If you have a girl or boy that is entering 6th-8th grades with an interest in lakes, streams or natural resources, you may have the opportunity to send them to the Sand Lake Conservation Camp for free! The Crandon, Laona, and Wabeno Lions Clubs have approved a scholarship for one girl and one boy from each school to attend camp.

To apply for the scholarships your children will need to get an application from the Land Conservation-Land Information/GIS Office by e-mail: [lcc@co.forest.wi.us](mailto:lcc@co.forest.wi.us) The completed application will need to include a 200-300 word essay titled "Why I Want to Participate in Conservation Camp." Winners, one girl and one boy, will be selected from each of the Crandon, Laona, and Wabeno School Districts.

The camp will be held from June 19-21, 2019 and is located at the Camp Bird Youth Camp at N8395 Caldron Falls Rd., Crivitz, WI. The parents of the winners will be required to arrange for transportation for drop-off and pick-up of the children which will also require parental completion and approval of registration.

## Rebel Drama presents Queen's "We Will Rock You"

There's been a buzz around the Northwoods about this year's Laona/Wabeno High School Spring Musical. It's no surprise as the music and script Rebel Drama is performing was created by one of the most famous and successful rock bands of all time. We Will Rock You was created by Queen and Ben Elton. It was a huge hit on London's West End, had a successful Broadway run and is now touring the U.S.

"It's been amazing so far," says Rebel Drama Director, Nick J. Lowery. "Certainly all the adults involved were going to be excited about a band that emerged over 40 years ago, but I had no idea that the kids would know so many Queen hits and love them the way they do." He goes on to explain, "I knew that they all knew 'Bohemian Rhapsody,' because it's the kind of song that will carry on through generations, but most of them knew 'Crazy Little Thing Called Love,' 'We Will Rock You,' 'We are the Champions,' and 'Somebody to Love.'" The show features over 20 songs from Queen's huge catalog of hits.

The music and concept of show provides an opportunity to go beyond normal musical drama staging and create more of a rock concert feel. Rebel Drama will be using lighting effects the program has never used before and adding in smoke, bubbles and a great deal of colorful staging and costuming.

The script tells the story of Galileo Figaro and Scaramouche a pair of teenage dreamers and outcasts in a cookie cutter world run by the GlobalSoft Corporation. The evil Killer Queen and her minion War Rocket Ajax seek to crush the kids and their Bohemian friends before they discover Rock and Roll and snap the people of the world out of the spell GlobalSoft has cast over them.

Galileo is played by Aidan 'A-Train' Lowery. Madelyn Korbas takes up the role of Scaramouche. Sunshine Nelson is the deadly Killer Queen and Conor Lowery is Ajax, a fascist enforcer who enjoys his job a bit too much. The Bohemian leaders are Michael Austin as Brit, Georgia Matuszewski as Ozzy, and Malina Lazzeroni as Buddy Holly and the Crickets. Playing the Ga Ga Girls, Super Yuppies and Bohemians are Rebekah Goodacre-Reinke, Hailey Krueger, Braylee Chrisman, Natalie Newton, Nat Johnson, Zoie Cayan and Pfeiffer Bodoh. Evan Thomas is the stage manager. Alexis Childress is in charge of the lighting and sound booth. Logan and Seth Riebe are the set construction and running crew. The adult production team includes Mary Ellen Keller, Patrick Lowery, Raletta Ashbeck, Katie Esserman and Nick Lowery. Wabeno Area Players have donated time and effort to promotion and ticket sales.

**Recipe: Colcannon (Irish Potato Salad)**

- 5 Russet potatoes
- 1/4 cup whole milk
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 large leek-halved and thinly sliced
- 1 head napa cabbage, cored and coarsely chopped
- 1/4 teaspoons salt
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 4 large shallots, thinly sliced
- 1 bunch kale, stemmed and coarsely chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- 2/3 cups chopped green onion tops

Cut and steam the potatoes until tender. Return to the still hot pot and add 1/4 cup butter, milk, kosher salt and 1/4 teaspoons pepper. Mash together. Melt the remaining butter in a large pot over medium heat. Add shallots and leeks. Saute until they begin to soften. Add the kale and toss until soft and wilted but still bright green, about 3 minutes. Add the cabbage and toss until tender-crisp, about 8 minutes. Sprinkle with nutmeg, salt and the remaining pepper. Mix the cabbage and mashed potatoes together well. Sprinkle with the green onion slices before serving.
