## Lumberjack Steam Train makes last run of the season Fall Festival Runs are coming!



The Lumberjack Steam Train will be making its last run of the regular season for 2015 this weekend. Thousands of visitors enjoyed a ride on vintage rail cars, pulled by the 1916 Vulcan steam engine that was used in logging operations in Laona in the first years of the last century.

While there, they enjoyed the logging museum, the petting zoo, the Green Treasure Forest Tour and the Cracker Barrel Gift Shop. They watched a blacksmith at work in an authentic blacksmith shop and learned much about the logging and sawmill industry of the past, as well as, living in the Northwoods during the logging era of the past.

But, the Lumberjack Steam Train isn't done running in 2015. The Saturday Fall Festival runs will take place on September 19th and 26th, and October 3rd.

Amid the splendor of the autumn leaves, the Lumberjack Steam Train will bring visitors from the vintage depot on Highway 8, in Laona, to the Camp 5 Museum complex. While there, they will enjoy the pumpkin patch, face painting, and roasting marshmallows, and all of the other attractions that a visit aboard the Lumberjack Steam Train provides.

The Fall Festival on October 3rd is special! This is when the Green Bush-Wacker Cowboy re-enactors return to Camp 5, along with their period clothing, six guns and beautiful horses. The Cowboys always make a visit aboard the train a memorable one! By the way, the re-enactors aren't all cowboys. You will see people from different backgrounds of the period, from a preacher to even a floosie! You may witness a train robbery!

The Lumberjack Steam Train leaves the depot on the hour, starting at 11:00 a.m., with the last train departing the depot at 2:00 p.m.

## 2015 Footstock Tournament Aug 22 & 23 on Lake Peshtigo, Crandon

The National Figure Eight Barefoot Championships, known as Footstock, will be held this Saturday and Sunday, August 22 and 23, in Crandon on Lake Peshtigo. Barefooters compete head to head on opposite sides of the wake over a figure eight course. The competition is double elimination. When a competitor has two losses, he or she is eliminated. There is no distinction between professional and amateur skiers. There are five divisions of skiers. Skiers can decide on a mutually agreed higher speed in Junior and Women's Divisions up to 42 mph. Skiers may compete in as many divisions as they qualify for. Separate entry fees are required. The tournament is a two day event and there is no make-up date for bad weather. Should the tournament be delayed long enough that the Tournament Director and Chief Judge determine there is not enough time to complete a double elimination tournament before dark on Sunday, the format will be changed to single elimination.

## New pedestrian/bike trail under construction in Crandon

You may have wondered what all the excavating and dirt work was for on West Hill, in Crandon. This is the new pedestrian and bike trail that will lead from the school to Pioneer Plaza and the Wolf River Trail.

The trail will connect with Boulevard Street at the bottom of the hill and head south to Hwy 55. Boulevard, however, will not be torn up, but will have signs directing the traveler. At Hwy 55, the trail will be along the right-of-way to the plaza. It will be a blacktop trail.

Bikes will follow the trail until the business district along Hwy 8, where the trail will turn into a sidewalk versus a trail, until it passes Dollar General, where it will be a trail again. Bicycles will be diverted to the street for this section.

The trail is being paid for by a TE grant, using federal dollars, but administered by the state. The TE money will cover 80% of the cost. A Stewardship grant will pick up the other 20%. This trail was applied for when Bradley was mayor, back in 2010 and approved. The five-year wait was for the funding to get here.

Janke Construction from Athens is doing the construction, and Becher & Hoppe is handling the engineering work.

## Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest and DNR sign Good Neighbor Authority Agreement

The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources announce the signing of a Good Neighbor Authority agreement.

The 2014 Farm Bill authorized Good Neighbor Authority for the Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management. Good Neighbor Authority allows the Forest Service to enter into agreements or contracts with states to have them perform forest, rangeland and watershed restoration services on National Forest System lands.

"This authority is a significant way for the Forest Service to partner with state agencies to make improvements to the land," said U.S. Forest Service Eastern Regional Forester Kathleen Atkinson. "I'm excited to have a new tool that allows us to work together in unprecedented ways into the future."

The completed master agreement, between the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, is one of the first to be signed in the country.

"The agreement allows the state to supplement the great work being done by Forest Service staff on the Chequamegon-Nicolet. Good Neighbor Authority projects will expand our capacity to achieve forest management outcomes described in the 2004 Land and Resource Management Plan for the Forest," said Paul Strong, Forest Supervisor, Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest.

The master agreement, a broad pact between parties, is the first step. A subsequent Supplemental Project Agreement will be signed in the coming weeks that more specifically identifies the nature of the work to be completed in the first year.

The first project under the agreement will have the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources prepare, award and administer timber sales that already have all of the inventory and planning work completed on the National Forest. These timber sales will enable the Forest Service to increase the amount of timber offered for sale to more than 100 million board feet (MMBF) in fiscal year 2016. Without the Good Neighbor Authority agreement the Forest would sell 85 MMBF in fiscal year 2016. The forest's timber sale program has been on an upwards trend over the last five years. In fiscal year 2010, the forest sold 62 MMBF and in 2015, 80 MMBF is expected to be sold.

This partnership will provide more wood to Wisconsin's important forest products industry, while creating and maintaining healthy forest conditions prescribed in the Forest Plan. A portion of the receipts from the timber sales will reimburse the state for its costs to do the work, with remaining funds available to be used to conduct additional restoration activities on the forest.

"We look forward to working collaboratively with the Wisconsin DNR as well as other partners to identify opportunities and projects on the National Forest that will benefit local communities and their economies with the timber receipts generated from Good Neighbor Authority," said Strong.

The Good Neighbor Authority provides the opportunity to work across jurisdictional boundaries and manage forest lands in a mixed ownership setting. It leverages state resources to increase capacity to accomplish work on National Forest System lands. It also helps strengthen federal and state partnerships.

"We are fortunate to have the Wisconsin DNR and its employees ready and willing to assist us in achieving important conservation goals on the National Forest in addition to the important work they already do on state, county and private lands," said Strong. "I am looking forward to working even more closely with the WDNR on a variety of conservation projects."

**The Affordable Care Act & Employer Coverage**

The employer mandate is a provision in the Affordable Care Act (ACA) that requires employers to provide health insurance for their employees. The mandate has been postponed and enacted piecemeal over the years, but it is currently in effect for businesses with over 50 employees. The mandate also put into place what is known as the Small Business Health Options Program (SHOP). SHOP is the Health Insurance Marketplace but for employers who employ 50 or less full-time equivalent employees. Employers use SHOP to browse and apply for policies for their employees.

**For Employers:** The employer mandate, as of 2015, requires employers to pay an "employer shared responsibility payment" if they have more than 50 full-time equivalent employees and do not offer employer health insurance that is affordable and provides "minimum value." The employer may have to pay this penalty if the employer does not offer a plan that is under 9.56% of an employee's individual household income or if the plan does not cover at least 60% of the total allowed cost of benefits that are expected to be incurred under the plan (minimum value). This mandate for employers with 50 or more full time employees is accompanied by additional tax reporting and filing requirements.

Employers with fewer than 50 full-time employees may offer health insurance for employees through the SHOP. SHOP plans do not have an open enrollment period. If an employer with 25 or fewer employees covers at least 50% of their full-time employee's premium costs with annual wages of less than \$50,000, the business may be eligible for a Small Business Health Care Tax Credit that will help subsidize the cost of supplying health insurance for employees.

**For Employees:** If the employer does not offer an option for health insurance, the employee should sign up for health insurance either on or off of the Marketplace. If the employee signs up through the Health Insurance Marketplace, he or she may receive subsidies that greatly decrease health insurance premium amounts of out-of-

pocket costs.

If the employer does offer a plan, it must be found to be both adequate and affordable. If the plan is found to be inadequate or unaffordable, the employee may use a special enrollment period (SEP) to choose a Marketplace plan instead of the employer coverage.

An employer plan is adequate if it covers at least 60% of claims incurred by the beneficiary (same as the minimum value standard noted above). Further, an employer plan is affordable if it costs less than or equal to 9.56% of the employee's individual household income. If the plan is either inadequate or unaffordable, the employee will have a SEP to join a Marketplace plan.



### SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WABENO AREA ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the School District of Wabeno Area is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting Heather Ostrowski, Director of Special Education, School District of Wabeno Area, at 715-473-2592, or by writing her at P.O. Box 460, Wabeno, WI 54566.

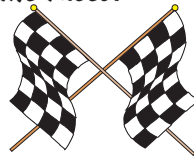

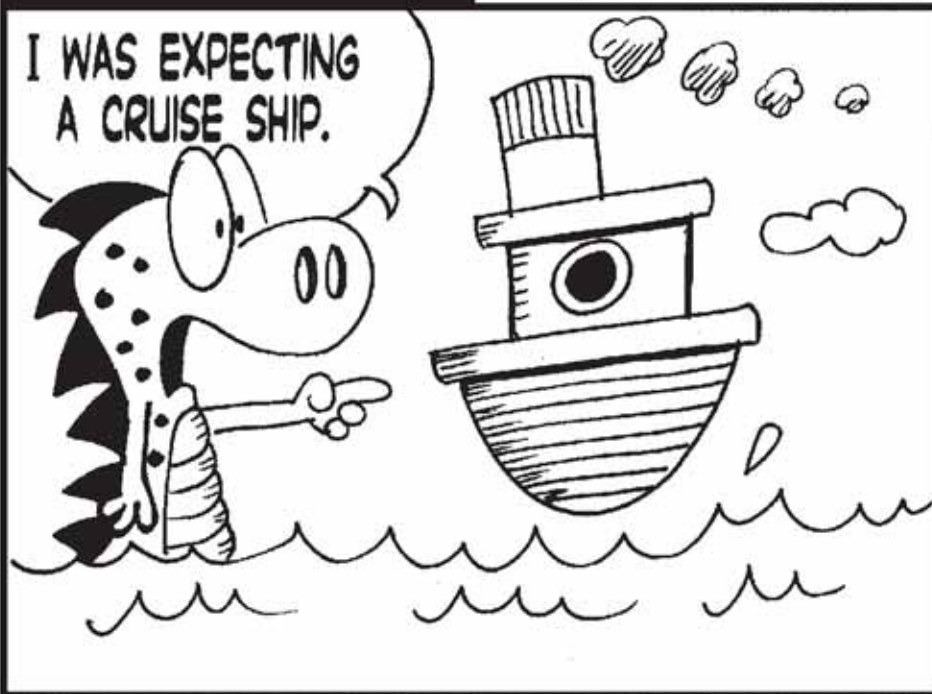

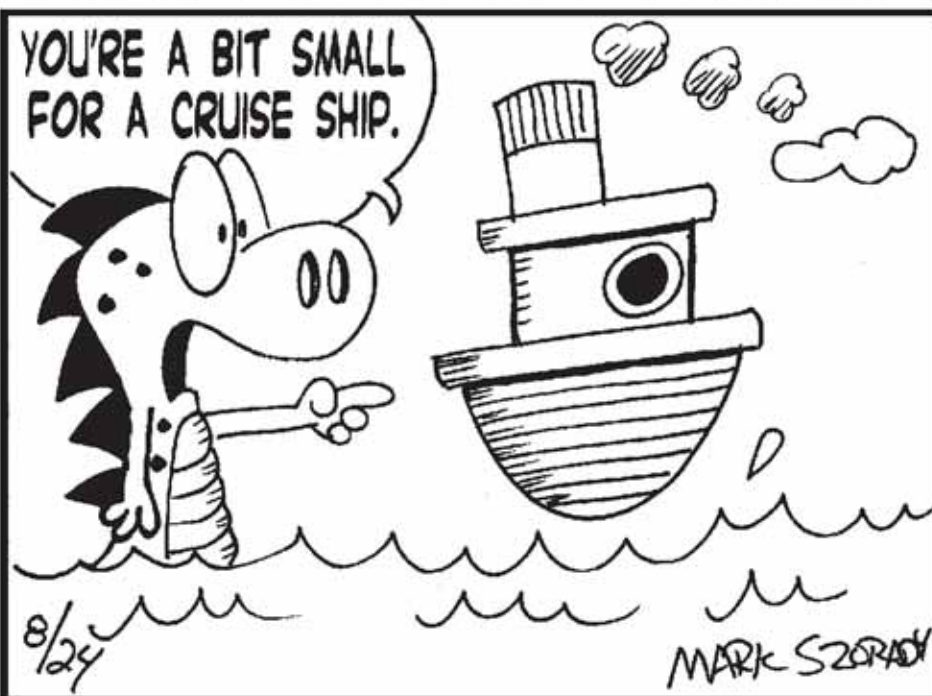
