**Alzheimer's Association presents
"Know the 10 Signs" workshop**

The Alzheimer's Association will host "Know the 10 Signs: Early Detection Matters" on Tuesday, February 14th. Julie St. Pierre, Community Outreach Specialist with the Alzheimer's Association Greater Wisconsin Chapter, will provide participants with information about what sort of memory changes typically occur with aging, tips to the earliest signs of Alzheimer's disease or other dementia as well as steps to take to obtain an accurate diagnosis.

The workshop will be held from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at the Crandon Public Library (110 W. Polk Street) in the lower level meeting room.

"In 2011, the first wave of baby boomers began turning 65 - the age at which the risk of developing Alzheimer's disease begins to increase significantly," stated St. Pierre. "Knowing the warning signs of Alzheimer's and getting diagnosed early is vital to receiving the best help and care possible."

People who attend the "Know the 10 Signs: Early Detection Matters" workshop will view video footage that address fears and myths associated with dementia. Individuals featured in the films include real people who are living with the early stages of dementia and their families discussing the following key topics:

- The 10 warning signs
- Basic overview of Alzheimer's and dementia
- Risk factors
- What is involved in getting a diagnosis
- Benefits of early detection including accessing available treatments, planning for the future and participating in clinical trials

U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin Introduces Amendment to Prohibit ACA Repeal from Increasing the Deficit

"Let's not use this fast-track process to add to our deficit."
WASHINGTON, D.C. – U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin has offered an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2017 budget being considered in the Senate that would prohibit the Republican plan to repeal the Affordable Care Act from increasing the deficit.

"This budget process was created for deficit reduction—which the Republican majority claims to care so much about," Senator Baldwin said. "Rather than reduce our debt, Republicans are choosing to fast track tax breaks to those at the top, take people's health care away, and turn control back over to insurance companies. If repealing the Affordable Care Act is so important—if putting the health coverage of over 30 million Americans at risk is so important—then they ought to pay for it."

Baldwin's amendment would restore the "Conrad rule" prohibiting reconciliation legislation from increasing the deficit within the ten-year budget window. This rule, named after former Senate Budget Committee Chairman Kent Conrad (D-ND), was in place from 2007 until it was repealed in the Fiscal Year 2016 budget resolution.

"The entire reason Reconciliation was created was for deficit reduction. For that special, protected, fast track process to be used to increase the deficit stands logic and its history on its head. It is past time to restore the Reconciliation process to its original purpose which was exclusively for deficit reduction. I applaud Senator Baldwin and her allies in this effort as truly fiscally responsible members," said former Senator Conrad.

"Reconciliation legislation is considered under special expedited procedures and should be used to enact the tough choices necessary to reduce the debt trajectory, not to make tax and spending giveaways even easier to deliver," said Maya MacGuineas, President of the Committee for a Responsible Budget. "Senator Baldwin's amendment would help ensure reconciliation is part of more responsible budgeting - something we particularly need now when the debt is so high relative to the economy."

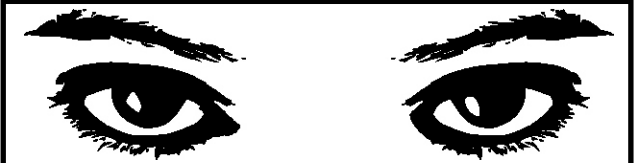

Air quality still improving, DNR report shows

MADISON - Concentrations of fine particles and other air pollutants in Wisconsin continue to improve - that is the latest message coming from the most recent data in the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Air Quality Trends Report.

The December 2016 report provides official state monitoring data through 2015 for air pollutants and shows trends in Wisconsin's air quality over time. In general, concentrations of most pollutants regulated under the Clean Air Act have been decreasing over the past decade in all regions of the state.

One of the many success stories highlighted in the report is the significant reduction in fine particle pollution. Fine particles form when air pollutants react in the atmosphere with ammonia and other gases. Fine particles may also be emitted directly from high temperature combustion sources such as vehicles, fires, or large boilers.

The trends report demonstrates how successful regulatory controls have been in reducing concentrations of this pollutant. Statewide, ambient concentrations of fine particles have decreased by approximately 30 percent over the last decade. The report shows a clear correlation between the start of this reduction and when new automobile fuel standards (regulations that removed sulfur - a fine particle precursor - from fuels used in automobiles) were implemented in 2007. Other state and federal regulations controlling the emissions of sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides from power plants are also responsible for these reductions. In Wisconsin, these reductions were so pronounced that three counties in Southeastern Wisconsin, which were not previously meeting the 24-hour fine particle standard, were able to be redesignated to attainment in 2014. All counties in Wisconsin now monitor concentrations of fine particles well below the federal air quality standards and are considered to be "in attainment" by U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The report reinforces the importance of operating a well-functioning statewide air program and air monitoring network, providing valuable information to understand Wisconsin's long-term trends in air quality. In tune with current alignment efforts, the DNR air program has and will continue to implement innovative approaches and efficiencies to address core priorities. Some of the report's other key findings include:

- Monitored pollutant levels continue to decrease statewide;
- The number of Wisconsin counties not meeting federal air quality standards remained at its lowest number since the enactment of the 1990 Clean Air Act amendments;
- The long term trend of overall improved air quality in Wisconsin has been occurring for decades.

"These trends demonstrate that Wisconsin's Air Program has been very successful in implementing regulatory approaches that are enhancing the state's air quality," said DNR Air Program Director Gail Good "Wisconsin's Air Program is a national leader in implementing strategies to improve air quality. Even though the air is much cleaner, the public may see information that suggests just the opposite. By providing real time monitoring data and information in the Trends Report, the department is ensuring the public has current and correct information so that they can see for themselves the improvements that have been made."

The air quality trends report, which includes an interactive map where the user can look at concentrations from sites around the state, is available on the DNR website.

News from Grow North Receives Hardwoods Products Strategy Grant

Grow North Economic Development Corporation focuses on creating economic development opportunities to improve the vitality of Oneida, Vilas, Forest, Lincoln, Langlade, Oconto, Florence, and Marinette counties. Areas of focus include workforce development, with efforts to attract, retain, and promote a pipeline of skilled workers to the region. Initiatives include engaging K-12 students by providing manufacturing and other business tours, FAB Lab / Maker Space opportunities, promoting forestry, logging, and wood products careers, and collaborating with businesses to offer apprenticeship opportunities. Vicky Oldham, Vice-President of Grow North, stated, "It is extremely important to provide educational opportunities for students through internships, applied learning, and dual credit options while in high school to prepare our youth for high-paying jobs in the region, as well as to build a sustainable pipeline of skilled talent for our workforce". Another area Grow North is focusing on is broadband expansion; "We play an active role in securing Connect America funds and Broadband Expansion grants, hosting round table listening sessions for businesses, and members of the community, and contacting legislators to ensure under or unserved rural areas receive assistance related to broadband coverage", explained Collette Sorgel, President of Grow North.

As a recipient of a Hardwood Products Strategy grant, Grow North is creating a marketing plan to showcase the wood products industry and related assets in the region. This includes the creation of a directory for the wood products industry, collaborating with the Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association and the Department of Natural Resources Forestry Products Services Division, promoting forestry, logging, and wood products careers, and developing markets for secondary woods, such as red pine, tamarack, etc.

In order to attract, develop, and grow new and existing businesses in the region, Grow North helps to create opportunities for entrepreneurs to develop skills and receive assistance. Financial support from the Juday Foundation, along with support from Vilas County Economic Development and Nicolet Technical College helps to provide scholarships for entrepreneurship training. To date, 53 individuals graduated from the training sessions and 26 either started or expanded their businesses. Entrepreneurship training will soon be expanded to address the needs of individuals with disabilities who would like to own their own business. By providing support and business space for start-up companies, Grow North ensures entrepreneurs have what they need to be successful. Dave Armour of Rental Shack in Eagle River utilized this opportunity to expand his business. "I found the Entrepreneurial Training invaluable. It helped me by being able to learn from and talk to the professional guest speakers that came to the training, including accountants, lawyers and other business people. I was able to take my business to the next level", said Armour. Chris Gaffron, owner of StitchIt in Eagle River, also understands the importance of the classes and support provided at the business incubator. "When I moved into the incubator in April 2012, I thought I was just getting rental space -- I didn't realize that I would also have support and guidance as I developed my business and created a business plan. I couldn't have done that without the help I received in the classes and from my mentors". Gaffron, who started out with just one industrial sewing machine, now owns three machines, as well as a laser garment printer. StitchIt provides custom embroidery and printed garments for businesses, resorts, and school districts. The company also has a special niche in the equestrian industry. Gaffron proudly added, "Whether I have an order for one item or an order for 1,000, the same high level of care is given to each piece, because I know that, to my customer, their order is the most important thing to them". To date, 10 businesses are currently housed in the business incubator space with 2 additional businesses looking to move in.

"Expanding opportunities for northern Wisconsin by leveraging partnerships and building strategies for growth will positively impact the economic vitality of our region", said Collette Sorgel, Grow North President. 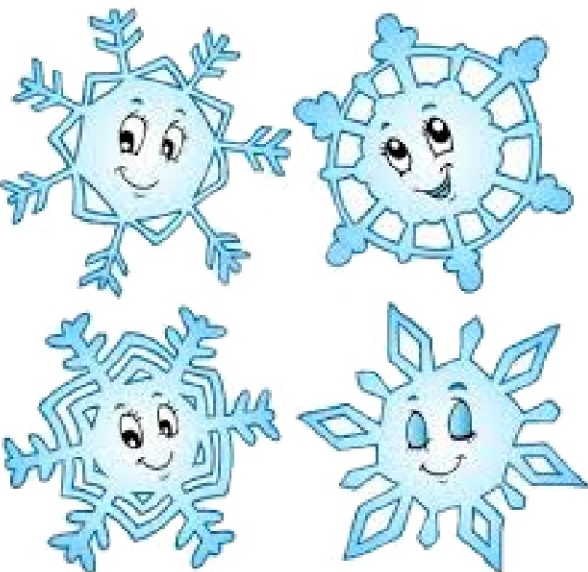

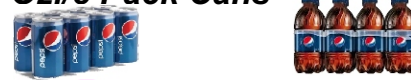
