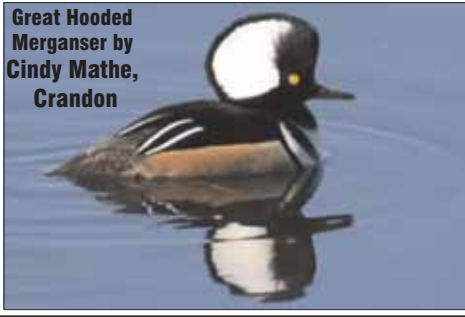

Jail/Courthouse meeting was held on May 7th

A meeting was held on May 7th at the Forest County Courthouse to further discuss the upcoming jail and courthouse project. The building committee was present as was the citizens advisory group.

The architect from the Wendel firm, David Cahisky, was in attendance, as was Mr. Berner from the Samuels Group.

The first topic discussed was whether to keep the old sheriff's quarter and jail or to tear it down. This topic occupied about 45 minutes of the meeting, with Berner pushing to eliminate the structure as well as the 1966 structure that connects the 1909 courthouse with the old jail and houses a number of apartments. According to Berner, there is a crack in an interior cement block wall, indicating that there is something wrong with the foundation. Berner said that the cost to renovate would be close to the cost of a new structure. The architect agrees, but it is a good guess that the building committee and the citizens committee don't necessarily buy into tearing down the building.

One of the reasons for eliminating the old structure is removal of asbestos and lead-based paint, but it also came out that the abatement of the paint and the asbestos has to be done whether the structure is torn down or retained. This cost, according to Mr. Berner, is estimated to be \$90,000 to \$100,000. It wasn't decided whether or not to raze the old structure or keep it, but there are many more meetings on the horizon.

Those of the citizens group that have toured the current jail are in agreement that the facility is inadequate and that something has to be done. Answers weren't forthcoming, but Mr. Cahisky, the architect, assured everybody that work is in progress that will provide a variety of options for the jail and new, secure courtroom.

Cahisky did an update on the studies that Wendel has done on the placement of departments within the courthouse complex, that show the space needed for various departments and possible improvements for handicap access to departments where it is likely more needed than other departments.

Other items discussed were the mechanical deficiencies in all of the structures, and it is obvious that there is an urgent need for upgrades in all of the buildings. This would include heating and cooling units, upgrades to electrical and computer systems.

Obviously, these decisions will be decided in time, and hopefully in the most cost-effective manner possible.

Crandon Post Office asks residents to help stamp out hunger

On Saturday, May 12, the National Association of Letter Carriers, U.S. Postal Service and other partners are asking the people of Crandon, Argonne, Hiles, Newald and Cavour to help Stamp Out Hunger. The annual food drive has grown into a national effort that provides assistance to the millions of Americans struggling to put food on the table.

The Stamp Out Hunger food drive, held on the 2nd Saturday in May, has become the nation's largest single-day food drive. In 2015, generous Americans donated 70.6 million pounds of food, feeding millions of people. This was the 14th consecutive year of at least 70 million pounds collected by letter carriers, bringing the grand total to 1.4 billion pounds of food collected, since the Food Drive began in 1993.

To participate in the annual Stamp Out Hunger food drive, residents are encouraged to leave a sturdy bag containing non-perishable food items such as canned soup, canned vegetables, peanut butter, pasta, rice or cereal next to their mailbox prior to the time of regular mail delivery on Saturday, May 12. Carriers have distributed blue bags to everyone's mailbox for their use. Letter carriers, along with volunteers from the community will collect these food donations. Carriers will be collecting food as they deliver the mail and take them to local food banks. All donations will stay in the community to be distributed by local food banks. If you wish, you can also drop your donations off at the Crandon Post Office during normal business hours.

Commission on Aging looking to fill a board vacancy

Membership on the Commission on Aging requires attendance at bi-monthly (daytime) meetings. Members receive a mileage reimbursement to travel to the meetings at the Courthouse.

Applications may be obtained by calling or stopping in the Office on Aging (Courthouse - north annex) and must be returned to the Office on Aging on or before 4:30 p.m. Tuesday, May 29, 2018. The Committee will review the applications and candidates will be selected to submit to the County Board Chairperson for official appointment in June 2018. Applicants may be requested to

meet with the selection Committee.

A stroke survivor walking unusually slowly in a public place is not being difficult - even if she is slowing you down. A stroke survivor who cannot see out of one eye might not be able to read signs or function perfectly in a store or restaurant.

Caring for stroke survivors can cause high levels of emotional, mental, and physical stress for caregivers. Family caregivers can promote positive post-stroke recovery outcomes. Still, they need to care for themselves as well. It is important to recognize when caregivers suffer compassion fatigue and try as best as possible to be supportive of the struggles they are encountering.

The following stroke symptoms may be isolated or develop in combination:

Body weakness - If someone experiences weakness on one side of his or her face, arms, hands, or legs, they should obtain medical attention right away.

Facial weakness - Mouth drooping, eyelid drooping, or uneven eyelids are also characteristics of a stroke. Of course, not everyone has a perfectly symmetrical face, but a change in someone you know, or an obvious asymmetry, is usually a sign of stroke.

Speech changes - Slurred speech, garbled speech, or words that do not make sense are signs of a stroke.

Vision changes - Blurred vision, double vision, vision loss, or partial vision loss can be the sign of a stroke or another serious eye emergency.

Falling - A stroke may cause balance and coordination problems.

Sensory abnormalities - Numbness, tingling, or a burning sensation may not be as noticeable as weakness or vision changes, but it may be the only sign of a stroke. Usually, sensory deficits occur on one side of the body during a stroke.

Headaches or dizziness - These may signal a stroke or another urgent neurological condition. It is best to err on the side of caution and get medical attention right away.

Confusion - If you are talking to someone who becomes unusually confused, it is essential to take this seriously.

Time spent deciding whether to obtain medical attention could end up as time wasted from getting the proper treatment.

Stroke Prevention

Most stroke risk factors are preventable or treatable. Medical risk factors include hypertension, heart disease, high cholesterol, blood clotting disorders, and diabetes. We can all manage these risk factors to reduce the risk of stroke. Lifestyle factors that can lead to a stroke include smoking, lack of exercise, stress, and an unhealthy, high fat, high salt diet.

Healthy habits can dramatically lower your stroke risk. These healthy habits include having a low salt and low fat diet combined with moderate exercise and stress control. Preventing a stroke is one of the most effective ways to prolong your life and avoid the negative consequences associated with a stroke.

Detecting Stroke Quickly to Prevent Negative Consequences

A stroke is a medical emergency that requires urgent medical attention. People suffering from a stroke who get to the hospital within three hours of the onset of symptoms have significantly better long-term outcomes and more treatment options. Getting this message out to as many people as possible has been one of the successes of stroke awareness month.

Unfortunately, many stroke patients cannot call for help. A stroke oftentimes impairs the ability to speak, walk or make an emergency phone call. If you recognize

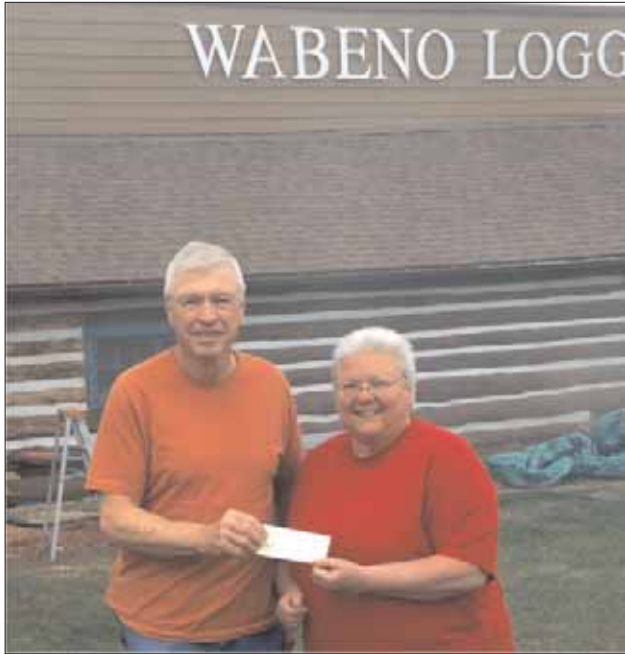
