More on the mushroom

This mushroom gets more attention than Hilary Clinton! Okay, you Republicans, don't start making those comparisons!

While there have been a number of attempts by readers, we think DNR Forester Liz Wood is probably right when she says it is commonly known as a "cowpie mushroom." John Lampereur concurs on this and furnished the Latin name, which is Phaeolus schweinitzii. John says another name is "velvet top."

Vivian Thompson of Townsend, however, identified the mushroom as polyporous sulphureus, but didn't supply the common name. From an internet search, we think that this is commonly called "chicken of the woods," an ID we had from another reader.

Regardless, it is hard to identify the many types of mushrooms from a photo in the paper.

The lichen we featured last week is an easy one to identify. From the book "Lichens of the North Woods," it is easily identified as the trumpet lichen.

But, Andy Roelse called in and said the lichen was a "pixie cup." After checking the book, he could be right. The lichen book said that some lichens can only be identified by a chemical analysis. It is one of the two!



Prepare to Fall Back by Checking Home Detectors

Daylight Savings Time ends this Sunday as we "fall back" and set clocks back one hour. This is also a great time to check things that keep us safe and ready for emergencies such as smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.

"This fall, we've already seen reports of people taken to hospitals after suffering from carbon monoxide poisoning," said Brian Satula, Wisconsin Emergency Management Administrator. "In many cases, the source of the carbon monoxide is a malfunctioning home furnace."

According to the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, about 450 people each year in Wisconsin are taken to hospital emergency rooms for symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning. At high levels, carbon monoxide can cause death within minutes. Symptoms of overexposure to carbon monoxide include headaches, fatigue, dizziness, shortness of breath, nausea and confusion. If you suspect you may be experiencing carbon monoxide poisoning, or your detector sounds an alarm, head outside immediately for fresh air and call 911.

"As we turn back our clocks, it's important to also check home devices that protect our families from carbon monoxide poisoning," said Karen McKeown, State Health Officer. "To prepare for winter weather, Wisconsin residents should ensure their source of heat and their carbon monoxide detectors are in good working order."

To protect your family from carbon monoxide, follow these safety tips:

- Make sure you have working carbon monoxide detectors. All homes and duplexes in Wisconsin are required to have detectors on every level, including the basement, but not the attic or storage areas. Detectors can be purchased at most hardware stores.
- Have your furnace or wood-burning stove inspected annually. Hire a professional to make sure it is functionally sound and vents properly outside the home.
- Never run a gasoline or propane heater or a grill (gas or charcoal) inside your home or in an unventilated garage. Any heating system that burns fuel produces carbon monoxide. Use a battery-powered detector where you have fuel burning devices but no electronic outlets, such as in tents, cabins, RVs and boats with enclosed cabins.
- Never run a car in an enclosed space. If a vehicle is running, you must have a door open to the outside.
- Generators should be run a safe distance from the home. Never run a generator in the home or garage, or right next to windows or doors.

Smoke detectors - Three out of five home fire deaths happen from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms. Check and replace batteries if needed and make sure the devices around your house are working properly. The U.S. Consumer Products Safety Commission estimates that about 16 millions homes in the nation have smoke alarms that do not work, due, in most cases, to dead or missing batteries.

Emergency Kits - Everyone should have a basic emergency kit in their home with supplies such as food and water to last you and your family for at least three days. Other items like a battery powered or crank radio, flashlights, and first aid kit should also be included. Daylight Savings Time is a perfect time to get a kit and if you already have a kit, check it to make sure food and other items are not near or past their expiration dates.

Following an acute heart attack, patients are faced with many concerns about their health. Your cardiologist will advise you of medications and lifestyle changes according to your degree of heart disease and heart damage. Patients often ask:

How long will I need to rest after my heart attack? Rest is important after a heart attack, but it's equally important for you to participate in normal activities and social events as much as possible. Some level of daily physical activity will be recommended. Most heart attack patients find they soon have plenty of energy for both work and leisure activities.

How much rehabilitation will I need? Participating in a cardiac rehab program is vital after heart attack - it can actually help you live longer. Rehab specialists will teach you to: follow a heart-healthy food plan, exercise safely guided by physical therapists, manage stress and anxiety, quit tobacco if you use it, and avoid a second heart attack.



Are You Eating Too Much Protein?

Protein, usually regarded as the dieter's panacea for losing weight, building muscle, and burning fat, might come with a side of unintended consequences, a new study published in the International Journal of Obesity found.

Researchers at the Cleveland Clinic analyzed the nutritional and lifestyle habits of 10,971 overweight Americans and found that weight-loss efforts, including changes to diets and diet pills, can cause unintended kidney damage to dieters with chronic kidney disease. And with one in five Americans living with chronic kidney disease and more than two in five overweight, this is thought to be a growing problem.

Of the participants studied, 50 percent reported trying to lose weight within the past year. Regardless of whether they were attempting to lose weight, the average participant consumed more protein than is recommended by the National Kidney Foundation for chronic kidney disease patients.

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the average American consumes about 15 percent of his or her daily calories from protein. One gram of protein is equivalent to four calories, so for example, in a 2,000-calorie diet, 15 percent translates to 75 grams of protein every day. People living with chronic kidney disease are advised to consume a little fewer than half that amount.

Even dieters without chronic kidney disease are advised to watch their protein intake -- particularly if their protein is coming from high-fat sources such as some cuts of red meat and full-fat dairy. Nutritionist Teresa Fung of Simmons College in Boston, told U.S. World News and Report that protein consumption above 35 percent of total daily calorie intake in considered high protein, and that that level is not necessarily recommended. However, it's important to remember that your individual protein needs vary depending on your goals and your activity level. A recent position paper published by the American College of Sports Medicine argued that active people should aim to eat 0.5 to 0.8 grams of protein per pounds of body weight every day. By this measure, a 150-pound active person eating 2,000 calories per day should consume between 75 and 120 grams of protein daily.

236,000 Wisconsinites to Face Massive Medicare Premium Hike Unless Congress Acts

Baldwin bill would prevent premium hike and keep financial burden off states

State of Wisconsin will be forced to cover \$29.3 million of the increase

WASHINGTON, D.C. – U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin today released detailed information regarding the direct impact that would be felt by Wisconsin residents if Congress does not prevent the looming massive Medicare Part B premium hike. Last week, Senator Baldwin joined Senate Finance Committee Ranking Member Ron Wyden and Senate Democrats in introducing legislation that would protect Medicare beneficiaries and states from the sharp rise in Part B premiums and deductibles in 2016. The Protecting Medicare Beneficiaries Act of 2015 ensures that Medicare premiums and deductibles will not increase in 2016.

"This commonsense measure will protect Wisconsinites and millions of seniors across the country from an abrupt and dramatic increase in Medicare costs," said Senator Baldwin. "I urge my colleagues to act quickly and prevent this premium hike for Wisconsin seniors."

Due to a lack of a Social Security Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for 2016, 30 percent of enrollees in the Medicare Part B program, which covers physician and outpatient services for seniors in Wisconsin, face a 52-percent premium increase if Congress does not act. According to AARP, an estimated 16.5 million individuals, including 236,000 in Wisconsin, will see their premiums increase. Of these estimated 16.5 million individuals, about 7.5 million will be forced to pay the premium increase out-of-pocket, including 124,000 in Wisconsin.

The other 9 million are dual-eligible beneficiaries, meaning they are enrolled in both Medicare and Medicaid and, by law, states are required to cover the premium and deductible increase facing these individuals, including 112,000 in Wisconsin.

The National Association of Medicaid Directors has estimated that, without Congressional action, this premium increase cost would cost state budgets throughout the country more than \$2.3 billion, including \$29.3 million for Wisconsin's state budget in 2016 alone. This premium increase and new burden on state budgets could also force Wisconsin to reduce benefits or make cuts to other areas of the Medicaid program. Furthermore, given that Wisconsin has already completed its budget for Fiscal Year 2016, a special session could be needed.

Johnson Co-Sponsors Resolution Opposing the EPA's Plan to Make Electricity Rates Skyrocket

Washington — Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, joined 47 other senators today in co-sponsoring a resolution to disapprove of the Environment Protection Agency's (EPA) proposed regulations for existing power sources.

"I am again disappointed in the EPA's use of executive overreach to harm Wisconsin families and businesses by putting at risk our ability to have affordable, dependable and reliable energy," Sen. Johnson said. "As he promised as a candidate, President Obama's latest regulatory overreach from the EPA would certainly cause electricity prices to skyrocket in Wisconsin and across the country. The best estimate right now is that his proposed plan would end up costing Americans \$7,000 per person. Wisconsinites deserve better. We can have both a clean environment and a healthy economy — in fact, we need a strong and healthy economy in order to afford the pollution controls necessary for a clean environment. The EPA's regulatory overreach continues to take us in the wrong direction."







- Skin soother: Honey is a popular ingredient, along with beeswax, in natural lotions and lip balms. Its antimicrobial properties are thought to make it a good choice as a home acne treatment. Combine honey with warm water and oatmeal for an all-natural skin scrub.
- Energy booster: Honey, like all sugars, can provide a temporary energy boost and spike in blood glucose, and it's a healthier option than many sugar substitutes. Research shows that diabetics can eat limited amounts of honey too, provided they're closely monitoring blood sugar levels.




