Torc: The Off-Road Championship focuses on team development



TORC: The Off-Road Championship continues its dedication to the progression of short-course off-road racing with a move announced Thursday to redesign the rules of the TORC PRO 2 class. Favoring driver development, the change will create a more accessible pathway through the PRO classes by requiring PRO 2 trucks to run a 410ci engine and DOT tires. Changes will make the leap from PRO Light to PRO 2 more affordable and accessible for teams. With a lower operating cost for PRO 2's, sponsors will have the opportunity for their dollars to go further by investing in more teams for longer periods of time. With the move to DOT tires, retailers can pull alongside their favorite drivers to support them throughout the season.

"There are major cost gaps between running a PRO Light, PRO 2 and PRO 4 program that do not support driver progression within the PRO classes," said TORC Series Director Ben Nelson. "The high cost to sustain a competitive team at every PRO level has become such that sponsors/partners are supporting fewer drivers each season. Making racing more affordable will allow for growth of new talent through the ranks. Our objective is to maintain an elite PRO-level racing series while creating an atmosphere that allows more teams to get on the track year after year."

Wabeno Area School Board on proposed referendum

Dear Community Members,

The Board of Education has passed resolutions putting a referendum on the April 4, 2017 ballot. We have discussed this information at our monthly board meetings and plan to hold public informational meetings in February and March. The dates and times will be announced on the school district website.

This referendum is needed because our current referendum is expiring, a decline in state aid and increases in operating expenses. Without this referendum, projections show the fund balance running out in two years. Many schools in the surrounding area have passed a referendum in recent years in order to maintain educational programs and their local school districts.

This referendum will be for \$1,600,000 each year for five years. The district is seeking this amount of revenue for operational expenses, which are critical in order to maintain current programs for our students.

General spending, staff reductions, salary freezes, and changes of insurance are examples of reductions, which have been made in the school district. Further reductions to program offerings will be detrimental to the educational success of our students.

If the referendum does not pass, the district will have options: another referendum this fall, dissolution, staff reductions, cuts in extra-curricular activities, and fees for the food service program. Remember, if the district dissolves your taxes do not disappear. You will pay taxes at the mill rate of the new district where your property is located. Currently, the mill rates of our neighboring school districts are higher than the mill rate would be in our district with this referendum. The following chart provides mill rate information for Wabeno as well as the surrounding school districts.

Johnson supports Wisconsin Farm Bureau, encourages passage of Gray Wolves Bill

WASHINGTON — Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.) offered written testimony Wednesday in support of his bill to return control over the protection of gray wolves in Wisconsin and other states to federal wildlife experts rather than federal judges.

Senator Johnson offered written testimony Wednesday to a hearing by the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee on potential reforms to the Endangered Species Act. The bipartisan legislation introduced by Senator Johnson last month with Committee Chairman John Barrasso (R-Wyo.) would delist the gray wolf in Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota and Wyoming under the Endangered Species Act. U.S. Rep. Sean Duffy (R-Wis.) has sponsored similar legislation in the House of Representatives.

Excerpts of the written testimony submitted by Senator Johnson for the hearing are below:

"I am glad the committee invited Jim Holte from the Wisconsin Farm Bureau to provide insights on the Endangered Species Act's unintended, negative consequences. I strongly agree with what I have heard directly from Mr. Holte and other stakeholders including farmers, ranchers, loggers and sportsmen—that all future gray wolf listing decisions should be made by experts in the field, not judges in courtrooms.

"In order to correct the misguided judicial action, I first introduced legislation two years ago with Chairman Barrasso requiring the Department of the Interior to reissue the respective 2011 and 2012 delisting decisions for Great Lakes and Wyoming gray wolves. Unfortunately, Congress did not take action on our bill last session. I was pleased to reintroduce the Johnson-Barrasso legislation, S.164, this year with the welcome addition of bipartisan support.

"I am hopeful this committee and Congress will pass S.164 soon and note our bill takes a sensible approach that allows states to manage gray wolf populations while not modifying the Endangered Species Act. The bill also does not prevent Fish and Wildlife Service experts from ever returning the wolf to the endangered list if it determines the population is in need of federal protection. This legislation provides us an example of how states and the federal government can work together towards reasonable, common-sense solutions for ecosystem preservation."

Representative Mursau receives "Friend Of Education" award

State Rep. Jeff Mursau (R-Crivitz) is the recipient of the 2017 "Friend of Education" award from the Fair Aid Coalition in recognition of his leadership to ensure fair funding for area school districts.

"Rep. Mursau, as a respected member of the Wisconsin legislature, has helped to bring attention to the unique needs and challenges of small, lake area school districts in northern Wisconsin," said Ben Niehaus, president of the Fair Aid Coalition and administrator of the School District of Florence County. Niehaus said that the coalition is especially grateful for Rep. Mursau's efforts to ensure that high property value school districts in northern Wisconsin receive at least \$1000 per pupil in state school aid.

Rep. Mursau, along with Sen. Tom Tiffany (R-Hazlehurst), is leading the effort to add a provision to the 2017-19 state Budget to establish a \$1000 per pupil "floor" in the state school aid formula.

Niehaus explained that of the \$6.458 billion the state will spend on K-12 education in 2016-17, roughly 70 percent, or \$4.5 billion, is distributed through a school aid formula that only uses property to measure "wealth." As a result, he said, some 60 rural, lake area and suburban school districts with high property values per pupil receive little or no state general aid (equalization aid/special adjustment aid), regardless of their community's ability to pay.

In the 2016-17 school year, 14 area school districts will receive less than \$1000 per pupil in general aid, including Beecher-Dunbar-Pembine, Crivitz, Elcho, Lakeland UHS, Minocqua J1, North Lakeland, Northland



According to Patrick Mans, administrator of the Crivitz School District, the \$1,000 per pupil minimum aid floor would address the continual loss of state general aid that is placing an unfair burden on local property taxpayers. "The needs of small, rural school districts are front and center thanks to the strong leadership of our local legislators, and this is another strong example of the good work that is being done on behalf of our students and taxpayers," he said.





U.S. Senators Baldwin and Tillis introduce legislation to support job creation for America's Veterans

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) and Thom Tillis (R-NC) introduced bipartisan legislation today that would support job creation for America's veterans, the Boosting Rates of American Veterans Employment (BRAVE) Act.

"America's veterans have bravely served our nation and we have a shared responsibility to make sure their service and sacrifice is honored," said Senator Baldwin. "The BRAVE Act is a bipartisan reform that can help reduce the unemployment rate for veterans and create jobs for them. I am proud to work across party lines with Senator Tillis and reward businesses that are putting our veterans to work."

"I'm proud to join Senator Baldwin to introduce bipartisan legislation that supports businesses who employ and back our veterans," said Senator Tillis. "The men and women who served in our military bring tremendous leadership capabilities and work ethic to the private sector, and the BRAVE Act is a major win for both veterans and employers who hire them."

The BRAVE Act is supported by The American Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), Military Order of the Purple Heart, The American Legion - Department of Wisconsin and the VFW - Department of Wisconsin.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) establishes long-term contracts with private businesses for medical equipment, supplies, services and more. Currently, the VA gives preference for these contracts to veteran-owned small businesses, however it does not give preference to businesses that actively employ veterans.

The BRAVE Act would change that and allow the VA to consider the proportion of veterans employed by a prospective contractor when awarding federal contracts. The VA Secretary would have the authority to give preference to businesses that employ veterans on a fulltime basis, and the VA would determine the preference for a business based on their percentage of full-time veteran

The bipartisan legislation would also encourage and incentivize VA contractors to employ veterans on a full-time basis. In addition, the Baldwin-Tillis legislation provides oversight of VA contractors and would allow for a 5-year debarment from contracting for those who knowingly misrepresent their proportion of veteran employees.

The BRAVE Act companion legislation (H.R. 974) led by Rep. Kathleen Rice (D-NY) and Rep. Paul Cook (R-CA) passed the House of Representatives last night.
