## Local artist creates new signs for Laona



Artist Sheri Jo Posselt has created new signs for the town of Laona. Sheri Jo was contracted by the Town Board of Laona in December of 2018. These new signs will replace the previous signs, which are located at the three highway entrances into town.

The Town is working on donations from various groups to cover the cost of the new signs. "The Town of Laona appreciates Sheri Jo, the Laona Chamber of Commerce, and the Laona Town Crew for their efforts in this project"

The signs were painted at "Marilyn's Greenhouse" 14680 County Road F in Lakewood, where Sheri Jo paints all of her larger art pieces during the greenhouse off season. This facility has been the artist's prime location for big projects in the past such as the 28 foot 100 year anniversary mural for "Lamers Dairy" N410 Speel School Road Appleton, WI in 2014, and 30 foot "Haen Meats" mural located at 600 County Trunk KK, Kaukauna, WI in 2015.

Sheri Jo painted over 100 murals in the Fox Valley area before she and her husband moved to Lakewood in 2010. One of those was also a 68 foot mural for St. Elizabeth Hospital commissioned in 1999. Many of her paintings hang in prominent municipal buildings and art galleries around Wisconsin. Remarkably, she paints "intuitive" pieces for clients by appointment in her studio called "Sincere Harmony" which is located inside "Amoterra", 17250 Brookside Court in Townsend. ## WASB recognized Janet Opiela for service

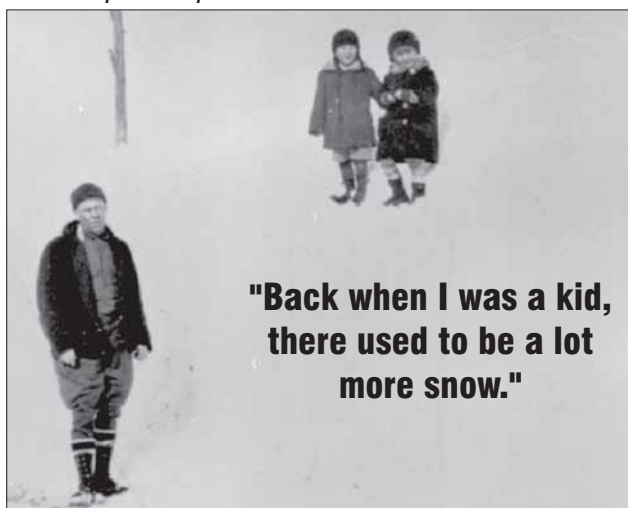

## Award-winning film "Defining Hope" March 8 at Nicolet College

How we make our journey through life – and especially what becomes important to us as we near its inevitable end – takes center stage in the film Defining Hope showing at 1 p.m. Friday, March 8, in the Nicolet College Theatre.

A winner of numerous awards, the documentary tells the story of patients with life-threatening illnesses and the compassionate nurses and other caregivers who guide them along the way.

Filmmaker Carolyn Jones interviewed the nurses over a six-year period and came to the conclusion that we are not dying very well in this country.

She was challenged to change that and thus made Defining Hope. Death is unavoidable and it's something we all need to talk about, Jones said.

"The film is less about death than it is about what makes life worth living," she explained. While it looks at serious issues, the film also includes many uplifting moments.

It follows patients as they make choices about how they want to live, how much medical technology they can accept, what they hope for and how that hope evolves when life is threatened. It is optimistic and reminds us that we have choices in how we die.

The hour-long feature was released in November of 2017 in honor of National Hospice and Palliative Care Month and, to date, has aired on hundreds of Public Broadcasting System stations nationwide.

Admission is free and open to the public.

Prior to the film, from noon to 12:55 p.m., the college will hold a Resource Fair in the Lakeside Center Commons. This will include blood pressure screenings by Nicolet College Nursing students and numerous information tables by Nicolet EMTs and paramedics, Nicolet Cosmetology, Aspirus Hospice, Ascension Hospice and Palliative Care, ADRC of Oneida County, Forest County Department of Aging, and the Nicolet Learning in Retirement program.

The college's Bytes Café will also be open.

After the movie, from 2:45 p.m. to 3:15 p.m., individuals are invited to attend a question and answer session in the Nicolet Theatre with representatives from Aspirus Hospice and Ascension Hospice and Palliative Care.

A part of the Nicolet Live! Performing Arts Series, the film is co-sponsored by the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Oneida County, Forest County Department of Aging, and entities at Nicolet that include the Learning in Retirement program, the Richard J. Brown Library and the Health Occupations Department.

## Baldwin demands answers from the FTC on weak enforcement of "Made in USA" labeling

**Companies that Labeled Foreign Products, Often Imported from China, as "Made In USA" Continue to Evade Monetary Penalties & Have Not been Required to Admit Fault**

**Senators Demand Increased Transparency & Stronger Enforcement of Standards to Protect American Manufacturers**

WASHINGTON, D.C. – U.S. Senators Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), Sherrod Brown (D-OH) and Chris Murphy (D-CT) demanded answers this week from the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) on its commitment to enforcing "Made in the USA" labeling standards. In October, the Senators wrote to the FTC and referenced instances where companies fraudulently affixed "Made in America" labels to foreign-made products. The Senators said mislabeling products not only misleads consumers but also disadvantages American businesses. The Senators urged the FTC to consider monetary penalties as well as admission of guilt settlements for companies that import products from countries like China and then commit these label violations.

This week, the Senators followed up, demanding increased transparency and stronger enforcement of our laws. The Senators requested additional information regarding the Commission's enforcement actions against companies that commit "Made in the USA" labeling violations, since little information has been available to date.

"The Commission is responsible for defending the integrity of "Made in the USA" labels, and we are concerned that companies too often use the label fraudulently but without penalty. Stronger enforcement of our laws and increased transparency into the Commission's actions are necessary to crack down on these violators, and we call on the Commission to do more to protect American manufacturers and consumers," the Senators wrote in their letter.

# Senior Chatter

## Watch out for the latest Medicare scam, DNA/genetic testing schemes

Each year, the Medicare program loses \$60 billion to fraud. The best way to reduce this figure is beneficiary education to prevent and reduce known pathways to fraudulent activities and unethical billing practices. The Wisconsin Senior Medicare Patrol staff have been hearing about DNA and genetic testing schemes in other parts of the country, and we recently learned that they are starting here in Wisconsin.

WHAT IS THE SCAM? Older adults at senior centers, housing complexes, and other community locations are targeted by companies promoting "free" genetic testing, cancer screening, or DNA testing. These screenings are frequently done under the guise of an ice cream social event. During the event, older adults are asked to swab their cheek to collect a DNA sample which will be sent to the lab for analysis. They are then told that the test will be covered completely by Medicare, and all that is needed to process it is their Medicare number.

ARE THERE OTHER VARIATIONS OF THIS SCAM? Yes. Sometimes Medicare beneficiaries are being contacted at home by phone and told that they will be sent a DNA testing kit in the mail. In this case, the person is asked to perform the cheek swab at home and then return the kit in the mail for DNA analysis. The caller then asks for the person's Medicare number and reiterates that there will be no charge to the beneficiary.

BE AWARE: Medicare only pays for DNA or genetic testing in rare circumstances where it is medically necessary for treatment or diagnosis of a medical condition.

These tests must be ordered by the patient's own physician.

There must be documentation in medical records to substantiate the need for the testing.

WHAT SHOULD I DO? If you are contacted by phone, hang up! Do not answer any questions or give out any personal information or your Medicare number.

Contact the Wisconsin Senior Medicare Patrol at (888) 818-2611 to report any related activities or suspicious requests for your Medicare number.

Remember that Medicare will not call you to confirm your personal information, your Medicare number, or ask questions about your health.

Report Medicare marketing violations – Medicare does not allow door-to-door sales or unsolicited contact with Medicare beneficiaries.

What can ADRCs, senior centers, independent living centers, and others do to help?

- Spread the word about Medicare fraud. Distribute SMP flyers and contact information.
- Screen any groups or people who want to give presentations to older adults.
- Do not allow speakers to collect personal information or Medicare numbers from attendees.
- Request Wisconsin Senior Medicare Patrol staff give a presentation to your group to educate beneficiaries on Medicare fraud.
- Do not agree to host an ice cream social or other event involving DNA or genetic testing.

## West Nile Virus detected in ruffed grouse

MADISON -- West Nile virus was detected in three of 16 ruffed grouse that were found sick or dead and submitted by the public to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource for testing from October through December 2018.

At this time, there is no evidence to confirm that West Nile virus or any other factor is having population-level impacts on ruffed grouse in Wisconsin. Ruffed grouse populations are known to rise and fall over a nine- to 11-year cycle, so declines are not unexpected, though the 2017 decline occurred before the cycle would typically predict.

Of these 16 birds, 10 were negative for any viral infection, three were positive for Eastern Equine Encephalitis virus, one was positive for WNV and two were positive for both EEEV and WNV. Of the six birds that tested positive for EEEV or WNV, three showed signs of clinical disease, which may or may not have eventually resulted in death. **Continued in Next Column**

## West Nile in Ruffed Grouse Continued

These results are preliminary, and 238 hunter-harvested grouse samples remain to be tested from the first year of a three-year study of WNV in ruffed grouse across Wisconsin, Minnesota and Michigan. Preliminary results for year one of this regional exposure study are tentatively anticipated to be available in mid-2019. Ultimately, the timeline for results will depend on the number of samples submitted by each state and the extent to which follow-up testing is required to differentiate between WNV or other similar viruses.

Anyone who finds a sick or dead ruffed grouse is encouraged to submit its carcass for disease sampling -- sick or dead ruffed grouse carcasses can be submitted at any time. Observations can be also reported to local DNR Wildlife Management staff.

In addition to sick or dead submitted samples, DNR staff distributed 500 self-sampling kits to grouse hunters statewide with assistance from the Ruffed Grouse Society and the Wisconsin Conservation Congress as part of a multi-year regional study [PDF] with Minnesota and Michigan.

Both WNV and EEEV are mosquito-borne viruses that can affect humans, horses and certain species of birds. Clinical signs of WNV in birds are indistinguishable from those of EEEV and can include tremors, weakness and loss of coordination. WNV was first detected in the state in 2002 but only now has been detected in ruffed grouse. EEEV is considered a native virus and was first detected in Wisconsin's grouse population in the late 1950s. This historical information suggests that the likelihood of EEEV having population-level impacts on grouse is low.

State wildlife officials say continued focus on habitat management for ruffed grouse is the best method to mitigate potential disease impacts on the population. Ruffed grouse are a short-lived species with only 30 percent of the average adult population surviving year to year. The Great Lakes region contains some of the most extensive early-successional forest habitat and healthiest ruffed grouse populations in the nation. DNR staff are currently working with partners to develop a long-term management strategy for ruffed grouse in Wisconsin.
