In 2001, the U.S. Congress provided VA with authorization (called the Mill Bill) to pay for emergency care in non-VA facilities for veterans enrolled in the VA health care system. The benefit will pay for emergency care rendered for non-service-connected conditions for enrolled veterans who have no other source of payment for the care. However, VA will only pay to the point of medical stability. There are very strict guidelines concerning these types of claims. Veterans and their non-VA providers should be aware that these claims must be filed with the VA within 90 days from the last day of the emergent care. This benefit is a safety net for enrolled veterans who have no other means of paying a private facility emergency bill. If another health insurance provider pays all or part of a bill, VA cannot provide any reimbursement. Veterans who retired from the U.S. military are covered by Tricare/CHAMPUS insurance and cannot file a Mill Bill claim.

To qualify, you must be provided care in a hospital emergency department or similar facility providing emergency care. You must be enrolled in the VA Health Care System and must have been provided care by a VA health care provider within the last 24 months. You must be financially liable to the provider of the emergency treatment for that treatment, and have no other form of health care insurance including Medicare, Medicaid, or a state program. You cannot have any other contractual or legal recourse against a third party (such as a Workman's Comp Claim or a Motor Vehicle Accident) that will pay all or part of the bill.

The care must have been rendered in a medical emergency of such nature that a prudent layperson would have reasonably expected that delay in seeking immediate medical attention would have been hazardous to life or health. If you are an eligible veteran, and a VA facility is not feasibly available when you believe your health or life is in immediate danger, report directly to the closest emergency room (ER). If your condition is stabilized by the ER but additional medical care is needed, proceed to the nearest VA Medical Center (VAMC). If hospitalization is required for your service or non-service connected condition, you, your representative or the treating facility should contact the nearest VAMC within 24 hours to arrange a transfer to VA care. Veterans have a responsibility to ensure that the VAMC is notified immediately upon any hospital admission.





What's the "Blue Beast"? It's a 9 1/2 ton aquatic plant harvesting machine used to cut nuisance weeds and excessive weed growth on the waters of the Inland Lakes District. The District includes the waters of Reservoir Pond, Horn, Little Horn and Explosion Lakes and a portion of the McCaslin Brook.

This weed cutter was delivered to the District on May 24th and was manufactured by Aquarius Systems in North Prairie, Wisconsin. Total cost of the "Blue Beast" was \$198,750 and was paid for by District members with an offsetting grant from the Department of Natural Resources of \$90,528. The grant money is managed by the DNR and is money collected by the State of Wisconsin from excise tax on gasoline used for marine purposes. Soon the "Blue Beast" will be "grazing" on the weeds of the Inland Lakes District so the boating public can enjoy smooth sailing on the District's waters.



# Green Shorts at Nicolet College June 16 looks at Planet Earth using short films



The one and only planet Earth will star in a collection of short films focused on ecology and the environment when Green Shorts premieres at 7:30 p.m., Thursday, June 16, at Nicolet College Tamarack Center 110.

While the collection of 16 short films has some of what one would expect – primarily exquisite scenery from far-flung places – "we also wanted to make sure we included films people would not expect," said Steve Schreier, who curated the collection along with Tom Jerow.

"The natural world is a vast and diverse place and how people view and interpret these places is equally as varied. It would have been easy to put together a collection of short films that only show beautiful places, but we wanted it to be much more than that. We wanted to open up new perspectives for people and how they view the natural world around them."

This is the third collection of short films the two Rhinelander residents have put together for the 2015-16 Nicolet Live! series and by far the most time and labor intensive. Schreier and Jerow culled through more than 200 films to come up with the final 16.

These range from a regional piece about removing a dam in Black River Falls, to Idiot with a Tripod about an East Coast blizzard, to an animated piece on space junk to a film on what happens to our clothes after they are donated. Films will run anywhere from a few minutes to about half an hour.

Schreier and Jerow will introduce the films, facilitate discussion, and answer questions.
