TORC: The Off-Road Championship presented by AMSOIL heads to the legendary Crandon International Raceway this weekend for Big House Brawl, Rounds 5 and 6 of the 2016 national championship.

The doubleheader weekend features pro racing in three classes: the powerful, four-wheel drive PRO 4WD trucks, the 900 horsepower rear-wheel drive PRO 2WD machines, and the fiercely competitive Atturo Tire PRO Lights. The TORC Series races are part of the 23rd annual Forest County Potawatomi Community Brush Run event, which also features Crandon Sportsman Off-Road Series running 10 unique classes of unique short-course machinery.

At the top of the standings in the TORC Series after four races this season are Johnny Greaves in PRO 4WD, Crandon local Keegan Kincaid in PRO 2WD, and Kyle Hart in Atturo Tire PRO Light. Greaves hails from nearby Abrams, Wisconsin, while hart is from Kelly, Louisiana

In addition to three days of TORC PRO and Crandon Sportsman competition, the Forest County Potawatomi Community Brush Run event weekend features camping and concerts. Thousands of fans are expected to load into the facility, which includes 2,500

This year marks the 100th Birthday of the Vulcan steam engine affectionately called Old 4-Spot. It has been a century since this Vulcan steam engine rolled out of the factory doors back in 1916, and 4-Spot has a very distinguished career.

Hauling logs and lumber in the early days, the Lumberjack Steam Train now hauls passengers to the Camp 5 Museum complex, where they spend an enjoyable day in the highly-rated logging museum, meet the animals in the petting zoo, take a fun but educational ride on the Green Treasure Forest Tour, peruse the wares in the Cracker Barrel Gift Store and enjoy a lunch in the open-air restaurant. Mole Lake's Ray Hoffman is a Forest County original. He entered this world on July 10, 1916, and he will be celebrating his centennial birthday this July 10 with friends and family.

Ray was born on the banks of Swamp Creek, just below Rice Lake, in a logging camp. His father was Joe Hoffman and his mother was Elizabeth. They came to Forest County from the Hatley-Bevent area.

Ray's in-laws, the Jaskie family, worked in McGee's logging camp that was located in the vicinity of Ackley Circle and the Mole Lake Pow Wow grounds. Their daughter, Maymie, was born there just nine months after Ray first saw daylight. Unfortunately, Maymie has since passed on.

Ray had four brothers and four sisters. One sister, Elmyra, is still alive and lives in Antigo.

This is about one in five deaths! Yet, every day in the United States 3,600 young people between the ages of 12 and 17 years initiate cigarette smoking. When clerks make a difference to decrease youth access to tobacco products, Wisconsin wins.

Nicolet College to Launch New **AODA Associate Degree This Fall**

With demand strong for substance abuse counselors in the Northwoods and nationally, this fall Nicolet College will launch a new, two-year associate degree to train professionals to treat people struggling with drug, alcohol and other issues.

"It's no secret that Wisconsin is at or near the top of just about every list that ranks alcohol consumption," said Lenore Blemke, dean of Health Occupations at Nicolet College. "Couple that with the increasing problem of opioid use and addiction, and it's easy to see which direction demand is going for professionals trained to help people successfully deal with these issues.'

The 64-credit Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA) degree will help students develop skills in counseling, diagnosis, treatment planning, group facilitation, and crisis management.

Blemke noted the credential is perfect for anyone looking to start a career in the field as well as for those working in a related health care field looking to add to their resume. Graduates will be eligible for licensure in Wisconsin as Substance Abuse Counselors-in-training. Full Substance Abuse Counselor licensure is granted after 4,000 hours of on-the-job experience and 360 hours of state-approved continuing education.

In 2015, Nicolet surveyed potential area employers and other professionals working in the field and received "a very strong and positive response indicating that jobs are available for individuals with the right skills," Blemke noted.

Across the nation, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics recently found the profession will grow "much faster than average" compared to other occupations, with 22 percent job growth through 2024. A driving factor in this growth is that addiction and mental health counseling are increasingly being covered by insurance policies, the Bureau noted.

Across the state, median entry-level wages for 2015 graduates with an AODA associate degree were \$33,599 year, according to the latest Wisconsin Technical College System Graduate Outcomes report.

Potential employers from both the public and private sector include clinics, hospitals, community residential facilities, counseling centers, corrections facilities, and social service agencies, Blemke explained. Fall Semester classes start Sept. 1.



Nicolet College Trustees Approve 2016-17 Budget

The Nicolet College Board of Trustees recently approved next year's budget for the college which holds the line on expenditures while providing additional skills training opportunities for students in the fall.

"The college continues to work hard to be fiscally responsible while at the same time expanding job training opportunities," said Nicolet College President Richard Nelson.

"This strategy keeps costs in check while giving more individuals the opportunity to build better lives for themselves. It also provides area employers with the skilled workforce they need to be efficient, productive, and profitable. These objectives, when combined, will help drive economic development in the region."

The \$36,589,653 budget for 2016-17 represents a 5.36 percent reduction from the previous year.

New academic offerings this fall will include a Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA) associate degree; a Drafting Design Technician technical diploma, evening Welding classes, and two new Auto technical diplomas.

Nicolet will be able to fund these new programs, in part, with a 1.5 percent increase in tuition, a 3 percent projected increase in enrollment, and reductions in operational costs in other parts of the college.

In addition, the budget passed at the board's June meeting calls for a projected 60-cent tax increase for every \$100,000 in property valuation in the district. This would bring the total tax levy to \$6,515,766 in the six-county district.

The final tax rate will be determined in October, after the state releases official equalized property valuations for the district.





NOCTA (Northern Oconto County Trout Alliance) is proud to announce it is the 2016 Season is on!


Beginning June 11, with a work day readying the facility for the arrival of the fish, Hatchery volunteers were joined by members of the 'Pirates of the Northwoods' Parrorhead Club in cleaning up the grounds, including the indoor workspace and holding tanks. It takes a lot of dedicated people to make a project like this happen, many thanks to all who pitched in.

The Lakewood Trout Rearing Station, which had been closed for several years, was revitalized in 2015 by the NOCTA, a group of fishing enthusiasts who wanted to see a return of trout to local waters. Through months of hard work and negotiating, a plan was formed between the DNR and the NOCTA to reopen the Lakewood site using all volunteer workers. Scott Vanlanen, NOCTA Director, reports that the 2016 season will see approximately 25,000 fish, 4,000 Brown Trout and 21,000 Brook Trout reared at the facility with distribution to local waters sometime this October. That is an increase of 10.000 fish reared in the 2015 season.

Vanlanen also announced that this year tours will be held every Saturday in July, 11 am - 2 pm, free of charge. Although donations toward fish feed would be very welcome.

It had long been an 'up north' tradition to take the kids to the Hatchery and let them see and feed the fish during the facility's previous operation and NOCTA wanted to offer that experience to the public again. Be it nostalgic or a new experience, bring the family out the Hatchery and have some fun!



It's the Berries!

The results looked "berry" good for berries for 2004 when United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) researches released a list of the top 20 antioxidant-rich foods in a study of over 100 commonly consumed foods tested.

Wild blueberries, cultivated blueberries, cranberries, blackberries, raspberries and strawberries took six of the top 11 spots. Here's the complete top 20 list - from highest to lowest in antioxidant activity - based on serving size.

- 1. Small red beans (dry, cooked), ½ cup
- 2. Wild blueberries, 1 cup
- 3. Red kidney beans (dry, cooked) ½ cup
- 4. Pinto beans (dry, cooked), ½ cup
- 5. Blueberries (cultivated), 1 cup
- 6. Cranberries, 1 cup whole
- 7. Artichokes (cooked), 1 cup hearts
- 8. Blackberries, 1 cup
- 9. Prunes, ½ cup
- 10. Raspberries, 1 cup
- 11. Strawberries, 1 cup
- 12. Red delicious apples, 1
- 13. Granny Smith apples, 1
- 14. Pecans, 1 ounce
- 15. Sweet cherries, 1 cup
- 16. Black plums, 1
- 17. Russet potato (cooked), 1
- 18. Black beans (dry, cooked) ½ cup
- 19. Plums, 1
- 20. Gala apples, 1

"Just like rust on a car, oxidation can cause damage to cells and may contribute to aging," states the American Dietetic Association. Antioxidants may help increase our immune function and protect against cancer and heart disease. They function by neutralizing the damaging effects of "free radicals" that form during cell metabolism as oxygen is burned.

In identifying these foods, researchers cautioned their antioxidant activity in the laboratory may differ from their antioxidant activity in the body. Absorption capacity may vary, and cooking processes may affect antioxidant levels. For example, cooking increased the antioxidant content of tomatoes but decreased levels in carrots. While a food didn't make the top 20 for antioxidant activity, it may still be a source of other health benefits.

Foods offer advantages over supplements in supplying antioxidants. They may provide compounds that offer benefits of which we're presently unaware. Foods also may contain additional substances that work with antioxidants to make them effective.

The American Heart Association (AHA) states, "At this time, the scientific evidence supports a diet high in food sources of antioxidants and other heart-protecting nutrients, such as fruits, vegetables, whole grains and nuts instead of antioxidant supplements to reduce the risk of CVD (coronary vascular disease). AHA further advises, "Some studies even suggest that antioxidant supplement use could have harmful effects."

While we wait for more to be known about antioxidants, we already have a good reason to eat berries. They taste good!



The Soo Line was the east to west railroad in Forest County starting in about 1887. In places where logging was active, the railroad would put in a siding which are extra tracks where rail cars could be left and filled with logs or pulpwood. The number designates the mileage from Minneapolis-St. Paul Minnesota to that siding. This landing was later used by Consolidated Papers for years to load out pulpwood and buy truck delivered pulpwood for shipment to their paper mills in Wisconsin Rapids, Byron, and Stevens

Like the Hess camp, this activity also came to an end.

By the way, we also don't understand some of the slang in the poem, and it either has gone out of style or it just rhymed!

The Camp in the Woods at 250

Written by the cook, James Nemetz-About 1920

There's a shack in the woods at 250, Nine miles from Cavour on the Soo. Where twelve men answer the rollcall, Leo Hess and his log-eating crew.

They are the pick of the State of Wisconsin, Sod-busters nearly all. It's a fright when the cook calls breakfast, The way they hit the ball.

There's Leo Hess, the bunter, Who tells them how and when. He sticks to his nest in the morning, Like a faithful old setting hen.

There is Raymond Bouck, they say he can load, He stands on the sleigh like a big black toad. "Go ahead" and "come back" is all he knows. With a smile on his map like a last summer's rose.

Here is a chap from Algoma, He's good with the tropical breeze. He claims that down home in Algoma, The foxes roost up in the trees.

Here comes One-Horse Bill, a brother of his, Who dreams of wealth and fame. He doesn't say much, but he thinks a lot, And he gets there just the same.

Next come Novak and Taylor, Each one a whaler, and Cardinal is a bull moose, It's really no fun, for you can't see the sun, For chips when these boys turn loose.

Here comes Ed with the bob-tailed goats, They eat their weight in hay and oats. You can yell and lick them till they do their best, And they can't pull a chicadee off his nest.

Here is Walter with the bald-faced bay, With Old King along side, he makes her pay, He zig-zags along like Gruman's Ford, And hits the landing with a half a cord.

Next comes Hugo with Ed Hess's heavers, They can eat up sawlogs like couple of beavers. They would easily be the winning team, If they wouldn't run out of gasoline.


Here comes the cook with his hash and his stew, He's been stagged out of every camp on the Soo. He bakes cement biscuits and sour bread, Pancakes like sweatpads and doughnuts like lead.

We wish him no harm, but we sure do hope, To see him dangling on the end of a rope, Till his neck stretches long and his eyes pop out, And his mouth opens wide like a rainbow trout.

We will send a message to old Nick below, And ask him to give this greaser a show. But we'll never tell him that he used to cook, for Havwire Hess. on Gunny Sack Brook.

There is Luthey from Crandon, the man with the cash, He puts pep in the crew and fear in the push. They say in Crandon that before next spring. That all of his cash will take to wing. And when the robin northward flies, He'll look down with tear-stained eves. Joint ahead and center back, Luthey's working on the track.

For Old Time's Sake



We apologize for the condition of this old photo, but when you are this old, you won't look so good either! The VanZile Hotel is on the left, the Soo Line Depot is on the right. If you are thinking that they called this town Argonne, you would be wrong. It was taken in VanZile. Of course, the name was later changed to North Crandon, and in 1921, it was changed to Argonne, but it was not Argonne when the picture was snapped!

The VanZile Hotel sat where the old bank is now, and there are numerous businesses on the street that runs parallel to the railroad tracks where the ball diamond and town park is today. The Hill family owned the hotel in later years, but it burned down one day when Mrs. Hill was making pies in the wood-fired kitchen stove. This is according to the late Russell Samz. The year was probably some time not too long after 1887, as the Soo Line came through in that year, and started calling VanZile North Crandon.

groomed grass campsites. Wisconsin's own Zac Matthews Band plays Saturday night in a concert that is free to fans camping on-site.

"2016 will be the best race season in our history, and it all starts with the upcoming Forest County Brush Run weekend," said Crandon President Cliff Flannery. "Our schedule is packed from Friday afternoon through Sunday, and we know our fans will have a great time."

This weekend's event is the first of two major TORC Series stops at Crandon International Raceway this year: the stars of the series return to the legendary venue in the heart of Wisconsin's scenic Northwoods for the season-ender in September.

Crandon International open its gates to the public all three days beginning at 8:00am. Weekend admission is \$45 for adults, and free for children 12 and under and seniors 75 and older. One-day admission is \$25 for adults and free for children under 12 and seniors 75 or older. Saturday night-only admission to enjoy the Zac Matthews Band concert is \$10.

Off-road racing began in Crandon, Wisconsin, in 1970 with the inaugural Brush Run 101 race through the forest surrounding the small town. The event grew so large that in the 1980s track officials added a spring race -renamed the Brush Run -- to augment the hugely popular fall World Championship Off-Road Races that attract up to 45,000 fans each Labor Day holiday weekend.
