Lake Property Owners, have you noticed erosion along your shoreline? This is a challenge that many shoreland property owners face, we would like to share some tips on how to keep your shoreland property in place!

The best way to identify and assess erosion problems is to check your shoreline regularly and monitor changing conditions. Warning signs of accelerated erosion problems include:

- A large area of bare soil along the shore (especially on a steep/high shoreline bank).
- Nearshore gullies caused by overland runoff from rooftops, driveways, and access roads.
- A noticeable recession of the shoreline over time.
- Large patches of unusually cloudy (turbid) water near a lakeshore, or unusually high stream turbidity (especially during periods of high water).

Choosing the best fit for your shoreland property depends on the quantity and speed of runoff from hard surfaces toward the water's edge, and the amount of energy along the shore. Shoreline erosion on low energy sites can frequently be addressed by limiting the amount of foot traffic to, and along, the water's edge. For example, you can create a purposeful path that meanders to the lake. You can also restore (or leave) native plants along the shore to create a no-mow zone. Further, you can allow aquatic plants to re-establish in the nearshore area.

Best Practices for a Healthy Lake

- FishFish sticks are strategically placed groups of whole, dead trees that are partially or fully submerged and anchored to the shore to create fish and wildlife habitat. These large woody structures also help prevent bank erosion by reducing the energy to your shoreline.
- 350 ft² native plantings stabilize banks with trees, shrubs, grasses, and wildflowers that improve wildlife habitat, slow runoff, and promote natural beauty.
- Diversion practices prevent runoff from getting into your lake or stream by redirecting water to areas (like a rain garden or rock infiltration pit) where it can soak into the ground instead.

The first meeting of the Argonne Centennial committee met last Wednesday at the town hall. It was lightly attended, with only five people present. However, there was a fire call which thinned the ranks of interested people. Randy Spencer, town chair, ran the informal meeting where some of the details of the celebration were discussed.

This is just a start, and it is expected that a much larger amount of people will attend future meetings. In spite of the low attendance, there was a good discussion of old stories about Argonne. It should be noted that Argonne is one of the older communities in Forest County. This is the 100th anniversary of the town changing its name from North Crandon to Argonne.

Argonne had an early start, and in a slightly different location. The first town that was started because of the Soo Line Railroad coming through Forest County was the Town of Wall. Another spelling of Wall is Wahl, but Chairman Spencer said that spelling he mostly sees on old documents is Wall. It was known that there would be a big switching area in this location, and the enterprising Abraham VanZile started the town to cash in on the activity the railroad would bring. Unfortunately, he didn't take into account the topography. When the railroad surveyors arrived, they didn't care about the new town, they looked at the large flat area that would accommodate a switching area. The Town of Wall was obsolete before it had a good start. The town was moved to the current location, and there are still some houses in Argonne that it is thought were moved from Wall to their current location. The new town was called VanZile for a time, but it is thought that the Soo Line called the new town and switching location North Crandon. In the picture above, that name is on the depot, which dates that photo from before 1921, when the town was renamed Argonne. There will be more to come in future issues on the Argonne Centennial.

Anyone with old photos of Argonne, are asked to share that history with the Centennial Committee. It would be greatly appreciated!

Argonne starts to prepare for their Centennial Celebration on August 14

951 cases of covid-19 (5 active) confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 951 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of Friday, April 23rd, Forest County has 4,720 negative test results. There are currently 5 active cases in isolation, 923 released from isolation, 0 hospitalized, and 26 deaths related to COVID-19.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page and local newspapers weekly on Friday's with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Every Monday there will be an updated vaccine report on our Facebook page to update residents on the progress being made on vaccinating community members. Jordan's Way Fundraiser For Forest County Humane Society

Hat's off to Director Chrystal Ross, Jay and Angie Schaefer and their entire team who with the help of Jordan's Way, put together a successful fund raiser for the Forest County Society animal shelter in just a week. What is Jordan's Way? Jordan's Way was founded by Kris, who met his best friend and inspiration 11 years ago at a local shelter. Jordan had spent her whole life in a shelter until Kris was able to rescue her. Over the years they helped each other grow as their bond strengthened. Many of us know the profound affect that an animal can have on our life, and the impact that we have when we rescue shelter pets. Sadly, Jordan passed in the fall of 2018 after a battle with cancer. Kris made a promise to honor her life by helping as many shelters in need as possible, founding Jordan's Way. Their mission is to share meaningful animal welfare stories that inspire people to adopt. They publicize their efforts on social media to work towards influencing the Clearing of Shelters. Through their community outreach, fundraising and advocacy, they create a buzz around shelters that builds a compassionate community of pet parents willing to provide a permanent home to homeless animals.

The event took place at the shelter on Thursday evening, April 22nd from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. During that time money was raised with online donations and donations for events like getting people out of jail, a dunk tank, brat fry, face painting, and many more crazy antics, and the whole event was live on Facebook. They also highlighted two celebrity dogs, one whose life was saved from a heart defect and the other from a horrible accident all because many caring people donated to the shelter for their huge medical expenses. What warmed my heart was seeing all the kids and even adults walking around with the puppies that were available for adoption. I overheard one young boy trying to convince his mom to adopt one of the puppies. That boy is going to make a great salesperson some day! Even though the on-site event is over, you can still donate to the fundraiser.

The Forest County Animal Shelter has a yearly budget of \$200,000 and is primarily funded through their two resale shops and donations. When the shelter was taken over by President Jay Schaefer and his wife Angie, they were in debt and the shelter was in serious jeopardy of closing. They have since been able to operate in the black, but currently only have enough money in the bank to cover 6 months of expenses, should they run low on funds. The shelter currently takes in about 200 dogs and 250 cats each year. What would happen to these animals if we had no shelter?

Jordan's Way will be back again next year, and with more time to do publicity, I hope there is an outstanding turn out and more donations to this great cause. I encourage our municipalities and people of our community to join in the efforts that will keep this shelter going for years to come. We are all God's creatures and called to serve those people and animals that need help. Thank you again Forest County Humane Society team for all you do!

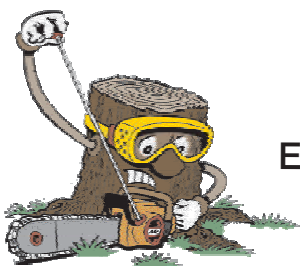

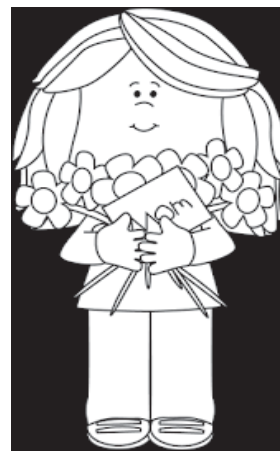

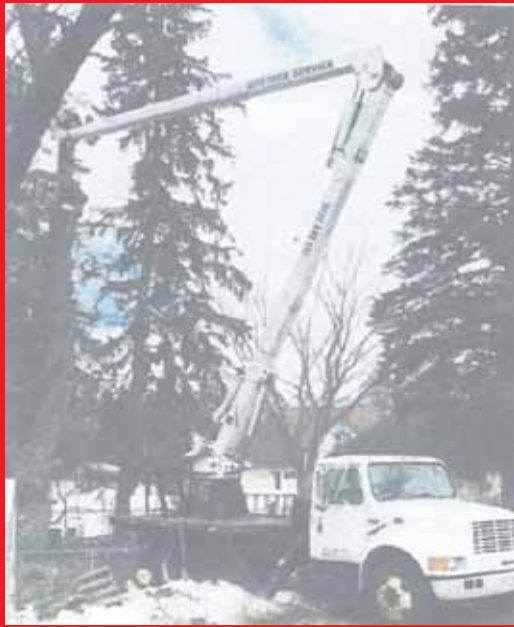
