2015 WI WINS Results for Forest County

For the past several months the Northwoods Tobacco Free Coalition (NWTF) has been conducting tobacco compliance checks throughout Forest County. Compliance checks are now complete for 2015, which leaves Forest County with an illegal sales rate of 21.05%. This is up from the 2014 illegal sales rate of 17.6%. Carly Trapp, 2015 WI WINS intern stated that "The biggest issue we noticed this year was clerks were unable to properly check youth's ID and ended up selling them tobacco".

Wisconsin Wins and the Forest County Health Department encourage all clerks selling tobacco to consistently card anyone who looks under the age of 40 and to refuse the sale of a tobacco product without proper verification of age. If your establishment would like more information on how to properly train employees and avoid potential fines please visit. If we all work together we can help to improve the health of our youth and improve our community's future by refusing to sell tobacco to minors.

5 Ways to Get the Most of Out of Your Fruits and Veggies

There are still many steps you can take to ensure a healthy nutrient punch every time you include fruits and vegetables in your diet.

Go with locally grown. The key to getting more nutrients is eating food that spends less time traveling from the field to your table. The way to accomplish that goal is with locally grown produce, either from your own garden or from a local farmer's market. Buy fresh, whole, and locally grown seasonal produce. Try to purchase produce with the least amount of time from farm to table, as vitamins and minerals are lost over time as well as with cooking and handling.

Choose frozen. Your natural instinct when eating produce is to think that fresh is always better than frozen. But that isn't necessarily the case. Sometimes the veggies frozen right after harvest have retained more nutrients than those "fresh" veggies that have taken forever to get to your plate.

Don't judge a book by its cover. Big, shiny fruits and vegetables sure look good and grab your attention in the supermarket, but just because they're beautiful doesn't mean they're better for you. For example, organic apples may be smaller and not quite as pretty, but their pesticide levels are likely to be lower.

Keep them rough. When it comes time to prepare those fruits and vegetables for eating, bigger, rougher pieces of produce may have the nutritional edge over finely chopped and sliced options. Keep chopping to a minimum. The greater the exposure of the fruit or vegetables to air, the greater the loss of nutrients.

Lions/Lioness conduct vision/hearing screening



Recently, the McCaslin Lioness and Wabeno Lions provided Vision and Hearing screening at the Wabeno Elementary and HeadStart. Children from age three to seven were screened, using the SPOT PediaVision camera. This screening, which just takes seconds, allows early detection of a mix of vision problems with young children. This does not replace a complete, comprehensive eye examination by an optometrist, however, provides the parents with a printout to help them determine if follow-up care is needed.

The Lions/Lioness also conducted hearing tests utilizing a portable audiometer. The children put on a head set, and motioned when they heard the frequencies. If necessary, the school contacts the parents for further testing.

House of Representatives Passes Bipartisan Border Jobs for Veterans Act

Bill would increase recruiting, expedite hiring of separating U.S. military service members for Border Patrol

WASHINGTON – U.S. Sens. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), Jeff Flake (R-Ariz.), John McCain (R-Ariz.) and Chuck Schumer (D-N.Y.) applauded the House of Representatives for passing H.R. 2835, the Border Jobs for Veterans Act, introduced by U.S. Representative Martha McSally and companion legislation to Senate approved S. 1603, the Border Jobs for Veterans Act. This bipartisan legislation will help put veterans to work as Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officers at understaffed U.S. ports of entry without raising costs or impacting existing veteran hiring authorities.

"I am pleased to see the Border Jobs for Veterans Act, which I cosponsored with Senators Flake, McCain and Schumer, pass the House this evening. This is an important, incremental step towards enhancing our border security," said Johnson. "Since becoming chairman of the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, I have looked closely at border security through a series of site visits, committee hearings and roundtables. One common theme that has emerged is that manpower plays a vital role in securing the border, both at and between our ports of entry. This bill gives former service members an opportunity to continue serving by ensuring the Department of Homeland Security and the Department of Defense work together to identify these qualified applicants and provide DHS with the best candidates to fill vacancies in remote ports of entry along our borders. Now, with the House's action, we can quickly get this to the President's desk for signature."

"Veterans need jobs and our ports need CBP officers. Solutions don't get more straightforward than

that," said Flake. "This legislation will put veterans to work, improve national security, increase trade, and grow the economy—all at no additional cost to the taxpayer. I thank my colleagues in the House, especially Congresswoman McSally, for their efforts in bringing this legislation closer to the President's desk."

"I came to Washington to get things done and advance solutions that will make a difference for the people of Southern Arizona. Today's bill does just that," said McSally. "It's a win-win for our district. It boosts staffing at our ports of entry and helps returning service members find jobs, and is the result of numerous conversations I've had with CBP officers working along our border. The failure to fully staff our ports slows trade coming across the border, hurting not just local communities, but our entire region's

reputation as a leading trade hub. My bill helps to solve this problem by ensuring the Departments of Defense and Homeland Security are working together to fill these positions with already-trained and qualified veterans."

"This bill offers a common-sense solution to help separating service members find much-needed jobs, overcome staffing deficiencies at U.S. ports of entry, and enhance the security of communities in Arizona and across the U.S. on our southern border," said McCain. "I thank Congresswoman McSally for advancing this bipartisan effort in the House, which will provide veterans vital opportunities to continue serving and protecting the nation."

"This legislation connects our veterans to jobs they're already qualified to fill, improves the flow of tourism, goods and services, and secures our borders. It is a win-win-win and I'm glad the House has passed it. It's our solemn responsibility to take care of our veterans when they return home, and that means helping them to find a good-paying job. The fact that veterans can fill much-needed positions along the Northern Border in New York is an added bonus. This bill is just plain common sense, and I hope we get it to the President's desk quickly," said Schumer

With a 62.5% completion rate, the program organizers were pleased as the initial goal was for 50% of participants that started the program to complete it. There were participants of all activity levels and the majority of program finishers reported an improvement in overall health whether it was weight loss, lowering blood sugar, lowering blood pressure, improved flexibility, increased mood etc. The relationships formed, horizons broadened and healthy habits developed over these 9 weeks is sure to have a lasting effect on the health of these individuals and a step in the right direction for the Forest County Community.

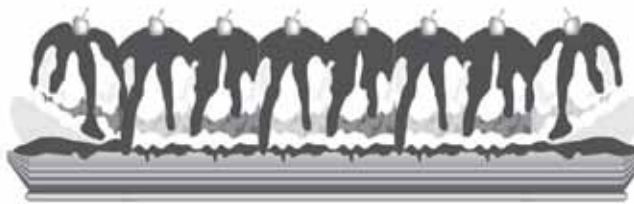


