Crandon Library News History on Tap



History on Tap to feature historic Forest County Farm

This month's History on Tap program is scheduled for Tuesday, April 25th at 7:00 p.m. and will feature a presentation by Wisconsin's National Register Coordinator Peggy Veregin. Ms. Veregin will be discussing the John and Anna Wywialowski Farmstead, located in the town of Armstrong Creek, which has recently gained recognition on the National and State Register of Historic places.

According to the Wisconsin Historical Society's website, the John and Anna Wywialowski Farmstead was purchased in 1936 in the Town of Armstrong Creek in an area well known as Wisconsin's Cutover region.

The cutover land, a by-product of lumber companies profits in the early 1900's, was eventually marketed and sold by the lumber companies and land speculators to would-be farmers, many of whom had been drawn from immigrant populations in cities like Chicago and Milwaukee

The Wywialowski family farm grew from a twocow Wisconsin frontier farm to a successful dairy farm that eventually handled over one hundred head of cattle. The Wisconsin State Historical Society believes that this Armstrong Creek property is "an excellent representative of an early-to-mid-twentieth-century Cutover farm."

In addition to discussing the historical significance of this property to Forest County's history, Ms. Veregin will also be discussing the steps necessary to nominating a piece of property to the state historic register, as well as the benefits of doing so.

This month's History on Tap program will be held at Group Therapy, located within one of Crandon's earliest historic buildings, the Page and Landeck Building. According to the book titled Crandon and the Page-Korb Mercantile Company "Forest County's Big Store" started business in 1900 and was recognized as the leading store in Forest County, catering to the "wants of the lumber interests and to the fast-growing farmers' trade." This book, along with photos of this historic building and information about the Wywialowski farm can be found online on our website at www.crandonpl.org. There is no registration required for History on Tap and this event is free of charge.

Nursing home closing creates crisis situation

The abrupt, unexpected closing of a Crandon nursing home has created a crisis like situation for the Forest County community. This past week AGI Healthcare notified city and county officials of the imminent closing of the facility forcing residents and their families to scramble to find new living arrangements. Thirty-eight residents have been notified of the closing and advised to find new homes as quickly as possible.

Upon notice of the facility closing, Forest County Economic Development Partnership called an emergency meeting with city and county officials on Wednesday afternoon to discuss the situation with the hope of finding a solution to keep the home open. Interim management officials from AGI were also in attendance. In addition to the stress put on residents and families, the facility employs seventy individuals, a vital employer in the community. Complicating the dire situation is the fact that the AGI owner made the unexpected decision without consulting or advising local officials.

Mark Ferris, Executive Director of the Forest County Economic Development Partnership commented, "You would expect in this type of situation, ownership would have provided fair warning of his decision. We're now dealing in a crisis, emergency situation that leaves very little wiggle room to keep the nursing home open. Had notice or discussions started even three or six months ago, we'd have a much better chance in resolving things. It is unthinkable that such little regard for the residents, families, and employees has been a part of the owner's approach. We understand there can be business issues, but we believe this decision was in place long before we were notified." Ferris went on to say that officials are looking at every option, 'leaving no stone unturned' to remedy the situation.

County Deer Advisory Council to meet for final recommendations for 2017 deer season

The public has a final opportunity to provide comments on antierless deer harvest quota, permit level and season structure recommendations for Forest County.

The council will hold its final spring meeting on April 19 at 6:30 p.m. in the Forest County Board Room. At this meeting, the council will receive additional public comments prior to developing final recommendations.

The council's preliminary recommendations, formed during its March meeting, are available for review at dnr.wi.gov, keyword "CDAC," by clicking "Find" and selecting Forest County. Councils considered scientific data and public opinion when developing their preliminary recommendations.

The council has recommended a harvest quota of 300, with 400 private land and 400 public land antierless permits available to hunters.

The council is also recommending that junior antlerless permits be valid in the county for the 2017 deer seasons.

To develop its final recommendations, the council will consider online input and other public comments along with professional assessments from Department of Natural Resources wildlife biologists, foresters and law enforcement. The public may also comment at any time before April 16 by contacting a CDAC member (a list is available on the CDAC web page at dnr.wi.gov, keyword) or by emailing DNRCDACwebmail@Wisconsin.gov.

Forest County's final quota, permit level and season structure recommendations will be presented to the DNR following the April meeting, and will then advance to the Natural Resources Board for approval in May. Once approved, the recommendations will take effect for the 2017 deer hunting season.
