First Covid-19 related death confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Health officials have confirmed one person has died of complications surrounding novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) in Forest County. This death is the first in Forest County associated with COVID-19.

"We are extremely saddened by this loss," said Jacee Shepard, Health Officer of the Forest County Health Department. "Our deepest condolences go out to their family, friends, and loved ones."

To date, 22 people in Forest County and 14,887 people across the state of Wisconsin have been diagnosed with COVID-19. There have been 507 deaths in Wisconsin.

Health Officials expect the number of confirmed cases to continue to rise in the coming weeks. Expanded testing and contact tracing efforts are being put into place both locally and statewide in an effort to slow and prevent the spread of disease.

The Forest County Health Department continues to encourage community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19.

In an effort to keep community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County.

27 cases of Covid-19 confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed a total of twenty-seven people have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) in Forest County. One individual is linked to the current public health investigation with the Bay at Nu-Roc and one individual is in isolation. County health officials are working to determine how the individual may have become infected and are contacting others with whom the positive case had close contact with. The individuals are linked to the current public health investigation with The Bay at Nu-Roc.

We continue to work closely with The Bay at Nu-Roc leadership and staff, along with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services Division of Public Health and the Division of Quality Assurance to ensure all appropriate measures are in place to keep the residents and staff safe and healthy.

The Forest County Health Department continues to encourage community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. Conservation Corner

Citizen Lake Monitoring Network

Forest County Land and Water Conservation department is looking for volunteers to monitor our Forest County Lakes. Citizen Lake Monitoring Network (CLMN) is a huge part of the Wisconsin Lakes Partnership. The goal of CLMN is to collect high quality data, educate volunteers and share data. Volunteers measure water clarity, using the Secchi Disk method, as an indicator of water quality. Volunteers will also collect chemistry, temperature, and dissolved oxygen data, and identify plants and watch for the first appearance of Eurasian Water milfoil and other invasive species.

250,000 drivers eligible for online renewal

New DMV online license renewal program available for drivers ages 18 to 64.

To accommodate thousands of customers needing to renew their driver license during the public health emergency, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) now offers many drivers the option to renew online. The new program, launched May 11, allows eligible drivers to renew their license up to one year before their card expires.

DMV estimates nearly 250,000 drivers are eligible to renew their license online this year.

"Renewing online is an important option for those who prefer to minimize public interaction at this time," Wisconsin DMV Administrator Kristina Boardman said.

Drivers, ages 18 to 64, with no new medical restrictions or negative changes to their vision since their last renewal can renew their license online (wisconsindmv.gov/renewDL).

Approximately 80,000 driver licenses expired since March 12, 2020. To eliminate the need to visit a service center, those licenses received extensions for renewal. The renewal extensions expire July 25, 2020.

To protect the health of drivers 60 and older, DMV is extending their renewal date to September 24, 2020.

Renewing online is fast and convenient. Drivers who renew online receive a confirmation email that they can immediately print and use until their new card arrives by mail within 10 days. The \$34 renewal fee remains the same.

Northwoods United Way 2nd Drive Thru Facemask Giveaway

The Northwoods United Way will be hosting another facemask packet giveaway on Thursday, June 4th starting at 9 a.m. The masks will be given out in quantities of 15, with one packet given to each car that comes to the distribution event until supplies run out.

"Based upon the success of our first facemask giveaway, we decided to have another event for those that were unable to get masks from us last time. These facemasks will give our populations another level of protection while shopping for essentials, getting fuel, and going to appointments," says Nancy Sattler, Executive Director of the Northwoods United Way. "We hope that those that received masks at the first event will allow other people to get in line first for this second event"

The masks are single use masks and are intended to be properly discarded after use. A best practices sheet will be included with each packet of masks.

"We are pleased to be able to offer this to our community members. The facemasks will be handed out by masked United Way volunteers and the drivers don't even need to get out of their cars to get the packet"

Funding for the mask give-away is made possible by donations to the Northwoods United Way Covid19 Community Response Fund. Masks will be available for pickup at Associated Banks in Crandon, Rhinelander, Eagle River and Minocqua (Chippewa St location) on June 4th.

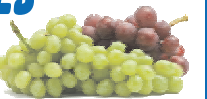

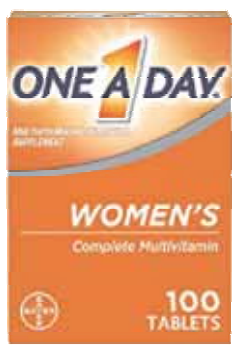


