Holt & Balcom Logging Camp volunteers receive OCHS Awards



Though the Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum is closed for the season, there is exciting news regarding the oldest logging camp in America still sitting where it was built. Two camp volunteers received awards at the 2019 Oconto County Historical Society annual dinner held in Oconto on November 7. Marcia Wahoske received the President's Award, and Jon Marsh was named Volunteer of the Year. Both awards were presented by Museum Director Kathleen Marsh.

Wahoske, who currently lives in North Mankato, Minnesota, is a fifth generation Holt whose lineage goes back to Devillo Holt, a lumberman who partnered with Uri Balcom to build the camp in Lakewood in 1881. She was a key financial donor during a ten-year restoration that began in 2007. Today the camp is a unique historic treasure that educates visitors about Northern Oconto County's logging heritage.

Conservation Corner

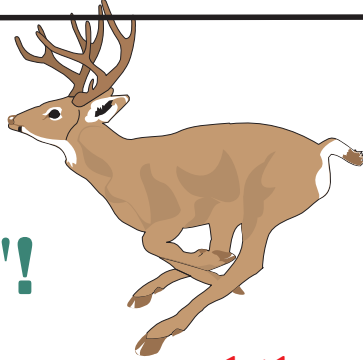

Over the last couple weeks, many people have asked what is the Land & Water Conservation Department and what does it do for Forest County? Well, if you locate the new website www.forestcountylandandwater.org, you may find out. Also, as per the Forest County website, www.forestwi.gov, under Land Conservation, you'll see that the Land and Water Conservation Department (LWCD) provides local leadership in carrying out programs that conserve our Land and Water resources. Under the direction of the Land and Water Conservation Committee (LWCC), the LWCD and LWCC are the primary links locally for Conservation Programs.

The LWCD provides educational and technical assistance to the public on land and water resource management. Lake and stream conservation, erosion control, farmland preservation, nonmetallic mining and resource restoration activities are just a few of the areas the LWCD works in. A primary duty of the department is to work on and meet goals as established in the Forest County Land & Water Resource Management Plan (LWRM). The LWRM is the guiding document on the priorities for the department. You will see more information on the LWRM in future issues of the Conservation Corner.

What does this mean to you as a reader? If you own land in Forest County and need information on managing or protecting natural resources on your property, give us a call, email us or stop in the office and maybe we can help. If you see a potential natural resources issue in your area, give us a call, we need your help. We also have contacts with programs that provide additional technical and financial assistance for landowners.

Marcia says she was raised to know and appreciate her ancestry from a very early age. "Being the greatgrandchild of W.A. Holt and Lucy Rumsey Holt included some really nice perks. From infancy, my family vacationed every summer at Island Lodge, Lucy and Arthur's summer retreat set high atop an island in Archibald Lake. It was there that I learned about the family and its place in Oconto County history."

She and Kathleen met while Marcia was vacationing at Camel Bells, her family's cottage on Archibald Lake. "Kathie was just getting involved in an effort to save the camp, and she captured my imagination with stories about it. As she spoke, my place in the family story came into focus. The project needed substantial funding, and I could help. What resulted is nothing less than a miracle, spearheaded by strong leadership and a close friendship that entangled itself in an amazing history all on its own."

Kathleen concurred. "Marcia's financial support was essential to saving the logging camp. Even though she lived out-of-state, she got directly involved, serving as narrator for several of our productions, including the Red Light Saloon shows. And as if all of that was not sufficient, Marcia has stepped up once again by establishing an endowment fund to ensure the camp's future."

In presenting the Volunteer of the Year Award to her husband, Kathleen said: "In 2005, Jon was introduced to Holt & Balcom by Lee Stehula, then President of the McCaslin Lions, who owned the site at that time. Lee asked Jon to help with student tours. Two years later, then camp manager Norb Langer asked for my help in soliciting donations to fix the leaking roof. Thus began our passionate love affair with the preservation of Northwoods history.

"Jon has served as a jack-of-all-trades at the Museum and a school tour guide, teaching the kids how to safely use logging tools. Working together to save the camp has enriched our lives in ways we could never have imagined. Jon has even put to use his amazing talent for story-telling and comedy. Reminiscent of Foster Brooks, his portrayal of Whiskey Jack, the town drunk and star of our Red Light Saloon series, has made him a celebrity of sorts in northern Oconto County."

If you have never been to Holt & Balcom, or if you haven't been there recently, the Museum is open Saturdays from Memorial Day to Labor Day, 10-3. Special tours can be arranged; call Camp Curator Robert Brown (715-276-3505) or Director Kathleen Marsh (715-276-6515).

DNR Reminds hunters about deer transportation regulations and carcass disposal options

Hunters can find nearby deer carcass disposal options on the DNR website and in the Hunt Wild mobile app.

MADISON, Wis. - With the 2019 deer hunting season underway, hunters are reminded to follow the deer carcass transport regulations and to dispose of deer carcass waste appropriately. The movement of deer carcasses infected with chronic wasting disease is a pathway for the disease to spread, and carcass parts from CWD-positive deer that are left on the landscape are a possible route for disease transmission to other deer.

CWD can spread among deer by direct contact between animals and indirectly through exposure to environments contaminated with CWD prions, the protein that causes the disease. Exposure to an area where a CWD-positive carcass has decomposed could be enough to cause infection in deer. Because of this risk, it is vital that deer carcasses, including all bones and other deer carcass waste from butchering, are disposed of in a way to reduce this infection risk.

Carcass movement restrictions are in place to limit the spread of the disease. Both whole deer carcasses and certain parts of carcasses from CWD-affected counties can only be moved within CWD-affected counties and an adjacent county unless going directly to a licensed taxidermist or meat processor within 72 hours of registration. Hunters in non-CWD affected counties can also take this action voluntarily. Visit the DNR website for a list of deer carcass parts that may be transported beyond CWD-affected counties or an adjacent county, as well as more information about carcass transport.

Hunters from other states/provinces should be aware of their state's carcass movement restrictions of deer harvested in Wisconsin before heading home.

Whole carcasses and parts of carcasses, other than those listed, from states and provinces where CWD has been detected, are not allowed to be brought into Wisconsin unless taken to a meat processor or taxidermist within 72 hours of entry into Wisconsin.

"CWD prions are infectious even after a positive deer dies, so proper handling and disposal of the carcass is very important to slow the spread of the disease," said Tami Ryan, acting Wildlife Management bureau director.

"Transporting a CWD-positive carcass to areas that are not yet known to have CWD increased the risk of transmission to new areas of the state.

Proper disposal of deer carcass waste is a factor in containing the spread of CWD. The DNR is committed to providing safe, convenient disposal options to hunters, especially in areas where options are limited or unavailable.

"This year, more deer carcass waste dumpsters are available to hunters across the state," Ryan said. "Some of the dumpsters will become available right before the nine-day gun deer season, so hunters should check the deer carcass disposal map on the DNR website frequently. More locations will be added and available during the nine-day gun deer season thanks to all the individuals and organizations that are participating in our adopt-a-dumpster program."

Hunters are encouraged to dispose of deer carcass waste in a licensed landfill that accepts this waste or in a dumpster designated for deer carcass waste. If a municipality allows deer disposal curbside or at a transfer station, the carcass should be double bagged. Please check the list of currently available disposal options [PDF]. A map with the CWD sampling locations and deer carcass disposal locations is on the DNR website as well as in the Hunt Wild app.

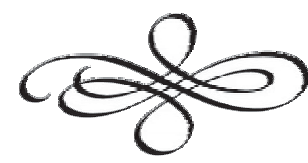

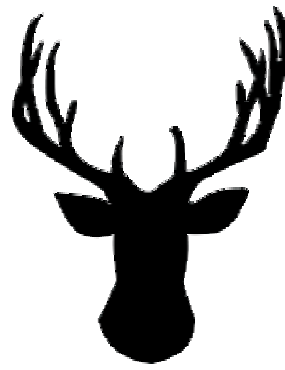

Deer hunting license sales on par with 2018

MADISON, Wis. - Another Wisconsin nine-day gun deer season is around the corner, and license sales continue to indicate that the hunting tradition is alive and well throughout the state. As of Nov. 17, sales for gun, bow, crossbow, sports and patron licenses reached 538,643 compared to 539,137 in 2018 - a difference of only 494 licenses, according to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

"License sales are brisk. We are happy to see customers buying their licenses early and not waiting for the last minute. DNR staff, private agents and our Go Wild system are prepared for a busy week as we expect sales traffic to increase each day as hunters prepare for the opener on Saturday," says Kimberly Currie, Director of Customer and Outreach Services.

Two areas have already exceeded last year's sales totals for the entire season. Individual crossbow license sales are up 10% year-to-date over last year's season total. The number of licenses purchased for young children also remains strong. In 2018, 2,257 children under the age of nine held a license compared to 3,648 already this year.

The department plans to release preliminary sales totals for the opening weekend on Tuesday, Nov. 26.

Pregnant Women and the Flu

(Rhinelander, WI)-Many pregnant women are not getting the flu vaccine and it's putting themselves and their babies at risk, according to a report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

Because pregnant women are at high risk of complications from the flu, the CDC recommends that pregnant women get a flu shot. Vaccination has been shown to reduce the risk of flu-associated acute respiratory infection in pregnant women.

"With the flu now spreading across the country, the CDC recommends that all pregnant women get a flu vaccine during any trimester of their pregnancy," said Elizabeth Lambert, APRN-CNP, with Ascension Medical Group. "Flu can range from mild to severe, but it's especially risky for pregnant women. Pregnant women suspected of having influenza should seek prompt treatment with antiviral medications."

According to the CDC Influenza (flu) is more likely to cause severe illness in pregnant women than in women of reproductive age who are not pregnant.

Changes in the immune system, heart, and lungs during pregnancy make pregnant women (and women up to two weeks postpartum) more prone to severe illness from flu, including illness resulting in hospitalization. Flu also may be harmful for a pregnant woman's developing baby.

"A common flu symptom is fever, which may be associated with neural tube defects and other adverse outcomes for a developing baby," said Lambert. "Getting vaccinated also can help protect a baby after birth from flu as mom can pass antibodies onto the developing baby during her pregnancy."

In addition to getting a flu shot, pregnant women should take the same everyday preventive actions the CDC recommends of everyone, including covering coughs, washing hands often, and avoiding people who are sick. Breastfeeding also has many benefits, including helping to protect infants from infections like flu.

Clinicians at Ascension Medical Group urge all individuals six months or older to get a flu shot, if you haven't already, especially if you are pregnant. TABK: Follow the Four Rules of Firearm Safety for a Safe and Successful Hunting Season

MADISON, Wis. -- Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources recreational safety specialists and the state's 4,100 volunteer hunter education instructors urge all hunters to keep your safety and the safety of those around you in mind at all times this fall.

Hunters following the four firearm safety rules has resulted in a 94% percent reduction in hunting incidents since 1967.

DNR Hunter Education Administrator Jon King said conservation wardens investigate every hunting incident and provide information to the Hunter Education Program to gain a better understanding of how and why incidents occur. "When we look at all of the incidents, we see at least one of the four firearm safety rules being violated every time," King said.

Hunters commonly refer to the four firearm safety rules as TABK.

T: Treat every firearm as if it is loaded.

Never assume a firearm is unloaded even if you are watching as it is unloaded. Make it a habit to treat guns like they are always loaded.

When carrying a gun, setting it down, working with it, putting it away, or getting it out, it is always smart to check the action to make sure that it is unloaded and the safety is on. Be sure to plan on unloading your firearm whenever you are not hunting, which will help you reduce the chance of an accidental discharge.

A: Always point your muzzle in a safe direction.

When you are hunting with your family and friends, there are many ways to carry your firearm. No matter which way you carry your gun, make sure it never is pointed at another person, building or vehicle. A safe direction is one where the bullet will do no harm in the event of an unwanted discharge.

B: Be certain of your target, what is in front of it and what is beyond it.

Positive target identification is a must. Do not shoot at movement. Know what is between you and your target and what is beyond your target. You must be sure of your target before deciding to shoot. Remember your bullet can travel a long way after shooting it; make sure you have a safe backstop.

K: Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until you are ready to shoot.

Almost every year, there are incidents of people shooting themselves, friends, houses and vehicles while handling a gun. The main thing to remember when holding a gun is never to put or rest your finger inside the trigger guard until you are ready to shoot.

"It is not enough to remember the rules, you have to practice them while using a firearm all the time," King said. "Wisconsin hunters have done a great job of practicing the safety rules, and reminders from time to time help keep everyone safer."

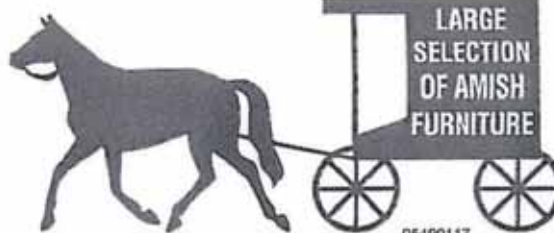
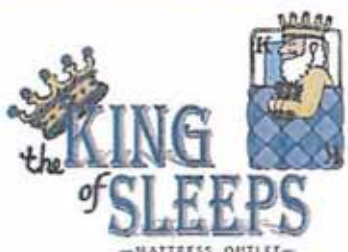
