Brown will talk about how the DWD can help businesses hire and retain veterans.


The first morning session, which is geared toward business professionals, will wrap up at 9 a.m.

The vintage depot on Highway 8, on the west side of Laona, awaits those who would like to buy a ticket for an enjoyable and educational trip to Camp 5 Logging Museum and all of the attractions that are offered.

While a visit to the Camp 5 Logging Museum is a visit to the past, there are other attractions that the whole family will enjoy. The pumpkin patch, face painting, and roasting marshmallows are always a hit with the younger

The museum gives an insight into the life and times of those pioneer loggers and lumbermen who built sawmills and towns in the wilderness. A working blacksmith shows how everyday tools and implements were created to do the work that was needed for this huge enterprise.

On October 3rd, the Green Bush-Wacker Cowboy Re-enactors make the day an extra special event! Beautiful horses, ridden by skilled horsemen, all dressed in the clothing of the era, liven up the scene as they fire "pretend," but loud bullets, and will likely pull off several train robberies during the course of the day. But the Old West wasn't just populated with cowboys. You may ride the train and sit next to a preacher, or a sheriff with his prisoner. Dance hall girls have also been known to ride the Lumberjack Steam Train when the Cowboys visit. You will know them when you see them!

Fall Festival is a great family event, and people of all ages will enjoy the day, the train ride and the beautiful autumn leaves. 





#### Social Security Payments, Dependents, and MAGI

BadgerCare Plus and the Marketplace are two ways to gain health insurance. If you make below \$11,770 in 2015, you are eligible for BadgerCare Plus. If you make above that limit, you are eligible for subsidized Marketplace insurance. Obviously, both programs require applicants to disclose their household income. Even if only one person is applying for health insurance, he must provide his income, his spouse's income, and sometimes his dependent's income.

Whether a dependent's income is added to the applicant's total income requires a separate test be done for the dependent(s). Social Security payments are not counted toward the dependent's income when determining if she will have to add her income to the applicant's income. However, if it is determined that a dependent's income is high enough that she will be "expected to be required to file taxes," but both dependent's income and any Social Security payments that she had received are added to the applicant's household income.

However, if the applicant received Supplemental Security Income (SSI), it is not included as income. It is easy to confuse this type of income with Social Security for obvious reasons. However, SSI is not paid out of the Social Security trust and is not a form of Social Security payment.

Dependents of individuals applying for BadgerCare Plus, or the Marketplace, have different rules when adding their income to that of the applicant. A dependent's income, under MAGI, is only added to the tax-filer's income when that dependent is "expected to be required to file taxes." A dependent is seen as expected to be required to file taxes when she has earned annual income of \$6,300, or annual unearned income of \$1,050.

When looking at a dependent's income and trying to calculate whether the dependent will be expected to be required to file taxes, Social Security and SSI are not counted. If the dependent has earned or unearned income







Steve Foltz returns home to perform with Trout Steak Revival Sept. 24 at Nicolet College



One of the first times Steve Foltz stepped on stage to play music in front of a live audience was in the 7th grade.

Foltz and his buddy D.J. Burdick entered the talent show at James Williams Middle School in Rhinelander. The 13-year-olds jammed on a medley of heavy metal cover tunes.

"It was pretty funny," Foltz said, fondly looking back. "We had another friend of ours running on stage to turn a strobe light on and off. We had a great time."

Let's just say his talents have grown considerably since his public musical debut 20 years ago.

On Thursday, September 24, Foltz will again take to the stage in Rhinelander, this time at Nicolet College with the fast-rising Trout Steak Revival, which is gaining national fame for its original bluegrass-inspired mountain music.

"I love the Northwoods and can't wait to get back to home," Foltz said during a phone interview from his current home in Colorado. "Rhinelander was a great place to grow up. I'm very happy and feel very lucky to come back as a professional musician."

Trout Steak's big break came in 2014 when it won top honors at the prestigious Telluride Bluegrass Festival, an event the band had played at since 2008 and which commonly attracts dozens of top bluegrass acts from across the country.

"That changed everything for us," said Foltz, a Class of 2000 Rhinelander High School graduate. "It was like climbing up from the bottom of a valley and looking out from the top of a mountain. All of our hard work had paid off."

The new level of national attention inspired the five band members to take on a higher level of commitment and work even harder.

Long known for writing their own original songs, "Telluride motivated us to write even more," he said. "We're also working on our four- and five-part harmony singing to expand our sound. It's important to all of us to always grow and improve as a band."

So what can one expect to experience at a Trout Steak show?

Foltz readily admits he's biased. "I like to think our shows are a great time. We have lots of fun playing and hope that comes through and translates into the audience having a lot of fun as well."

Foltz and the rest of Trout Steak Revival will take to the Nicolet College Theatre stage at 7:30 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 24. Tickets are \$15 and can be purchased online at nicoletlive.com or by calling (715) 365-4646.





When traveling through areas with abundant wildlife, remember a few quick safety tips

MILWAUKEE - Wisconsin's state parks, forests and wildlife areas are great places to experience the diversity of wildlife on our lands. As you are drive to and from these sites this fall be extra cautious, as many wildlife species are most active during dawn and dusk, traveling to and from foraging sites.

During August and September, more young wild animals are beginning to travel with the adults, and often know very little of the dangers of the road. Sandhill cranes and wild turkeys will commonly travel between roosting

sites and open forage fields, and young birds are still learning to fly during this time.

Below are some safety tips to keep in mind while driving in areas where wildlife may be most active:

If you see an animal in the road, slow down to avoid an accident;

Be vigilant in early morning and evening hours, the most active time for most wildlife; and

Be especially cautious on roads bordered by


