Crandon Police Dept. to add a K9 Unit to the force

The Crandon Police Department is pleased to announce that it will be adding a K9 unit to its department. Officer Ryan Wilson, who has been a member of the Crandon Police Department for three years, will become the K9 handler and will develop and maintain the City of Crandon K9 program. During his years in law enforcement, Officer Wilson has proven his dedication, proficiency and commitment to the department and the community.

As we take a further step to fight the widespread drug epidemic in our society, we believe that a K9 unit will be beneficial in many other ways as well. A K9 unit will not only provide a sense of security, but also has been proven as a deterrent to criminal activity. However, beyond having the ability to detect illegal drugs, the K9 will be trained for other functions as well, to include assisting in search-and-rescue operations, and to enhance officers' capabilities during routine patrol.

Mecikalski Stovewood Museum opens for the summer!



An area historic treasure, the Mecikalski Stovewood Museum opens for the season on June 2nd. The museum and visitor center will be open on Saturdays and Sundays, through Labor Day, from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. Additional tours may be arranged. Admission is free.

Built in 1899, this national historic site was constructed with an unusual method of folk architecture, using 18 inch lengths of cedar logs laid in a bed of wet lime mortar in a style often referred to as stovewood or cordwood construction. It is the largest building with a history of multiple commercial and personal uses that was built during this era.

Many turn-of-the-century exhibits associated with the building's history as a general store, saloon, farmers co-op, cheese factory, and blacksmith shop are displayed.

The Stovewood Museum is located in the small crossroads community of Jennings. To get there, take Hwy 45 to Pelican Lake, then Cty B East about 5 miles to Jennings, or from Crandon, take Hwy 55 South to Cty B West to Jennings.

Free Friday for Silver Anniversary Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run Races



With one of short course off-road racing's largest and most prestigious event, just under three weeks away, Crandon International Raceway has announced the return of its popular "Free Friday" promotion. Set for Friday, June 15th, the iconic Wisconsin track known as the "Big House" will swing open its massive steel gates to welcome fans for a complimentary day at the facility. The event will kick off the first Lucas Oil Midwest Short Course League racing in history, and includes free track admission and parking.

Crandon's "Free Friday" will open at noon on Friday with the first of the day's Sportsman classes doing practice laps kicking off at 3:00p.m. The weekend's five PRO classes will hit the track at approximately 4:30p.m. More than 200 Sportsman and PRO class racers are expected for the year's first Midwest competition, kicking off a summer-long Lucas Oil schedule including races at Bark River in Michigan and ERX near Minneapolis.

In addition, Crandon International has announced that fans coming to the race track early Saturday morning have the chance to take home \$1,000 in cash via a drawing held at 11:00 a.m.

The 25th FCP Crandon Brush Run event will feature the annual "Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup" race. Pitting the unlimited PRO 2 and PRO 4 classes together on the same track with a staggered start, the intense annual race offers a total cash prize package of \$25,000, with the winner picking up a healthy \$15,000 pay day. In addition, the winner will receive valuable product bonuses from Lincoln Welders and MasterCraft Safety.

The upcoming Crandon Forest County Potawatomi weekend will also be the debut event of the newly established Lucas Oil Midwest Short Course League, a four weekend, seven-race championship that represents the first step toward a national unified series for all Lucas Oil PRO short course competitors. The event will be highlighted via four hours of programming broadcast to 33 million homes on the MAVTV network, as well as professional live streaming of all PRO and most Sportsman classes of racing.

"After this long winter the staff at Crandon can't wait to kick off this new season and association with Lucas Oil," said Cliff Flannery, president of Crandon International Raceway. "Offering fans the chance to enjoy our hospitality and see some of the best off-road racers for free is a perfect way to celebrate our version of opening day."

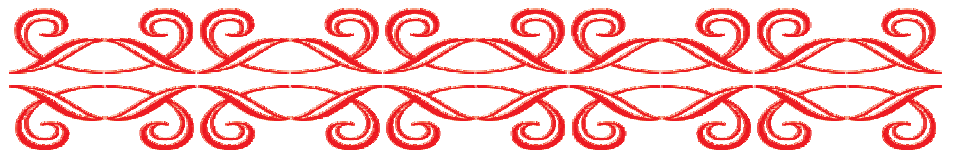
Crandon honors the fallen with Memorial Day Service

We caught up with the ceremony at the Cavour Cemetery. The speaker was Georgia Matuszewski, a 10th grade student at Laona High.

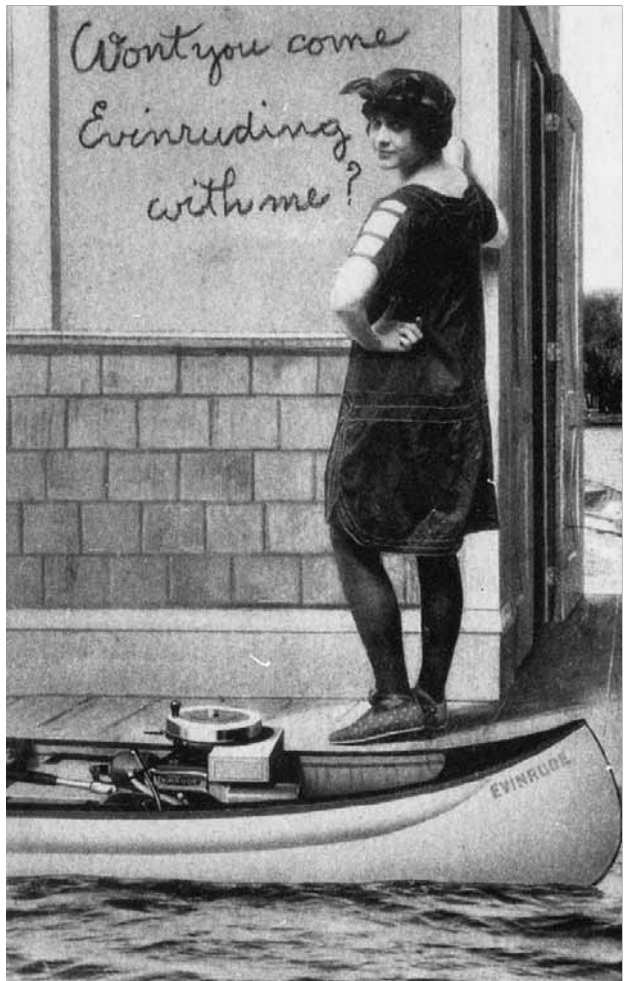

New fisher and otter management zones in effect for the 2018-19 trapping season

MADISON - Wisconsin trappers will observe a change to the number and configuration of fisher and river otter management zones for the 2018-19 season. New, simplified zones are now identical for fisher, otter and bobcat. Wisconsin is now divided into two fisher and otter management zones, split by HWY 64.

Previously, Wisconsin was divided into six fisher zones and three otter zones. The number of fisher zones made population data collection and analysis challenging, and two of the six zones were without management goals or population models. For otter, the central and southern zone seasons and permit levels were similar enough for the zones to be merged into one, while the northern zone remains unchanged.

For both fisher and otter, the previous management zones have now been consolidated into a northern and southern zone divided by Highway 64. The two-zone framework will improve population models in each zone and provide a consistent zone boundary.

The new zones are not anticipated to impact the number of fisher and otter permits available to the public, nor the wait time required to receive a permit. Rather, the two-zone framework will allow trappers the flexibility to trap these species across a larger area than under the previous framework, which restricted trappers to smaller zones. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' Furbearer Advisory Committee will determine quotas and permit levels for each new fisher and otter management zone at the end of May.

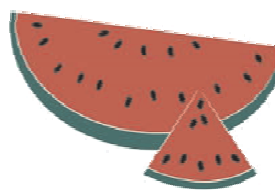
When applying for a fisher or otter permit, trappers will now select either the northern or southern zone. Permit applications are due on Aug. 1 each year, and may be submitted through gowild.wi.gov.

Traffic and Motorcycle coordinator at Nicolet College. "What many people don't realize is that riding a motorcycle, especially in traffic, requires a whole different set of skills than driving a car."

To teach people these skills - and bring riders into compliance with the law - Nicolet is offering a new one-day Basic Rider Course, referred to BRC2.

"Riding a motorcycle requires a different mindset than driving a car," England said. "In a vehicle, you have a ton or two of metal surrounding you to protect you and absorb a lot of the energy that comes with a crash. On a motorcycle you're exposed and it's the strategies and proper technique you employ that keep you safe."

Along with the increased skills also comes an increased sense of confidence, he added.

"That's when the road really opens up and riding becomes even more fun."

Nicolet will offer the one-day class six times: June 1 and 30, July 20, Aug. 18, and Sept. 29. All of these classes will run from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The college will also offer an evening option, which meets twice for four hours each session, on June 18 and 20 from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Cost is \$121.55 and all classes will meet on the Nicolet College Campus, located one mile south of Rhineland just off of Hwy. G.

Prior to each class students will need to complete a three-hour online course. Cost is \$19.99.

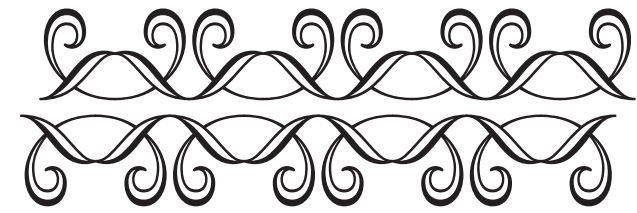

Wisconsin Consumer Report

Auto "Warranty" Robocalls

Submitted by Kathy O'Melia
MADISON - The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection has received a number of calls from consumers and at least 17 written complaints about auto warranty sales calls since December 22, 2016.

Automated phone calls ("robocalls") about vehicle "warranties" are typically sales pitches for extended service contracts.

"Robocalls using high-pressure sales tactics can mean trouble for Wisconsin consumers," said Frank Frassetto, Division Administrator for Trade and Consumer Protection. "Watch for unsolicited phone calls that are vague about who they are and what they are selling or those that aggressively try to push products and services."

While these extended warranty sales schemes usually operate through official looking mailers, phone-based warranty schemes are not new. In fact, in 2011, the Federal Trade Commission mailed refunds of more than \$3 million to nearly 5,000 consumers who were tricked by robocalls into buying extended service contracts disguised as warranties.

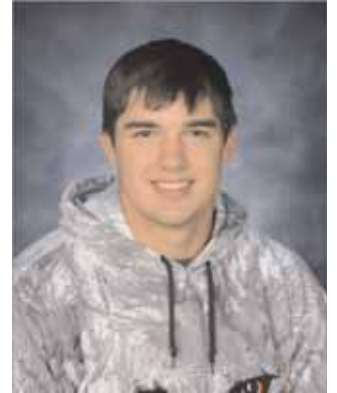

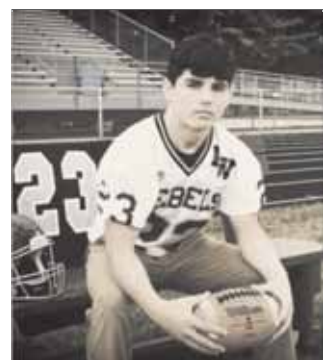
