they knew that any financial help they provided would cost England far more money than France had provided. They were right, and finally, the British tucked in their tails and went home.

The United States of America wasn't a reality until the Constitution was drafted and accepted by the thirteen colonies. Acceptance came after the first ten amendments to the Constitution; what came to be known as the Bill of Rights. Our lives are governed and protected by those rights today. The year we officially became a nation was actually 1789, after thousands of people lost their lives and/or property to the British Army.

That era is looked at today by historians as the "Age of Enlightenment." The movement towards democracy back in 1776 and the years that followed did change the world. It was the first time that nations weren't ruled entirely by aristocrats and those of noble birth. The idea of the people picking their leadership was entirely a new idea, and it scared the hell out of those aristocrats and nobles. France followed the new American country in revolting against the ruling classes, and it was a bloody affair that turned into a dictatorship for a time. We did it better!

Partisan politics came into being immediately, with the Federalists battling the Republicans (later to be the Democratic Party), and it wasn't pretty, and it still isn't. But it works, regardless of the mess. Then, like now, some elected officials used their offices for their own betterment, and usually they are eventually brought up short. It is a sloppy system, and the best the world has ever seen.



Crandon Sportsman competition filled out much of the afternoon for a large and appreciative crowd enjoying a mild Wisconsin Sunday. A happy Jerry Conrad took home top honors in the Miller Lite Limited 4 division, with S.Dave Miah topping the MasterCraft Safety Formula 4x4 field. A tight group of 15 Lincoln Electric 1600 Buggies didn't deter Mark Steinhardt from enjoying a perfect Brush Run weekend.

The youngest racers of the weekend took to the track in the Brew Pub Pizza Short Course Karts, with #20 Braden Beauchamp happily accepting his first place Crandon trophy. In the Mt. Dew Super Stock Truck division, Mitch Dorr was unstoppable, as was three-time weekend winner Rodney VanEperen in the Trigs Smoke House Super Buggy class.

With the Sportsman competition concluded, a large TORC PRO Lights group took the green flags in the day's penultimate race. As always, the action was heated in this large class, but at the end Canadian Travis Dinsmore, piloting the #43 Ford, won his first TORC race over yesterday's winner Luke Johnson. Doug Mittag finished in 3rd.

As Sunday afternoon slowly shifted to early evening, a snarling group of TORC unlimited trucks sat at Crandon's legendary Land Rush starting line for the weekend's main event - the 22nd annual Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup. The \$24,000 cash purse guaranteed the on-track battle would be intense - and once again the track and the PRO racers didn't disappoint.

Hammond went to an elated Johnny Greaves, with CJ second and a McLaughlin, Brandon S. Oberleitner satisfied Chad Hord taking the final podium position.

For Greaves, Sunday's triumph marks his fourth Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup title, tying the Appleton, Wisconsin resident with Las Vegas racer Rob MacCachren for the all-time lead with four wins each.

"Man, how was that for a race?" he shouted to a large gathering of happy Crandon fans. "That kid of mine kept reminding me of things that I had taught him over the years. I kept looking up and thinking; 'Where did that little s**t learn that?"

Wearing his traditional victory wreath and holding his check for \$15,000, he added; "I really want to thank my friends at Forest County Potawatomi for making all this happen. We have had a great relationship with them for years, and winning this today just feels really good."

With its 2015 season now at the half-way point, the TORC Series presented by Amsoil will head southeast for Rounds 9 and 10 at The Dirt Track at Charlotte Motor Speedway. The trip is much closer for the Sportsman racers as enjoy the challenging dirt circuit at nearby Bark River, Wisconsin.

> Including his four years of military service, Jeff retires with over 34 years in the Postal Service. He plans to spend his retirement traveling, hunting and fishing.



Wisconsin ruffed grouse survey indicates stable population

MADISON - Ruffed grouse enthusiasts should expect bird encounters similar to last year, according to the recently completed roadside ruffed grouse survey. For complete survey results, search the Department of Natural Resources website, dnr.wi.gov, and search keywords "wildlife reports."

"While we did see some continued regional declines, our roadside survey index to track ruffed grouse populations is essentially unchanged from 2014," said Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources wildlife survey coordinator Brian Dhuey. "Ruffed grouse populations are known to rise and fall over a nine to 11 year cycle, and the last peak in Wisconsin's cycle occurred in 2011. Survey results suggest that we have reached the low point in the population cycle and we should start to see increases in the next few years as the grouse population moves toward the next peak."

Roadside surveys to monitor the number of breeding grouse have been conducted by staff from the department, U.S. Forest Service, tribal employees, and numerous grouse enthusiasts and volunteers since 1964. Surveys begin 30 minutes before sunrise and consist of 10 stops at assigned points. Surveyors listen for four minutes for the distinctive thumping sounds made by drumming male grouse. Surveyors monitored 88 routes this year.

While the number of drums heard per stop statewide in 2015 was similar to last year, there were some notable differences among regions. While one of the primary regions for grouse in the state, the northern region, showed a 13 percent drop in the number of drums heard per stop, the primary region in central Wisconsin showed a 38 percent increase.

Weather conditions influence drumming activity by male grouse, and most observers felt weather conditions were conducive to accurate surveys this spring. Surveyors rated the overall survey conditions as "excellent" on 65 percent of transects runs, compared to 56 percent in 2014. Surveyors rated 2015 conditions as "fair," the lowest available weather condition rating, five percent of the time in 2015, compared to 7 percent in 2014. According to DNR Upland Wildlife Ecologist Scott Walter, maturation of southern Wisconsin's forest community in recent decades and the resulting loss of dense, brushy areas that grouse need for cover has resulted in lower numbers of grouse in the region in recent decades. Results from the 2015 survey show that grouse populations in both the southwest and southeast region remain well below historic levels.

"Ruffed grouse are closely linked to young forests" said Walter. "While grouse enthusiasts often focus on numbers in a single year, the long-term health of grouse is dependent upon the availability of the dense young forest cover they require. In Wisconsin, we are working to provide the habitat needed to benefit ruffed grouse and many other wildlife species through proactive approaches to forest management that will maximize the health and diversity of forest communities."

Dan Dessecker, Director of Conservation Policy for the Ruffed Grouse Society, reminds hunters of the importance of weather in grouse population dynamics.

"While cold temperatures and deep snow are generally hard on resident wildlife populations, ruffed grouse often thrive in such winters," noted Dessecker. "This past winter saw crusted snow conditions across much of Wisconsin, and this can limit a grouse's ability to burrow into the snow where it is protected from cold temperatures and predators. On the other hand, temperatures this winter were relatively mild until late February and early March when we experienced temperatures well below zero. Snow depths don't really hamper grouse from feeding in the winter because they eat primarily buds from aspen and other trees at this time of year."

According to Dessecker, weather conditions, especially during the brood rearing period in late May and early June, also play an important role in the fall ruffed grouse numbers. Newly-hatched grouse chicks are very sensitive to chilling, and warm, dry conditions can provide for high survival during the first few weeks of life.

"Grouse hunters are used to the cyclic nature of ruffed grouse populations, and they know that grouse can still be found in the best cover during low periods," continued Dessecker. "Hunters might have to work a bit harder to flush birds, but sunny October days with your dog in the north woods are tough to beat, and Wisconsin still has some of the best grouse hunting in the country."

Celebrating the Nation's Birthday

We are once again celebrating our nation's birthday. It is actually a celebration of the Declaration of Independence. Acceptance came after the first ten amendments to the Constitution; what came to be known as the Bill of Rights. Our lives are governed and protected by those rights today. The year we officially became a nation was actually 1784, after thousands of people lost their lives and/or property to the British Army.



But it works, regardless of the mess. Then, like now, some elected officials used their offices for their own betterment, and usually they are eventually brought up short. It is a sloppy system, and the best the world has ever seen.







Forest County Museum's **Artifact Autobiography:** Per-Ola Land Token

The Forest County Museum will be writing a bimonthly column highlighting unique objects that can be found at the museum. The articles will be told from a first person perspective of the artifact so the reader may feel a personal connection with the piece of history. This week's article features the Per-Ola Land Token.



I am a bronze colored metal coin 1.25 inches in diameter with writing on both sides and a large swastika symbol on one side. The swastika in my case was used as a symbol of good fortune (http://www.ushmm.org). I was found underneath a bed twenty years ago at an old farm house located in Racine County by a man named Pete Downs. The farm would hire workers during the time of the harvest and I was most likely dropped by a man that worked on the farm and wanted to start his own operation up north (Pete Downs 2015). The writing on my sides states that I was created by the Per Ola Land Company so that I could be exchanged for the free use of 7500.00 dollars' worth of heavy clearing machinery as well as a 20 dollar credit in the first purchase of land from the company. The Per Ola Land Company, a branch of the Keith and Hiles Lumber Company, opened an office in Forest County in 1916. The company divided the land they owned into 5000 acres of farm units and allowed farmers the use of stump pulling machines at no cost. The company claimed that in a few years the area would be a paradise for farmers after the lumbermen had cleared the way (Franzen 1992:83).

Forest County promoters put up booths at the State Fair and handed out propaganda on the success of farming in the area. The board in Forest County hired someone in 1915 to teach immigrants how to properly farm American soil and the Federal government gave them a surplus of explosives to blast the stumps from the earth (Franzen 1992:83). There were many that put their trust in me as a token of a new start and a better future as farmers of the north. But the short growing season, harsh winters, and the stumps covering the landscape spelled out failure for a large number of participants in the Per Ola Land Clearing Plan. There was so much land that was given to the government through bankruptcy and unpaid taxes due to the failure of the farms that the county was


