Conservation Corner

Sugar Shacks and Maple Sap

Although a few weeks ago it seemed that it would never happen, spring is near and that brings commercial and hobby production of maple syrup to Forest County.

Sugar camps have a long history, dating back to Native American tribes who utilized syrup and sugar made from the trees. Sugar and syrup also became an important trading item for many people, especially in North America. Historically there were thousands of sugar camps dotting the forest within the county.

What makes the sap flow? Sap flow from sugar maple trees is entirely temperature dependent. The rise in the temperature of the outer layers of the tree (the

This is the love story of Ethel and Norman Thayer, who are returning to their summer home on Golden Pond for the forty-eighth year. He is a retired professor, nearing eighty, with heart palpitations and a failing memory—but still as tart-tongued, observant and eager for life as ever. Ethel, ten years younger, and the perfect foil for Norman, delights in all the small things that have enriched and continue to enrich their long life together. They are visited by their divorced, middle-aged daughter and her dentist fiancé, who then go off to Europe, leaving his teenage son behind for the summer. The boy quickly becomes the "grandchild" the elderly couple have longed for, and as Norman revels in taking his ward fishing and thrusting good books at him, he also learns some lessons about modern teenage awareness—and slang—in return. Chuck Ackley's Story

When you were born in 1922, you have nearly a century of memory of where you lived and what you have seen. Charles "Chuck" Ackley can make that claim. Chuck is the son of Chief Willard and Sadie Ackley. Born in Antigo, he grew up in Mole Lake.

When asked about his early memories, he talked about always carrying a slingshot, fishing in the neighboring lakes and Pickerel Creek, which he described as a long walk. Chuck and his friends Harry Poler, John Duck, and Vern McGeshick snared rabbits for the family table, ice fished on Rice Lake and speared suckers in Swamp Creek.

He remembers picking wild rice with his father at age ten or eleven, and says he was delegated to pole the boat. He also talked about trapping beaver and game wardens always after them. But, they got away!

Chuck attended school in Mole Lake and enjoyed playing baseball. His school career was short, however, and he left after 5th grade. It was the Great Depression, and there was work to do to help support the family. Chuck earned money cutting firewood and any other job he could get that paid a few needed bucks.

It is obvious when talking to Chuck that he enjoyed his time as a youngster in Mole Lake. He talked fondly about having a bicycle and riding the bike the eight miles into Crandon to catch a movie. Chuck said the Jacobson grocery store was operating in Mole Lake, and they shopped there. He added that in those days, much of their food was grown in the garden, Willard kept pigs and chickens, and along with fishing and hunting, they didn't go hungry. He said that even through the depression years, Willard managed to keep a car running, and they did do some shopping in Crandon. Willard also provided a taxi service of sorts for many Mole Lakers who needed to get into Crandon for various reasons.

He left Mole Lake in the late 1930's to serve in Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC's). Chuck, along with Stewart Ackley and Frankie Smith were sent to a CCC camp near Marquette, Michigan. It was in the CCC camp that he learned to do kitchen work. He became one of the camp cooks. I noticed that he didn't brag about his culinary skills, but that was his job and he was trained to do it.

He was back in Mole Lake when the attack on Pearl Harbor came. Like most of the young men back then, he found himself in the armed forces. He joined the Army and did some training in Texas, where he also was given the job of cooking, again. In the early years of the war, there was a fear of a Japanese attack on the west coast, and Chuck was taken to California for shore patrol duty near San Luis Obispo, which he didn't mind at all. He remembered going on leave back home, and he and Ed Baker decided to see more of the USA, and drove a 1933 Chevrolet back to California. Then he was moved to Washington state for more of the same duty.

Like many soldiers who enjoyed this good duty during the first part of the war, it came to an end. When the Japanese carriers were destroyed in the Battle of Midway, the supposed threat to the west coast came to an end, and

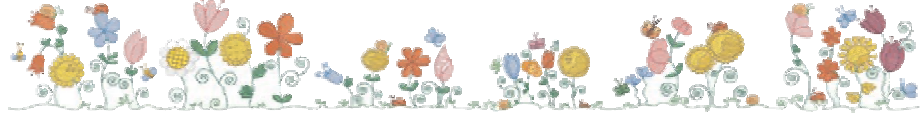

This award-winning documentary focuses attention on opioid crisis through unique first-person account of addiction. The film tells a gripping tale and challenges stigma. In 2016 more Americans died from overdoses than in the entire Vietnam War conflict. And yet those new casualties are rarely considered victims of disease.

The film chronicles the life of Matthew Edwards, a Crandon High School graduate, whose addiction to opioids began at age 15, after being prescribed pain medicine for a minor surgery. His grippingly honest writing reveals the secrets he tried so hard to conceal throughout a decade long struggle to escape addiction. Matthew's mother, Jane Funk, currently a teacher at Crandon High School, published the book "What I Couldn't Tell you: one Man's Struggle with Opioid Addiction" in June of 2017 and worked with filmmakers Molly Hermann and Rob Lyall on the "Written Off" documentary.

At 5:30 p.m. a mock teen bedroom, Hidden in Plain Sight, will be available for viewing for those 18 and older. Following the viewing of the documentary, a panel discussion will be held with treatment specialists, law enforcement, public health and

Dear Editor,

February 1, a tri-county effort was kicked off through a coaster campaign in local bars and taverns. The campaign focuses on men getting help for mental health concerns, such as depression and anxiety. The strategy is provided by the Community, Outreach, Prevention, Education Coalition (COPE) Coalition. The coalition is a tri-county, Forest, Oneida, and Forest Counties, that provides education, prevention, and outreach on the issues of mental health and AODA.

"This is one of the strategies for suicide prevention for middle-aged males", stated Jacee Anderson, Director of Forest County Health Department. "According to the 2016 Centers for Disease (CDC) data, suicide rates for males 55-64-year old is the 8th leading cause of death." Wisconsin Interactive Statistics on Health (WISH) data ranks Vilas County as the second highest (per 100,00) rate in Wisconsin, which is almost double the national rate at 21.2/100,000. Oneida County has a rate of 16.5/100,00 and Forest County is 12.7/100,000.

"The coaster is a resource that may provide hope to someone and possibly save a life. The front of the coaster, has a link to the <https://headsuptguys.org> website. The site provides information and resources on mental illness and suicide. It's easy to follow and includes ways to obtain support, such as therapy or medication management in the community in which you reside," explained Jason Dailey, Assistant County Veterans Service Officer for Oneida County.

"The back side of these coasters provides patrons with our local Tri-County Crisis number# 1-888-299-1188 and the National Crisis Line, 1-800-273-TALK (8255), so they have access to support 24 hours/day, 7 days/week. It takes a village and we would like to sincerely thank all bars and taverns that supported this strategy in our three counties!" ended Heidi Pritzl, Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Ascension Koller Behavioral Health.

Take a walk in the woods with the words of John Muir and the music of the Chance Ensemble at the Nicolet College Theatre Saturday, March 30 at 7:30 p.m. With Muir's own writings providing the unifying thread and the ensemble's accompanying score of nature-forged new music, University of the Wilderness celebrates Muir's life and legacy as one of the world's great naturalists.

The score is the creation of Cheryl Leah and Ed Willett and is deftly performed by the Chance Ensemble of voice, cello, and violin. Narrated by Norman Gilliland of Wisconsin Public Radio, the show's musical landscape is a place where contemporary, classical, and Celtic music beautifully collide to deliver a deep appreciation for Muir.

With Gilliland giving voice to Muir's writing, the ensemble takes the audience on a journey from Muir's childhood in Scotland to his young life in Wisconsin and finally to his profound and influential experiences in the great Sierra Nevada Mountains. "In creating the program we kept as our guide the goal of reflecting the multi-dimensional nature of Muir, his indomitable spirit, his daring and adventurous nature, the beauty and the humor of the man," according to Leah and Willett. "This show leaves the audience with a desire to rekindle their relationship with his words and to follow in his footsteps."

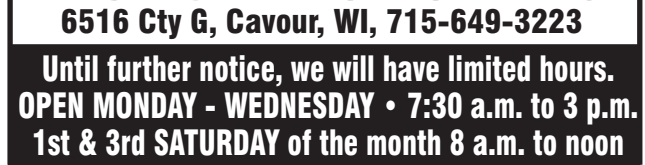

RFP's for equipment specifications, grant writing, and working closely with not only the contractors, but also my colleagues, are all huge assets in Town Government and aid in achieving the vast variety of unique responsibilities and obligations that Towns encounter.

Just to list a few of my accomplishments, since I have been in office; I've been awarded over \$135,000.00 in LRIP (Local Road Improvement Program) grants towards road projects and almost \$800,000.00 in infrastructure joint projects, partnered with other entities. Last summer we bid out for a new 1 ton pickup truck as well as a new tandem axle patrol truck. We crushed gravel, breaker run rock and sand for the first time in 18 years. We built a new salt shed and paved over 2.5 miles of roads, (partially with grant funding and also one as a joint project) and we accomplished all of this without having to increase taxes or borrow any money! As an efficient Town Board, we've always strived to keep taxes stable, therefore your tax bills haven't increased in many years, (due to the Town of Lincoln's levy portion) and still remain to be only about 12% of your entire tax invoice. 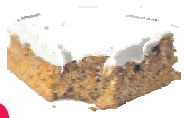

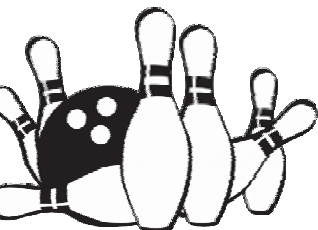

sapwood) to a temperature above 32 degrees fahrenheit causes a positive pressure in the tree fibers. This pressure produces the sap flow. Many people assume that sap flows only from the roots, actually on warm spring days which follow cold nights, sap flows down from the tree's branches and then out the spouts or taps. Sap also flows back and forth laterally within a tree, depending on temperature and pressure. Sap flows out breaks in the sapwood. When tapped and the internal pressure of the tree is greater than the atmospheric pressure the sap flows out, much the same way that blood flows out of a cut.

Here are some interesting facts about maple syrup and sap:
** Pure maple syrup is only made on a commercial scale in North America, nowhere else in the world
** It takes approximately 40 gallons of sap to make one gallon of pure maple syrup, depending on the sugar content of the sap in that year and at that time of the year.
** Each tap can yield 10+ gallons of sap per season. Vacuum collection systems yield approximately twice the sap as gravity systems.
** A gallon of maple syrup weights 11 pounds as compared to 8 pounds for a gallon of water

There are quite a few commercial grade operations of maple syrup production that have developed within Forest County over the last 10 years. These operations are bringing economic development and business production to our forest in the form of alternative products. Production of maple syrup is an agricultural operation, however many associate it with forestry because of the trees involved. Depending upon production capabilities and industry standards, property used for maple sap production may receive property tax breaks under agricultural use. 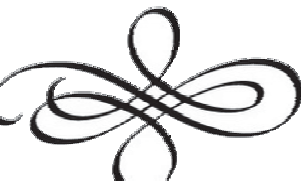

the days of shore patrol ended.

Chuck, as a member of the 40th Infantry Division, was sent to Hawaii for more infantry training. Eventually, his division was sent to Guadalcanal, which was now firmly in American hands. According to the 40th Division history online, they were moved to New Britain for a short time, and then made a landing on the island of Luzon, in the Philippines. Chuck and the rest of the men in his unit found themselves fighting the Japanese. He said he fought on several Philippine Islands. One interesting thing at this time, Chuck said while laughing, was meeting the movie star Randolph Scott in the Philippines.

Chuck was a good soldier. He earned his Combat Infantry Badge, three bronze battle stars, the Philippine Liberation medal and a Bronze Star for saving the life of a fellow soldier.

Eventually, Chuck and others in his unit were sent home. He returned safely to Mole Lake in 1945. He took a job with Connors in Laona and then fell in love. He married Naomi Van Zile in 1946. By the end of the year, he had a son named Jeff. Karen and Vicki arrived in the years ahead. Naomi, unfortunately, passed away in 1997. All who knew her thought highly of her.

Nobody can accuse Chuck of being a quitter or job hopping. He worked at the Connor plant for forty years, retiring in 1985.

He says he has enjoyed his retirement. He has watched Mole Lake grow from a community of small cabins to a place with nice homes, and he can look out his front window and see a large hotel and casino that employs people and brings money into the community.

We wish him more happy years in Mole Lake with the company of his children, six grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.
