Thirty years ago, this week, I walked into the Pioneer Express, office to visit with Phil Orlenko. I had come to town to buy hydraulic oil, and knew Phil because he carried the news, that I wrote, for the Lake States Independent Logger's Association. I was shocked to learn that he was giving up on the Pioneer, and was moving back to Sheboygan after a run that lasted a little over a year. The question was whether or not I wanted to take over the debt and own the paper.

I had whittled down my logging operation to me, a John Deere skidder and the only crew was Max, a springer spaniel that liked to go to the woods with me. But, I had to give an answer right away. I said yes, and hurried home to tell my wife, Linda, that we were now in the publishing and printing business. I changed clothes and hurried back to help Judy Burkey and Penny Carter put out the first issue of November of 1987. Thirty years have passed.

We started in the little garage next to the nursing home, moved to an old house off main street temporarily, until something opened up on the main street. We were there five years. On September 1st of 1993, we opened the door for the first day of business where we are now.

It has been fun, mostly. We have had some great people work for us, and we have enjoyed helping local businesses get the word out about what their products and services, as well as carry some of the area news. We intend to go for awhile longer.



Senior Chatter
What to do about Equifax Data Breach

You may have heard about the recent data breach at Equifax, one of the three major credit reporting agencies in the U.S. The data breach affected approximately 143 million Americans. According to Equifax, the breach occurred between mid-May through July of this year. The information released included people's names, Social Security numbers, birth dates, addresses, and even driver's license numbers. In addition, the data breach released credit card numbers of roughly 209,000 people, along with other documents with personally identifying information of nearly 182,000 people.

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) recommends that people take the following steps to help protect their information. First, find out if your information was affected. You can go to Equifax's website, <https://www.equifaxsecurity2017.com/potential-impact/>, and enter your last name and the last six digits of your Social Security number. You should be sure to use a secure computer to do this. The website will tell you if the data breach affected you.

Individuals in the U.S. can get a year of free credit monitoring whether or not they were affected. Equifax's website will give you a date when you can come back to enroll in these services. On that date, you can go back to the website and click "Enroll." You will have until November 21, 2017 to enroll.

Equifax also provides answers to some frequently asked questions here: <https://www.equifaxsecurity2017.com/frequently-asked-questions/>.

In addition, here are some other steps you can take to protect your identity:

- Always keep a close eye on your credit card and bank accounts to watch for charges you don't recognize.
- Check your credit reports for free by visiting www.annualcreditreport.com. If you see activity you don't recognize, it might be due to identity theft. You can learn more about identity theft at <https://www.identitytheft.gov> or by contacting your local police department.
- Think about placing a credit freeze on your files. This makes it harder for someone to use your identity to open a new account in your name. Keep in mind that it doesn't prevent someone from using your existing accounts.

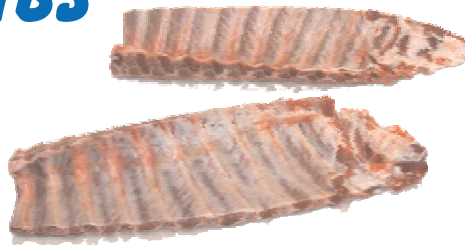

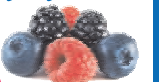

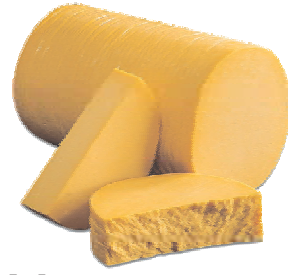

Through the month of November, we will be repringing old news stories from the Pioneer. Some will bring back memories to our readers as well as our staff.

From January 30, 1995, a year when we had very little snow

In keeping with World Cup tradition, Crandon officials also announced a minimum total cash and prize purse of \$200,000 for 2018. This year the record-breaking World Cup purse included \$150,700 in cash divided into eight Crandon World Championship races, including a massive \$68,500 alone for the 8th annual AMSOIL Cup Challenge weekend finale.

The 2018 Crandon World Cup purse will include a \$49,000 first place prize, plus a custom engraved Henry Rifle, Lincoln Electric Welder and brand new Impact Racing safety equipment for the winner of the AMSOIL Cup Challenge -- a format that pits unlimited PRO 2 versus PRO 4 trucks against each other after a timed staggered start.

The Crandon World Cup is part of the Crandon World Championship Off-Road Race weekend that comprised 29 races in 2017, including a complete slate of TORC PRO and Sportsman classes. Coveted Crandon World Championship titles and custom rings are presented to all PRO and Sportsman winners.

As is Crandon World Cup tradition, the day's format will be comprised of the world's best off-road racers competing in a wide variety of PRO categories including PRO 4 unlimited trucks, PRO 2 East and PRO 2 two-wheel drive trucks, PRO Light limited trucks, PRO Buggy open-wheel cars, PRO Stock and PRO Modified UTV classes and the PRO Modified Karts for the sport's youngest drivers.

In addition to the record purse, Crandon International Raceway also set new watershed marks in 2018 with a record crowd of 54,404 through the facility's massive gates over two days. Earlier in the week all 2,100 grass camping sites within the 400 plus acres that make up the "Big House" were sold before weekend racing even started.

"When we created the Crandon World Cup the promise to racers, teams and our fans was to put the best drivers in the world at the biggest track for the biggest purse in front of the biggest crowd," explained Crandon President Cliff Flannery. "From our perspective Sunday of Labor Day weekend is now the unchallenged Indy 500 or Daytona 500 of short-course off-road racing. It's what the sport needs and what fans around the country deserve. Our goal going into 2018 is taking this momentum and making the Crandon World Cup even bigger and better."

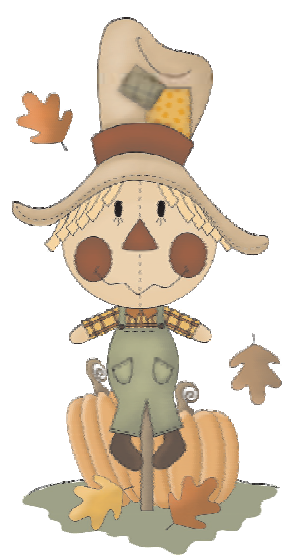

COOLER WEATHER**

Devastating house fires can happen in an instant, and many begin due to human error. The U.S. Fire Administration reports that cooking tops the list of residential building fire causes (50%), followed by heating equipment (12.5%) and electrical malfunction (6.3%).

Make your fall and winter seasons merry, bright and fire-free with these essential fire safety tips.

1. Schedule a chimney inspection at least once a year. Creosote, or condensed smoke, builds up on the flue and can catch fire. An annual cleaning and inspection can prevent chimney.

2. Keep flammable items at least three feet from heat sources. According to the National Fire Prevention Association, 56% of fatal home heating fires ignite from items being used too close to heating equipment. Make sure everything is a safe distance from heat sources, including the furnace, space heaters, fireplaces and wood stoves.

3. Check smoke detectors frequently. Approximately 60% of house fire deaths happen in structures with no working smoke alarms. Test your home's smoke alarms monthly and replace batteries each year.

4. Have a family escape plan and practice it regularly. All household members need to know all exit strategies in case a fire breaks out, as well as where to meet once they're safely outside. Have a semiannual drill and practice at different times of day.

5. Cook safely. Never leave the room when boiling, frying or baking, keep pot holders and dish towels away from the flame and immediately turn off appliances when not in use.

6. Be mindful of holiday decorations. If you choose to decorate with strings of lights, always check their condition first. Throw out those with exposed electrical wiring and be sure to read over the manufacturer's instructions.
