Governor Evers Signs Bill Encouraging More Wetland and Floodplain Restoration

Governor Tony Evers put his final approval on Senate Bill 91 (now 2021 Act 77) which focuses on restoring the natural capacity of wetlands to manage water. The legislation calls for the creation of a hydrologic restoration general permit for simple, voluntary projects that repair hydrology, often involving upper watershed wetland restoration and floodplain reconnection.

Instead of needing multiple permits, certain restoration projects may qualify for a single general permit

Record breaking schedule for 52nd Polaris Crandon World Championships

Thanks to the cooperative effort by a diverse group of series, corporate partners and off-road racers from America, Mexico and Canada, Crandon International Raceway today announced the most action-packed and comprehensive schedule in the 52-year history of the Polaris Crandon World Championship Off-Road Races. The four day event is scheduled for September 2 through the 5, 2021.

In a weekend which also includes the 6th annual Red Bull Crandon World Cup, the schedule offers tens of thousands of fans flocking to Crandon International a Labor Day celebration that features a whopping 42 races spread over three days and nights – a record for the event and the iconic facility. Located in the picturesque Northwoods of Wisconsin, the facility nicknamed The Big House is preparing to host an estimated 400 race teams and a sold-out Camp Crandon which is comprised of more than 2,100 grass camping sites.

The massive race weekend is the largest, oldest and most prestigious short-course off-road race in the world, and includes a complete schedule of Pro and Sportman AMSOIL Champ Off-Road series racers going all-out to win both season championships and Crandon World Champion title and rings for all classes.

For the first time in Crandon history all rock racing classes of the Ultra4 series made famous at the annual King of the Hammers event in California will be competing. Every Ultra4 category will compete twice over the three day World Championship schedule, including a block of night racing Saturday evening under the lights in the Crandon Off-Road Park.

Another historic first is the inaugural appearance of race-prepared Volkswagen Beetle sedans that will make up the EMPI Crandon Class 11 World Championship presented by Continental Tire. While the largely stock Class 11 sedans have been a staple of desert and Baja racing from the sport's earliest days, these fan favorites have not been seen at Crandon for decades. With racers coming from around the United States and Mexico, the Volkswagens will be racing for two rounds of competition on Friday night and on Sunday.

The 6th annual Red Bull Crandon World Cup for Pro category racers will also take place on Sunday, with the sport's best Pro drivers earning coveted Crandon World Championship titles and the biggest prize of all -- the annual Red Bull Cup Challenge finale.

Mursau given award at NorthLakes Community Clinic's Appreciation Event



At NorthLakes Community Clinic's Annual Community Appreciation Event on August 18th, Representative Jeff Mursau Assembly District 36th was presented with a Community Health Center State Grant Champion Award, honoring his commitment to increasing access for underserved patients and recognizing the critical role of Community Health Centers.

Representative Mursau signed onto a bill for this 2021-2023 biennial budget session to increase funding by \$1 million for the 17 Wisconsin Community Health Centers which provide access at nearly 200 service sites in Wisconsin, including school-based sites, mobile clinics, and brick-and-mortar locations in both rural and urban communities.

Community Health Centers have served on the frontlines of the COVID-19 pandemic, continuing to provide primary care and other services for patients while also launching testing and vaccination efforts. Currently, State Grant funding accounts for only 4% of overall Community Health Center funding. This funding, which has remained stagnant since 2009, is one of the only flexible sources of funding for Health Centers, and a critical resource for proactively addressing unique community needs.

Grave Rededication



Charlie "Brother Charlie", Murray's grave was rededicated at the Town of Crandon, (Siding One) Cemetery on August 7, 2021. Charlie was born in 1906 to Ida Mae "Piedy" Barker and James Logan Murray, Charlie passed away from a heart condition at the age of 16. With only a plain homemade concrete marker, Charlie was laid to rest in 1922 under the shade of a cedar, "Tree of Life." The story of Charlie and the fact that there was no marker that commemorated his life and death kindled the family rededication project. Those attending the rededication were the children, grandchildren, great grandchildren and great-great grandchildren of Charlie's sisters and brothers. Descendants traveled as many as 1,600 miles to attend. The rededication was followed by a family reunion.

that will be developed by the Department of Natural Resources. To be eligible, the projects must improve wetland and stream health by improving hydrologic connections, conditions, and functions. As more Wisconsin communities grapple with water-related problems, 2021 Act 77 will create an efficient review process for hydrologic restoration projects.
"Especially here in Wisconsin, wetlands are key to healthy, resilient watersheds," said Wisconsin Wetlands Association Executive Director Tracy Hames. "Wisconsin has lost nearly half of its original 10 million acres of wetlands, so we need to facilitate restoration to improve storage and slow the flow of water across our landscape."
Wisconsin communities are facing more water-related problems each year and need more tools to confront these costly and destructive problems. Flooding damages homes, businesses, farms, roads, and wildlife habitat, impacting the economy and overwhelming the budgets of local governments. These same storms also intensify water quality problems by unleashing sediment and runoff into the surface water of lakes and rivers.
"No single action will solve all the problems we face, but restoring healthy hydrology must be part of our overall strategy to build resilience," said Hames. "This permit will encourage more consideration of wetland solutions to problems like flooding, erosion, sedimentation, run-off, and water quality."
This legislation was introduced by Representatives Oldenburg (Viroqua) and Steineke (Kaukauna), and Senators Cowles (Allouez) and Bewley (Mason). It received bipartisan support of 40 unique cosponsors over the last two legislative sessions. A diverse array of organizations also supported the bill, including conservation, sporting heritage, local government, and real estate affiliated groups.
Senate Bill 91 (2021 Act 77) builds upon 2019 Act 157, which appropriated \$150,000 to Ashland County to demonstrate simple wetland restoration practices that can be used to manage runoff and reduce downstream flood risks.

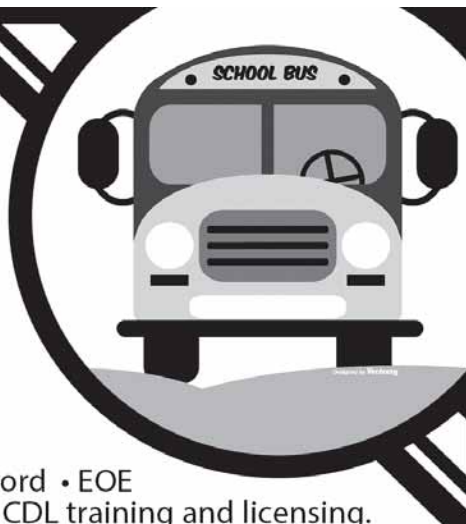

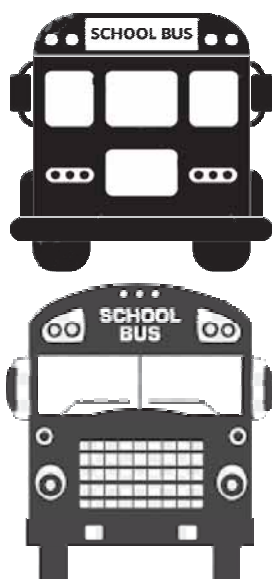
