Camp 5 Museum/Lumberjack Steam Train in Laona on Saturday, July 25 is hosting a Veterans and Military Day. This project is part of a Wisconsin Historical Society to collect and preserve Veterans' and Active Military photos for their Archives.

In the winter of 2013 the lakes of Pickerel, Little Pickerel and Smoke in the Town of Townsend suffered a severe winter kill which almost killed off the entire fisheries of these lakes. To address this concern and the major impact on the lakes, concerned property owners and other community members got together and formed the Pickerel Chain Lake Association with the expressed interest in maintaining the healthy water quality of the lakes and restore the fisheries. In the fall of 2014, as a result of our fund raising and donations by others, including other lake associations, we were able to install the first of our three planned aerators. We also received fish from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources which began the restocking of our lakes. The aerator was install in Pickerel Lake and was in operation most of the winter of 2014-2015. **Continued on page 21**



Forest County Museum's **Artifact** Autobiography: Victorian Crazy Quilt

I was donated to the Forest County Museum by Deloyce Conway and was created by Grace Shaw Ross. Grace's father was Samuel Shaw, the founder of Crandon. Grace's sister was the first female mayor in Wisconsin. I am large rectangular quilt made from many different types of fabric with innumerable colors. My patches are in every type of shape and I have floral patterns sewn onto various patches. I was all the rage after the 1876 Philadelphia Centennial Exposition. During the exposition one the most popular exhibits was the Japanese culture display including their asymmetrical paintings and crazed ceramics. Women of the time started to mimic the style in their quilting and it became a popular topic in women's magazines. Quilts like me were often made using fabrics such as: brocade, silk, and velvet. I was a perfect way for Mrs. Ross to show off her needlework skills with all my decorative stitches.

I could have been used as a fundraising device which was the common practice at the time. Church groups would ask famous individuals for a scrap of their clothing to sew into a quilt and then auction it off to the highest bidder to raise funds for missionaries. Quilts like me were first made by the wealthy women in society, like Grace Ross, but the practice soon trickled down to the lower classes. Bundles of silk scraps could be bought at a low cost so average women could incorporate it into their quilts. After 1900 cotton, denim, and flannel could also be found on the quilts. The fad started to fade after 1910. If you would like to come visit me at the Forest County Museum, I am located in the parlor next to the sewing machine.



Over the winter of 2014, the PCLA applied for, and ultimately received, a grant for a lakes management plan to be developed for the three lakes. This lake management plan is partially funded by the WDNR and will provide a useful tool on managing the lakes for good water quality and lake protection. The lake management plan is an intensive study of our lakes both what is in them and what flows into them. The study looks at the fisheries, plants, and the overall ecology of the lake. The lake management plan provides us with a pathway to address issues within the lakes which may include water quality, aquatic invasive species, and fisheries re-establishment among other concerns. The lake management plan is being developed by a private firm, Onterra, out of De Pere, and will take two years to complete.

Our future plans include completing the lake management plan, installing the remaining aerators, and filling our lakes with fish. We also partner with the Town in helping maintain Oughton Park which is on the shores of Pickerel Lake. On June 27, the PCLA had an Oughton Park cleanup day, where members spent the day restoring park benches, staining picnic tables and removing weeds. Working with the community, we hope to accomplish our goals in the near future. We are off to a great start but have a long ways to go.

Please join the Pickerel Chain Lake Association for its first annual community picnic and fund raiser on Saturday, July 25, from 3 pm to 7 pm to further support our association's efforts in restocking Pickerel, Little Pickerel, and Smoke Lake with fish following the disastrous freeze out from the winter of 2013. There will be a children's game area with many events and prizes for the kids. 

NRCS Conservation Local Work Group Meeting Scheduled for August 3rd

Farmers, Landowners, Organizations, and Agencies **Encouraged to Attend**

Rhinelander, Wis. July 15, 2015 - The U.S. Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) has announced that the Headwaters Local Work Group meeting will be held in Rhinelander, on August 3rd. The Headwaters Local Work Group advises NRCS on the delivery of conservation programs, on private lands, in Iron, Florence, Forest, Langlade, Lincoln, Oneida, and Vilas Counties. The meeting will start at 1 PM and conclude at 3 PM, in the Oneida Room, of the U.S. Forest Service office, at 500 Hanson Lake Road, in Rhinelander.

Twenty one meetings will be held across Wisconsin in July and August to gather input and help set priorities for USDA conservation programs under the 2014 Farm Bill. "Local Working Groups offer a seat at the table for interested individuals and groups to advise NRCS on how best to set priorities and locally implement conservation programs," said Jimmy Bramblett, Wisconsin State Conservationist. "Members are diverse with an interest and focus on local agriculture and natural resource issues," added Bramblett. Farmers representing a variety of crops and livestock raised within the local area, private woodland owners, representatives of agricultural and environmental organizations, and representatives of other agriculture and natural resource agencies are welcome and should be represented.

This year, LWGs will represent two or more counties grouped together by geography, similar land use, resources, and type of agriculture (see map of Local Working Groups).

The main program discussed at the meetings will be the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), the primary federal conservation program for agricultural and forest lands. EQIP offers technical and financial assistance to help landowners with needed conservation practices for water quality, soil health, wildlife and other natural resources. As of May, Wisconsin has received \$19.6 million in EQIP funding for conservation practices this year.


