



## New flexible, part-time Nursing classes offered at Nicolet College

Nicolet College is launching a series of part-time and flexible classes for anyone interested in a nursing career but is unable to attend traditional daytime classes.

"We're seeing an increasing number of people who want a career in nursing but need alternatives to the traditional pathway," said Nicolet's Dean of Health Occupations Lenore Blemke. "People are busy. They have to work. They have children and any number of other responsibilities. This new sequence of classes is an option that may work for them."

All of the classes - from the pre-requisites through the core Nursing classes that lead to an associate's degree - will be held online, in the evening, or on weekends, Blemke explained.

Students will be able to start the sequence in either early June or this fall by taking Nursing Assistant classes. The 70-credit sequence has students taking between one and three classes a semester and completing the associate's degree in the summer of 2020.

While some potential students see that as a long ways off, "I always ask them, 'What type of work will you be doing in 2020 if you don't have a degree?' It does take

effort, but the rewards of earning a Nursing degree will last a lifetime.'

Along with the personal satisfaction that comes with a career helping others, the field also pays quite well.

Nicolet Nursing students who graduated in 2015 reported a starting median salary of \$41,493. The survey also showed a 100 percent job placement rate, with every student responding to the survey finding a job in the field.

Blemke noted that salary increases with experience and for students who continue their education and earn bachelor's and master's degrees.

"Nicolet has guaranteed credit transfer agreements with a number of four-year campuses." she said. "This creates the pathway for students to apply their Nicolet associate's degree towards a bachelor's degree in Nursing."

#### Mountain Fire Lookout Tower re-opening ceremony

We are pleased to invite you to a re-opening ceremony of the Mountain Fire Lookout Tower on the Lakewood Ranger District of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. The ceremony will be held at 10a.m. Friday, June 10, 2016. The ceremony will take place at the tower approximately two and one-half miles north of Mountain, Wisconsin off of Old 32 (Forest Road 2106). We are planning to serve snacks and refreshments immediately after the ceremony at the Schoolhouse Bai (14007 WI-32) in Mountain.

The Mountain Fire Lookout Tower was built in 1935 by the U.S. Forest Service and the Civilian Conservation Corps. It was once a part of an extensive lookout tower network in the former Nicolet National Forest. The Mountain Fire Lookout Tower was the first tower in Wisconsin to be placed on the National Historic Lookout Register and the National Register of Historic Places. It also was the 41st lookout tower to be registered in the United States. The tower was taken out of service in 1970 and was last restored in 1994. The Mountain Fire Lookout Tower was restored in 2015-2016 through a partnership between the Lakewood-Laona Ranger District of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest with financial assistance from the Oconto County Economic Development Corporation, numerous local businesses, organizations, communities and residents. Employees from the Lakewood-Laona Ranger District spent more than 500 hours doing the restoration work.

"This was a great partnership and community effort," said Greyling Brandt, Recreation Program Manager on the Lakewood-Laona Ranger District. "Together we were able to restore the tower and now can open it to visitors again to get an up close look at a piece of Wisconsin's history."

An Apple a Day... Want to keep a lid on your calories? Fruit beats

fruit juice, even if the juice has added fiber.

Once a week for five weeks researchers gave 58 adults one of four pre-loads 15 minutes before lunch: peeled apple segments, applesauce, ordinary apple juice or apple juice with five grams of added fiber (pectin). That's how much fiber the apple and applesauce supplied naturally. Serving sizes were adjusted so that all four preloads had the same number of calories (125).

After the apple segments, the participants ate 15 percent (roughly 190) fewer calories at lunch than they did with no pre-load. The applesauce shaved 100 calories off lunch, but the juices trimmed none.

The volunteers felt more full after the apple than after the applesauce, and more full after the applesauce than after juice with or without fiber.

Always pick fresh fruit over juice. Try snacking on fresh fruit before meals to see if it curbs your appetite.




