## Conservation Corner

I had a property owner from the North end of Forest County call the other day and inform me of a Spruce Beetle infestation. Bark beetles are found throughout Wisconsin. Their ranges vary with each beetle species and its preferred host tree(s). Common conifer bark beetle species include: pine engraver (*Ips pini*), red turpentine beetle (*Dendroctonus valens*), chestnut-brown bark beetle (*Pityogenes hopkinsi*), spruce beetle (*Dendroctonus rufipennis*), eastern larch beetle (*Dendroctonus simplex*), and balsam fir bark beetle (*Pityokteines sparsus*).

Many species of bark beetles attack conifers in Wisconsin. Most prefer to attack only one or a few host species of conifers. Bark beetles can attack trees under stress; stress can be caused by overcrowding, drought, flood, damage from other insects, disease, changes in the water table, wounds, fire, storm damage and thinning during a drought. Bark beetles may also attack trees that are dying, freshly cut trees, and logging debris. Stressed trees are more vulnerable to bark beetle attack because their defensive mechanisms are compromised. Healthy conifers produce large quantities of pitch that often prevents bark beetle attacks. Occasionally, extremely large populations of bark beetles are able to mass attack and overwhelm the defenses of healthy trees.

Adult beetles emerge in spring after spending the winter in the layer of needles and other debris on top of the soil or from an infested tree. Beetles bore into a tree, mate and lay eggs. Fungi that may impact tree health are sometimes introduced during colonization. Larvae hatch and feed beneath the bark creating galleries that disrupt the flow of water and nutrients in the tree. Some species, such as the pine engraver (*Ips pini*) complete development rapidly (in as little as 30 days) and go through multiple generations per year. Other species, including the spruce beetle (*Dendroctonus rufipennis*), take up to two years to complete their life cycle. Warmer temperatures allow beetles to develop more quickly whereas cooler weather will lengthen the cycle. Populations of bark beetles can build up rapidly in hot, dry years.

The signs and symptoms of a bark beetle invasion include:

- Individual or groups of trees with light green, straw yellow, red or brown foliage. Brown, dead needles and tree mortality may occur abruptly.
- Small, round exit holes in the bark or pitch tubes near the base of the tree.
- Feeding galleries (tunnels) under the bark.
- Fine dust in bark crevices, at the base of the tree, or on understory plants.

Prevention practices include:

- Conducting sustainable forest management activities such as thinning stands at the proper time to maintain healthy, vigorous trees.
- Avoid stressing conifers in multiple ways, such as thinning during a drought, whenever possible.
- Remove harvested logs within three weeks of being cut during the months of March through September.

Management strategies will vary depending on the bark beetle species, host species, and site conditions. Recommendations for managing conifer bark beetles may include:

- If trees are stressed from drought, storm damage, or disease consider a pre-salvage harvest.
- Promptly salvage trees that are severely damaged by storms, fire, disease, insects, or other destructive agents before bark beetles have a chance to infest them.
- Harvest conifers during winter or when bark beetles are not active. Remove cut logs and tops down to 2 inches in diameter from the site by March if cut during the winter, or within three weeks of being cut from March through September.
- Logging debris remaining on the site should be left attached to the main stem, scattered into openings, or driven over to break it up and allow faster drying.
- Minimize damage to remaining trees during logging operations. Avoid large wounds, soil compaction and root injury which can stress trees and attract bark beetles.
- Plant site-appropriate conifer species, taking into consideration soil types and other factors that impact tree health and survival.

## Forty-eight cases of Covid-19 confirmed In Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 48 cases in Forest County. The individuals are isolating at home. No further information will be released to protect the confidentiality of the individuals. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. The Bay at Nu-roc has no active cases and all residents are out of isolation. There were 35 cases at Nu-Roc, nine are in isolation in the county, one is in the hospital, and there have been three deaths to make up the 48 confirmed cases.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily and local newspapers weekly with current COVID-19 case counts. 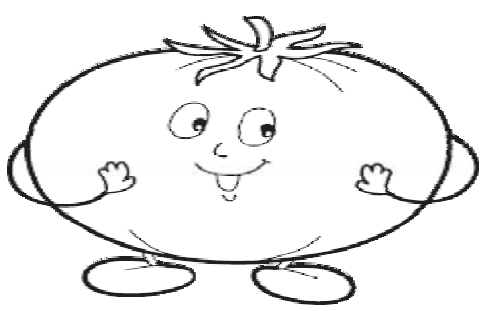

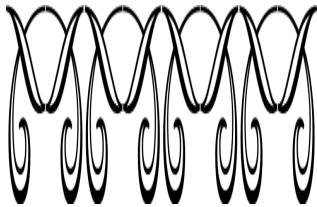

### FoodShare & Purchasing Food Online

Starting May 21, 2020, people who receive FoodShare or Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits are now able to order and purchase food on Amazon's and Walmart's websites using their QUEST or P-EBT card.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service approved Wisconsin's request to expedite implementation of online food purchasing at authorized retailers for people who receive FoodShare or Pandemic EBT benefits. At this time, the Food and Nutrition Service has only authorized Amazon and Walmart to accept online payments in Wisconsin, but hopefully more retailers will become authorized in Wisconsin soon.

#### How To Purchase Food Online

When purchasing food on Amazon's and Walmart's websites, people will be able to choose an EBT card payment option and enter their card details. They will be asked to enter their card PIN each time they check out.

People can only use their QUEST or P-EBT card to purchase eligible food, just as they would at a physical store. If they are ordering other items at the same time, they will be asked to enter another form of payment to purchase those items. Amazon and Walmart provide more information about the purchasing process on their websites.

## ATV/UTV safety laws Cont. from pg. 1

and operator error were some of the top contributors to these incidents. There also were 22 fatal ATV/UTV accidents in 2019.

To keep this sport as safe as possible and reduce injuries and deaths, the DNR urges riders to follow these safety tips and these new updates to existing laws.

### ATV Passenger Rules

- ATV operators cannot have a passenger riding in or on any part of an ATV that is not designed or intended to be used by passengers. Previously, this law only applied to roadways. After market seating does not comply with the law.

### New ATV/UTV Legal Definitions

- For ATVs, low-pressure tires are no longer required; instead, the only requirement is three or more tires. ATVs are required to be commercially designed and manufactured and their width cannot exceed 50 inches as measured laterally between the outermost wheel rims on each side of the vehicle.
- For UTVs, low-pressure tires are also no longer required; instead, they must have four or more tires. UTVs must be originally manufactured with, and must have at all times, a width of not more than 65 inches as measured laterally between the outermost wheel rims on each side of the vehicle.

- No person (except emergency services personal) may operate an ATV or UTV that is equipped with any of the following: 1.) A lamp that emits a color other than white or amber and that is visible from directly in front of the vehicle. 2.) A lamp that emits any color of light other than red, yellow, amber or white and that is visible from directly behind the ATV or UTV. 3.) A flashing, oscillating or rotating lamp that emits any color other than yellow or amber.

### Lighted Headlamp Display Requirements

- ATVs and UTVs must now have a lighted headlamp and tail lamp during operation - regardless of time of day and location.

- Any person operating an ATV or UTV must dim his or her high-beam headlamps and any auxiliary lamps when within 500 feet of an approaching ATV/UTV or vehicle, and within 500 feet to the rear of another ATV/UTV or vehicle.

Operational Requirements and Modification Restrictions  
ATVs and UTVs cannot be operated with anything else other than tires (exception: private property or frozen waters).

ATV and UTV operators born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 who are at least 12 years old for an ATV (and at least 16 years old for UTV) must complete an ATV safety certification course to operate in Wisconsin (exception: on private property owned by operator's immediate family). DNR Conservation Wardens recommend all ATV and UTV operators complete a safety course.

**Thelma (Wilson) Flannery**  
Thelma Flannery's wonderful life on Earth ended July 10, 2020 in the Riverview Health Systems facility in Tomahawk, at age 98. She used to say that people asked how she stayed so healthy for so long, and she'd reply, "Bush's Beans." So, there's friendly advice for you, too.

Thelma's journey began in Fillmore, Ky., the second daughter of Clay and Mary Ellen Wilson, on Jan. 9, 1922. But it might have been Jan. 10; she was told one date, the birth certificate listed the other. The Wilson family moved to Laona when Thelma was 4, when Clay found work in the logging industry.

Thelma was one of eight children to Clay and Mary Ellen. Sister Maude, and brothers Willie, Herb, John and Edgar (Bug) preceded her in death; sister Laurena (Beanie) and brother Jim survive her. Thelma was married to Gorden Flannery for almost 53 years — he died in March 1994 — and lived most of her life in Forest County.

A 1940 graduate of Laona High School, Thelma married Gorden on Sept. 21, 1941 in the Seventh-Day Adventist Church in Clearwater Lake. The day was so unseasonably warm, she recalled, that two young squirrel hunters rested their guns against the building and came inside to cool off during the ceremony.

She gave birth to five children and suffered the deaths of two of them: Son Terry (Joan) in Oct. 2018 and daughter Marilyn Conn (Bill) in April 2016. Thelma is survived by daughter Jean Montgomery (Bill) and son Gordon Richard "Luke" (Merilynn), both of Crandon; and son Dan (Mary), of Appleton.

Thelma and Gorden had 18 grandchildren and step-grandchildren, 34 great-grandchildren and 22 great-great-grandchildren.

Thelma made a quilt for almost each one of them. She made thousands more quilts for friends, relatives, friends of friends, kids who needed to know they were loved, and many more.

Thelma quilted for the final 60-some years of her life, as early as Dan's infancy and as late as March 2020. Some were beautiful, ornate and of her own design. Some used fabric from T-shirts and sweatshirts to tell the story of a life. Some celebrated new lives, some comforted those at life's end. Some were sold, many were donated. Some earned blue, red and white ribbons at the Forest County Fair.

From 1996 to 2012, Thelma created 514 quilts for Bernie Peterson, an editor at The Post-Crescent newspaper in Appleton. In turn, Bernie gifted those quilts to friends, colleagues, relatives, acquaintances, friends of friends, relatives of relatives ... and a few folks who just deserved warmth and comfort.

It was a remarkable connection, and she kept scores of thank-you notes from quilt recipients.

Some notes also came from teachers and families from the Rhinelander School District, where daughter Marilyn worked for 26 years as a school aide. Marilyn identified students in need of kindness, and Thelma created and donated a quilt for them, a heartfelt combination that showed love to scores of young people. Since Marilyn's death, Thelma continued quilting for people in northern Wisconsin and beyond. Son-in-law Bill Conn made many of those connections, helping her stay active and healthy, and drove her to thrift stores around northern Wisconsin in search of fabric.

Thelma was a quiet, strong woman. She did much of the couple's parenting work, while Gorden worked on the road or roamed the woods.

She was a member of the Lakeland Baptist Church in Crandon for more than 60 years and was a major benefactor to the church.

Every Bible she owned was read multiple times, with underlined passages and notes in the margins. She loved the Lord, and faithfully attended services.

As a child of the Great Depression, Thelma showed the desire — maybe the need — to use materials, tools, dishes, silverware, thread, Tupperware, books, scrap paper, pencils and pens as long as they'd hold up. She found a way to reuse Christmas and birthday cards.

Her actions usually spoke louder than her words. She was uncomfortable in gatherings of people, and never mastered "small talk." And, like many of her generation, she struggled to ask for help.

Thelma's burial site is adjacent to Gorden's in the Crandon Lakeside Cemetery. Her funeral will be held Wednesday, July 15, at Lakeland Baptist Church, 106 S. Hazeldell Ave., Crandon. Visitation is from 10-11 a.m., followed by a funeral service, and burial.

To respect the health of family members and funeral participants, facemasks are required at the church.

If you're attending, and have a quilt Thelma created, please bring it to drape on the pew where you sit. Weber-Hill Funeral Home, Crandon, is providing assistance.

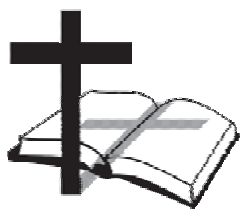

## DMV Reminder: Extension on driver license renewal ends July 25, 2020

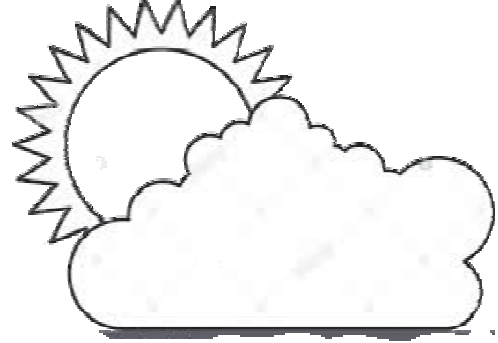
The deadline for drivers under age 60 who received extensions to renew their license due to COVID-19 is Saturday, July 25, 2020. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) reminds drivers to renew their licenses online ([wisconsindmv.gov/renewDL](http://wisconsindmv.gov/renewDL)) to avoid a late fee.

DMV recently added an online license renewal option to offer greater convenience and help keep customers safe during the health emergency. Most drivers between ages 18 and 64 are now able to go online, confirm they have no new changes in their health that impact their ability to safely drive, and complete the renewal process. Online renewals take effect immediately and are viewable to law enforcement. Drivers can also go to a DMV customer service center to renew — go online to make an appointment ([wisconsindmv.gov/DLGuide](http://wisconsindmv.gov/DLGuide)).

DMV recognizes the elevated health risk to drivers over age 60 during this pandemic and has granted them an additional 60 days to renew their driver license. They have until September 24, 2020 to renew with no late fee.

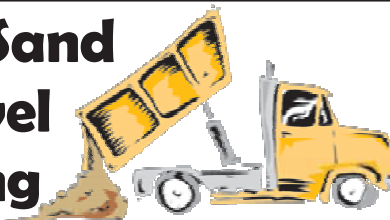

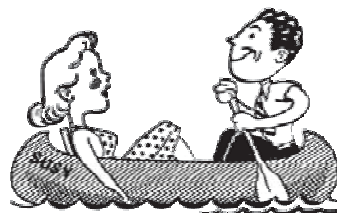

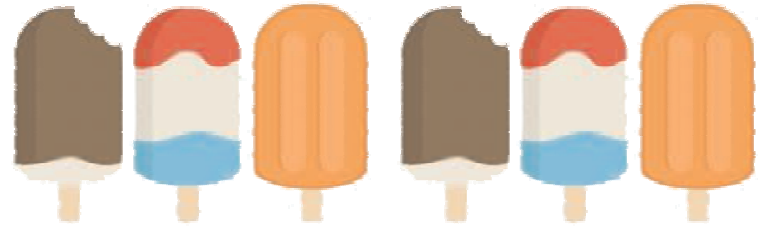
