Forest County is a partner and supporter of the Wild Rivers Invasive Species Coalition (WRISC). WRISC is a coalition which seeks and obtains grant funding from many sources to provide services to Forest, Florence, and Marinette Counties in Wisconsin and Dickinson and Menominee Counties in Michigan. Since 2009 WRISC has completed invasive species education, management and control in many areas across the 5-county region. The mission of WRISC is dedicated to the management of our lands and waters through cooperation, education, prevention and control.

WRISC provides services to private landowners, organizations, and municipal partners. There is no cost to become a partner, it only takes agreement with a memorandum of understanding between your group and WRISC. Larger numbers of partners will improve the chances for WRISC to obtain grants.

I would encourage every group with an interest to sign on to become a partner with WRISC. Let's work together to fight invasive species on our lands and in our waters.

A primary goal of WRISC in 2021 will be inventory and management of invasive species populations on road rights-of-way. There is a particular concern with wild parsnip which has greatly expanded its populations within rights-of-way and also provides health dangers to the public. This summer, WRISC is planning several "pulls" in Forest County. You can find information about these events on their website www.wrisc.org.

You may see WRISC's Strike Team out and about in Forest County or neighboring counties this summer. They are getting into their field season and will be busy locating and eradicating invasive species.

Mecikalski Stovewood Museum opens for the summer!

An area historic treasure, the Mecikalski Stovewood Museum opens for the season on June 5th. The museum and visitor center will be open on Saturdays, through Labor Day, from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. The museum will also be open on July 4th. Additional tours may be arranged. Admission is free.

Built in 1899, this national historic site was constructed with an unusual method of folk architecture, using 18 inch lengths of cedar logs laid in a bed of wet lime mortar in a style often referred to as stovewood or cordwood construction. It is the largest building with a history of multiple commercial and personal uses that was built during this era.

Many turn-of-the-century exhibits associated with the building's history as a general store, saloon, farmers co-op, cheese factory, and blacksmith shop are displayed.

The Stovewood Museum is located in the small crossroads community of Jennings. To get there, take Hwy 45 to Pelican Lake, then CTY B East about 5 miles to Jennings, or from Crandon, take Hwy 55 South to Cty B West to Jennings.

The Paul family; a father and son in two wars



Lynn Paul, seen above, was one of the young men who joined Himes at the courthouse recruiting party. He served in France with the 32nd Division and came home healthy. Older folks will remember that he ran a grocery store on the north end of Crandon's Lake Avenue where the chiropractor's office is now located.

His son, Jimmy Paul, was a tail gunner in a B-24 in WWII. Jimmy made the ultimate sacrifice. The plane went down over the ocean, and his remains are likely still in the tail gunner's seat, with all of the crew in a watery grave.

Lynn Paul closed his store every Thursday until he retired in honor of his son, who lost his life on a Thursday. Jimmy is second from the left in the back row of the picture.

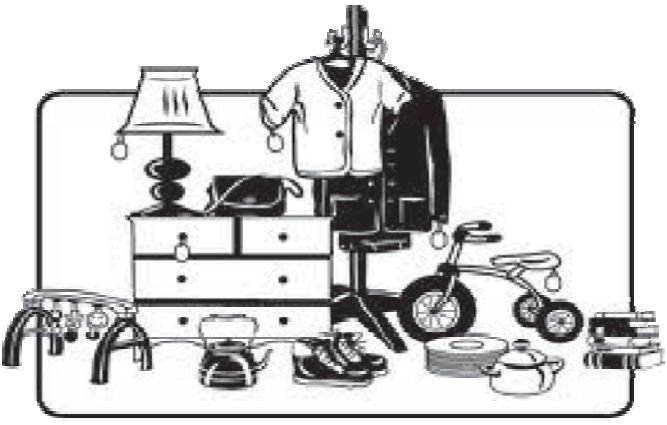

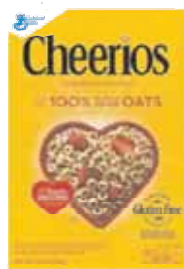

A waist gunner in a B-17 Flying Fortress, S. Sgt. Wade H. Flannery, age 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clifford Flannery of Pelican Lake, Wisconsin, has been decorated with the Distinguished Flying Cross on extraordinary achievement in combat. He is show above receiving the award from Colonel Dale Smith.

Sgt. Flannery has been flying on bombing operations over Germany and the occupied areas since shortly before the invasion of France and now has 30 missions to his credit. Indicative of the pace at which the Air Forces have been operated during the summer are 13 missions made in a 15 day period.

Among some of the well known objectives that the Airman's Fortress has attacked are Hamburg, Bremen, Leipzic, Merseburg, Peenemunde, Stuttgart and Ludwigshafen, all in Germany. His other assignments have taken him to France in support of the ground forces

In addition to the DFC, Sgt. Flannery also wears the Air Medal with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters, previously awarded to him.




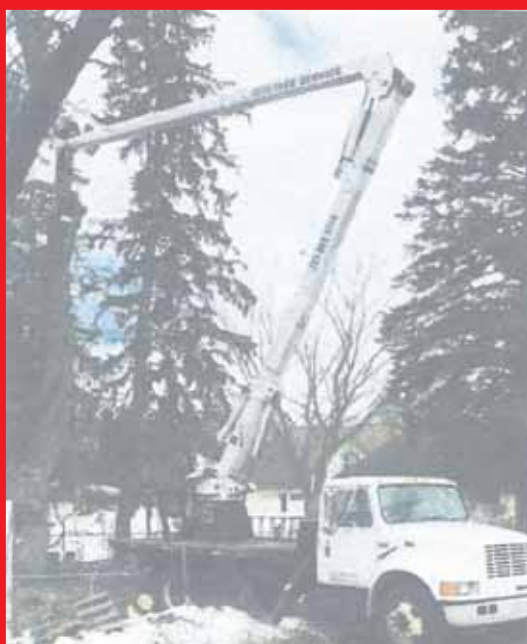
