We have also received recognition in the Wisconsin Land & Water annual report for this outreach effort.

The Cowboys will be robbing the Lumberjack Steam Train!



It is an exciting experience when the Cowboys come to the Lumberjack Steam Train and the Camp 5 Museum complex. This marks the 21st year that these colorful characters have come to Camp 5 and the Lumberjack Steam Train. They will be there with their horses, guns and full cowboy regalia on Saturday, July 20. We are glad to have the Cowboys return on our 50th Anniversary year of running the Lumberjack Steam Train!

These desperadoes will no doubt rob the Lumberjack Steam Train on every trip to Camp 5. Keep your folding money out of sight! It has been noticed, however, that through the years, they have never robbed a passenger. There is usually a shipment of gold or other valuables they are after, and they have been known to rescue an accomplice from the grip of the Sheriff and his deputies who will be on the train.

The Cowboys are an exciting group that replicates the wild days of the old west. They come complete with vintage clothing and firearms, and they ride fine horses. They all aren't rough and wild outlaws. The Marshall and his deputies will be making a heroic effort to keep the lid on their lawless and wild behavior. A preacher is usually on the train, and there will be some lovely ladies in vintage dresses that will make you girls wish you could look that stylish!

The Cowboys are never thwarted in their efforts to rob each and every train that arrives at the Camp 5 Museum Complex. There is a jail on hand, but they always manage to escape due to the efforts of their lawless friends.

To ride the Lumberjack Steam Train, stop at the depot on Hwy 8, on Laona's west side. You can ride to the Camp 5 Museum Complex in a vintage passenger coach or caboose. When you arrive, enjoy the petting zoo, feeding and petting a variety of farm animals who enjoy the attention as much as the visitors. The early days of logging in the Northwoods are displayed in the Logging Museum. The days of the lumberjack wielding axe and crosscut are displayed with photos and tools that give the viewer a feel for the history of the time. A working blacksmith shop adds to the experience in the Logging Museum. Modern sustained yield logging is explained on the Green Treasure Forest Tour, with a trolley ride through a beautiful hardwood forest. The Cracker Barrel Gift Shop provides a shopping experience, and don't forget to sample the delicious ice cream! Lunch or a snack is available at the Choo Choo Hut Restaurant on the grounds. And, don't forget to visit the Nature Center and learn more about the ecology of the northern landscape.

The train leaves the depot at 10 a.m. and every hour on the hour, with the last run leaving at 2 p.m. The Lumberjack Steam Train runs Tuesday through Saturday. The regular season ends Saturday, August 17, but there will be another run on Saturday, August 24. It is great fun for all ages. If you can't make a visit this summer, come to Fall Festival on September 21, 28 and October 5. The Cowboys will make another visit on October 5, during Fall Festival.

Curator Bob Brown reports two new items have been added to the Museum's extensive collection of logging era artifacts. 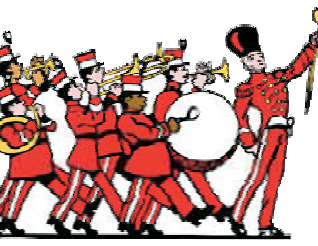

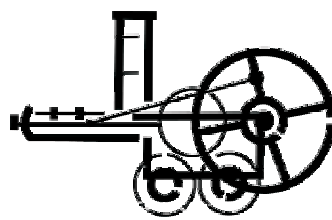

DNR asks boaters to be good neighbors & limit damaging wakes

MADISON -- Boaters, paddlers, anglers and swimmers, as well as shoreline property owners, are put at risk when boat operators throttle up and leave wakes in their paths - forcing others on the water to react quickly to the sudden rough water that slams other vessels and crashes into the shorelines.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is joining the Minnesota DNR in a public campaign urging all boaters to be aware of the risks and problems caused by boat wakes and to take steps to reduce big wakes.

Others are sharing the waters-- watch your speed to keep wakes in check. Safety is part of the fun - and it is everyone's role! Photo credit: Contributed

Driven by a growing number of calls and complaints about excessive wakes, both states launched an educational effort urging people to "Own Your Wake - for everyone's sake." The to spread the word about the importance of minimizing wakes that might pose a nuisance or hazard to others.

Anyone with information regarding natural resource violations, may confidentially report by calling or texting: VIOLATION HOTLINE: 1-800-TIP-WDNR or 1-800-847-9367. The hotline is in operation 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Trained staff relay information to conservation wardens.

"Wisconsin is known for its abundant waters that are destinations for all types of outdoor enthusiasts. Sharing our resources keeps it fun and safe for all - and that means operating with the other vessels in mind," said Todd Schaller, Wisconsin DNR Chief Conservation Warden.

The summer boating season with a mixture of speedboats, fishing boats and "wake boats" has given rise to increasing concerns around large wakes and the problems they can cause. (Wake boats sit low in the water and produce big waves that someone being towed can surf.)

Common wake complaints in the summer include damage to shoreline properties, docked boats as well as paddlers and swimmers who get caught in the wakes' rollers.

"One person's boating fun should not cause safety concerns and damage for others," Schaller said. "We hope boaters understand the impacts of boat wakes and voluntarily comply with existing rules and basic principles of on-the-water courtesy, to own your wake for everyone's sake."

Nutritionist Annemarie Colbin, PhD lists other adverse effects in her book, *The Whole Food Guide to Strong Bones*:

- Asthma
- High blood pressure
- Diabetes
- Joint and low back pain
- Pain in general

An article by Dutch researchers in a recent issue of the *Journal of Nutrition, Health & Aging* outlines signs specific to the elderly. Some of them are subtle:

- Low attention span

- Low blood pressure
- Dryness of the tongue and mucous membranes (which according to the article can, in turn, cause the patient to choke and/or make the patient difficult to understand)

- Confusion
- Constipation
- Falls
- Fever with no obvious cause

Chronic dehydration can lead to adverse effects on senior health, some of them quite serious. According to a study from the Netherlands published in the *British Journal of Nutrition*, chronic mild to moderate dehydration has been associated with several disease states, such as fatal stroke.

Sip It, Don't Skip It

The Schols article suggests drinking 1.7 liters (about 7 cups) of water daily. According to Schols, it is better for elderly people to drink small amounts on many occasions throughout the day rather than large amounts on only a few occasions. "Drinking large amounts all at once can cause the stomach to expand which, in turn, decreases one's sense of thirst," the authors state. The kinds of fluids consumed are also relevant, they add. Broth, fruit juices, tomato juice, milk and sport drinks are recommended. "Excessive consumption of alcoholic drinks and high protein supplements should be avoided, especially during periods of dehydration as these drinks actually dehydrate rather than hydrate," the authors warn.

Why Seniors Resist Drinking Water

It is not unusual for elderly people to avoid drinking water. One of my students, a woman in her 70s, is a case in point. While spending the weekend with friends in their country home she didn't want to wake her hosts by using the bathroom at night, so she stopped drinking water. She became dehydrated and passed out. She had osteoporosis, so she was lucky that she didn't break a bone. Another student who complained of constant dizziness also refused to drink water because she didn't want to use the restroom. She was astonished to learn that dehydration can lead to dizziness and fainting. None of her doctors had ever mentioned this, she said. As a Yoga teacher for the older adults, I urge my students to drink water. In hot, humid weather you can lose a lot of fluid without realizing it, so during a recent heat wave, I gave everybody another reminder. The following week, one student came over to me after we finished class and said she drank more water after hearing me talk about it. "I feel so much better," she said.

Make Drinking Easy

Sadly, doctors who conducted a study about dehydration in the elderly, reported in the *British journal Age and Ageing*, reported: "One-quarter of older patients in our hospital are unable to take a drink. The commonest reason for this is the inability to reach their cup [because it was too far away from them]. This is a particular problem for patients confined to bed," authors Branwell Spencer, Martin Pritchard-Howarth, Thomas Lee, Catherine Jack wrote. So if you visit a bed-ridden friend, be sure to fill their cup often, and keep it within their reach.

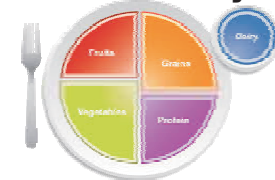

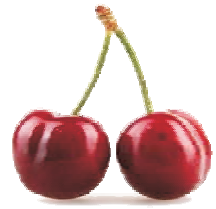

Fight the Bite: Know the Signs and Symptoms of Lyme Disease

Ticks are typically most active in Wisconsin from May to September, but it is still important to use caution year-round.

Black-legged or deer ticks, can harbor the Powassan virus along with disease-causing bacteria such as Lyme disease, babesiosis, anaplasmosis and ehrlichiosis.

In rare cases, Wisconsin wood or dog ticks can cause Rocky Mountain spotted fever and typhus, tularemia and tick paralysis.

"In Wisconsin, Lyme disease is the most common tick-borne illness," said Kimberly Radtke, APNP, a Nurse Practitioner with Ascension Medical Group in Rhinelander. "The symptoms of Lyme disease can appear in just three days, or they may take as long as 30 days after a tick bite to develop."

A rash, which often appears one week after a tick bite, occurs in 50-70 percent of patients. It is the most recognizable sign of Lyme disease.

"As the area of the rash gets larger, it may begin to resemble a bull's eye," said Radtke.

In addition to the rash, a person who is suffering from Lyme disease may experience other symptoms in the first month including: fever, chills, headache, fatigue, muscle aches, joint pain, and swollen lymph nodes.

"It's important to treat Lyme disease as soon as possible after the bite," said Radtke. "Left untreated symptoms become more serious as the bacteria starts to affect the nervous system. It can become difficult to treat."

At later stages, Lyme disease can cause headaches, arthritis-like pain, stiff neck, loss of muscle

tone, irregular heartbeat, dizziness, shortness of breath, shooting pain, numbness and short-term memory problems.

A simple blood test can detect Lyme disease. "If you spend time outside and experience achy muscles and sore joints, ask your primary care clinician for a Lyme disease blood test," adds Radke.

She also says it's important to check for ticks daily after being outdoors, even in your own yard. Check all parts of your body carefully, including your armpits, scalp, and groin. Remove ticks immediately using fine-tipped tweezers.

You can also take some steps to Create a tick-safe zone around your home.

Remove leaf litter and clear grasses and brush around your home and the edge of the lawn, and place mulch between lawns and wooded areas to keep ticks off the places you work and play the most. Also check for and repair holes in window and door screens.

Avoiding ticks doesn't mean that you have to stay inside, in front of the TV.

"Work and play outside but remember to apply an effective repellent to exposed skin and wear long-sleeve shirts, long pants, and socks to keep bugs off your skin," said Radtke.

Public comment sought on proposed rules for the health of Wisconsin waters

MADISON - The public has until September 20, 2019 to provide feedback on two proposed rule revisions related to assessing the overall health of lakes and streams in Wisconsin.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is seeking public comment on two proposals that would update Wisconsin Administrative Code related to protecting water quality.

"The goals of these revisions are to clarify policies, provide consistent processes and provide protection of aquatic life and recreation for the public," said Kristi Minahan, a DNR water quality standards specialist. "These rules describe how the biology of a lake or stream, such as its fish, insect, plant and algae communities, are used to assess its overall health. They also establish how algae and plants will be used to determine whether a water body is responding to elevated phosphorus levels and whether it may need a different phosphorus criterion."

The first rule (Natural Resources Board order WY-23-13) addresses processes the department uses to assess bodies of water for impairments, including biological criteria for water quality standards and phosphorus impairments.

The second rule (NRB order WT-17-12) would establish a process for determining when an individual waterbody needs a higher or lower phosphorus criterion than the statewide target in order to meet water its quality goals.

The proposed language can be found by searching the DNR website, dnr.wi.gov, for "public input" and clicking on the buttons for "proposed rules" and then "Permanent" rules and looking for Board Order numbers WY-23-13 and WT-17-12.

A public hearing will be held for both rules at 10 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 12, 2019, with simultaneous telepresence in Madison and Green Bay.

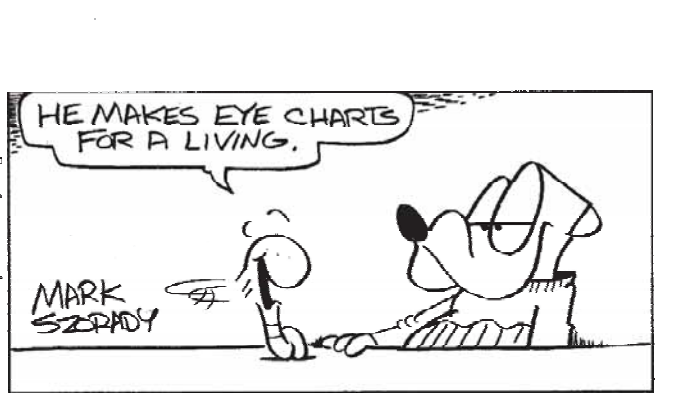
