

Ron Strong opens Soo Bahk Do studio in Crandon



Ron Strong is the proprietor and instructor at Strong SOO BAHK DO. He is in a new location, in Crandon, across from the Hotel Crandon. He is teaching a Korean style martial arts discipline. This is the only studio in Wisconsin and one of about 130 nationwide. Strong's studio is one piece of a world-wide organization.

Strong has been teaching this martial arts program for 22 years, which breaks down to 20 years of teaching in Marquette, Michigan and two years in Crandon. What Strong teaches is a course in self-discipline, mental discipline and self control. Strong says it teaches your mind to focus.

Office on Aging offers free bus rides in February

Have you thought about riding the bus, but think I can drive myself, why bother? The weather this time of the year can be unpredictable and somewhat intimidating to drive in

In hopes to encourage people to give the bus a try, February will be "Ride the Bus Free" month for everyone, new and veteran riders.

The Forest County Commission on Aging has two buses that have routes that travel to Rhinelander, Iron Mountain, Michigan and Crandon. You can make doctor or dentist appointments based on the scheduled routes or spend the day shopping your favorite stores.

Both buses are equipped to handle wheelchairs. Any citizen of Forest County 25 or older is able to ride. However, individuals 60 and over and persons with disabilities are given preference based on availability of seats.

You can find scheduled routes in the Pioneer Express by watching Senior Chatter or by calling the Aging Office at (715) 478-3256. Most riders can be picked up at their residence and will be returned home at the end of the day depending on the route schedule and where you live. Most trips last from 6 to 8 hours and include stops for lunch. It cost \$4.00 to ride the bus per day.



VOTING BY

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election

TOWN OF WABENO

Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail, email or in person.

Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is: 5 p.m. on the fifth day before the election, February 16, 2017.

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an absentee ballot in person

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

Monday, Wednesday, Friday - 8am to Noon The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is February 6, 2017.

The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office February 17, 2017.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election.

The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on February 21, 2017. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.

- ~Get students more involved in community activities, allowing the students to see what this area has to offer
- ~Add resources and expertise for teachers and learning environments.
- ~Build trust and support between school, parents and community.
- ~Teachers feel supported in their efforts to give our students the finest education.
- ~Give students more opportunities and increase their performance.
- ~Boost support and patronage for our businesses.

Being fiscally responsible is imperative, while still providing the best education for our students. We need to have a long term vision and plan that offers our district sustainability. With state budget cuts to our public schools, it is getting more difficult to make money stretch as far as it once did.
