Opposition forms against housing sexual predators in the Town of Blackwell

Opposition is building against the plan to house sexual predators in the Town of Blackwell. To be more specific, in a home in a development on Bear Lake, east of the Village of Blackwell.

The problem began with the purchase of a house and property within the Bear Lake Shores development on Bear Lake. The Bear Lake Shores Association, Inc. learned that the purchase was made by a company with the intent to rent the house to violent sex offenders.

The Bear Lake Shores Association is objecting for a variety of reasons, the most obvious, of course, is that they don't want sexual predators within the community when they have families visiting. In addition, there are deed covenants in place on the development prohibiting any commercial use of any of the properties within the development.

There is also a federal campground on Bear Lake, with a beach and other amenities, and the Forest Service is strongly considering closing the facility should there be convicted sexual predators in the neighborhood.

According to a lawyer, who is not formally hired in this case but has done some research of Wisconsin statutes on situations such as this, the placement of convicted sexual predators in this location would violate the laws of Wisconsin.

Should this rental happen, there is a fear for children and grandchildren in the area, and a fear that with these residents in place, property values will decline.


Inexplicably, there has been a legal ruling that the placement can proceed by Vilas County Judge Neal Nielsen, but the ruling was made, it is thought, before the Town of Blackwell had submitted its response on the matter.

There have been other situations where an attempt or query was made to locate sexual predators in Forest County communities, but haven't succeeded as of yet.

It should be noted that the Bear Lake area doesn't have good cell phone reception, making property owners nervous, because they are afraid that if there is an incident, they couldn't get through to the Forest County Sheriff's Department.

Residents of the area appear to be determined to stop the placement of these individuals within their community.

Laona Courthouse/Jail meeting an opinion

The meeting in Laona on the jail/courthouse issue was held in the gymnasium last Wednesday, January 24th. Like the previous meetings held in Wabeno and Crandon, there was a slide show showing the problems with the current jail and courthouse. After attending all three meetings, I must admit that I wouldn't want to see it again!

The slide show covering the current deficiencies makes some points that have to be addressed, but there are some of the problems depicted that I would call a stretch. Yes, there are extension cords in some of the photos, valves that are probably sticky, an IT room that is obviously the result of adding technology as needed, and does look messy, and a carpet that is generating static electricity.

Most people commented that these are all problems that should have been fixed through the years, and shouldn't be reasons for tearing down the 1909 courthouse, anymore than you would tear down your house because the wiring was insufficient and you didn't like the carpet.

That's not to say there aren't serious problems with the old grand courthouse. Certainly, the heating plant should have been replaced years ago. From what we have been told, there are some leaks in the roof that need attention. No doubt there is a long list of maintenance issues, but then again, as I write this, the courthouse is open and operating, and likely can do so for scores of years to come with proper care. I think most readers will agree with this assumption.

The jail problem began this process. Sheriff Dennee and staff are pushed to the limit for space. The need for a secure court room and secure access is also not just a whim. More storage is needed.

Whatever the reason for the meetings in Wabeno, Crandon and Laona, there are needs to be met, but those needs must fit the capabilities of Forest County taxpayers ability to pay. This was made abundantly clear by those members of the Laona audience who chose to speak.

One of the speakers from the audience brought out some statistics on Forest County. He had looked up things like the average wage, the amount of people living in poverty, the amount of delinquent taxes already on the books, and more. His conclusion was that the people of Forest County are in no position to handle a large raise in their taxes. Other speakers also put forth similar thoughts.

To refresh the memory, the brochure mailed to taxpayers of the county gave two options. One option cost approximately \$26 million, and that option saved the old 1909 courthouse. The other option saved \$3 million, to quote the brochure, but meant that the old courthouse would be razed and that area used for parking lot.

After listening to people attending all three meetings, those who want to retain the old courthouse make up the vast majority. Those who don't want the county to take on a huge debt are also in the majority. Those who realize there is a problem facing Forest County with their law enforcement facility are also in the majority, especially when they are given the facts.

It is hoped by, I think, most of the residents that the county board will listen to their constituents and not spend any more money than is absolutely necessary to upgrade the jail and do the necessary repairs to the 1909 court house. Like a household, the county must live within its means, and putting a huge tax burden on the residents isn't good government.

At all of the meetings, Wabeno, Crandon and Laona, it was stressed that because the board didn't have to hold a referendum on this issue, they weren't going to. They also made it clear that constituents should call their county supervisor and voice their opinion.

I went to the Crandon meeting and it was interesting that, in my opinion, it seemed like the decision had been made and we were just being appeased. So, I urge all the residents of Forest County to call your representative to tell them to go back to the drawing board.

I know we all love the "best" of everything. When we built Praise Chapel Church we would have loved to have a lot more but we had to work within a budget and we had to build with common sense. At this point, I believe the proposed courthouse project is way over the heads of Forest County's ability to pay. The county is already over taxed because most of the land is non-taxable. We need to look at plans that stay within a reasonable budget I have talked to a few people and we agree that there is a way to build and refurbish buildings to stay in a budget that would not require a raise in taxes.

How? Refurbish the courthouse, Social Security, and jail buildings. Then build a building on the East side of the courthouse to connect the jail to the courthouse. In that new building, put the courtroom, the utilities, the elevator, and storage.

I believe you can do it with no additional taxes because the County Shop will be paid off and the money used to pay on the shop can be used for the Courthouse project, and therefore no taxes need to be raised.

In the days before radio and television, an entertainment center like this was a very popular asset to a community, and people carried memories of the good times in this type of establishment until the end of their days.





Besides these complications, new research estimates that diabetes and its complications cause 12% of all deaths, making diabetes the third leading cause of U.S. death. Medicare covers supplies and services to treat or prevent diabetes-related problems.

What Medicare Part B may cover:

- · The fasting blood glucose test. This test screens for diabetes. Medicare covers two blood glucose tests each year for those at high risk for diabetes.
- · Supplies to control diabetes. These include blood sugar testing monitors, blood sugar test strips, lancet devices and lancets, and blood sugar control solutions.
- · An external insulin pump and the insulin used by the pump.
- · A foot exam every six months, provided you have not seen a foot care professional for another reason between visits.
- Therapeutic shoes for diabetics who need special footwear.
- · Medicare nutrition therapy for diabetes, if referred by a doctor.
- Self-managment training. Medicare covers up to 10 hours of initial diabetes self-management training. You may also receive up to two hours of follow-up training each year. The follow-up training may not occur in a calender year in which you got your initial training. The training includes tips for eating healthy, being active, monitoring blood sugar, taking drugs, and reducing risks. You must have a health-care professional's written order for the diabetes training.

What Medicare Part D may cover:

- Insulin not given through an insulin pump
- · Certain medical supplies to administer the insulin. Supplies may include syringes, needles, alcohol swabs, gauzes, and inhaled insulin devices.





Senators Baldwin and Collins praise signing of RAISE Family Caregivers Act

Bipartisan law to establish a national strategy to support family caregivers is endorsed by over 60 aging and disability organizations

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) and Susan Collins (R-ME) are applauding yesterday's signage of the Recognize, Assist, Include, Support, and Engage (RAISE) Family Caregivers Act into law. This bipartisan effort is especially personal to me as I was raised by my maternal grandparents and later served as my grandmother's primary caretaker as she grew older. I know the challenges that family caregivers face. I've listened to family caregivers across Wisconsin. This reform will provide much-needed support for family caregivers and help ensure that our older adults and loved ones with disabilities receive the highest quality care in their own homes," said Senator Baldwin. "Every day, family caregivers do right by their loved ones, and I am proud to say we are doing right by them with the RAISE Family Caregivers Act being signed into law to formally recognize and support family caregivers across this country."

"Family caregivers play an essential role in our communities by dedicating time and attention and making countless personal and financial sacrifices to care for their loved ones," said Senator Collins. "I am delighted that our bipartisan legislation to develop a coordinated strategic plan to leverage our resources, promote best practices, and expand services and training available to caregivers has been signed into law. Family caregivers across America will now receive the much-needed recognition they deserve as well as the resources and training needed to better balance the full-time job of caregiving along with everything else that life brings."

"Signing the RAISE Family Caregivers Act into law is an important step in supporting the nation's 40 million family caregivers who take care of loved ones, many of them elderly, often with very little support or

· 40 million family caregivers in the United States provided an estimated \$470 billion in uncompensated long-term care in 2013.

· Many caregivers are putting their own health at risk since caregivers experience high levels of stress and have a greater incidence of chronic conditions like heart disease, cancer, and depression.


