WASHINGTON — Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, said the following after Defense Secretary Ashton Carter called for a suspension on collecting bonus repayments to National Guard

Yesterday, Johnson sent a letter to Secretary Carter urging DOD to cease collection of the bonus repayments and explain its decision to seek recoupment of reenlistment bonuses paid out nearly 10 years ago.

"Secretary Carter's decision to cease and desist the recoupment of re-enlistment bonuses will come as a relief to many service members and their families who literally have been paying the price for the Pentagon's mistake. I am grateful that Secretary Carter heeded my call to stop the harassment of our veterans. The Pentagon's initial decision to recoup money from service members was a terrible error in judgment and was not in line with the tremendous debt of gratitude we owe our servicemen and women for their sacrifices. We owe our troops better than this, and I will continue my oversight to help ensure we do not repeat these mistakes in the future."







Richard's brothers, Fred and Earl, and

sisters, Sylvia, Mildred and Loretta, also from Mole Lake preceded him in death.

Although born in Wisconsin, he was not yet accepted as a citizen of the United States at birth, during the years before the Federal Government enacted the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934 when his citizen status was attained; however he went on to serve our country for ten years, during World War II and after. He spent his first several years speaking only Ojibwa & living in a "tar paper shack" in the woods along highway 55 in the Mole Lake area here in northern Wisconsin.

As a child, he along with other Ojibwe children were kidnapped & then taken away to a government school in Lac du Flambeau for a brief period. He became ill and his uncle Sokaogon Chief Willard L. Ackley was able to bring him back to Mole Lake.

Although both parents, Albert Ackley and Helen (Pete) Ackley, had passed away when he was very young. He lived with various relatives & worked on a farm until he joined the U.S. Army Air Corps & later the Air Force serving in WWII. He left the Air Force after ten years and married a Southwestern Ohio girl, Eugenia Marie, and settled in Greenville, Ohio. Together they raised five children; his new wife's sons, John Brian and Charles James (deceased), from her previous marriage, and son, Richard Daniel, Jr.; daughter, Faleigh Jeanne; and son, Paul David

Richard worked as an electrician & sign painter in Greenville, Ohio area. Richard enjoyed public speaking engagements for many years in and around Darke County Ohio speaking about his Native American culture and history and was an active participant in community activities/events and enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren. He was recognized as a local artist and sign painter around the Greenville community and was a regular participant in the many historic events which took place in Greenville and Darke County, Ohio throughout the years. Along with taking the time to make individual hand-drawn greeting cards each year for family and friends.

Richard was always homesick for Mole Lake throughout the years and was eager return to his boyhood home in Forest County. Following the death of Marie in 1995 he returned to Mole Lake.

Richard was honored April 27, 2015, during his participation in the World War II "Never Forgotten Honor Flight XIX" trip to Washington DC along with his fellow WW II US military veterans.

As per Richard's request there will be no ceremony held. He has requested his ashes be spread out in his homeland. By his request, instead of flowers, he would appreciate donations made to the Forest County Humane Society in his name.





It's been an honor to represent you in Madison and I'm grateful to have the opportunity to serve you these next two years.

I don't take your vote of confidence for granted. Since the last legislative session I've continued to work on issues that are important to you so that we can hit the ground running when the next legislative session begins in January.

This fall/winter I'm chairing the State and Tribal Relations Legislative Committee. The committee has passed two bill drafts already and we'll have additional meetings before the years end to build on the many positive efforts we've made over the past few years.

I've also supported many educational causes that will hopefully facilitate positive change next session, especially for our rural areas. I was honored to have been asked by the State Superintendent to serve on the Advisory Council on Rural Schools, Libraries, and Communities. 





### Added sugars can be hidden source of calories

### Tips to cut back and know when sugar is added

Madison, Wis.-For many people, added sugars are a hidden source of extra calories that can make it hard to stay at a healthy body weight. "On average, one of every six calories we eat comes from added sugars," says Susan Nitzke, UW-Extension specialist and professor emeritus in nutritional sciences at the University of Wisconsin-Madison

According to Nitzke, cutting back on added sugars is a good way to improve the nutritional quality of your diet. She recommends the following steps to limit added sugars in your diet:

- -Drink water, low-fat/skim milk, 100 percent fruit juice. coffee or tea instead of drinks with added sugar.
- -Cut back on desserts, baked treats and candies.
- -Snack on fruits and vegetables, whole grains breads and crackers, yogurt, low-fat cheese and nuts.
- -When you bake, look for recipes that use less sugar.
- -Check the ingredient labels on processed foods and avoid those with lots of added sugars.

Nitzke says that "added" sugars are sugars and syrups that are put in when foods or beverages are processed or prepared. Over a third of added sugars in the diets of most Americans come from soda and other sweetened beverages. She points out that energy drinks, sports drinks and fancy coffee beverages are in this category. "Don't be fooled by nutritious-sounding names such as 'herbal boost' or 'athletes' pep,'" warns Nitzke.

According to Nitzke, the best way to know which foods and beverages are high in added sugars is to check the ingredient list. A product is high in added sugar if one of the first two or three ingredients listed have is high fructose corn syrup, white sugar, brown sugar, corn syrup, corn syrup solids, raw sugar, malt syrup, maple syrup, pancake syrup, molasses, honey, fructose and dextrose.

### Medicare Open Enrollment Period is a Good Time to Review Your Risk of Overmedication

It's that time of year again. As the leaves start to change color and the air starts to get a little colder, Medicare recipients all over the nation reevaluate their prescription drug needs in order to maximize cost savings with the new Medicare Part D plans that become available January 1. During Medicare Part D Open Enrollment (October 15-December 7), Medicare recipients are encouraged to bring a list of their medications to a person who can help them through Medicare's Planfinder tool, which then produces Medicare Part D plans best suited for their individual needs. This yearly evaluation can save you money on lower co-pays and lower yearly maximum outof-pocket expenses.

However, you might want to run that list by your doctor or pharmacist first. The reason: older people are constantly being prescribed medications but not routinely having their medications reviewed for interactions or whether the drugs are actually necessary. This leads to a problem called polypharmacy or overmedication. If you're already taking the time to review your list of medications for Medicare Part D Open Enrollment, now is a great time to have a conversation with your doctor or pharmacist about drug interactions and what drugs are still necessary for you.

Many people are prescribed medications from specialists who often don't communicate with each other. Also, if people are hospitalized, hospital doctors may add to the list of medications for both acute and chronic conditions without any plans for ongoing treatment or monitoring after discharge. If a primary care doctor or pharmacist doesn't do a reevaluation of all these medications, they can start to add up.

Adverse side effects of overmedication can include the follow:

- · Misdiagnosis of depression, dementia and Alzheimer's
  - Reduced kidney and liver function
  - Reduced body fat
  - · Increased risk of dementia, delirium and poor

your drugs (including vitamins, herbal supplements and over-the-counter medications). Bring all of the pill bottles

- · Ask your doctor if you still need to take each drug and why.
- · Ask if the dosage on any of your prescriptions can be lowered.
- · Ask your doctor if there are any lifestyle changes you could do that would help you cut back on any of your medications. Be aware that some drugs build up in the body
- (and tend to build up at a higher rate in older people) so it is not unusual for a new side effect or drug interaction to appear even with drugs you've been taking for a while. Don't be afraid to do your own research about dosages and drug interactions, and then discuss with your
- doctor or pharmacist. • Use only one pharmacist. Make sure he or she knows what other vitamins, herbal supplements, and overthe-counter medications you are taking.
- · Ask if a prescription is really necessary and hold long you should continue to take it. Also ask what the potential for eliminating, reducing, or tapering the drug, and the drug might interact with medications you are already taking.



### Veterans Corner

Creating a "Survivor's File"

Whether your marriage was in the early days of military service or long after retirement, one of the most difficult situations you'll face is dealing with the death of your military spouse. Nothing can make this mission easy, but being prepared can help ensure that you do what you need to when the time comes. A file with all the Veteran's important papers won't help if it's in an unlabeled file drawer or on a computer protected with a password that you don't have. Similarly, funeral wishes can't be followed if the cemetery selected has since closed to new burials.

Survivor's files at a minimum will need your Social Security Number and copy of your DD-214. Make sure your survivor's file includes information on any VA payment or claim you've filed with the VA. If you retired from the military, include a copy of your latest Retiree Account Statement and highlight the section that shows if you did or did not enroll in SBP and, if you did enroll, what category of beneficiary you enrolled (for example, spouse or former spouse). Do you have life insurance? Include a copy of your policy and current information on where to call. Note that your spouse needs to get a new ID card and must notify the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) (1-800-538-9552) of your death. Your will - Where is it? If you were married before, are any benefits going to your former spouse and children?

Upon death, survivors will need to contact the Defense Finance and Accounting Service's Retired Pay Center (1-800-321-1080) for those receiving military retired pay. For those receiving VA disability compensation, they'll need to contact the Department of

Veterans Affairs (1-800-827-1000). You should also contact the local Social Security office. My office can assist with these matters. I can also assist the survivors in applying for VA benefits they may be eligible for.

Nicolet Apprenticeship programs provide high-end skills training for rewarding careers



"Enrolling in Nicolet's plumbing apprenticeship program "was one of the best moves I've ever made," said Joe Dorion, now a journeyman plumber.

In high school, Joe Dorion took every shop class he could.
