





Cool Meals for Hot Days

As the temperature soars, your desire to turn on the stove likely wanes. Keep cool and stay healthy with these delicious, no-cook dinner ideas.

Rely on fresh produce: In the summer, vegetables and fruit are plentiful and at their flavorful peak. Use them for salads, appetizers, side dishes and dessert. 1 cup diced red pepper

4 cups diced tomatoes 2 cups English cucumber, seeded and diced

2 garlic cloves, minced

1 cup water

3 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

2 tbsp red wine or sherry vinegar

1/4 tsp coarse salt

1/4 cup fresh basil leaves

Directions: In a blender or food processor, combine the red pepper, tomatoes, cucumber, garlic, water, oil and vinegar. Process until coarsely pureed. Serve with a pinch of coarse salt and fresh basil leaves.



Getting Medicare part A Coverage

Medicare can be a challenging program to understand - particularly if you have a unique enrollment circumstance. Many folks will automatically be enrolled in Medicare Part A and not have to pay a premium for this coverage, but this is not the case for everyone. In general, if you or your spouse worked for 10 years in Medicarecovered employment, you are eligible to receiver Medicare Part A benefits without paying a premium. Medicare-covered employment is any job you or your spouse held in which you paid Medicare or PICA taxes. You ear one credit for every \$1,120 of taxable income with a maximum of four credits per year. Some people may have left the workforce early and, therefore, do not have enough work credits for premium-free Part A. While others may be new to th4e country and have only worked in the United States for a couple years. Regardless of the reason, it can be a difficult situation to navigate. Here are some things to keep in mind:

Medicare premiums are expensive. If a person has less than 30 work credits, the Part A monthly premium is \$407. If a person has 30-39 work credits, the premium is \$224 per month. Others who are eligible for the reduced premiums are:

- 1.) A spouse who has been married to a person with 30 or more work credits for at least one year;
- 2.) A widow who was married to a person with 30 or more work credits for at least one year propr to death; and
- 3.) A divorced spouse who was married to a person with 30 or more work credits for a period of at least 10 years immediately before the date of divorce if the insured spouse had at least 30 work credits at the time of divorce.

Part A late enrollment penalty. If a person is not eligible for premium-free Medicare Part A and does not buy it when he or she is first eligible, the penalty is an increase in the premium of 10%. The person will be subject to the higher premium for twice the number of years (period of 12 months total) he or she could have had Part A, but did not sign up.

For example, if someone was eligible for Part A in 2015, but only had 10 work credits, he or she would have a premium of \$407 each month. If the person waited 2 full years to enroll - he or she would have to pay \$447.70 per month in Part A premiums for 4 years.

Medicare Savings Program. A person may have his or her Part A premiums paid for by the state if he or she is eligible for a Medicare Savings Program called Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB). Eligibility is determined based on one's income and asset level. People who qualify at the lowest income level may be eligible for coverage for the Medicare Parts A and B deductibles, copays, and coinsurance, as well as coverage of the Part B \$104.90 monthly premium.

Marketplace. People not entitled to premium-free Part A may purchase a plan on the Marketplace. They would be eligible for subsidies via the Marketplace by virtue of not having premium free Medicare Part A coverage. While the Marketplace would provide minimum essential coverage, the individual would still be subject to late enrollment penalties from Medicare.

CJ Greaves will be looking to not only wrap up the 2015 TORC PRO 4x4 championship, but also another season title in the TORC PRO 2WD

After a full weekend of racing and concerts held within the track's massive 400-acre property, the 6th Annual Amsoil Challenge Cup will again serve as an intense and spectacular finale. The race will see TORC's PRO 2WD and PRO 4x4 classes let loose on the track at the same time after receiving staggered starts. In an Amsoil Challenge Cup record, the winner will take home \$46,000 in cash plus additional prizes from MasterCraft Safety and Lincoln Welders.

Last year it was a flying LeDuc that snatched the Amsoil Cup victory from both Greaves -- all piloting Monster Energy-sponsored TORC PRO 4x4 trucks.

For this year, the Greaves Motorsports team is taking steps to insure that performance won't happen again. "We've improved both our trucks to another level over 2014," said Johnny Greaves, himself a two-time Labor Day cup winner. "Our laps times at Crandon for the spring Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup race were faster than the quickest lap laid down at last year's Amsoil Cup race."

Part of that philosophy springs from the confidence found in fact that CJ Greaves has the lead in both the TORC PRO 2WD and PRO 4x4 categories, with Johnny a solid runner up in the later class. The younger Greaves will be battling Crandon's own Keegan Kincaid for the PRO 2WD title.

Wisconsin State Patrol Law of the Month: September 2015

Drivers should be patient, cautious, attentive, as school year

At the start of the school year, students are not the only ones who need to recall what they learned just a few months ago. Drivers also need to remember some important lessons.

"Drivers must be cautious when approaching students who are walking or riding bikes. They also will need to be careful around school buses that are loading or unloading passengers," says Lieutenant Steve G. Krueger of the Wisconsin State Patrol North Central Region.

Stop for school buses

Wisconsin law requires drivers to stop a minimum of 20 feet from a stopped school bus with its red warning lights flashing. Drivers must stop whether the bus is on their side of road, on the opposite side of the road, or at an intersection they are approaching. However, drivers are not required to stop for a school bus if they are traveling in the opposite direction on the other side of a divided roadway separated by a median or other physical barrier.

When they are passed illegally, school bus drivers are authorized to report the violator to a law enforcement agency and a citation may be issued. The owner of the vehicle, who might not be the offending driver, will then be responsible for paying the citation.

A citation for failure to stop for a school bus costs \$326.50 with four demerit points. If reported by a school bus driver, the vehicle owner's liability for the illegal passing of a bus costs \$326.50 with no demerit points. Students walking to school

State law requires drivers to yield to pedestrians:

- · Who have started crossing an intersection or crosswalk on a walk signal or on a green light if there's no walk signal. · Who are crossing the road within a marked or unmarked
- crosswalk at an intersection where there are no traffic lights or control signals.
- · When a vehicle is crossing a sidewalk or entering an alley or driveway.

In addition, drivers may not legally overtake and pass any vehicle that has stopped for pedestrians at an intersection or crosswalk.

Drivers who fail to yield the right of way to pedestrians who are legally crossing roadways may be issued citations that cost approximately \$175 to \$326 (depending on the type of violation) along with four demerit points on their license. The cost of the citation increases if it's the second violation within one year. A citation for passing a vehicle that is stopped for pedestrians costs \$326.50 with three demerit points. Students biking to school

When drivers are passing bicycles traveling in the same direction, they must leave a safe distance of no less than 3-feet of clearance and must maintain that clearance until they have safely passed the bicycle.

A violation of the state law that requires drivers to overtake and pass bicyclists safely costs a total of \$200.50 with three demerit points. The cost for a second violation within four years increases to \$263.50 with three points.

Lieutenant Krueger says, "As another school year begins, we are asking drivers to be patient, cautious and attentive whenever they are near students who are walking, biking or riding a bus."

Senator Johnson held question and answer session in Crandon

Senator Ron Johnson held a question and answer session in Crandon at the Hotel Crandon on Saturday, August 29th. Johnson started by stating that, " We share the same goal, we all want a safe, prosperous and secure America, Wisconsin and Crandon.

Johnson is the Chairman of the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee. He also serves on the committees on the Budget; Commerce, Science and Transportation; and Foreign Relations.

As Chairman of the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, there has been 49 pieces of legislation. Almost all of it has been unanimous. The committee has priorities that do not have an order but their concerns are border security, cyber security, protecting our critical info structure, and answering terrorist threats in America.

Governmental Affairs looks into abuse of taxpayers dollars in the form of fraudulent and wasteful programs and working on eliminating the wasteful spending or program. Senator Johnson also commented that the Good Neighbor authority was granted. He stated that it is a good program to give the logging industry a boost. There will be more opportunities for jobs and bringing money into Northern Wisconsin. He then opened the floor to questions.

Some of the concerns from the public were; veterans' health benefits decreasing, the V.A. in Tomah, planned parenthood, sugars in foods and drinks, and the

The first major concern was the Iran nuclear deal. Senator Johnson said that he is not in favor and that it is a bad deal. He also stated that it does appear to be going through because there will not be enough votes to override a veto from the president.

Johnson was asked what he is doing for medical benefits for the veterans. Benefits are decreasing and causing concern. Johnson replied that the investigation by his staff is still on going, referring to the V.A. hospital in Tomah and he hopes that in the future, veterans will have a choice on their medical benefits.

Senator Johnson was then asked about planned parenthood. Johnson responded that he is waiting to hear if planned parenthood is breaking the law. A bill to de-fund planned parenthood failed in the senate.

Hospice: What You Should Know

It is a fact of life that we must - at some point - deal with end-of-life issues. When an individual has been diagnosed with a terminal disease or condition, hospice care can be a wonderful care option. Hospice care was introduced to the United States in the 1970's, and it also

care can be a wonderful care option. Hospice care was introduced to the United States in the 1970's, and it ahs become an increasingly common treatment. Last year, 1/65 million people received hospice care, according to the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization. More people are utilizing hospice care, and more providers are entering the market.

For many families, however, hospice is an unfamiliar concept that prompts fear and questions. Following are answers to some common questions.

What is hospice care? Hospice provides endof-life care and support to people who are dying and their families, most often in a patient's home. By signing up for hospice, patients generally agree to stop all diseasefighting treatments, although some hospices allow such therapy if it is to help manage symptoms such as pain or problems breathing. Hospice's primary goal is to alleviate pain. Through a team of caregivers, hospice provides comprehensive care and instructs families on patient

How much care does hospice provide? Comprehensive care generally does not mean around-the-clock service, although many hospices do provide 24/7 care when the patient is in crisis or near death. Therefore, hospice may not be viable option for everyone as it may require involvement of family members or necessitate hiring a private nurse or home health aide.

Who pays for hospice care? Medicare covers most hospices for its beneficiaries. Private insurance plans and HMOs also generally pay for hospice care, but they may have a preferred provider. Daily co-pays and additional costs may be incurred by an insured.

If hospice is not a place, where do I get hospice care? For patients who can't be cared for at home, some hospices have inpatient facilities in freestanding centers or specially designated sections in hospitals or nursing homes.

When should I start to think about hospice? Most hospices require an order from the patient's physician as well as approval from the hospice medical director. Both must certify that the patient has six months or less to life if the illness runs its normal course. However, if a patient outlives that time, he or she can be "re-certified" to continue receiving hospice care. If you get better, you can leave hospice and go into active treatment.

How do I find a good hospice? First, seek recommendations from health-care providers and specialists. Ask which hospice they would use for themselves or a loved one. Next, call the recommended hospices and ask questions about the issues that matter most to you. You can then get a feel for if the hospice would meet you and your family needs through this conversation.
