Covid testing in the Town of Doty



Oconto County has set up a free drive-through Covid testing program at the Doty Town Hall, on County Road T in Mountain. There will be four testing events. The first is on October 27, 12 p.m. until 8 p.m. Other tests will be conducted at the same location on November 10, from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m.; November 24, 12 p.m. until 8 p.m.; and on December 8 from 12 p.m. until 8 p.m. The testing will be provided by the Wisconsin National Guard. If you are age 5 or older and have covid symptoms or have been exposed to someone with covid 19 you can get tested. It is a good opportunity to take care of your health for those in northern Oconto County. Watch for an ad in this issue for more details on this important health measure.

2021 Wisconsin Land and Water Conservation Association Poster and Speaking Contest

The Wisconsin Land and Water Conservation Association is hosting another poster and speaking contest and we are inviting all of our students from Crandon, Laona and Wabeno school districts to participate.

This year's poster theme is Healthy Forests = Healthy Communities and the speeches must promote the conservation of natural resources and the protection or enhancement of environmental quality. Each student that enters the poster contest or speech contest will have a chance to advance to the regional and then onto state representing Forest County.

We would like all entry forms for the speeches in by JANUARY 13th, this will give us enough time to schedule slots on the 19th. Due to COVID-19 we would like to be able to space out each speech to make sure we are taking the correct actions for cleaning and social distancing.

The annual 2020 Thanksgiving Day Dinner hosted by St. John Lutheran Church, Townsend, has been cancelled. Event coordinator Lynn Schmidt said this was a difficult but necessary decision.

"For the past ten years, we have held the traditional Thanksgiving dinner to not only foster fellowship among the congregation, but to offer a place to go for those in the community who wanted to join us on this very special day."

In the past two years, the dinner has attracted over 120 guests. "But due to mitigation efforts designed to counteract the spread of COVID-19," Lynn said, "we are adhering to the CDC Guidelines which ask us not to gather in large groups this fall. We look forward to 2021 when we can resume this very popular community event."

417 cases of Covid-19 (34 Active) confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 409 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of today, Forest County has 2,855 negative test results. There are currently 34 active cases in isolation, 372 released from isolation, 1 current hospitalization, and 10 deaths.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily and local newspapers weekly with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

Forest Products Week



Gov. Tony Evers has proclaimed the third week in October (Oct. 18-24, 2020) as Forest Products Week. The week recognizes the people who work in and care for our forests, the businesses that create forest products and the many ways forest products contribute to our lives.

"Forest products contribute \$24.3 billion annually to the state's economy," Collin Buntrock, forest products team leader with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources said. "Additionally, our forests directly provide more than 63,000 jobs for Wisconsin residents with a payroll of \$4.2 billion. In fact, forestry is the number one employer in seven counties, and every forestry job supports 1.7 additional jobs in the state."

In addition to celebrating the positive impact of Wisconsin's forest products sector on the state's economy, Forest Products Week recognizes the myriad forest products ingrained in our daily lives.

"From paper products such as food packaging, fine writing paper and tissue paper, to lumber used for homes and furniture, the products made by the more than 1,200 forest products companies in Wisconsin help make our life better," Buntrock said. "Emerging forest products such as mass timber, nanocellulose and biochemicals are beginning to unlock innovative uses for wood that may help the state's industry diversify in the future."

Forest Products Week also salutes the people who care for the 17 million acres of forests in Wisconsin.

"Sustainable forestry is key to maintaining Wisconsin's forest-based economy," Buntrock said. "While 31% of Wisconsin's forests are owned by county, state and federal governments, the 57% of the forestland owned by about 391,000 individuals and families supplies a majority of the wood used by Wisconsin's forest products industry to make the products we use every day."

Buntrock's team of forest products specialists helps Wisconsin's forest industry build and maintain strong markets while ensuring that forests remain a vital part of the state's economy and culture for future generations.

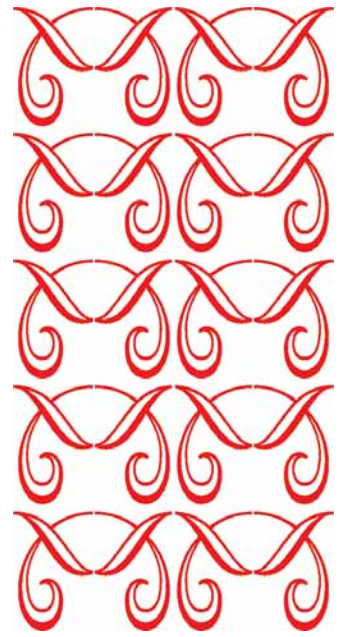

INSURANCE TIP HEATING WITH WOOD & PELLET BURNERS

Outdoor wood furnaces & pellet burners have become increasingly popular. Some companies charge a premium of \$15 to \$50. Others do not. Contact your agent to do an inspection or if you have questions before you install or have it installed.

If you are burning wood, follow all manufacturer's guidelines for installation or hire a professional to do the installation for you.

Here are some more safety tips:

1. Burn seasoned wood. Wood two years old or more.
2. Place ashes in a covered metal container to keep wind from blowing coals and sparks around.
3. Clean your chimney at least twice a year, using an approved cleaning method.
4. Install smoke alarms on same level as stove and have a fire extinguisher close by.
5. Every year, make sure your smoke pipe is firmly in place where it enters the chimney and screw sections together.
