#### Wisconsin wild turkey, pheasant & waterfowl stamps available April 12, 2017.

Stamp funds are available to non-profit conservation organizations and units of government focused on habitat development, management, preservation, restoration and maintenance for wild turkey, pheasant and waterfowl. Funding for successful applicants will be available during the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' 2018 and 2019 fiscal vears.

"Because of these stamp programs, millions of dollars have been dedicated to projects directly related to habitat and species management of Wisconsin's turkey, pheasant and waterfowl populations," said Jaqi Christopher, DNR assistant upland wildlife ecologist.

Habitat projects typically involve restoration and management of valuable woodland, savanna, grassland and wetland communities.

"The diverse habitat work funded by the sale of Wisconsin Wild Turkey, Pheasant and Waterfowl Stamps is a significant benefit to the citizens of Wisconsin," said Eddie Shea, DNR assistant wetland habitat specialist. "These types of projects provide quality habitat for a broad suite of wildlife species, offering a great outdoor experience to hunters and non-hunters alike."

Funds are generated from the sale of Wild Turkey, Pheasant or Waterfowl Stamps, as well as a portion of conservation patron license sales. While stamps are required to hunt these species, many collectors and nature enthusiasts also purchase the stamps to help support wildlife habitat.

On average, annual wildlife stamp revenue exceeds \$300,000 for pheasant, \$750,000 for wild turkey and \$550,000 for waterfowl. Through state law, 60 percent of Pheasant Stamp funds are reserved for game farm pheasant production, while one-third of Waterfowl Stamp funds are reserved for habitat projects in Canada, where a significant proportion of Wisconsin's fall ducks are reared.

For eligibility information and criteria, application guidance, funding priorities, and further information, visit dnr.wi.gov and search keyword "wildlife stamps."

#### Pickerel Volunteer & Rescue announces upgrade



Pickerel Volunteer Fire and Rescue is pleased to announce an upgrade to its equipment at Station Three in the Town of Ainsworth with the acquisition of a new water tender from Firovac Power Systems in Ohio. The new tender is an exponential upgrade in functionality, capability, and safety from the previous water tender. Nationwide, fire department water tenders are involved in more accidents per number of responses than any other emergency vehicle which made replacement of the older homemade truck a high priority. Firovac has built similar trucks for departments throughout the continental US as well as Alaska. The new truck meets and in some areas exceeds national safety standards for fire apparatus.

The truck being replaced was a used 1991 Ford purchased by the department over 15 years ago. It carried an 1800 gallon milk tank that was purchased used by the department in 1973 and placed on a used 1966 International. This tank was later moved to a used 1977 Mack and then to the Ford. The new truck has a 2850 gallon water tank and fire body built on a 2017 International chassis purchased locally from Quinlan's Equipment.

The new truck is built with a vacuum pump and tank design that is very similar to many septic trucks in service throughout Wisconsin. Firovac has been building vacuum trucks for fire departments since 1985 and continues to pioneer this design in the fire service. Several fire department friendly changes such as larger suction hose, three sided loading and unloading, heaters, and powered portable tank holders are used to make the truck safer and more efficient. The old truck needed a minimum

of 2 people and either a portable pump or another truck to setup and refill in a process which took 15 minutes or more initially plus travel time. The new truck can, at times, be setup and self-filled by 1 person in under 5 minutes. This means it can be back at a fire scene delivering water before the previous truck could be filled. It also retains the capability to filled in the same manner as the previous truck if needed. The department anticipates the new truck will outperform the old truck by at least a 2 to 1 ratio in gallons per minute of water delivered while using less personnel.

The process of replacing the previous truck was started nearly a decade ago with current and former department personnel looking forward to the future and anticipating several truck replacements in the coming years. Two other recent fiscally advantageous purchases of used apparatus opened the door for this truck to be purchased after much patience. Pickerel Volunteer Fire and Rescue would like to extend its gratitude to Firovac Power Systems, Quinlan's Equipment, its own personnel who served on the truck acquisition committee and helped with getting truck ready for service, Ainsworth and Nashville townships, and most of all to the greater Pickerel community which supports the department making these improvements possible.





### USDA funding available for septic system repairs

STEVENS POINT, Wis., March 16, 2017 – U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development Housing Program Director Dave Schwobe announced today that funding is available for Wisconsin residents to make repairs to their homes.


"During the cold, wet, short days of winter, you probably enjoy spending more time inside with a blanket by the fire and less time outside enjoying the beauties of nature," Schwobe said. "As the days begin to lengthen, the temperatures rise and you start to think about spring cleaning, keep in mind what's in your yard that you don't see---your septic system."

If an inspection of your septic system indicates that it needs to be repaired, replaced or upgraded, USDA Rural Development can provide assistance through home repair loans and grants. Loans are available for up to \$20,000 at a one percent fixed interest rate for up to 20 years. Individuals who are age 62 and older and who do not have repayment ability for a loan, may be eligible for a grant of up to \$7,500. Funds can cover all upfront and construction costs, including septic system designs, permits and installations.

Program eligibility is based on household income that cannot exceed 50 percent of the area median income and the property must be located in a rural community. Portions of all counties in Wisconsin are eligible for Rural Development's housing programs with the exception of Milwaukee County.

"The cheapest septic system you'll ever have is the one you're using now," says Schwobe. "Having it inspected may prevent septic system failure and will protect your investment, your family and Wisconsin's groundwater."

Previous to the referendum 3 year ago, and with this new referendum, school administrators state they have implemented staff reductions, salary freezes, and changes to insurance in effort to reduce expenses. After compiling figures for the last 5 years (from the Districts "Summary of Receipts and Expenditures") it looks like total salaries have increased 19% for the 2016-17 budget over the 2012-13 amount, budgeted benefits increased 30%, and purchased services have more than doubled. Where are the reductions? Budgeted benefits are 51% of salaries. Can you justify this and ask for an additional \$1.6 million per year for 5 years?

Wabeno School District's 2014-15 per student spending was \$16,371. According to Wisc Dept of Instruction, the average per student spending in the state is \$12,842. Rural school districts are usually a bit higher than average.

Per Wisc. DPI the 2014-15 average ratio of students to staff statewide is 8.4. Wabeno's is 5.6. With less than 30 seniors graduating, do we really need a student to staff ratio less than the state average?

For 2014 - 2015 ACT test results, Wabeno's avg. composite score was lower than Beecher-Dunbar-Pembine, Crandon, Elcho, Florence Co., Laona, Three Lakes, and White Lake. Do we have a successful academic program?

The free food service program is voted on at the school board annual meeting, why not have that as a referendum question?

Rural school districts do struggle with rising expenses, but considering the above information, is 1.6 million per year justified

We have submitted questions to the Wabeno School District Referendum site, but have not seen the response yet.



Some of these flavors include cotton candy, gummy bear, cookies 'n cream, and peanut butter cup. All these different flavors have helped fuel the popularity of these products among kids. 81.5 percent of youth ecigarette users and 73.8 percent of youth cigar users state that they use these products because they come in flavors that they like. Simply, tobacco products should not be sold in flavors that appeal to our youth, and especially in thousands of different flavors that make using them seem fun and harmless.

#### Drug Sentencing Cont. from pg. 1

-- Anthony Quintana (age: 43), of Weston: 10 years in prison, 10 years of supervised release;

-- Karen Quintana (age: 39), of Weston: 2 years in prison, 5 years of supervised release; and -- Diana Alvarado (age: 40), of Mole Lake: 30 months in prison, 5 years of supervised release.

The investigation revealed that the three defendants conspired amongst themselves and with others, and distributed more than 150 grams of methamphetamine in the Mole Lake area. The group also distributed in excess of 100 illegally obtained oxycodone pills. On four separate occasions between November 2015 and January 2016, Anthony Quintana and Diana Alvarado distributed at least an ounce of methamphetamine to others, with one delivery in excess of 2 ounces. Karen Quintana participated in two of the deliveries and arranged other deliveries of methamphetamine. The deliveries occurred in Alvarado's apartment on the Mole Lake Indian Reservation, with her young daughter present at the time of multiple deliveries.

In sentencing Anthony Quintana, Chief Judge Griesbach noted the serious nature of the offense, referring to Quintana's prior convictions for drug dealing, and stated that the defendant was "unwilling, uninterested or unable" to stop selling drugs despite the prior convictions. In sentencing Karen Quintana, Chief Judge Griesbach discussed the impact of methamphetamine dealing, saying the defendant was part of a group that "destroys the fabric of communities." In sentencing Alvarado, Chief Judge Griesbach reiterated the seriousness of the offense, and pointed out Alvarado's elevated role in helping sell "poison" in the community, and greater involvement in the criminal activity.

The case was investigated by the Forest County Sheriff's Department, the Wisconsin Department of Justice Division of Criminal Investigation (Native American Drug and Gang Initiative), Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory, and the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs. It was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Andrew J. Maier.

Editor's Note: In addition to the federal sentencing, Kole McGeshick, of Crandon, was sentenced in Forest County Court to three years in state prison and five years of extended supervision for trafficking, delivery and possession of prescription narcotics and marijuana.




