In 2019, Governor Tony Evers declared it the Year of Clean Drinking Water. As part of the state-wide initiative to ensure Wisconsinites have access to clean, safe drinking water, Gov. Evers signed Executive Order #40 in August 2019 to address the issue of PFAS (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances) in Wisconsin.

Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a large group of human-made chemicals that have been used in industry and consumer products worldwide since the 1950s. PFAS do not occur naturally and are widespread in the environment. They are found in people, wildlife and fish all over the world. Some PFAS can stay in peoples' bodies a long time and do not break down easily in the environment.

Executive Order #40 directed the DNR to create the PFAS Coordinating Council (now known as the Wisconsin PFAS Action Council, or WisPAC) in partnership with other state agencies. WisPac has developed statewide initiatives to address growing public health and environmental concerns regarding certain PFAS substances. These initiatives are part of a statewide PFAS Action Plan.

Michigan also has formed a citizens' alliance to help fight PFAS pollution. The Great Lakes PFAS Action Network (GLPAN) is a coalition centered and driven by people impacted by toxic PFAS pollution.

GLPAN combines the resources and expertise in PFAS impacted communities and then combines it with

Argonne celebrates 100 years as a community this weekend

Argonne will be celebrating their 100th year as the Town of Argonne this weekend, on Friday and Saturday. It may have been 100 years back that the name was changed to Argonne, but this community is one of the oldest in the county. It was North Crandon for quite some time, as the old photos on display this weekend will show.

The community has gone through a great many changes, as all communities do. The first occupation in the town was certainly logging, followed closely by working on the railroad, as the Soo Line developed their switches, depot and maintenance facilities.

Farming took over as land was cleared, and potatoes were the predominant crop. Eventually, dairy cows became the use of the many farms that had sprung up around the community. That too came to an end, as the dairy business wasn't able to compete with dairy farmers and bigger dairies to the south. Beef cattle now roam the pastures that dairy cows used to inhabit.

Neither farming or logging has disappeared through the years, but the businesses have changed to meet the markets and the times.

The once proud Argonne school has disappeared, and all the kids ride the bus to Crandon. The old wooden town hall that used to shake with the cheers of basketball fans and provide a place for Christmas plays and other events like dances has been replaced with a modern structure.

Communities change to meet the times they live in, and Argonne, like many other communities, has made the changes and carried on. It was a good place to grow up when I was a kid, and still is. Enjoy the celebration of a successful community!

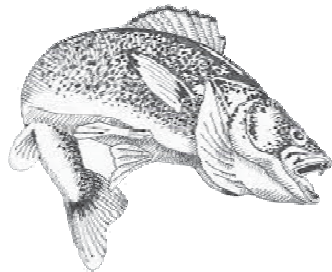

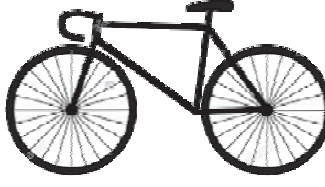

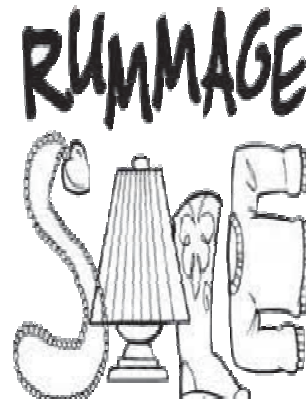

Fires, Floods, and the Climate Crisis

The lead news stories lately have been about record heat, drought, and wildfires in the western U.S. and Canada, (who hasn't noticed the smoke smell, hazy skies, and air quality alerts) followed by stories of flooding in other parts of the country and world. These fires and floods are worsened by human-caused climate warming.

Burning coal, oil, and natural gas releases carbon dioxide into the atmosphere where it acts like a blanket, preventing heat from escaping into space. This added heat raises temperatures and speeds evaporation from water bodies, soils, and plants, increasing the severity of droughts and wildfires. This evaporated water - combined with warmer air's ability to hold more moisture - contributes to torrential rains and flooding in other areas. Basically the water cycle is in overdrive.

This June was the hottest on record. But for our children, it will be one of the coolest in their lifetimes unless we rapidly reign in carbon dioxide pollution.

other organizations' resources and expertise. Together, they educated decision-makers at the state and federal level, secure funding for large-scale cleanup, and ensure accountability for swift, comprehensive solutions to PFAS contamination for people across the Great Lakes region.

Over the past decade, it has become clear that PFAS - which are used in everything from furniture, clothing and cookware to food packaging, child car seats and fire-fighting foam- is responsible for serious health impacts to people and wildlife.

PFAS contamination may be in food, drinking water, dust, some consumer products and workplaces. The EPA concluded that diet is the major contributor of exposure to PFAS compounds, with drinking water and/or dust being additional exposure sources.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has additional information on PFAS, and the US EPA also provides additional health information on PFAS. Another area of interest is PFAS accumulation in wildlife. Little is known about the effects of PFAS accumulation in wild animals and fish.

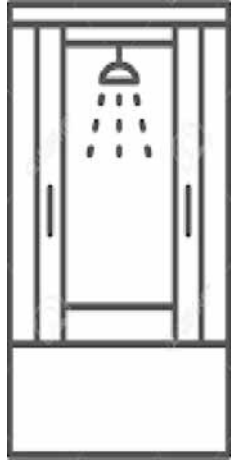

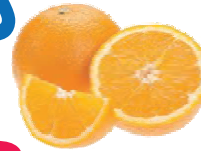

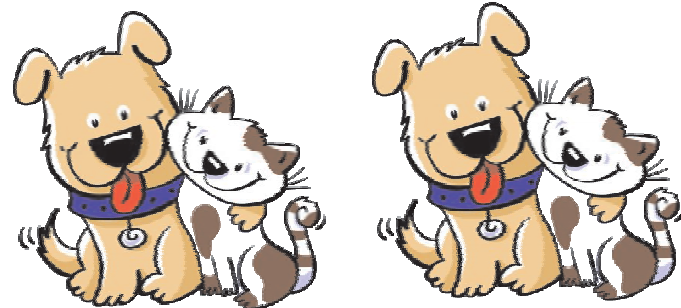

Ed Chartraw. Class of 1964. Ed played football, basketball, and baseball all 4 years of high school, and participated in track 1 year. He was named All-Conference in two sports in both his junior and senior years. Ed was an exceptional student as well as an athlete and graduated as Co-Salutatorian of his class. Ed played baseball at the University of Wisconsin and his junior year led the Big 10 Conference in batting average. After graduation from college, he became an educator in Illinois where he was serving as the Superintendent of Schools in his district when he retired.

Phil Resch. Class of 1966. Phil earned 11 varsity letters spread over football, basketball, baseball, and golf during his high school career. He was named to the All Conference football team. In addition to his participation in high school sports, in the summers Phil was also an active member of the Crandon Ski Serpents Water Ski Club. Following his graduation from CHS, Phil attended the University of Wisconsin where he was a member of the nationally-ranked Intercollegiate Rowing/Crew Team. He was the team's Most Valuable Player his junior year, Captain his senior year, and was a member of the 1st U.S.A. Olympic Rowing Team Training Camp in Boston.

Paula Noreika. Class of 1979. With girls competitive sports being relatively new, Paula first started playing competitive basketball as the only girl on the Mole Lake Braves basketball team in 5th and 6th grade. When she got to high school, she earned 11 letters as a member of the volleyball, basketball, and track teams. She was a two-year Most Valuable Player on the basketball team and received All-State and All-American recognition after her senior season.

Marty Roberts. Class of 1982. While the previous athletes being honored were all multiple sport stars, Marty specialized in a fairly new sport at Crandon High School - Wrestling. He established a high bar of success for future wrestlers to aim for, as he won multiple conference championships, various other tournament championships, and placed in the WIAA State Tournament twice back when there were no divisions of schools and all teams competed in the same tournaments. Marty is presently nearing the end of a distinguished career in the United States Navy.

Jim Van Zile. Class of 1969. Jim is also a unique selection as an inductee. His first two years in high school, Jim participated in track, where at one time he held the school record for the mile run. His junior and senior years, Jim lettered in football, basketball, and baseball, where he was the Most Valuable Player his senior year. However, what really cements his induction into the Hall of Fame is his extensive coaching career at Crandon High School. He joined the high school staff as the Chippewa-Sokaogan Home School Coordinator in 1975 and after finishing his teaching degree at U.W.-Stevens Point in 1990, was a teacher in the Crandon District until 2020. He coached at least one sport every year during his 43 years of employment by the district, except in 1988-89, when he was finishing his college degree at Stevens Point. His resume includes stints as either the head coach or an assistant coach at one time or another in the football, boys basketball, girls basketball, baseball, and softball programs, with several conference championships. Following the 2007-08 basketball season he was named the Assistant Coach of the Year by the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches' Association.

Faye (Lee) Thielke. (Coach) She was hired by the School District of Crandon in the fall of 1970 as a K-12 Physical Education Instructor and as the Advisor for the Girls Athletic Association (GAA). With the passage of Title IX, girls sports programs could become competitive interscholastic programs and during the 1971-72 school year, some of the Northern Lakes Conference schools, including Crandon, sponsored girls' teams. She organized and coached the first girls' volleyball, basketball, and track programs, while also serving as the advisor for cheerleading and pom poms, and organized various sports clinics to support the new sports programs. She served as the Volleyball Coach from 1972 until 1987 (except 1978) and her 1980 and 1983 teams won conference championships. In 1987, her team won the WIAA Regional Championship and finished second in the Sectional Tournament. In 1985, she was recognized for coaching her volleyball teams to 100 conference wins; and in 1988, she received a "Gold Award" from Scholastic Coach. Faye Lee graduated from Blair High School and U.W.-River Falls, where she was a member of the Field Hockey Team.

Harold Resch. (Coach) Last, but not least among the first group of inductees to the Hall of Fame is Coach Resch. Harry, as he is affectionately known among his former students, athletes, and community residents, was hired by the School District of Crandon in 1965 after graduating from U.W.-LaCrosse, to teach High School Chemistry and Math. He became an Assistant Basketball Coach in 1965 and then the Head Coach in 1967. He served as head coach until 1978, when he chose to step down. However, he returned as the head coach again from 1987 until 1990. He compiled a record of 182 wins and 102 losses, with 5 Conference Championships (1969-70, 1970-71, 1972-73, 1973-74, 1975-76). His 1974-75 and 1975-76 teams won WIAA Regional Championships and played in WIAA Sectionals. Mr. Resch served as Crandon's Athletic Director from 1985 until 2001. He was also a WIAA Game Official for 35 years and umpired in the WIAA State Baseball Tournament in 1986 and 1987.

The committee would like to remind alumni and interested Crandon area residents that the establishment of this Hall of Fame is coming more than 100 years after the first class of students graduated from Crandon High School, and it was the intent of the committee to try to honor some of the earlier athletes, coaches and contributors. The committee needed to establish some criteria, and the lack of records and accurate information for some possible candidates made consideration difficult, but the committee will be working to address that problem for future years. Also, the decision to not include more recent outstanding athletes in the first group of honorees is not intended to be a slight. The committee recognizes that there are a considerable number of people worthy of being inducted to the Hall of Fame, but felt that it should go back and try to honor those from previous generations, if possible.

The time will come for these younger candidates. The committee hopes that people will appreciate the efforts of its members and their attempts to recognize deserving Crandon High School athletes of the past.

able to bring our students and the public back on campus health and safety of our campus community," said Matthew Schur, director of Risk, Compliance and Security at Nicolet

The Scoops and Scholarships event will run from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. outside under a large tent across from the Lakeside Center on the Rh the Prince and the Peach.

Nicolet admissions representatives and other college staff will be on hand to answer questions about admissions process, financial aid, and other topics related to starting the fall term.
