



Robert Otto Trick, 64 of Argonne, WI, passed away, February 13, peacefully at home.


Robert was born June 19, 1951, in Oak Creek, Wisconsin, to the late Joseph and Luella Trick.

#### Farmers and Ranchers: The Original Conservationists

**Conservation Program Restores Wildlife; Helps Farmers** Care for Land, Air, Water

The modern environmental conservation movement is one that has brought awareness and conservation practices to many urban audiences. To some, it probably seems like a recent shift in American thinking.

But American farmers and ranchers throughout rural and tribal lands were the original conservationists, wasting nothing and preserving as much as possible. And in recent decades, they've produced some amazing results that everyone should know about as a result of the USDA Conservation Reserve Program, or CRP.

This relatively young program, in farming terms, just entered its 30th year. CRP is a voluntary program where farmers remove environmentally-sensitive land from production for 10 to 15 years. Farmers re-establish key plant species, like approved grasses or trees, to improve water quality, prevent soil erosion, and create wildlife habitat. In return, farmers receive modest annual payments.

Since 1985, producers enrolled in CRP all across the nation have been responsible for restoring 2.7 million acres of wetlands and protecting 170,000 stream miles—enough to go around the world seven times. This protected water is responsible for reducing nitrogen and phosphorus runoff by 95 and 85 percent relative to cropland, respectively.

The program has enabled farmers and ranchers to reduce soil erosion by more than 9 billion tons, and even sequester 1.4 billion metric tons of greenhouse gasses-equal to taking 9 million cars off the road every

These restoration efforts also have an amazing and nearly immediate benefit to wildlife population, such as ducks, pheasants, sage grouse, and the lesser prairie chicken -- even grazing for elk and moose, improved habitat for pollinating honeybees, and clearer streams for trout. In one area of the northern Great Plains, known as the Prairie Pothole Region, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service estimates that duck populations have increased by 1.5 to 2 million ducks per year. Many outdoors organizations also support CRP for its contribution to recreational activities such as hunting and fishing.

The success of CRP and a statutory limit on the number of acres that can be enrolled in the program will mean this year's enrollment period will be one of the most competitive in recent history. The application deadline is February 26. The most competitive applications will be those that combine multiple conservation benefits, such as water quality and wildlife habitat.

There are a lot of great conservation activities across the country, but when I think about the largest positive impacts to the rural environment, it's only natural that the American farmer and rancher are at the top of the list.

Nashville with the acquisition of a used fire engine from the Stone Lake Volunteer Fire Department in Sawyer County Wisconsin. The used fire engine represents a significant upgrade from the old 1975 engine which was donated to the department in the early 2000's. Increased pump size, double the storage space, simpler operation, and excellent condition of the apparatus were several key factors in the purchase. It has also allowed significant standardization of equipment between this engine and the one based at Station Three in the Town of Ainsworth. Moving forward, that standardization will make training of personnel easier and improve operations.

Acquisition of this used engine at a considerable cost savings compared to the purchase of a new truck also puts the department in a position to move forward with further upgrades to its equipment. The Pickerel Volunteer Fire Department would like to extend their gratitude to the Stone Lake Fire Department, its own personnel who assisted in finding the truck and getting it ready for service, Ainsworth and Nashville townships, and most of all to the community which supports the department making these improvements possible.

### Veteran's Corner

**Vietnam Service "Presumptive" Disability Benefits** 

VA presumes that specific disabilities diagnosed in certain veterans were caused by their military service. VA does this because of the unique circumstances of their military service. If one of these conditions is diagnosed in a veteran, VA presumes that the circumstances of his/her service caused the condition, and disability compensation can be awarded.

The following health conditions are presumptively recognized for service in Vietnam:

Veterans with one or more recognized conditions do not have to show that their illness is related to their military service to get disability compensation.

VA presumes that their condition is serviceconnected. Conditions include chloracne, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, soft tissue sarcoma, Hodgkin's disease, porphyria cutanea tarda, multiple myeloma, respiratory cancers including cancers of the lung, larynx, trachea, and bronchus, prostate cancer, acute and subacute transient peripheral neuropathy, type 2 diabetes, and chronic lymphocytic leukemia.

Certain conditions are also recognized for the children of Vietnam veterans:

Covered birth defects include a wide range conditions. Eighteen defects are specifically included and others not specifically excluded are covered.

Vietnam veterans who served in the Republic of Vietnam between 1/9/62 and 5/7/75, and later contracted any of these conditions, or have children with birth defects, should apply for disability compensation benefits. There are no time limits to apply.

#### Go for the Green

Green fruits and vegetables contain many healthpromoting phyto-chemicals including lutein and indoles. They help protect against certain cancers and help maintain vision health and strong bones and teeth.

Some green fruits and vegetables include leafy greens, asparagus, green peppers, broccoli, green beans, peas, cabbage, green onion, Brussel sprouts, okra, zucchini, Chinese cabbage, green apples, green grapes, honeydew melon, kiwifruit and limes.

Some green ideas for St. Patrick's Day (or any day)

- Tossed lettuce salad. Add extra green with green peppers if you like.
- Corned beef with cabbage is a natural for St.
- Include some kiwi fruit, green grapes and/or honeydew melon in your fruit salad.
- Add avocado slices to salads and sandwiches. To maintain avocados' green color, eat them immediately or sprinkle them with lemon or lime juice. Though two tablespoons of avocado have about 5 grams of fat, it's mostly heart-healthy monounsaturated fat.

  - Have a vegetable pizza with green peppers.





#### Chairman Johnson releases report on flawed Dept. of Labor Process that could hurt retirement savers

WASHINGTON — Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, released a report Wednesday, "The Labor Department's Fiduciary Rule: How a Flawed Process Could Hurt Retirement Savers," detailing the Labor Department's flawed process in handing down its fiduciary rule.

"The Labor Department's rule threatens to harm low- and middle-income Americans by increasing the cost of investment advice," said Johnson. "Saving for retirement is important, and investing can be a complex process. Ensuring Americans' access to investment advice will help them plan for retirement. Americans saving their hard-earned money shouldn't face additional hurdles imposed by Washington."

Johnson's inquiry revealed that the Labor Department disregarded concerns and recommendations from career, nonpartisan, professional staff at the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), regulatory experts at the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs (OIRA) within the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), and Treasury Department officials. The report shows how the Labor Department pushed to issue the regulation at the expense of thoughtful deliberation. The report presents signs that political appointees at the White House played a key role in driving the rulemaking process. Details of the report:

- -- Despite public assurances that the Labor Department had collaborated with the SEC, emails reveal discord between the agencies about the rulemaking. A Labor Department employee wrote to his SEC counterpart: "We have now gone far beyond the point where your input was helpful to me. . . . If you have nothing new to bring up, please stop emailing me." The SEC staffer responded: "I am now also utterly confused as to what the purpose of the proposed DOL rule is."
- -- Career, nonpartisan SEC staff identified at least 26 items of concern related to the substantive content of the proposed rule, and the Labor Department declined to fully resolve all of the concerns.
- -- After the Labor Department sought to address the SEC's stated items of concern, a senior SEC official emphasized to the Labor Department that concerns remained:

[W]e continue to believe that commentators are likely to raise concerns that the proposal may result in reduced pricing options, rising costs and limited access to retirement advice, particularly for retail investors. Commentators also may express concerns that brokerdealers, as a practical matter, may be unlikely to use the exemptions provided and may stop providing services because of the number of conditions imposed, likely costs, and lack of clarity around provisions.

- The Labor Department rejected the SEC's recommendation and ignored requirements set in executive orders to quantify the costs and benefits of alternative approaches. As a Labor Department employee explained. "We think this would be extraordinarily difficult and would appreciably delay the project for very little return."
- -- Treasury officials voiced concerns that the Labor Department's proposal, by attempting to regulate IRAs, "fl[ies] in the face of logic" and was contrary to congressional intent. The Labor Department promulgated the proposed rule less than two weeks after circulating this draft, undoubtedly limiting the extent to which the department considered the comments it received from the Treasury Department.
- -- The administration was predetermined to regulate the industry and sought evidence to justify its action. In emails to senior White House advisors, a Labor Department official wrote of the need to find literature and data that "can be woven together to demonstrate that there is a market failure and to monetize the potential benefits of fixing it." In another email, a Labor Department official discussed "building the case for why the rule is necessary.'




#### Rebel girls defeat D2 Menominee 48-42!


#### Rebels defeat Cougars 79-55
