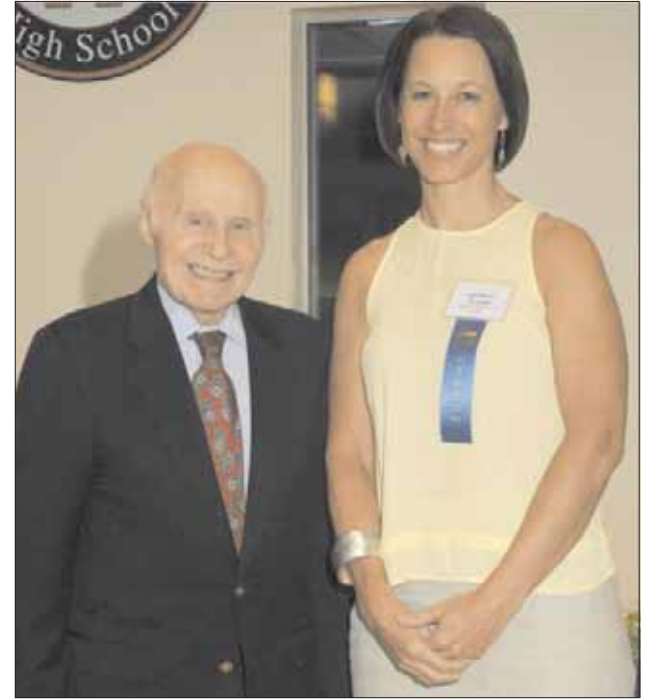

Kathie has written, produced, directed, and starred as Cathouse Cate in The Red Light Saloon, a musical comedy series that pays tribute to the hardy souls who tamed the Northwoods. All of these productions were staged a fund-raisers for the Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum in Lakewood where she is the Curator and tour guide. Between 2007 and 2013, she raised well over a hundred thousand dollars to fund a total restoration of the Museum.

Kathie grew up on a dairy farm in Sherwood, Wisconsin. She attended Mount Mary College in Milwaukee, majoring in English and History, and taught middle and high school English in the Kaukauna Public Schools for 35 year. Kathie and Jon share four children, five grandchildren, and two great-grandsons.

**Natural Resources Board approves 2016 deer harvest quotas and season structure**

MADISON - The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board approved deer hunting season framework and antlerless deer quotas for 2016 at its May 25 meeting in Madison.

Final season framework reflects recommendations from County Deer Advisory Councils - 2016 marks the second year these councils have played a key role in Wisconsin's deer management efforts. In addition to direct feedback from councils, 5,574 questionnaires were received during a public input process.

Ten deer management units will not have an antlerless quota (each within the Northern and Central Forest zones), while the rest of Wisconsin will have a quota of 256,775 antlerless deer (compared to 224,735 in 2015). A decrease in buck-only counties compared to the last two years (19 in 2014 and 12 in 2015) is a good indication that councils are seeing herds rebound in Northern Forest Zone counties.

The issuance of bonus deer hunting permits, in addition to farmland zone permits included with each deer hunting license, will include 22,775 permits valid on public access lands (compared to 18,450 in 2015) and 136,875 permits valid on private lands (compared to 125,375 in 2015). As a reminder, bonus antlerless permit sales for the Forest zones begin Monday, Aug.15 at 10 a.m. Central Farmland Zone permits will go on sale Aug. 16, and Southern Farmland Zone bonus permits will be made available Aug. 17.

A Holiday Hunt will be held in 13 counties and provide for an additional antlerless-only opportunity for firearm hunters from Dec. 24 to Jan.1. In addition, junior license holders in Ashland, Sawyer and Forest counties will not be allowed to harvest antlerless deer - these councils exercised their right to submit this recommendation in an effort to encourage increased herd growth.

**White Lake School visits Holt & Balcom Museum**

White Lake Elementary School third through six graders visited the Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum on May 19. They were accompanied by their teachers Mrs. Thompson (Grades 5-6) and Mrs. Schuessler (Grades 3-4) and several parents acting as chaperones. To say the students were enthusiastic about their day away from the classroom is an understatement.

Each student got the opportunity to stamp a log, use a two-person saw, and get up close and personal with the artifacts and tools contained in the camp's cookshack and bunkhouse. There were lots of laughs and lots of learning happening that sunny morning. Students came away with a greater appreciation of their logging heritage as well as for the men who helped to transform the northwoods over a century ago. They also learned a new slogan for future reference: "Museums Hold Memories."

People often say there is nothing new under the sun. That would be inaccurate in this case. For the first time since any of the volunteer staff can remember, the student visitors did something both remarkable and memorable. As the group was about to leave for a tour of the Cathedral Pines virgin pine preserve on Archibald Lake, Mrs. Schuessler stepped forward to make an announcement. She said the kids had sponsored a bake sale, and they wished to give the camp a \$50 donation from the money raised. Camp Manager and Tour Leader Bob Brown gratefully accepted their donation on behalf of the Museum.

The main mission of Holt & Balcom is preservation of the oldest logging camp sitting on the location where it was built. A close second is education. On May 19, both hosts and visitors could say Mission Accomplished!



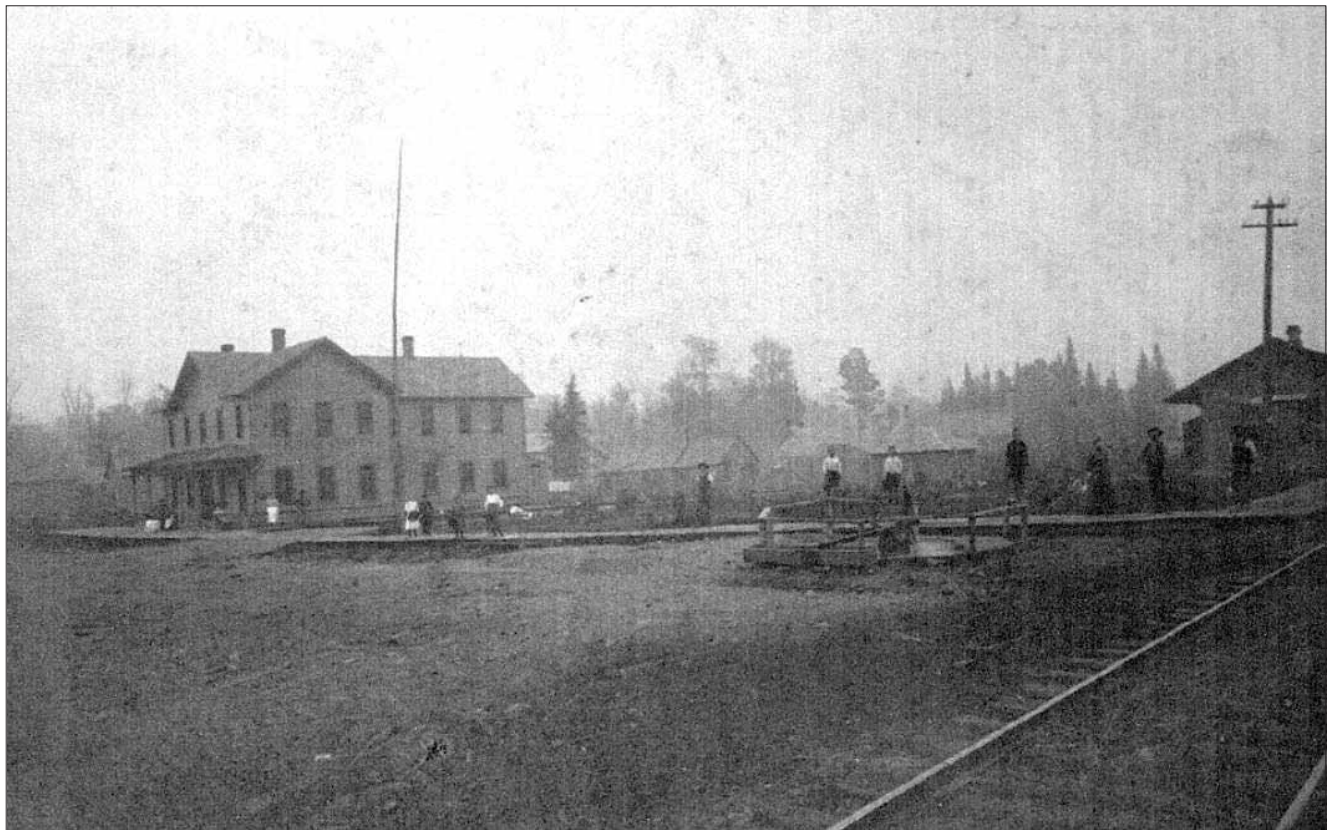

## For Old Time's Sake



Back in the 1920's, you may have taken your car to be repaired at this place or bought a tank of gas. Called the round-roofed garage by many in more recent times, the old building was used by Maurice Roberts for his logging business for years. When this picture was taken, it was a Studebaker dealership. This may be a bad guess, but we think the owner was Leo Samz, but we will be glad to correct this if you know and tell us!  
 This is now the home site of Steve Schultz, who probably wouldn't mind having a couple of the vintage cars that used to be parked on this spot in Argonne.

## For Old Time's Sake



We apologize for the condition of this old photo, but when you are this old, you won't look so good either! The VanZile Hotel is on the left, the Soo Line Depot is on the right. If you are thinking that they called this town Argonne, you would be wrong. It was taken in VanZile. Of course, the name was later changed to North Crandon, and in 1921, it was changed to Argonne, but it was not Argonne when the picture was snapped!  
 The VanZile Hotel sat where the old bank is now, and there are numerous businesses on the street that runs parallel to the railroad tracks where the ball diamond and town park is today. The Hill family owned the hotel in later years, but it burned down one day when Mrs. Hill was making pies in the wood-fired kitchen stove. This is according to the late Russell Samz.  
 The year was probably some time not too long after 1887, as the Soo Line came through in that year, and started calling VanZile North Crandon.

## For Old Time's Sake



This photo was sent to us by this lady's granddaughter, Christine Chartraw. Those growing up in Argonne back in the 50's and early 60's knew her as Grandma Holler.  
 Grandma Holler ran the New Argonne Inn, just across the side street to the east from the round-roofed garage. There were a number of hotels in the railroad town of Argonne in those days. People riding the Soo Line who had to spend the night in Argonne used the hotels, as did the loggers who came in from the camps on the weekend.  
 In her old age, she lived in a small house next to the Catholic Church. She was bent way over from the waist, but still moved around her garden and flower beds and never hesitated to straighten out kids who weren't behaving well.

### GACHS boasts successful forensics season





### Abby Ashbeck brings home medals from SkillsUSA competition

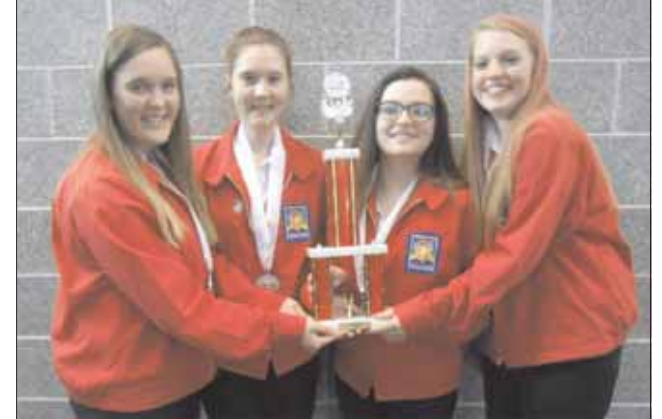

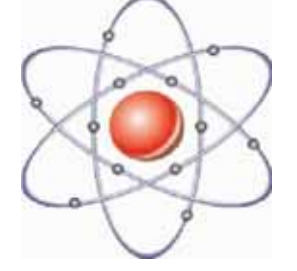

**Chairman Johnson votes to reject Fiduciary Rule**

WASHINGTON — On Tuesday Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, voted to reject the Labor Department's fiduciary rule. Chairman Johnson released a report in February detailing the Labor Department's flawed process in handing down the rule that hurts investors saving for retirement.

Johnson had this to say after his vote, which was in favor of H.J. Res. 88, a resolution of disapproval of the rule:

"Americans saving their hard-earned money for retirement shouldn't be forced to deal with additional hurdles and costs imposed by bureaucrats in Washington. This rule will likely increase compliance costs for advisers, driving up the price of their services and decreasing access to advice for low- and middle-income investors. By voting for this resolution of disapproval, we are saying the regulatory overreach of the Obama administration must stop."

### Staying Well: Healing Foods

Why Should I Choose Fruits & Vegetables?

- Excellent source of fiber
- Rich in vitamins and minerals
- Low in calories and most are fat-free
- Provide a food source of water - being made up of more than 50% water

Abundant in phytochemicals and antioxidants  
 • Helps reduce risk of various diseases such as cancer, obesity, heart disease, arthritis, asthma, macular degeneration and diverticulosis

#### Specific Considerations

#### Phytochemicals

Phytochemicals ('phyto' means plant) are naturally occurring plant chemicals  
 • Phytochemicals are not yet classified as nutrients. Nutrients are substances necessary for sustaining life. Phytochemicals have been identified as containing properties that aid in disease prevention  
 • In the human body, some phytochemicals act as antioxidants, some protect and regenerate essential nutrients, while others work to deactivate cancer-causing substances

Thousands of phytochemicals have been identified in the plant foods we eat

One serving of fruit or vegetables may contain 100 different phytochemicals. Some are available when the vegetable is raw, and other when the vegetable is cooked. It is important to eat a mix of raw and cooked vegetables to gain the most benefit from phytochemicals.

Cooking method matters; steaming helps retain water soluble vitamins like B vitamins and vitamin C rather than boiling

High cooking temperature and long cooking times also destroy heat sensitive nutrients such as B vitamins, vitamin C, and folate, so keep cooking times short

#### Antioxidants

The most well known phytochemicals are the antioxidants. Antioxidants protect cells from damage caused by metabolic by-products (free radicals), as well as toxic substances from food and the environment. As our bodies use oxygen to produce energy, free radicals are formed that may damage cells and lead to cellular dysfunction and disease. Colorful plant foods are loaded with antioxidants so eating a variety of fruits and vegetables is a great way to protect the body from oxidation, and reduce the risk of numerous health conditions.

#### Examples of antioxidants:

- Beta carotene - carrots, cantaloupe
- Vitamin C - citrus, cantaloupe, mango and kiwi
- Vitamin E - dark leafy greens, broccoli

- Selenium - mushrooms, cabbage

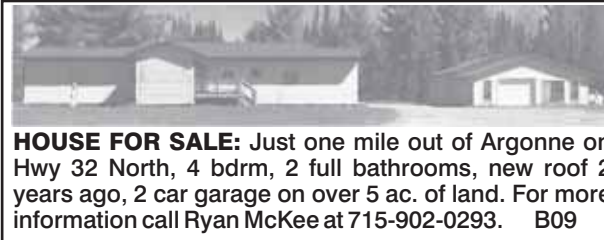
