To the Editor:

A few counties in northern Wisconsin are considering resolutions requiring our county forest lands meet FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) certification. FSC is an international governing body based in Bonn Germany; the current Secretary is based in Oaxaca, Mexico. Wisconsin does not have representation on FSC in a voting capacity.

There are two primary organizations certifying forests in Wisconsin—FSC and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI). FSC operates outside of State regulations. Academic and survey data suggest FSC artificially limits the availability of wood for a variety of purposes. In 2014 EconoSTATS released a study concluding 31,000 jobs will be lost in the state of Oregon if FSC standards become mandatory. Oregon chose not to adopt FSC. The counties in northern Wisconsin currently meet sound forestry standards, with SFI (Sustainable Forestry Initiative) certification and our Managed Forest Law (MFL).

Before making such a drastic change in public policy a few questions should be answered. Will FSC entail more compliance costs? Will the counties receive a higher price for their wood? If the counties already meet certification requirements, who benefits? Isn't adopting an international standard without representation as a voting member a loss of local control?

Finally, if private residents wish to have their forestland certified it is their right. But county forests exist to benefit all residents of a county. Our county forests have a long history of sound forest management. Adding a layer of bureaucracy like FSC on our county forests does not seem to serve the best interests of the residents of northern Wisconsin. Let's not five up local control of our county forests

Please ask yourself, "Do you really want someone from Bonn, Germany or Oaxaca, Mexico" running our county forests. I think not.

#### **Promoting Healthy Bones**

Bone is alive! Bone is a living and growing tissue. Throughout life, bone is constantly being renewed in a process called remodeling. During remodeling, old bone is removed and it is replaced with fresh new bone.

At what age do I need to be concerned about my

It's never too late to take action to promote healthy bones. Healthy bone actions that should begin in childhood and continue throughout your lifetime include:

- eating a well-balanced diet rich in calcium and vitamin D
  - · participating in regular exercise
- · taking safety precautions to protect your bones and prevent falls
  - · limiting alcohol intake
- avoiding excessive dieting and excessive thinness · talking to a medical professional about promoting healthy bones

Why does calcium matter?

Think of your bones as a bank account in which you "deposit" and "withdraw" calcium throughout life. Calcium is a mineral that makes bone dense (thick) and strong. During childhood, the teen years and early adulthood you build your bone bank. The maximum bone density you will ever have is largely determined by your genetics. After age 25, bone healthy actions help maintain bone mass. Throughout your life, if your dietary calcium intake is too low, your body will "withdraw" the calcium it needs from your bone bank. Over time, if more calcium is taken out of your bones than is put in, the result may be thin, weak bones (osteoporosis). In your senior years, usually after age 70, thin, weak bones may break more easily during normal activities. It is important to meet your daily calcium recommendation by choosing a well-balanced, calcium rich diet and including three cups of milk a day. If you don't, or cant drink milk, choose other fortified foods and beverages and/or supplements.

Why is Vitamin D important?

Vitamin D is necessary to build and maintain strong bones by helping your body absorb and use calcium. Except for fatty fish and fortified milk, there are few reliable dietary sources of vitamin D. To get the proper amount of vitamin D, sun exposure and supplements are generally necessary.

Get moving!

An ideal exercise program combines weight-bearing, muscle-strengthening, and posture and balance exercises. Weight-bearing simply means that your feet and legs are supporting or carrying your weight. This type of exercise builds bone mass in youth and maintains it in adulthood. Some examples of weight-bearing exercises include walking, dancing and climbing stairs. Muscle-strengthening exercises build muscle that help support your bones. Lifting weights, using resistance bands and exercising on resistance machines are ways to strengthen muscle. Proper body alignment and posture training exercises promote correct posture and may help to minimize the stooped posture that results from osteoporosis. To ensure your safety, consult your medical professional before beginning an exercise program.





#### Wisconsin DMV reaching out to confirm process for obtaining voter ID

DMV is reaching out to the public to confirm the process for obtaining an identification card for voting purposes

If you will be at least 18 years old by the next election, if you are a U.S. citizen, and you are eligible to vote in Wisconsin, you may apply for a free ID card for voting purposes. Here are the steps to be followed to receive a document that can be used for voting:

1. Make one trip to any DMV location and bring proof of residence (example: a utility bill), your social security number (if available), and proof of name and date of birth (example: a birth certificate).

2. Fill out the identification card application. If you have the necessary documents, you will receive your identification card within 10 business days via US Mail.

3. If you do not have proof of name and date of birth, proof of U.S. citizenship, or proof of a legal name change, DMV will assist you by initiating the petition process. You must fill out the DMV Petition Administrator application (in addition to the identification card application). Once you enter the process, you will receive a receipt that may be



#### Statewide crackdown on drunken driving

#### 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over' campaign runs from **August 19 to September 5**

Law enforcement officers throughout the state will be out in force to combat drunken driving during the 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over' campaign from Friday, August 19 through Labor Day, September 5.

"Enforcement and educational efforts to prevent drunken driving, like the 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over' campaign, have helped reduce deaths from alcoholrelated crashes by approximately 38 percent and injuries by nearly 50 percent over the last 10 years in Wisconsin," says David Pabst, director of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Bureau of Transportation Safety. "However, deaths in alcohol-related crashes increased from 162 in 2014 to 190 in 2015, which is a 17 percent increase, and injuries also increased from 4,932 to 5,174, which is a nearly 5 percent increase."

To get drunken drivers off the road before they kill themselves or innocent victims, 33 impaired driving (OWI) task forces have been created in Wisconsin that allow multiple agencies to coordinate and combine their resources for high-visibility enforcement efforts. Overtime for task force officers is covered by federal funding administered by the WisDOT Bureau of Transportation

Impaired driving task forces typically notify the public in advance of their enforcement initiatives as a deterrent to drunken driving. Roadside signage and vests on officers let the public know that intensified drunken driving enforcement is underway, according to Pabst.

"Law enforcement officers are well trained in identifying the signs of impaired driving, and they know where and when to look for drunken drivers," Pabst says. "If drivers make the irresponsible and reckless decision to get behind the wheel while impaired, officers are ready to stop, test and arrest them. Last year, there were nearly 24,000 convictions for drunken driving in Wisconsin. However, our goal is to get people to drive sober, not to make more arrests."

To help prevent drunken driving, WisDOT offers a free Drive Sober mobile app, which includes a find-a-ride feature that uses a smart phone's GPS to locate alternative transportation, a blood alcohol estimator, designated driver selector, and interactive games that help determine whether drivers should give up their keys. Since its launch three years ago, nearly 70,000 people have used the app, which can be downloaded for free by visiting: www.zeroinwisconsin.gov/drivesober/.




