Governor Evers announces Best Practices and Safety Guidelines for Wisconsin Businesses

MADISON: Gov. Tony Evers announced today that businesses looking to keep workers, customers, and families safe while “turning the dial” toward reopening can now draw on a series of publications to keep them informed of best practices and safety tips.

The brochures include general guidelines for all businesses to follow as well as industry-specific advice, such as for restaurants, retailers, manufacturers, professional offices, farmers, manufacturers, builders, hotel and motel operators, barbers, personal care services and other fields.

“Wisconsin businesses have done a great job in adapting to our state's Safer at Home order,” Gov. Evers said. “As we begin to ‘turn the dial,’ they need to know how to reopen safely so that employees and customers can feel confident when they return.”

The guides were developed by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) in consultation with the Departments of Health Services, Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, and Tourism, as well as and industry experts and associations.

“What these guides really aim to do is provide actionable advice for businesses, especially small businesses, as they begin the road back to reopening,” said WEDC Secretary and CEO Missy Hughes. “The guides answer basic questions, such as how to handle transactions at cash registers, what to do about merchandise that's been handled by customers, and how to set up an office using social distancing strategies.”

Some of the general advice for businesses includes:

- Making sure that employees who are sick don't come to work
- Curtailing business travel whenever possible.
- Promoting telecommuting or other work-from-home arrangements

Making sure employees have access to sanitizers and personal protective equipment when appropriate.

Gov. Evers said the reopening of state businesses will continue to be guided by the health care metrics contained in the Badger Bounce Back plan, which include tracking new cases of COVID-19, assessing available medical resources to cope with COVID cases, and ensuring adequate testing and mitigation resources.

Spring has arrived in Northern Wisconsin, and pretty soon the leaves will be emerging, greening up the Northwoods! There are many tools to help us become experts at identifying trees. I'll share some of my favorite tools and resources.

If you're new to tree identification or just getting started, don't worry. I have an easy guide with basic terminology for identifying trees: <https://www.uwsp.edu/cnr-ap/leaf/Documents/7-8%20Tree%20ID%20Terms%202012.pdf> This is a document from UW-Stevens Point LEAF program.

LEAF is a Forestry Education Program and they have an excellent online Dichotomous Tree ID tool: <https://www.uwsp.edu/cnr-ap/leaf/Pages/TreeKey/treeToidentify.aspx> to easily and quickly identify the tree. Five cases of Covid-19 confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed a that a fifth person has been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) in Forest County. The individuals are being isolated and no further information is being released to protect their privacy. County health officials are working to determine how the individuals may have become infected and are contacting other individuals with whom the positive case has had close contact with. It is linked with the cases at Nu-Roc.

We are working with our local, state and federal partners to deal quickly and effectively when people have symptoms of COVID-19 or have been around people who have been infected to make sure our community remains safe and healthy.

COVID-19 can be spread by asymptomatic people, meaning people who are not experiencing symptoms such as fever, cough, and shortness of breath. In addition to maintaining at least six feet of physical distance as much as possible, we recommend that everyone wear cloth face coverings in public settings where physical distancing measures are difficult to maintain, frequently wash their hands, and cover coughs and sneezes to prevent catching and spreading disease.

People with confirmed infections have a range of symptoms, from little to no symptoms to people being severely sick and dying. Symptoms may include:

Tiffany wins election for 7th Dist. seat in Congress

State Senator Tom Tiffany has moved from his senate seat in Madison to a seat in the U.S. Congress after winning the special election from Democrat Tricia Zunker.

The total vote for the entire district was 109,594 for Tiffany and 81,955 for Zunker. Forest County voted heavily for Tiffany with a final count of 1,640 to 852.

Nashville Ward 2 was the only district to vote for Zunker who won by a vote of 68 to 5.

Forest County reports COVID-19 investigation at Nu-Roc

The Forest County Health Department is reporting that there have been staff and residents of The Bay at Nu-Roc that have tested positive for COVID-19.

“The Forest County Health Department is working closely with The Bay at Nu-Roc leadership and staff to conduct a thorough investigation to track, trace, and contain the virus,” said Jacee Shepard, Health Officer/Director of the Forest County Health Department. “We want to assure the residents of The Bay at Nu-Roc, their family members, and facility staff that extra steps are being taken to protect residents because they live in a setting that puts them in close proximity with a larger number of people and they rely on staff and volunteers for care.

“Resident safety is always our top priority. We continue to work with both the local and state health departments to ensure that we are taking all appropriate infection control practices,” said Judi Christensen, Regional Clinical Director for The Bay at Nu-Roc. “Staying home is the most important way to protect our residents and the staff that cares for them. We hope that people will continue to call and email residents, send letters and cards, and send their love and support to our residents and staff on the frontlines.”

The Forest County Health Department does not release the names of residents that have tested positive for COVID-19 because the strategies employed by the health department to protect the community also seek to ensure the privacy of individuals and their families. Immediate family members have been notified.

A “public health investigation” is initiated when a

single positive case is identified in a long-term care facility, or when two or more cases are identified in group housing, health care facilities, workplaces, and other settings such as restaurants. A "case investigation" and contact tracing are conducted with all people who have tested positive for COVID-19 and their contacts, regardless of the setting.

To date, four people who live in Forest County have tested positive for COVID-19. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) will be posting data about facility-wide public health investigations and outbreaks to their website weekly. This data is part of a public health strategy that informs the public about what is happening in their community.

If you have been in contact with someone who is a confirmed case of COVID-19, staff from the Forest County Health Department will contact you to notify you of potential exposure. When they call you, they will ask if you are experiencing symptoms, if you are an essential worker, and will provide information about quarantine and isolation. If you have symptoms, they can also help you understand when and how to seek medical help, how to get tested, and options if you have concerns about being able to safely quarantine or isolate for the required time.

"COVID-19 can be spread by asymptomatic people, meaning people who are not experiencing symptoms such as fever, cough, and shortness of breath," continued Shepard. "In addition to maintaining at least six feet of physical distance as much as possible, we recommend that everyone wear cloth face coverings, frequently wash their hands, and cover coughs and sneezes to prevent catching and spreading disease."

The Forest County Health Department, Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS), and The Bay at Nu-Roc are working around the clock to try to help everyone remain safe.

We encourage the public to frequently monitor the Forest County Health Department Facebook page and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services website for current information. Additional information can be found on the CDC website.
