Thorn Hired as FLOW AIS Coordinator

Lumberjack Resource Conservation & Development Council announced the hiring of Derek Thorn as the FLOW (Forest, Langlade, Oconto Waterways) AIS (Aquatic Invasive Species) Coordinator. Derek was born and raised in the Rhinelander area and attended Three Lakes High School, where he was first introduced to aquatic invasive species as a Clean Boats, Clean Waters Inspector for the Three Lakes Waterfront Association. Derek attended the University of Wisconsin-Steven Point and received degrees in Water Resource Management, Wildlife Ecology and Management, and Biology.

Derek comes to the position with a wealth of experience, having worked for Oneida and Vilas Counties' AIS teams and the WDNR. He has taught AIS prevention education and outreach programs, participated in purple loosestrife bio-control, led Clean Boats, Clean Waters interviews and workshops, conducted aquatic plant surveys, mapping, and identification of native and invasive species and conducted creel surveys, population estimation surveys, and electro-fishing surveys.

Being a part of FLOW, as the AIS Coordinator, is important to Derek. Working to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species is something he values and finds essential. Thorn explained, "Learning about invasive species and protecting our native waterways was my main focus in college. I am incredibly happy I have the opportunity to continue making a difference in the world of aquatic invasive species." In his free time, Derek likes to spend time outdoors, fishing, hunting, hiking, camping, and kayaking.

The FLOW position is made possible through the WDNR Surface Water Program and a Community Project Grant from Lumberjack RC&D Council. Each county in Wisconsin receives a WDNR allocation to put toward AIS programming and prevention. Lumberjack RC&D Council, acting as the agent for Forest, Langlade & Oconto Counties, will administer WDNR AIS programming.

Tracy Beckman, Executive Director for Lumberjack stated, "We believe combining resources to be able to hire a full-time coordinator will bring sustainability to surface water programming throughout the tri-county area. Derek is exactly what the program needs and his enthusiasm and passion for the work shows in everything he does."

Thorn will be responsible to implement WDNR programs such as the Citizen's Lake Monitoring Network (CLMN), Clean Boats, Clean Waters (CBCW), AIS Snapshot Day, Landing Blitz, Drain Campaign and other DNR initiatives. Evidence suggests that healthy behaviors took a back seat for many Americans during the pandemic. Many experts agree that people can improve their brain health and reduce the risk of cognitive decline by adopting healthy lifestyle habits, preferably in combination, including:

- **Exercise regularly**
Regular cardiovascular exercise helps increase blood flow to the body and brain, and there is strong evidence that regular physical activity is linked to better memory and thinking.

- **Maintain a heart-healthy diet**
Stick to a meal schedule full of fruits and vegetables to ensure a well-balanced diet. Some evidence suggests a healthful diet is linked to better cognitive performance. The Mediterranean and DASH diets are linked to better cognitive functioning, and help reduce risk of heart disease as well.

- **Get proper sleep**
Maintaining a regular, uninterrupted sleep pattern benefits physical and psychological health, and helps clear waste from the brain. Adults should get at least seven hours of sleep each night and try to keep a routine bedtime.

Boat Responsibly!

MADISON, Wis. – It's National Safe Boating Week, and thousands of boaters are expected to hit the water this Memorial Day Weekend. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) reminds boaters that wearing a life jacket could save your life.

It is human nature to think drowning can't happen to you. The majority of people who drown in boating accidents know how to swim but become incapacitated in the water such as being injured or unconscious, exhausted or weighed down by clothing.

So far this year, six people have died in boating incidents, and another 22 people died in 2020. Operator inexperience, inattention, recklessness and speeding are the four leading causes of tragic watercraft crashes, and the leading cause of death is drowning.

"Safety is an important part of water fun. Most drowning victims on Wisconsin waterbodies were not wearing life jackets," said Lt. Darren Kuhn, DNR Boating Law Administrator. "Wisconsin rivers and lakes can be relaxing and family-friendly places to spend a summer day when you put safety first and respect for the water."

The department does not track all drownings – only those fatalities linked to the use of a recreational activity item, such as a boat, kayak or canoe.

Statistics show boaters who wear life jackets and take boater safety courses are most likely to stay safe on Wisconsin waters. New life jackets are much more comfortable, lightweight and stylish than the bulky orange style most boaters know. There are innovative options, such as inflatable life jackets, allowing mobility and flexibility for activities like boating, fishing, paddling or hunting, and are much cooler in the warmer weather.

Follow the basic safety tips below and enjoy Wisconsin's great lakes and rivers with family and friends.

- WATER SAFETY TIPS**
- Sign up now to take an online boater education course.
 - Always wear a properly fitted life jacket that has a snug fit and is fastened when you're on or near the water. Life jackets will keep you on top of the water if you walk off an unexpected drop-off, or a wave or current overpowers you or you fall out of a boat.
 - Enjoy the waters sober and know your limits. Alcohol blurs a person's judgment, reaction time and abilities.
 - River shorelines and sandbars pose unseen dangers. Higher, fast-moving water can tax an individual's boating, paddling and swimming skills.
 - Keep an eye on the weather and let someone know where you are going.
 - Be ready for the unexpected and always wear your life jacket. More boating safety tips are available on the DNR website.

Questions and Answers About Medicare Savings Programs and Extra Help

Understanding Medicare can be challenging! But it is worth the effort to learn how to make the most of your Medicare options. It is also important to learn about the Medicare related benefit programs that can save you money if you qualify. The Medicare Savings Programs and Extra Help for Medicare Part D assist eligible people with their Medicare costs and Part D prescription drug costs. Read these frequently asked questions and answers to see if these programs could help you or someone you know.

What are Medicare Savings Programs? Medicare Savings Programs assist seniors with limited incomes and assets to pay for some or all of Medicare's premiums, deductibles and co-pays.

What do Medicare Savings Programs help pay for? Depending on your income, they will pay for the Part B premium and possibly Part A and B deductibles and co-payments.

What is the Part B premium? Unless you are already on a special program, most people with Medicare have the Part B premium automatically deducted from their Social Security checks each month. In 2021, the standard Part B premium is \$148.50.

How low does my income need to be in order to qualify for Medicare Savings Programs? The 2021 monthly GROSS income limit for an individual is \$1,449 per month or for a couple the limit is \$1,959 per month.

What is counted as income? All of your income is counted including Social Security, pensions, annuities, veteran's benefits, rental income, etc. Also, you must include the amount that is automatically withdrawn from your Social Security check to pay for the Medicare Part B premium as part of your income. In 2021, the standard Part B premium that needs to be added back in for your gross income is \$148.50.

What are the asset guidelines to be eligible for the program? Individuals must have assets or resources less than \$7,970 and couples must have assets below \$11,960.

What exactly qualifies as an "asset?" Your assets include money in checking accounts, savings accounts, CD's, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, IRA's, investments, cash and any real estate other than your home.

Does my house or car count as an asset? The house you are living in and your car are not counted as assets.

What is "Extra Help" for Part D? Extra Help also known as Low Income Subsidy (LIS) - is a program that helps people with limited income and assets pay for the premiums, deductibles and co-pays for their Medicare Part D prescription drug insurance. Just like the Medicare Savings Programs, your income and assets are considered for determining how much help you can get.

How much income can I have and still qualify for Extra Help? Your Gross income can be up to \$1,610/month for an individual or \$2,177/month for couples.

What is the asset limit to be eligible for Extra Help? Individuals can have up to \$13,290 and couples can have up to \$26,520.

If I don't qualify for Extra Help can I still get Part D drug coverage? Yes. Whether or not you qualify for Extra Help does not affect your eligibility for a Part D plan.

If my income is low enough but I am over the asset limit, are there any other programs I can qualify for? Senior Care is a low-cost prescription drug program that considers only your income -- not your assets. You may want to check out this program if you are over the asset limit for Extra Help but still have limited income.

I think I meet the qualifications! How do I apply for the program? Contact your county's Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) for more information about these programs. They will guide you through the application process.

It looks like I am just a little over the income and asset limits. Does it pay to look into this further? YES! The benefit specialists may be able to help identify some things that are not counted toward the limits, such as money set aside for a burial account. If you are close to the qualifying guidelines you should call to ask specific questions.

I am part of a church or civic group that might be interested in receiving more information about these programs. How can I best get this information to my group? Call your local Aging and Disability Resource Center for brochures, and fliers. The more people we can reach with this information, the better!

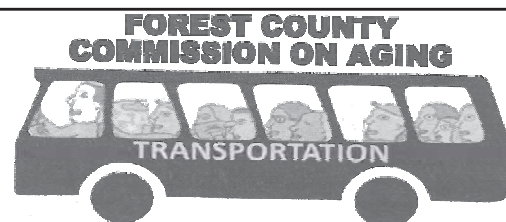

Felzkowski on funding for rural schools
Madison, WI – The Joint Finance Committee today took up the Department of Public Instruction budget and voted on a myriad of K-12 education funding proposals, from increases in special education funding, to doubling mental health aids, to various programs targeted to aid rural school districts. Senator Mary Felzkowski (R-Tomahawk) made the following statement:
“Today we made significant investments into our state’s future by supporting the education of all our children across the state. Education has always been at the forefront of my priorities as a member of the Joint Finance Committee, and I have always been proud to vote in support of our schools. This year, the funding we set aside for our schools comes on top of \$2.6 billion in federal money. I am confident our school districts will use this money wisely.”
The K-12 education proposal that was passed today achieves the following:
• Provides nearly \$500 million in new state funding.
• Sets aside \$350 million to maintain education funding stability in the future.
• Guarantees a minimum of \$781 per pupil to all school districts if the schools were in person more than 50% of the 2020-21 school year.

• Increases Special Education Categorical Aids by nearly 10%, or by \$86 million, bringing the total to 30% of eligible costs - the highest dollar levels ever.
• Doubles Mental Health Categorical Aids by providing an additional \$12 million.
• Provides \$7 million for school-based mental health collaboration grants – a 54% increase.
“I was especially proud to advocate for the funding targeted towards our rural school districts who face unique challenges and costs. I am grateful for my colleagues who voted to support the rural school plan I advocated for, which included an additional \$13 million in high cost transportation aid. I am pleased that we also invested in Lakeland STAR Academy in Minocqua, which offers students with disabilities in the Northwoods the opportunity to learn how to live independently and with self-confidence.”

Too often are the needs of rural Wisconsinites overlooked, and funding this incredible educational institution shows that the Joint Finance Committee is focusing on the right issues.”
Last month, Rep. Swearingen was joined by members of the Joint Finance Committee to tour Lakeland STAR Academy, where they witnessed the immense impact that STAR Academy has on its students and the community at large. “I have advocated and fought for this funding for years, and it is incredible to see these efforts pay off. I celebrate this win for our district, and most importantly, for the children who will now have the tremendous opportunity to live a fulfilling, independent life.” Rep. Swearingen added. Lakeland STAR Academy caters to predominantly autistic students with the goal of providing its students with the confidence and determination to live self-sufficiently and find gainful employment posteducation.
Representative Swearingen represents the 34th Assembly District, which includes the Northwoods counties of Oneida, Vilas, Florence and portions of Forest.
