Performing artists fill 3 stages at 2nd Annual WAM Fest!

Plans are taking shape for the Wabeno Art & Music (WAM) Fest on Saturday, August 6th. In its second year WAM Fest features live music on three stages, fine art auction, "arty" activities for kids, Plein Air landscape painting competition and artwork sale, food, drink and more. The event runs from 10 am to 10pm in historic downtown Wabeno, Highway 32 in Forest County.

Tim Friesen, member of the WAM Fest planning committee is happy to announce the line-up of performers. According to Friesen, "This year we created a staggered schedule on three stages that will allow continual live music during the day-long event. And the music this year is wide and varied including a fire dancer at dusk." There are three stages: the East Pavilion Stage, Band Shell and the West Pavilion Stage.

On the East Pavilion Stage artists perform one hour starting with Skip Jones (folk) at 10 a.m., Ray Ehlinger (roots country) at 11:45 a.m., Keith McGillivray (flutist) and Ric Doonbaliat (percussionist) 1:30 p.m., Carolyn Carter (Southern bell-hillbilly) at 3:15 p.m., Gary "Buzz" Baum (singer songwriter based in Georgia) at 5 p.m., Jeff Brown (acoustic rock genre) at 6:45 p.m. and CityScape (trio based in Milwaukee performing classic standards, jazz, blues, pop/rock) 8:30 p.m. to close.

Performances on the Band Shell stage vary from 45 minutes to one hour with Heather Styka (folk and award-winning song writer) beginning at 10:30 a.m., Michael Magee (originals and covers) at 11:45 a.m., Cheri & Paul (husband-wife duo from Lakewood play 60s and 70s, old and new country, Americana and folk) at 1 p.m., Living Room (folk rock trio) at 2:15 p.m., Leah Reed (3-piece jazz rap fusion) at 3:45 p.m., Larry Seiler (eclectic) at 5:30 p.m., Ed Marsh (bluegrass 5 piece) at 7 p.m., Heidi Milan (fire dancer) at dusk and Ric Stream (classic rock/oldies) performs 8:45 p.m. to close.

New to WAM fest is an emerging performing artist stage, the West Pavilion Stage for budding performing artists. The Anger Brothers start the day at 11 a.m.; a ukulele group will perform at noon followed by Sophie Wysocki at 1 p.m., Blake Matthews at 2 p.m., Irish dancers at 3 p.m., Maddie Korbas at 4:30 p.m. and Sarah Jennings at 5:30 p.m.

Each stage is within close proximity and easy walking on the Logging Museum grounds.

The children's arty activities will be held outside in front of the Museum and run from noon to 3 p.m. Activities include clothesline art, paint books and bubbles galore. There is no cost to participate. An additional kid's activity is called Jr. Rembrandt. Kids are invited to paint on a provided canvas and their art will be on display for silent auction. WAM Fest attendees can purchase tickets three for \$1 and try to win the kids' art piece. Voting closes at 4:30 p.m. Best of Show winners will be selected by a panel of judges in two categories; 12 and under and teens with artful prizes awarded.

Plein Air artists are signing up to participate in a competition and sale of their completed artwork. Artists select a landscape, downtown building or other outdoor location within one mile of the Wabeno Band Shell. That's where they paint and visitors can view the action. Painting begins anytime between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. and runs until 2 p.m. Each artist may submit up to three Plein Air paintings.

Framed, ready-to-hang paintings will be sold at the artist's selected price during the "buy it now" period 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. at WAM Fest "ART HQ". Artists are encouraged to preregister and details and registration form can be found online:

https://wabenoartandmusicfest.org/artists. Registration can also take place at WAM Fest.

Volunteers still needed. Contact Mary Beck to help serve food, beverage sales and set up. This year an artist commemorative pin will be sold for \$2. The artwork on the pin was created by local artist Stephen Wysocki from Armstrong Creek.

Local businesses are making monetary and prize donations; funds will help defer the costs of the artist performers. Prize drawings will be held throughout the day of the event and all attendees have a chance to win by filling out the event evaluation form.






Oh, how we love the mud pits!





Application forms may be sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk, households must fill out the application and return it to the school (unless notified at the start of the school year that children are eligible through direct certification). Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by agency or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children in a household where one or more household members receive FoodShare, FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, list the household member and the FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number, list the names of all school children, sign the application, and return it to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk of households not receiving FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 cash benefits, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or mark the box to the right of "Check if no SSN". Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal and free milk policy the high school secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. 

U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin toured Kretz Lumber in Antigo to highlight Wisconsin's timber economy. Senator Baldwin was joined by Kretz Lumber leadership and members of the Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association for the tour.

"Our timber economy in northern and central Wisconsin is facing a number of challenges that need to be addressed," said Senator Baldwin. "Today's tour shows the importance of building on the progress we've made by continuing to work with industry stakeholders in Wisconsin and the U.S. Forest Service. By working together, we can help create a more stable supply of timber from our federal lands, while sustainably managing our resources."

Senator Baldwin has been a strong supporter of Wisconsin's timber economy. She has championed the use of Good Neighbor Authority in Wisconsin, which was established by an agreement signed by the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources in 2015. Good Neighbor Authority was passed in the 2014 Farm Bill, which Baldwin supported. It allows the Forest Service to enter into agreements or contracts with states to have them perform forest, rangeland and watershed restoration services on National Forest System lands. Senator Baldwin has also fought to end "fire borrowing," where U.S. Forest Service funds have been regularly diverted from Wisconsin forests to fight wildfires in the west.

Report deer sightings to **Operation Deer Watch**



Wisconsin's residents can help with deer herd management by participating in this year's Operation Deer Watch, an annual citizen-science survey that collects information on deer. Data from this survey provides insight to the reproductive status of Wisconsin's deer herd for 2016 and helps shape deer management for the state.

"This is a fun and useful opportunity for all individuals and families to enjoy Wisconsin's plentiful wildlife," says Brian Dhuey, DNR surveys coordinator. "The Department of Natural Resources encourages anyone interested in deer, from hunters and trappers, to outdoor enthusiasts to take part."

To get involved, record all bucks, does and fawns seen during the day from Aug. 1 to Sept. 30. Daily observations can be tracked using an online tally sheet available at dnr.wi.gov, keyword "deer watch."

Data from the survey is additionally used by County Deer Advisory Councils (CDAC) when developing deer season framework, harvest quotas and permit level recommendations.



Kentucks, of course, are from many nationalities, with the majority probably being English or Scot, but they also came from French, Dutch, German and other nationalities as well. The common thread here is that they came to the area to improve their lot in life. Cutover logging lands were available at cheap prices and good terms from the big lumber companies in Forest County at that time.

Life in Kentucky, as I have been told by some of the old timers, was rough. They were living on mountainsides very often, and because of the lack of opportunity or the ability to purchase lands for farming, sons and daughters often ended up staying with their parents well into adulthood.

In addition, Kentucky was a border state during the Civil War, and families became split by different allegiances to the Union or the Confederacy. It was often easier to just leave. When a family member came here and work was available he would write home and tell his family, who often followed.

A good example of this was told to me by Oliver Campbell, who came here as a teenager in the years before World War I. He took a walk down the street in Crandon, and was approached by three different men who wanted to know if he needed work. He was amazed. As he described it, there was periodic work back in Kentucky, and the future looked bleak. This was a whole new world.

That is not to say that everything was easy and the money poured into everybody's pocket. It took hard work to get ahead, but at least the work was available. There was also a collision of cultures.

When the big sawmills located here, they brought people with them, and others moved to the area with the money that it took to start a business. The majority of theses entrepreneurs were from out east. They had better opportunities to acquire an education, had the chances back in New York or Maine to build up some savings, and they were here to take advantage of the lumber boom brought on by companies like Page and Landeck, who had just built a big sawmill on Clear Lake in Crandon.

The old newspapers of the time loved to portray the Kentucks as a lower class of citizen, and certainly, some of them were lawless. This isn't that surprising when you take into stock that they had left a state with constant fighting between these people with the different allegiances that started with the Civil War.

Of course, most were hard-working. They came from a place where hardwood logging was predominant, and they knew how to use an axe, pull a crosscut and sharpen that crosscut so it could cut hardwood. Like most people in these days, they also knew how to work a draft animal, like horses and oxen.

The Page & Landeck mill became the Keith and Hiles Mill, and then the Fish Lumber Company bought the mill. In 1921, the mill burned, and there were a lot of people out of work.

What is interesting is that many of the eastern business people started to leave, heading, I assume, for greener pastures and another place to make some easy money. Most of the Kentucks stayed, and a large amount of these families are still here.

Of course, the stereotype of the Kentuck is a fellow taking a nap alongside a whiskey still, with his hound dog and old shotgun by his side. What is not accurate is that making whiskey in the woods was easy work. Wood had to be cut and carried, sugar and grain had to be moved to the site, and an endless supply of good water was also needed and had to be carried. After talking about this business with the old Kentucks through the years, they were quick to say it was a lot of work!

With prohibition and the lack of industry available after the mill burning, making whiskey became and opportunity for many, and the Kentucks, with their heritage of making whiskey, made good stuff, if you can believe the old timers. Whiskey made from corn and other grains was an easier way to get your produce to market in the mountains of Kentucky, so there was a practical side to this trade.

Illegal whiskey paid for a lot of meals, clothes and other necessities in those years. Distilling provided jobs and money, but so did the transport to markets, which included Chicago and even St. Louis. The business went on to provide incomes even after the repeal of prohibition, because it was also a way to keep from paying taxes on the booze.

So time has passed, and most of us who claim some Kentucky heritage are descendants of people who were Kentucks and those who weren't. But, it is good to remember where we came from, and the people who worked and sacrificed to give us this beautiful place to live. For these same reasons, Armstrong Creek was settled heavily by Polish people who also came seeking land and opportunity, and that community will be celebrating their heritage this weekend also.



10 tips to reduce the risk of food borne illness:

CLEAN

1. Wash hands with soap and water - Wet hands with clean running water and apply soap. Use warm water if it is available. Rub hands together to make a lather and scrub all parts of the hand for 20 seconds. Rinse hands thoroughly and dry using a clean paper towel. If possible, Thursday - Aug. 4 - Beef stew with potatoes, carrots, onions use a paper towel to turn off the faucet.

- 5. Rinse produce Rinse fresh vegetables and fruits under running water just before eating, cutting or cooking. Even if you plan to peel or cut the produce before eating, it is important to thoroughly rinse it first to prevent Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. microbes from transferring from the outside to the inside of the produce.

SEPARATE

6. Separate foods when shopping - Place raw seafood, meat and poultry in plastic bags. Store them below ready-to-eat foods in your refrigerator.

7. Separate foods when preparing and serving -Always use a clean cutting board for fresh produce and a separate one for raw seafood, meat and poultry. Never place cooked food back on the same plate or cutting board that previously held raw food.

COOK AND CHILL

8. Use a food thermometer when cooking - A food thermometer should be used to ensure that food is safely cooked and that cooked food is held at safe temperatures until eaten.

9. Cook food to safe internal temperatures - One effective way to prevent illness is to check the internal temperature of seafood, meat, poultry and egg dishes. Cook all raw beef, pork, lamb and veal steaks, chops and roasts to a safe minimum temperature of 145 degrees F. For safety and quality, allow meat to rest for at least 3 minutes before carving or eating. Cook all raw ground beef, pork, lamb, and veal to an internal temperature of 160 degrees F. Cook all poultry, including ground turkey and chicken, to an internal temperature of 165 degrees F.

10. Keep foods at safe temperatures - Hold cold foods at 40 degrees F or below. Keep hot foods at 140 degrees F or above. Food are no longer safe to eat when they have been in the danger zone between 40-140 degrees F for more than 2 hours (1 hour if the temperature was above 90 degrees F).
